

FEWER FARM DWELLERS

A continued decrease in farm population in the United States is reported by the Deartment of Agriculture, which estimates that therd were 479,000 fewer people on farms January ! this year than on January 1 a year ago.

The department estimates the farm population at 30,-665,000 on January 1, 1926, compared with 31.134,000 on January 1, 1925, a decrease of 1.5 per cent. These figures include all men, women and children living on




