MOORE'S GILEK **CELEBRATION BE** HELD TOMORROW

Thousands Will Attend Celebration of 50th Anniversary of Revolutionary Bat-

Moore's Creek, Pender County N. C., Aug. 23 .- (AP) -- With appropriate ceremonies, a 30 acre tract of land here will tomorrow b: transferred from the State to the Federal government, the ceremony being the celebration of the sesqui-c ntennial of the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge. Assistant Secretary of War, Hanford MacNider, will accept the land which will be converted into a national park.
