Jones will co-chair Health Care Study Commission

State Representative Walter B. Jones, Jr. (D-Pitt) has been named by House Speaker Liston B. Ramsey as House Co-Chairman of the Indigent Health Care Study Commission. The Commission will study the issues of access to and financing of health care ser-

vices for North Carolinians who are unable to pay for their medical care. In accepting the post, Jones said "I am pleased to have been appointed as co-chair of this important Study Commission. I will have the opportunity to serve and to work to determine state and local responsibility for providing health care to the medically indigent. We will explore options for financing and delivering health care services to those people who are in need." "Because of federal cuts in medical assistance, North Carolina has to develop a policy that will insure that necessary health care is available to all of its citizens," he added. Jones is one of three members of the House of Representatives who will serve on the 12 member study commission. He chairs the House Committee on Commissions and Schools for the Blind and Deaf, and serves as vice-chairman of the House Committees on Children and Youth and Human Resources.

Some facts that will affect your life

1. Avoid cholesterol—rich foods, eggs, red meats, fried foods and rich dairy products as whole milk, cream, cheese and butter, as well as foods high in saturated fat. Choose instead lean meats, skinless chicken and turkey, fish, low-fat dairy products.

2. Three risks for heart attack persons: high blood pressure, high cholesterol and smoking. There are other risks like age and a family history of heart attacks, but you cannot change these. And if you are overweight, do not exercise and live a high-stress life, you are at greater risk too.

3. A blood pressure of 140/90 or more is generally considered to be too high. The higher your blood pressure, the greater your risk of heart disease or stroke. A better pressure would be 120/80. To reduce blood pressure: (a) bring your weight down to normal; (b) decrease your sodium intake, not only table salt but in snacks and processed foods; (c) take prescribed medicine regularly. Many doctors also prescribe exercise and relaxation training to lower blood pressure.

4. People who are inactive tend to have more heart disease than people who are physically active.

Regular, brisk and sustained exercise often can reduce blood pressure and help you to lose weight and may even help you to stop smoking.

5. Christians are happier. They are not afflicted with the neurotic phobias, compensations, defenses, of the selfish and self-centered. Because of his willingness to forgive, he is not tormented with jealousy and desire for revenge. Because of the fullness of his heart, his life he feels no need for expensive, degrading diversions.

6. The first step in assuring good sleep is to clear the mind of worry, fear, and all else that wars against a peaceful spirit.

7. Anger is usually looked upon as a moral weakness.

8. Be a faithful and useful member of the church.

9. Too many children every place else except finding the time to visit their parents. Show your love and respect while there is still time, for it's later than you

think.

10. Physical blindness is bad enough, but it is not as dreadful as spiritual blindness.

11. Define a "bad man." A bad man is a man who doesn't want to be better.

12. Bitterness is a form of torture and some people actually appear to like it. We can disagree without being bitter over our disagreements.

13. Jesus said, "The kingdom of God (heaven) is within you." If a man's spirit is happy, he is wealthy.

Six secrets of strong families

Is your family a strong family? All of us can contribute to family failure qualities. Some strong family qualities are these:

1. Commitment. Time, energy, spirit and heart are essential, which says the family comes first. Commitment and sexual fidelity are closely linked that an extramarital affair is regarded as the ultimate threat to a marriage. "An affair does a terrible thing to your partner's self-esteem." It says you are replaceable.

Some families have been eroded by a more subtle enemy—

work, and its demands on time, attention and energy. It's important for fathers to remember this: "If I'm a good father to my sons, they're likely to be good parents too. Someday—after I'm gone, and certainly after that report has rotted, my grandchildren or great grandchildren will have a good father because I was a good father."

2. Time together. Money, cars, fine homes, children say, don't make homes. "Doing things together" instead. Strong families work, play, attend church services and eat meals

together, wash dishes together, fold clothes together, mow the grass together. Some of your closest moments are times working together.

3. Appreciation. Feeling ap-

preciated by others is one of the most basic human needs. Each night parents, go into the children's bedrooms and give each a big hug and kiss. Then say, "You are really good kids

and we love you very much." One lady informed me that each morning when her husband leaves for work, he puts his arms around her and two girls, whispers a prayer, asking God to take care of his family until he returns home, hugs and kisses them, and says, "Goodbye." Such a father! God bless him. This man puts God first. This is surely a happy family; in fact, the wife says, "I love him more and more each day."

Read the contrast. This couple delighted in acid sarcasm with each other. They constantly were fault finders and belittled each other. Don't visit a couple like that—their ways may rub off on you. Always make positive remarks when your spouse comes home and do be pleasant, regardless of his attitude or mood. You arrived home safely, didn't you? You found your family still there, healthy and safe, didn't you? That's enough to make you be pleasant and agreeable.

4. Communication. Good communication creates a sense of belonging, eases frustrations as well as full-blown crises. If your son can't talk with you about cars and tennis, why should you expect him to discuss the drug traffic at school? Good communication creates a sense of belonging. I repeat; it means clearing up misunderstandings. Hinting is poor communication. When your wife says, "Are there any good movies downtown?" she is saying, "Take me to a movie." Understand her. Some of these men are so hard to talk with, yet they can go around others and be the life of the party. Some men would rather be any place else except at home. Set the example, men. Your wife, your children, your home is no more that what you make it.

5. Spiritual wellness. This is the caring center within each of us that promotes sharing, love and compassion for others. Strong families express their spiritual dimension in daily life by practicing what they preach. "Our family," one person wrote, "has certain values—honest, responsibility, and tolerance, to name a few. I can't talk about honesty and cheat on my income tax. Kids know when you are a hypocrite."

Just think! God gave you health and strength enough to work all the week and you are too lazy to get up on Sunday morning and spend an hour or two in church service. Where are your values? What kind of example are you setting for your children? Mothers, if Dad doesn't go, get your children and yourself ready and go to church. We'd have fewer juvenile delinquents if fathers took their sons to Sunday School as well as church. Who's the delinquent—father or son?

6. Coping with Crisis. These tools : focusing on the positive, skill in communication; spiritual resources and adaptability are necessary for coping with crises. "Life is troubles." When you don't set aside time for your family, time to be with your son or daughter while they snack or eat, time to hold the baby; time to take a walk with your wife; time to go on a vacation together, you'll look at your own life and cry one day. There'll come a time in your life when you'll need your family and the family will not be there. She would rather put you in a nursing home than be bothered with taking care of you in the home. The children will visit seldom, and the telephone calls be none. Think about this now, men.

A healthy family is a place we enter for comfort, development and regeneration, a place from which we go forth renewed and charged with power for positive living. Put love into your family as an investment. It's the best investment you can make. NICH STINNETT and JOH DEFRAIN

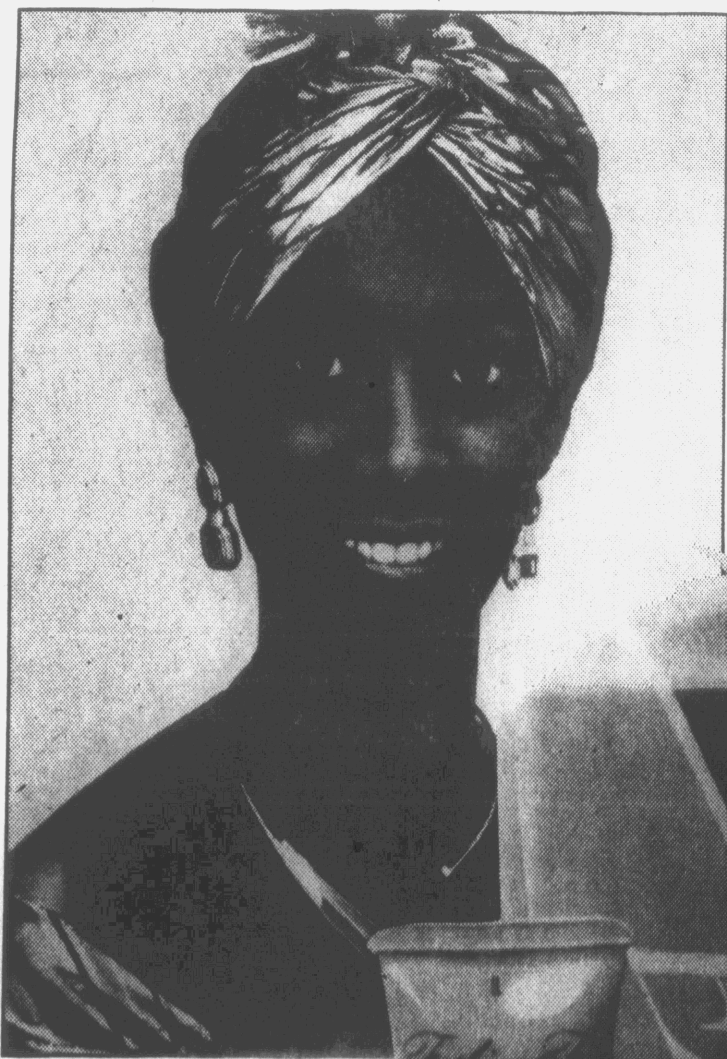

His legislative experiences have covered a wide range of committee appointments relative to Finance, Education, Labor, Corrections, and other areas.

In addition to these achievements, Mr. Michaux is a member and partner in the law firm of Michaux and Michaux, P.A.; a licensed and practicing Real Estate Broker in the State of North Carolina; a licensed property and casualty insurance

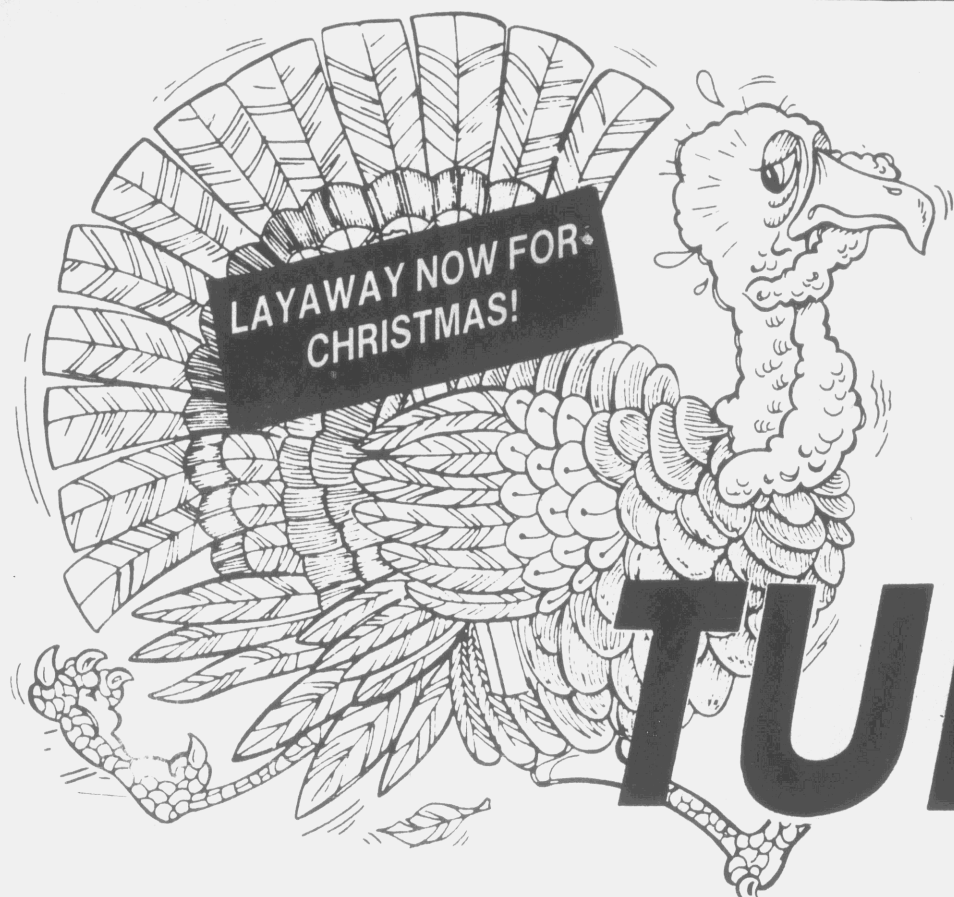

Thanksgiving is just around the corner and the "magic of cooking poultry and eggs" can come alive this November for you and your family. Three tricks to turkey and egg magic are...creating recipes, cooking quickly and serving with flair. Make the process fun and easy! Learn labor-saving methods to get those blue-ribbon dishes on the table quickly.

MEXICAN CRUNCH TURKEY SHELLS

(Serves 6)
6 hard cooked eggs, peeled
1 lb. ground turkey
1 oz. Taco seasoning mix
1 tablespoon onion flakes
1 egg
1/2 lb. corn chips, crushed
1. Combine ground turkey, seasoning mix, egg and onion, mix well.

2. Flatten 3 oz. of ground turkey mixture into a large patty.
3. Place hard cooked egg in center of patty and fold meat over to completely enclose egg.
4. Roll coated egg in crushed corn chips (to achieve better adhesion, coated egg may be dipped in egg wash before rolling in chips).
5. Bake in 350 degree F. oven for 25 minutes or until turkey is done. Serve hot or cold with commercial salsa.

ORIENTAL TURKEY PUFFS

(Serves 8/Three appetizers per person)
1/2 lb. ground turkey
1 can (8 oz.) bean sprouts, chopped
1 can (4 oz.) water chestnuts, chopped
1/4 cup green onion, chopped
1 tablespoon soy sauce
1 teaspoon ground ginger

1 (10x15" sheets) frozen puff pastry, slightly thawed
1 egg
1 1/2 teaspoon milk
2 tablespoon sesame seeds
1/2 cup Chinese hot mustard
1 cup sweet and sour sauce
1. Combine ground turkey, sprouts, water chestnuts, onion, soy sauce and ginger, mix well. Cover and refrigerate several hours or overnight, allowing flavors to blend.
2. Beat together eggs and milk.

3. On one 10"x15" sheet of pastry evenly distribute 24 scoops of chilled mixture. Cover with another set of pastry. Press edges of pastry with fork. Using a ravioli cutter, pizza cutter or sharp knife, cut pastry into 1 1/2" squares. Press to seal edges. Place squares on baking sheet. Brush lightly with egg mixture. Sprinkle with sesame seeds.
4. Bake in a 425 degrees F. just until edges are golden, about 10 to 13 minutes. Serve immediately with hot mustard and sweet and sour dipping sauces.
