WASHINGTON LETTER.

From Our Regular Correspondent. Washington. D.C., April 14, '99 It is regretable that Congress is not in session, so that the democrats could inject sufficient ginger into Mr. McKinley to make him call Germany down as they made him call Spain down a year ago. The people are stirred to deepest indignation by the news that German treachery in Samoa has been responsible for the ambushing of a small detachment of American and English marines by 800 natives and the killing of two lieutenants, one American and one English, one American Ensign, and four marines and the administration is doing just as it was doing a year agowaiting. Germany has deserved a sharp call down from this government four or five times since the war with Spain began, but in every instance the administration has allowed itself to be placated with a little soft soap from the German Ambassador. 
