EDUCATIONAL INEQUALITIES

As a nation we spend over a thousand million dollars a year to educate the twentyfour million children who are in our schools. Of that amount but a fraction over one per cent is expended to insure that they will grow to strong manhood and womanhood. According to the U. S. Bureau of Education but one-tenth of the nation's school children are receiving "anything which even pretends to be adequate physical education and health training."






