The United States government main tains a Bureau of Animal Industry, for the protection of the people against diseased or unwholesome meats.

At Kansas City, for instance, live stock intended for sale, to a packing house, is quarantined outside the stock yards, and it an animal is not in a perfectly healthy condition, it is not permitted to enter the yards, nor to be offered for sale to a packer of butcher. The United States government keeps ex pert veterinary inspectors right in the packing houses, whose business it is to examine the liver, lungs and general appearance and condition of every animal killed, and if this inspection discovers anything wrong with the animal, the inspector personally conducts it to the tanking department, that it may not, by any chance, he offered for sale as food. Every piece of meat or other article leaving a packing nouse bears a government certificate of health, and when you buy packing house meat you "e assured of its purity and whelesome 1038. This is one of the best regulations in existence, as if prevents unhealthy cattle or hogs from being slaugh tered and sold for food.

The Old Marine Band.

The big man in the band of former days in the Marine band in its infancy was the man who marched in the front and played a chime of bells which was rigged up on a long pole. He was an entire band in himself. Behind him marched two or three others who had similarly arranged chimes, though of smaller proportions. There n ay have been cornets, trombones and bass horps in existence then, but certainly none of them was ever carried by the Marine band until after 1835. I was He cometh forth as the horse married that year and remember very well seeing the band parade a day or so before my marriage, and I am certain there were no horns carried by the band except bugles or trumpets. I don't know, that their music was not as sweet as it is today. It sounded to us folks of that day so anyhow. There seemed to be more music in the string and reed instruments than in the various horns of today, and the men who carried the chime bells could, for sound at least, double discount any of the performers in the band today.-Washington Star.
