Mexico City, May 1.—(INS)—Loreta Rodriguez, a blind beggar long a character, left several hundred thousand pesos when she died in a hospital, only to have it stolen. Her neighbors, living in the same squalor, searched her home but before they notified the police. They found numerous earthenware jars filled with gold coins patiently accumulated through half a century. The police have recovered some of the gold, but since the old woman left no heirs, they do not know what to do with it and are inclined to abandon search for the remainder known to be missing.

The case so alarmed another beggar, Manuel Lopez, that he has appealed to the police to protect his savings until he can make arrangements to put them in a bank, a situation most distasteful to a native, since any banker will estimate that there is much more gold hidden in Mexican homes than there is in the banks.

Alberto Covarrubias, dubbed Dean of the Dips, has just faced the police court for the one-thousandth time and has been sentenced to serve the remainder of his days on the Isla Marias. His offenses have always been for petty larceny and he escaped with light sentences. In recent years he has become the toast and boast of the criminal element and the judge decided to put him away for keeps. He will be one of a large party of criminals to go to the islands with the next monthly consignment.

A million pesos has been set aside by the National Bank of Mexico for the establishment of a series of bonded warehouses throughout the republic. They are to be administered by a subsidiary company. The warehouses will be

used for the benefit of the farmer and money advanced on products put in storage.

The government hopes to find in the states of Nuevo Leon, Tamaulipas and Coahuila oil deposits rivaling those of the celebrated Panuco fields in Tampico. Following the discovery of numerous evidences of the existence of gas and petroleum a party of scientists has gone into the three states to make a thorough survey. If petroleum is found concessions will be granted to foreigners in the hope of being able to stem the exodus from the Tampico fields for those of Venezuela.

The Department of Agriculture has discovered a means of abating the devastating dust storms that sweep over the Valley of Mexico during the dry season. The storms originate in the old lake bed of Texcoco filled with alkaline dust. After years of experimenting vegetation has been found that will grow there.

Radio receiving sets for public schools are being built by the Department of Education and before the end of the year there will be one in every public school in the republic. Sets are of various types running up to four tubes.

As soon as installed daily programs of half an hour will be broadcast from the department here.

CABLE LETTER

London, May 1.—(AP)—The American railroad "cow catcher" has been introduced in London streets in the form of a safety first apparatus on automobiles. The "cow catcher" as used here is attached to the front wheels of motor cars, the idea being that the unwary pedestrian will be tossed to one side rather than run over. The device has attracted much attention, as its like has never been seen here before. English locomotives like those on the continent are cow catchers, having straight fronts and to Americans appear as if not com-

pleted. The invention came out just after the announcement was made by Sir William Johnson-Hicks, home secretary, that more than ten persons were killed on the roads of England every day last year.

Tobacco pipes used by the noted in England, had just as much interest for Englishmen as the "Daves pipe" used by the American vice-president holds for Americans. Recently one of the bribes of Stanley Baldwin, prime minister, brought \$15 at a charity bazaar auction.

Since then many members of the government and other of note have been besieged with requests for their discarded pipes. Lord Eustace Percy, minister of education, as a rule smokes a corn cob, bearing the label "made in Missouri" with a clay pipe for a change, but when pressed to part with these for charity, he declined, giving instead a little used Meerschaum which sold for 10 pounds.

New York will have an epidemic of Noel Coward plays if that young British playwright executes all the contracts he brought back with him from America to supply plays to the American managers. He also has signed contracts to supply fifteen plays to British managers since his return from New York.

Paris, May 1.—(AP)—French people are complaining that their country is getting to be too much of a "melting pot." They feel that they are being overrun by foreigners, not those who come as tourists, but those who come to settle.

As an example of the part this foreign element plays in general labor is given by the personnel of a cafe-restaurant, where the proprietor is the only representative of France. The cashier is a woman Turk, the two waiters are Spanish, the dish washer is Hungarian and cloakroom woman, an American. The orchestra is composed of a violinist who is a Belgian, an English pianist, a Polish saxophoneist and a Martinique native for jazz effects. This restaurant is in a seaport of Brittany, where foreigners are most likely to be found but there are many foreigners in other cities, also.

Although it has always been so, but never openly admitted, it is becoming a recognized thing that tourists pay more than the natives in France. A French woman, married to an Englishman, stopping off at Avignon on the way to the Riviera, was given a room at a hotel marked sixty francs. When it was known that she was French and lived in France the price was lowered to 45 francs, the manager explained that the hotel wished to cultivate native clients who might return or send their friends whereas the foreign tourist was not likely to pay a second visit to the town.

Summer vacations in France will be more expensive for tourists this year with a new 10 per cent increase in all railroad fares going into effect probably early in May. The new rates will make journeys more than three times as costly as they were in July 1914.

The 10 per cent increases now being prepared by the minister of public works, added to those put in force the first of the year, make a total of 25 per cent, since January 1. The new first class rates work out at virtually 2 cents per mile.

Berlin, May 1.—(AP)—Convinced after a business trip to the United States that American tourists ought not to be hampered in the pursuit of pleasure, Buromeister Scharnal, of Munich, is advocating a modification of the police ordinance under which cafes and cabarets are now closed at 1 A. M.

Though warring against propaganda which would have Munich famous for nothing but its powerful Bavarian beer, Mayor Scharnal said Americans want a good time within reasonable bounds and he is going to see that they get it. Munich, in the

states, has a reputation for art, scholarship, beauty and hospitality, he said, but he feels that after browsing around museums and art galleries all day Americans want to frolic at night.

A summer session for foreign students modeled after summer schools in American colleges and universities will start at the University of Berlin, July 15. The courses include political economy, sociology, art, civilization, German language, literature and social and political history. Among the lecturers will be Professor Alois Brandt, noted Shakespeare authority of the University of Berlin. The courses will run for six weeks to August 25.

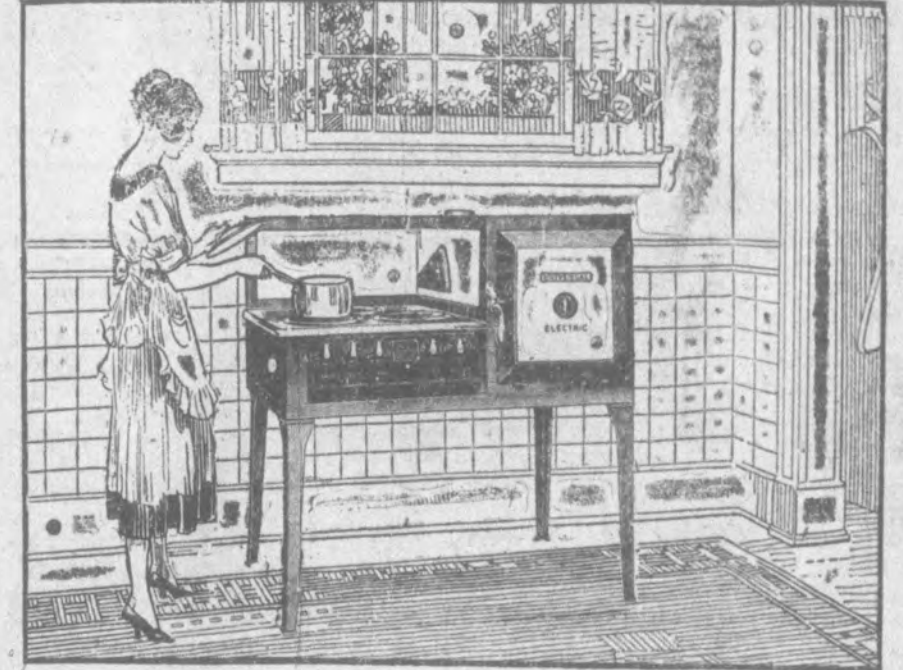
