MAYENCE RESISTS RHINELAND FORCES TO FORM REPUBLIC

Leaders, However, Confident Movement Will Succeed Soon

PARIS, Oct. 22.—It is understood that Premier Poincaré doubts the success of the separatist movement in the Rhineland and apprehends increased difficulties for the allies, if it succeeds. There seems to be more worry in French official circles over the situation in Bavaria than in the Rhineland.

MAYENCE, Oct. 22.—Rhineland forces entered Mayence early this morning, but met with resistance when an attempt was made to occupy the city hall. Two separatists were wounded in an exchange of shot. The separatists then assembled in another building to wait instructions of their leaders. It is understood that it has been decided to delay proclaiming a republic here until Tuesday or Wednesday. Meanwhile negotiations with German police for peacefully establishing the Rhineland government in Mayence will be continued.

AIX LA CHAPELLE, Prussia, Oct. 22.—Separatists led by J. Deekers and Dr. Gutherdt, proclaimed a Rhineland republic here today. Not a drop of blood was shed, although the Separatists took possession of the city hall and various public buildings and control of the police service. The regular police finally ranged themselves on the side of the republic. Having encountered no opposition here the Separatist leaders decided to proceed with the taking over of other towns, leaving Aix la Chapelle in charge of a few picked men to watch that the police kept their promise to support the republic.

As an additional precaution, however, the police who were allowed to retain their arms upon promising allegiance to the republic early in the day were disarmed tonight, but were allowed to remain on duty.

Thousands Expected To See High Point's Pageant of Progress

HIGH POINT, Oct. 22.—Thousands of visitors are expected to throng to High Point Thursday for the "Pageant of Progress" to be produced by civic organizations of the city in celebration of the completion of good roads in the fifth State highway district.

Plans for the pageant, which will bring to High Point two governors, a member of President Coolidge's cabinet and other notables, practically have been completed. It is the expectation of persons who have helped in forming the plans that the event will be one of the most spectacular and best attended ever held in North Carolina.

While the pageant will be an all-day affair, the outstanding feature of the program will be a mammoth parade, which will be two miles in length according to present plans. The parade, which will begin at 9 o'clock in the morning, will be composed of 2,000 persons, 1,000 of them in special costumes, members of the parade committee have announced.

FORMER FEDERAL AGENT INDICTED IN LIQUOR CASE

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—Gaston B. Means, former agent of the department of justice has been indicted on four counts in an alleged conspiracy to violate the national dry laws and using the mails in a scheme to defraud, it was learned today.

Means' indictment became known when the seals were broken on four indictments handed to Judge Knox in the federal court last Thursday. The indictment charges a series of conspiracies to violate the prohibition act, the liquor tax law and the internal revenue laws by illegally removing liquor from bonded warehouses. Four others were also indicted in connection with the alleged law violation.

Charge Plot to Wipe Entire City By Fire

QUITMAN, GA., Oct. 22.—Fire that broke out in three different parts of Quitman at 1:40 o'clock this morning, and believed to have been a plot to destroy this city, caused more than \$100,000 loss.

Fire companies that made a fast run here from Valdosta, 20 miles away, and heroic work on the part of local fire fighters saved the city.

Robberies that have been reported during the afternoon and night from all parts of the city, appear to confirm the theory here that robbery caused the fires.

Several attempts were made to open safes in offices and business houses, it was reported.

5 Killed In Grade Crossing Disaster

MEMPHIS, TENN., Oct. 22.—Five persons were killed, two injured, one probably fatally, when an automobile in which they were riding was struck by a Frisco passenger train at crossing near Quindfield, Ala., yesterday, according to word received here. The dead: Rev. H. P. Lucas, 40, his wife, and two-year-old daughter, Windfield; Rev. W. J. Otis and Rev. Max Hankins.

CHICAGO, Oct. 22.—The United States Railroad Labor Board today made public a decision awarding increases of one to two cents an hour to clerks station forces, docks, warehouse and platform freight handlers and similar employees of 65 carriers.

An unusual provision of the decision is that the "sum of the increases granted to the employees in each section shall be distributed by joint action of the representatives of the carriers and of the employees in such a manner as to bring about just and equitable rates for the employees in each of the various sections for which increases are provided."

FORMER CAROLINA TEACHER TELLS SYSTEM OF INSTRUCTION EMPLOYED IN COSMOPOLITAN SAN FRANCISCO

"Like almost all Eastern people (I speak in terms of our own American continent) I had longed to penetrate the West. I had long contemplated about this position that I wish to crossing the Sierras; I had thought of Nevada deserts. Wyoming had always sounded wild and "brunch." Beyond Nevada had long lain for me the idyllic land of romantic adventure (I do not in the least mean Holly Wood).

In May of this year dreams had also if I have an occasional American way of coming true, and before I can pupil to break the chain of for was half sure of just what had happened, I sat up and took notice.

Among my pupil, it might be interesting to recount some of the Nationalities that I encounter every day, beautiful. Five days later I stepped off the Overland Limited for San Francisco in the city of Berkeley. At once the indefinable charm of the California sky and hills laid hold on me. A few days later I sat in a spacious office in San Francisco's splendid "City Hall." Across a desk from me sat the superintendent of San Francisco schools.

I left this office with the practical assurance of a position to teach Mathematics in the Galileo high school. A few days later I had the official notification necessary. It is about this position that I wish to write.

WHEN THIEVES FALL OUT

There is an old adage to the effect that when thieves fall out honest men may get a benefit. The principle underlying this adage suggested in the case of the illegal beer brewers of New Jersey and Pennsylvania. For some time past they have been competing in the New York trade, smuggling their wares to the big thirsty town in large lots. They have had to "smooth" the way by distribution of backsheesh. Lately, however, the New Jersey brewers have suspected that the Pennsylvania rivals were having a bit too much better of the game and being nearer the market, have felt aggrieved. So they undertook a drive for business, and it is alleged, ended a pool to the end of corrupting on a larger scale the enforcement agents. This is the opportunity of the federal organization. Certain agents were detailed to be bribed and went through the game with much success. Recently 11 men were arrested in New York at the hotel which served as headquarters of the beer smugglers. It is stated that the evidence is complete. The raid that led to the arrest was not without incident had been secured quietly, so that the case is now well advanced. The accusations cover a wide range. They involve merely the bribing of officials, but the manufacture of potable drinks out of denatured alcohol and other violations of the federal law.

Such proceedings are of the kind to break the flagrant violations of the law. Prison terms are needed. The profits in the business of rum-running, bootlegging and illicit distilling are enormous. Money penalties are amply compensated by increased profits. But when a penitentiary is made the goal of the lawbreakers a decided "crimp" is put in the business.

Clamors for modification of the enforcement act are constantly heard, in the interest of a broadening of the scope of allowable penalties. Far more likely is the amendment of the law to increase the penalties for violations, with imprisonment rather than fines.

POLITICS AND CHURCHES

At the recent world conference of the Seventh Day Adventists, Prof. C. S. Longacre, is hour and with the least debate.

quoted in the news as making this remark: "I have no faith in political preachers who would substitute the policeman's club for the cross of Christ. Christ was a saviour and not a politician. He ordained ministers to preach the gospel of love and not sheriffs to execute vengeance upon evildoers. A legal legion can only beget habits of hypocrisy and engender insincerity and strife."

Professor Longacre's words are at variance with views of ministerial duties held in some quarters, and unquestionably will not find a cordial reception with those pastors who have carried their militancy into active crusades for imposing this or that theory of government on the general public.

There will always be a debate as to just where the dividing line between the strictly religious and the secular functions of a pastor should be drawn. The viewpoints of practicality and spirituality are vastly different, and temperament, genius and desire for publicity all have a part to play in determining any individual pastor's course.

Many pastors are confronted with a dwindling church attendance and attribute the loss of congregations to influences outside of the church. More and more have the churches extended the sphere of their activities, formed coalitions with other churches, until the line between denominations and congregations is growing less pronounced.

It is barely possible that therein lies the trouble. It cannot be challenged that it is man-sized job for any pastor to look after his own congregation. With concentration of efforts upon his own parishioners, he will be able to do the maximum of good. Scattered efforts are likely to weaken the influence of any minister in much the same way as the practice applies to any business or any of the professions.

TAX REDUCTIONS, WHEN?

Senators and representatives agree that taxes ought to be reduced; the public, groaning under its burden, fervently says, "Amen." There is further accord among leaders in Congress and Treasury officials that they can be reduced, but there is divergence of opinion as to when the action should be taken.

Senator Smoot, who is to be chairman of the finance committee at the coming session of Congress, says that it will be possible ultimately to reduce the taxes, notably the income taxes, to the extent of \$500,000,000. But he does not want it attempted at the approaching session. Such an attempt, on the eve of a presidential campaign, would, he says, "open a Pandora box of troubles."

Senator Borah, on the other hand, avers that Pandora's box of troubles is already open "out in the country." If, as Senator Smoot suggests, \$500,000,000 can be lopped off, it should be done, the Idaho statesman contends, as soon as possible. He urges Senator Smoot to urge his program, and do it at this session, claiming that if an active campaign is not at once conducted, Congress may drift into a program of raising the taxes inequitably.

Public sentiment at large is likely to take the view that, with the general concurrence of congressional and administrative opinion that taxes not only should but can be reduced, the action should be taken at the earliest opportunity.

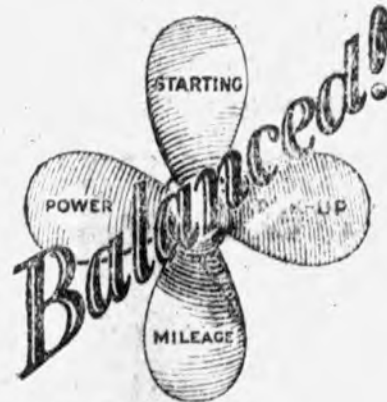

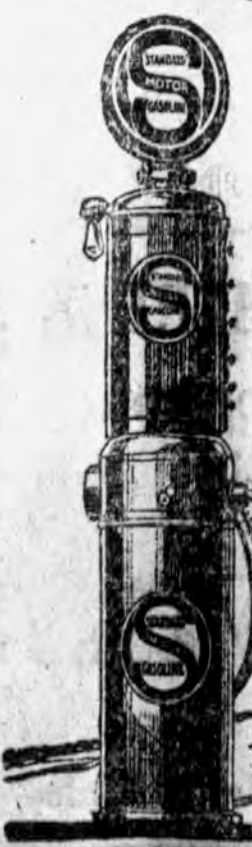

Despite Its Quiet Londoners Find the City Too Noisy

LONDON.—One of the first impressions that observant Americans coming from their own noisy, bustling cities, get of London is its serene quiet. Turn off any of the busiest highways, and in a few yards the stillness of the side-streets is soothing to the ear. One may walk blocks and blocks without hearing the sounds of a phonograph coming from any window, and the curb is almost deserted, automobiles not being so common as in America. Those that do roll down the streets give warning of their coming by old-fashioned horns, never so irritating as ear-splitting sirens. Only on a few occasions has the typewriter replaced the pen.

There is a noticeable absence of children with their noisy games. Except in the poorer quarters, they do not congregate on the sidewalks and streets. That is one of the things that isn't done.

Yet many Londoners think their capital terribly noisy. Of those who loved the easy, jazzless age before the war, some are beginning to complain of the tide of sound ever rising all around them. Stanley Rowland has just protested at length against "the crime of noise," in an article in the Nineteenth Century. Motor-horns cause him anguish, motorcycle's fret his nerves, jazz music he cannot tolerate. But the growing noises of the home fret him as much as the inevitable racket of the streets, the cafes and dance halls.

TURKISH EMBASSY IN LONDON, CLOSED SINCE 1914, TO REOPEN

LONDON.—It is expected that the Turkish embassy which has been closed since 1914 will be re-opened soon. The Embassy which is in Portland Place presents a grimy exterior for it has remained untouched all these years. A solitary caretaker has been in charge of the building and he stated today that the furniture was just as it had been left in 1914. He complained that he had been without wages for months, but he expected his little account would be satisfactorily settled.

"No, we have had no burglars. There is nothing here to steal," he concluded.

Ancient Church Celebrates.
STOCKHOLM.—Sweden's oldest and most magnificent cathedral, the edifice at Lund, has just observed the eight hundredth anniversary of its founding, with elaborate ceremonies. Delegates were present from churches in England, Germany, Norway, Denmark and Finland.

The central altar of the cathedral was consecrated in 1123.

PHILIPPINE JUDGES DIRECTED TO REPORT ON JAIL CONDITION
MANILA.—Hereafter judges of the Philippine courts will be required to make monthly inspections of the jails in their respective provinces to which they sentence convicted persons, and submit a report to the Secretary of Justice of the conditions of those jails.

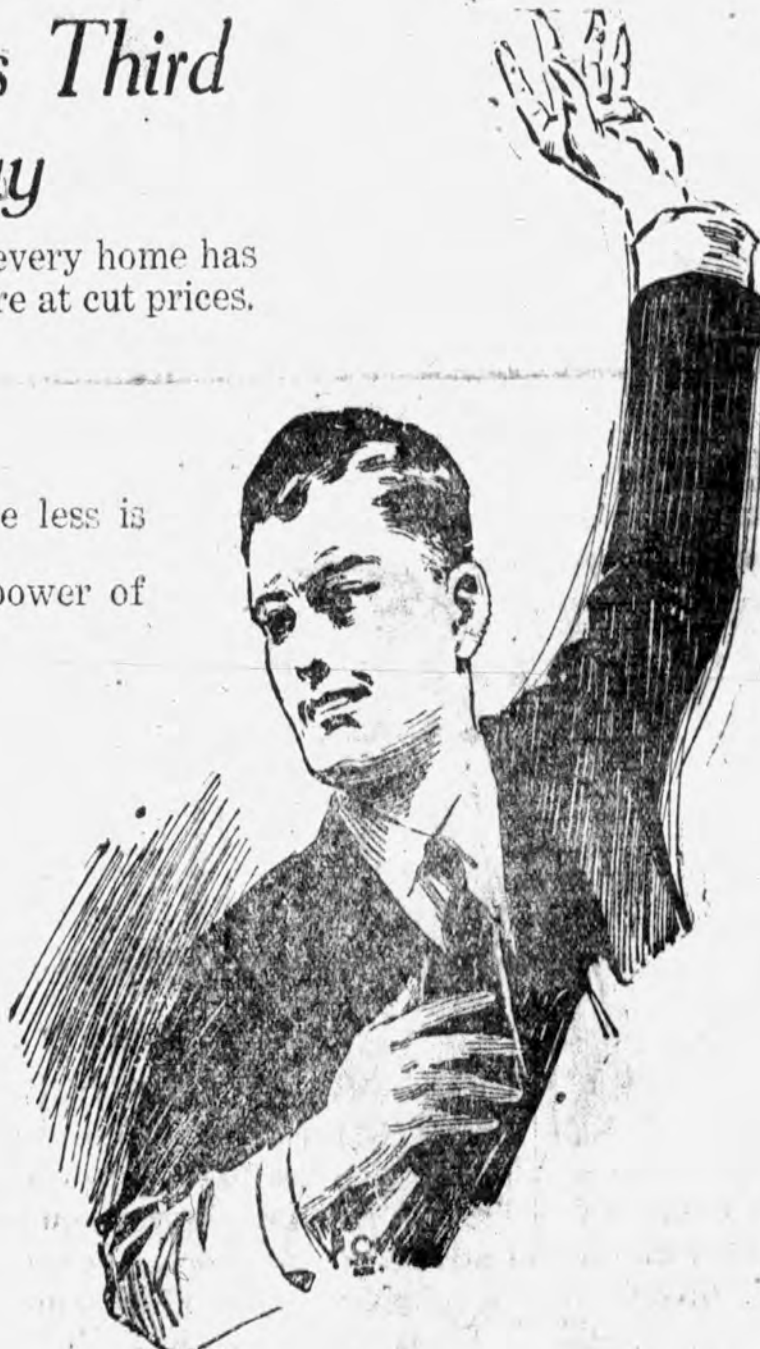

Former Carolina Teacher Tells System of Instruction Employed in Construction San Francisco

(Continued from page one)

stately palace that he now occupies; Sands is a "dusky" lad who doesn't seem to pay any attention to the fact that he is also a full negro.

Imagine one's attempting to get at pupils from a human standpoint, from the standpoint of knowing and understanding them when there are all these different nationalities, when each tenth pupil represents different customs, manners, and thoughts! And yet San Francisco seems bravely to forge ahead with this immense task. Part time school, for those that can not attend the full time and for those over sixteen and not eighteen. Evening schools for Americanization work and for adults who wish the advantages of school. Physical training. R. O. T. C., Commercial work, and every other kind of institution that seems to be demanded by this mass of people that make up the city's population—all provided.

The pupils fall into as many classes of attention and intelligence as they do into nationalities, and thus it comes about that a class of thirty becomes problematic from the standpoint of what to do with the retarded, the accelerated, and the "don't care."

This latter element is the "legally adopted child" of California's compulsory school law. This law makes it compulsory for all pupils to attend full-time school until the age of sixteen; and between the ages of sixteen and eighteen if a pupil has not finished high school, the best he can hope to do in the way of skipping school is to through the part-time school. This means that there are many pupils who are in school because they must be. And the effect upon the teacher is sometimes provocative of the most serious thinking. Every seriously-minded teacher wants his pupils to do well; here is an element that lets you want all by yourself. What's to be done? I have not found out yet.

One primal feature that runs throughout the school system—Jew, Negro, German, Chinese, Japanese, Philippine, French, Italian, American, and what-not, is the broad prevailing spirit of democracy. It is everywhere; it is among rich and poor, white, black and yellow; it is incapable; one feels it from the outset; it is glorious—yes, glorious, even when one stops to think back up above to that name Sand—Sands, a negro. Being from the south "southern" I can not truthfully say that I relish, particularly, having little Sands as my pupil; but, being from the

south in its way of appreciating big things, I do appreciate the big spirit of these westerners that says "an equal chance to all."
