

PERILOUS ROADS

As one of the first steps towards preventing motor mishans, the Pennsylvania rage deed executed on the 10th gathering information concerning mishaps that have occurred during the past year on the roads under its jurisdiction.

One of the interesting revelations is that the majority! of the mishaps have taker place on highway sections where conditions were idea for motoring. Most of them occurred on straight stretches of road, and about threefourths on dry roads. The explanation for this may be that far more mctorists drive on straight dry roads than on wet or tortuous ones.

It is obvious that there is more of a temptation to take risks where the conditions seem favorable than where they are patently unfavorable. With a long straigh' stretch of dry road before him, the driver will fee' more inclination to exceed the maximum than if he has curves and slippery places.

The figures then go to show that accidents are due for the most part, not to the condition of the road, but to the carelessness or incompetence of the driver or defects in the machine.

One of the striking things shown in the department's report is the high mortality rate in pedestrians struck by automobiles. Of 111 pedestrians who figured in motor mishaps on the state highways, 36 were killed and 65 injured, while of the occupants of automobiles in the casualty list 116 were killed and 1,400 injured.

It is a gloomy record and emphasizes once more the necessity of taking steps to make the highways safe.

HIGH COST OF BOOKS

A chronic complain among book readers in this country is that book prices are too high for the average purse. When the literat scold the American public for its indifference to good literature, the usual retort is that its cost is prohibitive to all except the wealthy.

There is some foundation to this complaint against the high cost of reading. Popular novels cost on the average \$2 and many are higher. Biographical and autobiographical works, of which the past five years have produced many worthy ones, range in price from \$5 for single volumes to \$10 and even \$25 when published in two or more volumes. The average price for other

KANSAS, IMPORTS MEXICAN QUAIL AS FARM LABOR

Topeka, Kan., Feb. 2 - (AP)-Kansas ha sfound a way to import labor without running afoul of the immigration authorities.

The state has just imported 5,-000 quail from Mexico to nolp out the Kansas farmers. They are expected to eat up 125,000 insects during next summer, and, with their brood of young "bobby whites" to destroy at least a quarter of a billion weed seeds by untumn.

The Mexican quall is slightly smaller than the native bob white of Kansas, but the state game warden is assured that the two will interbreed. He estimates conservatively that the purchase of 5,000 birds will bring Kansas 25,600 young quail next summer.


