

Because the engines of the ship are the only ones remaining of the early steam navy of the United States, much interest is expected to be aroused when she is exhibited in the future at E.ie. The first steam engine built to the Navy was designed and built by Robert Fulton in 1815 and the ship in which they were installed was destroyed in a magazine explosion in the Brooklyn Navy Yard in 1829. The Fulton II was captured by Confederates in the Civil War and destroyed and steam engines built in 1842 for the naval ships Missouri and Mississippi olso lost in fire and battle.
