THE NAVY ON TRIAL,

It is ten years since the American Navy suffered a submarine disaster comparable with the loss of the S-51 in the sinking of the F-4 at Honolulu and the death of twenty-six gallant men. But it is not a month since the crash of the dirigible Shenandoah; not three weeks since another tragedy was barely averted by the arrival of the seaplane PN-9 No. 1 at Kauai, miles off her course and in the nick of time.

Before the official inquiries into the loss and while a definitive air policy is being sought by the Coolidge commission, the new Block Island tragedy further demands investigation. Without such disturbing issues as those raised by Col. Mitchell, there are reamanagement of our navy.




