SWEDE'S FRUGALITY SHOWN BY SAVINGS BANK DEPOSITS

Stockholf, Dec. 7 .- (INS) -The well-nigh Scotch frugality of the Swedish people is attested by the fact that deposits in their savings banks now reaches the total of \$648,-000,000 or approximately \$108 for every man, woman and child in the country,—a figure as hig has any in Europe. The first tSwedish Savings Bank was opened in Gothenburg in 1820, or a little over a hundred years ago, and the following year another was started in Stockhelm. For the training of children, savings institutions are now operated in the publie schools.

It is in attracting and holding the deposits of small capitalists that the savings banks have been most successful, the average length of their deposits being over four and a half years, while in other banks it is only a little over one Year. The expense of savings bank management averages 0.48 per cent, while in the others it is 1.4. In the Postal Savings Bank, operated by the government, the deposits now amount to \$42,560,472, or an increase of \$2,-6335,681 during the current year. Each one of the county's 3,600 post offices is a savings bank.


