



But perhaps the hardest lump to swallow is the matter of checks and money. Unless Madame has a profession of her own, she can have no bank account in her own name. All her funds remain under the thumb of her husband and unless she has taken particular care in making out a marriage contract, she is likely to see her dowery spent as her husband pleases.

According to the law of July 13, 1907, a married woman exercising any profession has the right to place her money in a bank and draw it out at will, but in reality, almost no establishment will open an account for a woman without the written authority from her husband, and this on legal paper Deaths By Alcohol drawn up by a notary.
