Bill for State Referendum on Prohibition Modification in the Hands of Governor Smith

Albany, N. Y., April 20 .- (AP)-A bill for a state referendum on prohibition modification passed by the legislature was in the friendly hands of Governor Smith today. Prohibitionists threatened to refrain from voting on the matter if the governor signs the bill.

The Assembly last night passed the bill 87 to 62. It was persed by the Senate last week and becomes law if signed by the governor. Governor Smith is known to favor referendum although he refrained from commenting on the bill while it was before the legislature. Just before its passage the Rev. answer arguments that the R. O. 


