The Hooker & Bernard five story prize house, occupied by Roberts & Ficklen, has been converted into a stemmary, and began operations this week. A REFLECTOR reporter was shown through the p'ant by Mr. E. B. Ficklen, a member of the firm and their manager and buyer on this market.

The building is one of the largest here, and every department of it represents a place of activity. A large annex on the west side of the building contains the steam drying and ordering rooms and the power house. These are thoroughly equipped with modern appliances for andling tobacco. The first floor of the main building contains the business office, receiving, packing and shipping rooms The second floor has the picking and stemming rooms, and third, fourth and fifth floors are used for hanging and air drying. In the stemming rooms from 75 to 100 hands, most of them women, are employed. The steam department is under the supervision of Mr. W. E. Jarrett who has had many years experience in working tobacco.


