NUMBER ACTIVE SPINDLE HOURS

Indicates Improved Business Conditions in Cotton Mill Industry in N. Car.

Raleigh, Doc. 22 .- (AP) -Indicative of improved business conditions in the gotton mill induztry in North Carolina, and of the comparative absence of labor trou bles 'n this state, is the fact that, though North Carolina had only slightly more than half as many spinning spindles in place on November 30 as Massachusetts, she led that state in the total number of active spindle bours during November.

Figures compiled by the United States Department of Commerce, and just received here, show that on November 30, the Bay State led al others in the number of spinning spindles in place, with 11,614,824. North Carolina came second, the figure for this state

being 6,937,396. But North Carolina led Marav chusetts in the active spindle hours for November by nearly 100,000,000 hour. The figure for this state was 1,624,171,089 hours, while that for Massachue etts was 1,566,991,884. South Carolina, third in the list of state in the total number of spindler in place, also led Mas chusetts in the number of active spindle hours.


