SAYS HE STOPPED UP MANIFOLD ON THE SHENANDOAH

Aviation Chief Rigger Confesses He Stopped Up Manifold But Was Told Not to Give Information to Court

Washington, Nov. 23. (AP) Arthor E. Carlston, aviation chief rigger of the wrecked Shenandoah, told the Shenandoah Navat Court today that one of the surviving officers of the airship, Lieutenant Charles Bauch, had told him not to give certain information to the court unless it was asked for specifically.

This information which Carlston withheld when he first testified at Lake Hurst was that tifteen minutes before the Shenandoah broke up he had closed off amidships the internal gassing manifold connecting the eighteen helium gas cells in the individual

Cariston testified that he stopped up the manifold on his own initiative because helium was rushing to the after cells and the ship already was up by the stern. Asked why he had not given the court this information before, he said he "did not regard it s material to the inquiry.


