This condition, we say, makes the opening of the college a sad sight when we stop to realize that more young women have failed to gain admission than have been admitted because of the line ited facilities of the college.

The first of December last year the college enrollment for the present term! was filled and since that time more than 900 applications for admission have been refused.

Were it possible for us to have here tomorrow all the State Legislators, all the young women who have fail ed to gain admission into the colleges of the state this year, and all the children who must necessarily suffer the consequences of untrained teachers, the relaization of just how badly en larged facilities of the college are needed would be brought home to the lawmakers and when the college asks for additional funds at the coming General, Assembly these men would gladly appropriate necessary amounts to provide greater educational facilities. Without trained teach ers the children of the state cannot receive the education to which they are entitled and without facilities for taking care of more students the college cannot train the hundreds of young women who want to devote their lives to the teaching profession.






