


SMALLPOX SPREADING.

The cry that to close the barrooms and open a Dispensary would injure the business of the town is a flimsy falsehood that ought to deceive no one. It destroys no business except that of the bar-keeper.

Fayetteville, Louisburg, Monroe and Waynesville have all had great er prosperity under the Dispensary law than ever before in their history. The tax book proves it.

We are not surprised that all the bar-keepers are opposed to the Dispensary, but how any other citizen having the welfare of the town before him, can put his name and influence on that side is hard to understand.

When asked if the Dispensary had decreased crime in Fayetteville Mr. Robinson, though opposed to the measure, was compelled to reply "If the reports of the Mayor be true it has reduced crime."

Politicians are proverbialy afraid of their own shadows. But why not lay politics aside and act simply as independent citizens. In a nrivate letter Judge Timberlake says the "Good people of Louisburg without regard to politics or religion united in an effort to secure the Dispensary." A similar movement in Greenville would insure uccess.




