The price of good tobacco on the opening sales of the Eastern Carolina Tohacco Markets was lower than expected and while farmers in consequence are more or less disappointed and depressed, I do not bel'eve the first sales are an index to future prices. On the contrary I rather think it is a pretty good indication of much better prices when tobacco of quality as well as color comes on the market in quantity. Therefore I would encourage farmers to look forward hopefully and with confidence to profitable returns from this crop nor do I believe they will be disappointed in doing so for many good and strong reasons, chief among which is the fact that Eastern North Carolina has the best crop of tobacco that has been grown here since 1919.


