JACKSON, Miss (AP)- In Mississippi, where mention of the civil rights movement evokes images of bombings, Ku Klux Klan, public schools are preparing to test a program that will ultimately teach students about the subject in every grade from kindergarten through high school.

So far, four school systems have asked to be part of a pilot effort to test the curriculum in high schools. In September the Mississippi Department of Education will name the systems that have been approved for the pilot. By the 2010-11 school year, the program should be in place at all grade levels as part of social studies courses.

Advocacy groups such as the William Winter Institute for Racial Reconciliation and Washington based Teaching, for Change are preparing to train Mississippi teachers to tell the "untold story" of the civil rights struggle to the nearly half million students in the state's public schools.

"Now more than ever we are engaged in national debates about race and so much of those debates are impoverished in their understanding of history," said Susan Glissen of the winter Institute "We want to emphasize the grass-roots nature of civil rights and the institution of racism." The program is the out growth of a law passed in 2006 by the Legislature. The state moves forward with statewide implementation in the 2010-11 school year, despite an unsucessful legislative effort to eliminate the plan this year. Education officials looked to other states for a model, but couldn't find one that included as comprehensive as what Mississippi has in mind said Chauncey Spears, who works

"We will not sit by while our liberties and freedoms are being looted by elected officials serving their interests and not the interests of their constituents." She admonished "Black liberal politicians" for playing the race card instead of facing up to the fact that their policies have failed. "Personally, I will not sit by and let those who criticize our cause call it about race and call us rednecks," she said. "My neck is not red." Rev. Bryant also spoke against big government. "Yes, we need reform. Yes we know something needs to be done about our health system," he said. "We send this message to you. We want reform, but there will be no government takeover of one more American industry." He also spoke about the division in this country, pointing the finger at politicians for causing it. "Politicians are building walls between the people," he said. "You are building walls misunderstanding. You're building walls of hatred. You're building walls of racism. You're building walls of classism and ... in the words of Ronald Reagan, when he spoke to Mikhail Gorbachey at the Berlin Wall, Mr. Obama, 'tear down this wall." U. S. Rep. Elijah Cummings (D-Md), saw the Sept. 12 march in a larger context, and it caused him some concern. Noting the lack of diversity in the crowd, he pointed to the lack of diversity in the Republican ranks in Congress and mentioned that it seemed disingenuous to call either group a cross-section of America. He referred to statements from march participants, saying, "When you listen to their comments, many of them didn't know what they were protesting. So it makes you wonder what it's really all about." Citing the statistic that 1 in 3 people had a lapse in health care coverage in the last two years, he said the very people protesting are the people who would be helped by reform. "Most of them are arguing against their best interest," he said. When asked what he believes this is all about, Cummings said, "Basically what you have is a lot of people upset that Barack Obama won. He is a brilliant, competent and honest elected official. "I am convinced there is a genuine dislike - and in some cases hatred - for this African-American president." Meadows said, "They've [the loud minority] been loud, rude and obstructionist and quite harmful to a lot of citizens. I think, unfortunately, it [dissension] does tend to discredit the health care reform initiative." Organizers of the march seem to think their efforts will affect the process. Steinhauser said, "I think it will make an impact with moderate that Drake's comments do not reflect the actions, resolutions Republicans and moderate

### Southern Baptist **Minister Prays** For Obama's Death

June 21, 2009) - A well-known minister of a denomination that once supported slavery and is firmly against a woman's right to an abortion said recently that he is praying for President Obama to die. The Rev. Wiley. Drake, a former second vice president of the Southern Baptist Convention, told Fox News Radio earlier this month that he was practicing "imprecatory prayer" or seeking a divine curse that would cause the president to die. "If he does not turn to God and does not turn his life around, I am asking God to enforce imprecatory prayers that are throughout the Scripture that would cause him death," Drake said in an interview with Fox's Alan Colmes, according to the Associated Press. The Southern Baptist Convention was formed in 1845 so slaveholders could continue to serve missionaries. The church supported the South during the Civil War, supported segregation of the races before and during the Civil Rights Movement and has been known for its hostility toward affirmative action and busing to achieve racial balance in schools. The church has been a favorite of conservative Republican Party candidates. ( In 1995, Southern Baptists formally sought forgiveness from African-Americans.( By 2007, the convention's minority membership, including African-Americans, Asians and Latinos, had grown to about 18 percent, said the Rev. Richard Land, head of the denomination's public policy arm. But like many other U.S. denominations, the 16.2 million-member Southern Baptist Convention remains overwhelmingly White.( Presidents Jimmy Carter and Bill Clinton were raised Southern Baptists. Carter left the church in 2000 over its increasingly right-wing agenda and. while Clinton acknowledges his roots in the denomination, he attends services with his wife, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, who is a United Methodist. Roger Oldham, vice president for convention relations with the Southern Baptist's executive committee, said that Drake's comments were out of line with church teachings. Oldham told the Associated Baptist Press

"I think it is a fair statement to say that the vast majority of Southern Baptists are committed to praying for the well-being of the president in accordance with the specific instruction given in 1 Timothy 2:1-3," Oldham said, quoting, "First of all, then I urge petitions, prayers, intercessions and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all those who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. This is good, and it pleases God our Savior." Drake recently said that he prayed for the death of famed abortion doctor George Tiller. Tiller was shot to death in his church on May 31 in Wichita, Kan. by an antiabortion activist. In regards to Obama, Drake, who pastors à church in Buena Park, Calif., had not retracted his statement as of AFRO press time.

Angela Davis Discuss the State of Women's Rights

The crowd's roar echoed the ferocity once demonstrated by the former Black Panther, who took her seat at MICA'S Constitution Day panel discussion silently, allowing a modest smile to compliment her demeanor. At 65, Davis' navy blue blazer spoke of her scholarship as a professor at the University of California Santa Cruz. But, the tattoo on the outside of her left ankle younger reflects her years. Displayed below her black capris was hummingbird, considered a fragile, yet fearsome fighter, analogous to the prominent force Davis has been within the struggle for Black liberation and women's rights. Her expertise in feminist studies contributed to Maryland Institute College of Art's dialogue on the state of women's rights in 2009 last Saturday. Davis acknowledged President Obama's efforts to support women's rights by signing the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act to end the wage disparity between men and women. She also supports Obama's universal health care plan, but criticizes his approach to selling the idea to conservatives. "I get very angry when Obama feels that it's necessary constantly to reply to the right wing by saying 'No, this health care reform is not supposed to benefit illegal immigrants," she said. "When I say the importance of health care for all women in this country, I mean all women in this country. mean women in prison, l who are mean women immigrants without

"During the entire conversation, she felt 'cornered' and unable to escape. She found your attitude to be condescending and the entire encounter to be very embarrassing." ### Social Security Checks Will Be Decreased

WASHINGTON (AP) -Millions of older people face shrinking Social Security checks next year, the first time in a generation that payments would not rise. The trustees who oversee Social Security are projecting there won't be a cost of living adjustment (COLA) for the next two years. That hasn't happened since automatic increases were adopted in 1975. By law, Social Security benefits cannot go down. Nevertheless, monthly payments would drop for millions of people in the Medicare prescription drug program because the premiums, which often are deducted from Social Security payments, are scheduled to go up slightly. "I will promise you, they count on that COLA," said Barbara Kennelly, a former Democratic congresswoman from Connecticut who now the National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare, "To some people, it might not be a big deal. But to seniors, especially with their health care costs, it is a big Cost of living adjustments are pegged to inflation, which has been negative this year, largely because energy prices are below 2008 levels. Advocates say older people still face higher prices because they spend a disproportionate amount of their income on health care, where costs rise faster than inflation. Many also have suffered from declining home values and shrinking stock portfolios just as they are


income. "For many elderly, they don't feel that inflation is low because their expenses are still going up," said David Certner. legislative policy director for AARP. "Anyone who has savings and investments has seen some serious losses." About 50 million retired and disabled Americans receive Social Security benefits. The average monthly benefit for retirees is \$1,153 this year. All beneficiaries received a 5.8 percent increase in January, the largest since 1982.

More than 32 million people are in the Medicare prescription drug program. Average monthly premiums are set to go from \$28 this year to \$30 next year, though they vary by plan. About 6 million people in the program have premiums deducted from their monthly Social Security payments, according to the

Millions of people with Medicare Part B coverage for doctors' visits also have their premiums deducted from Social Security payments. Part B premiums are expected to rise as well. But under the law, the increase cannot be larger than the increase in Social Security benefits for most recipients. There is no such hold-harmless provision for drug premiums. 

### How To Complain **About A Company**

As we all know, sometimes companies don't get it right you order a DVD and receive a t-shirt with three wolves instead, your luggage winds up in Bangkok while you're in Birmingham, or you find two charges on your Visa bill for the same item. Here's a brief primer on how you, the consumer, can get the remedy you need.

1. Exhaust all options with the company. Most mistakes are honest ones, so hopefully speaking with customer service will set things right. Be polite but firm when dealing with customer service representatives. Anyone who has worked in customer service knows that screaming, swearing and name-calling aren't appreciated, and are occasionally tracked and noted on your customer profile.

Ask to speak with a manager; and if discussions there have reached a standstill, consider filing a written complaint. Many companies have ways to file complaints online, and ask customer service representative for the proper email and mailing address, as well as what kind of response you can expect to receive. Most companies have contact information on their Web sites, but keep a copy of whatever you send with dates so you can follow up.

Written letters are a great medium because it helps you create a paper trail of the interaction you've had with a company. When writing a complaint letter, be detailed

include contact information so the company can reach out to you. (The government puts out a Consumer Action Handbook, a handy index of resources for consumers and also offers tips on how to write complaint letters.)

2. File a complaint with the Better Business Bureau. Although the BBB is not an official regulating body, it's a powerful channel between consumers and companies. Consumers can file complaints on the BBB's Web site, and the Bureau then sends the complaint to the company. If the company is among the BBB's participating 400,000 businesses, they must respond, says Alison Southwick, a BBB spokesperson. Member companies adhere to the BBB Code of Business Practices, licenses and clearly disclose customer other things. Other non- booking regularly respond complaints, too. Consumer "There's 1,000 customer complaints are also filed into the BBB's database of publiclyavailable reliability reports.

When writing a complaint to file with the BBB, be as detailed as possible. List the names, places, dates, times and numbers of people you spoke with. If the complaint is about a smaller company or possible scam, these clues can help the BBB track down fraud. A rule of thumb: "People should just pour themselves a glass of wine and start typing," Ms. Southwick says.

The BBB doesn't handle complaints against employers or licensed professionals such as doctors or lawyers. But they will direct those complaints to the relevant ethics boards or industry regulators.

3. Tell the government. This option is best when you have an issue that you think could impact many other consumers, Ms. Southwick says. Think more along the lines of telemarketing fraud or loanmodification scams rather than a late pizza delivery person.

Ms. Southwick also suggests that consumers file a complaint with their state attorney general and the Federal Trade Commission. Consumers aren't guaranteed individual resolution to their issue, but if these offices get lots of similar complaints, it could launch an investigation. Ohio state attorney general Richard Cordray recently filed a lawsuit against a debt collector after receiving a wave of customer complaints. These complaints can be filed either through the Federal Trade Commission's website or by finding contact information for your state attorney general. (Google your state and "attorney general".) In general, they're looking for the same details and information that the BBB is, as they, too, may need clues to investigate. 4. Go public. Once you've exhausted all other options, you may have some luck going to the Web. Blogs and Twitter have made it almost too easy to (loudly) voice your complaints

to a sympathetic audience.

and a public relations nightmare can explode at lightning speed for a company.

Some companies like JetBlue have made a point of introducing internet-focused consumer relations representatives, but not all companies have in-house resources dedicated to online complaints.

Nine different employees handle JetBlue's million-followerstrong Twitter stream, says Morgan Johnston, JetBlue's manager of corporate communications. He's one of them, and the airline has with two or three staffers manning Twitter at any given time.



### The African American Depression



Obama spoke to Wall Street today about the need to carefully guard the apparent economic recovery, ordering financial titans to act with integrity as the recession slowly dwindles away. But The New York Times is painting a much different economic picture for African Americans. For blacks in large numbers, we are not coming out of a recession - we are experiencing a depression that germinated nine years ago. In addition to that, we are being blamed by disgruntled whites for their increasing economic misery. From The Times: When you're going down, as the white middle class has been doing for several years now, it's all too easy to imagine that it's because someone else is climbing up over your back.

grievance, though, blacks are the ones who are taking the brunt of recession. disproportionately high levels of foreclosures and unemployment. And they weren't doing so well to begin with. At the start of the recession, 33 percent of the black middle class was already in danger of falling to a lower economic level, according to a study by the Institute on Assets and Social Policy at Brandeis University and Demos, a nonpartisan public policy research organization. In fact, you could say that for African-Americans the recession is over. It occurred from 2000 to 2007, as black employment decreased by 2.4 percent and incomes declined by 2.9 percent. During those seven years, one-third of black children lived in poverty, and black unemployment - even among college graduates consistently ran at about twice the level of white unemployment. That was the black recession. What's happening now is more like a depression.






