# **URGE INCREASE** SCHOOL TERM TO

### Also Recommends That General Assembly '27 Be Asked Provide Funds Erection Of Five Normal Schools In State.

Raleigh, March 19,-After : morning spent in the discussion of specific and technical problems of the teaching profession in group meetings, the North Carolina Educational Association in its 42d annual session here convened at 2:20 o'clock for what was expected to be one of the most important meetings.

At the afternoon session the report of one of the important committees of the organizationthe legislative committee- was expected to be made. This report was to be definitely launched to fight on the part of the teachers for the proposed statewide minimum eight months school term.

The North Carolina general assembly of 1927 will be asked to call an election on a constitutional amd dment to increase the minimum school terms in North Carolina from six to eight months, if the recommendations association are followed.

The committee, whose report was made today to the association in session here, also recommends that the next general assembly be asked to provide the funds for the erection of at least five more normal schools in North Carolina, to provide means of securing more trained teachers for
