STATE GEOLOGISTS SAYS PROSPECTS FOR OIL HERE

Says Oil Indications On Westbrook Property Here Best He Has Seen Outside Of Proven Field.

Surface indications of oil here are the best that have ever been seen outside of a proven field, according to H. J. Bryen, State Geologist, who arrived in this city late yesterday from Raleigh and ioday made investigations on the Westbrook property where preparations for drilling for oil are now in progress,

A charter to the Westbrook Drill ing Company was granted by Secretary of State W. N. Everett yes terday and contracts for the drilling will be let on Saturday, according to announcement here to-

Since the first discovery of the 611 and gas seepage following an accidental discharge of dynamite on the property about three months. ago, the presence of oll has become more and more prevalent and four experts who have visited the Fpot have expressed belief that oil in commercial quantities would be

As soon as the contracts are let Saturday the machinery will be moved to this city immediately and work on the actual drilling will be gin. The contract is being let for a first completed section of 1-750 feet and then in 500 foot sections until a depth of 3,750 feet has been reached if it is necessary to go that depth. The contract calls for the completion of the first 1,750 feet within forty-five; days from the letting which means that no time will be lost in getting equipment on the ground and getting the drilling under way.

The owners of the property and those in close touch with the project are becoming more and more enthusiastic over the prospects as favorable reports from hie different experts have been received and the visit of Mr. Bryson here today much to strengthen belief that oil will soon flow from beneath the earth here.

Paris, Dec. 2, (INS)-When ne name is reached on the roll call at the weekly parade of the 1 rst Batallion of France, the following nation regularly is made: "Lance-Corporal the Prince of Wales absent with leave at the court of His Majesty the King of

The Prince was made an "anspessade" or lance-corporal when he visited the French military school at Saint-Cyr on October 29th last. This rank exists only in the Saint-Cyr Battalion and only two other persons have been granted it since the cadet school was founded by Napoleon. POST AS GOVERNOR OF THE PHILIPPINES

His Retirement Has Been Definitely Decided Upon By The Coolidge Administra

(c) International News Service Washington. Dec. 2 -The turbu. lent days of Leonard Wood as Governor General of the Philippines are numbered.

His retirement has been definitely decided upon by the Coolidge administration, it was learned today and consideration is now being given the selection of a successor.

Three names are being considered ! Senator James W. Wadsworth of New York, recently defeated for re-election; Col. Carmi Thompson of Ohio ,who has just completed a survey of the Islands for President Coolidge; Col, Henry L. Stimson of New York, Secretary of War in the Taft administration.

Other names have been suggested but it is this trio that are receiving major consideration. All are veterans of the Spanish-American War. All have a more or less intimate knowledge of Philippine affairs, and all are 'available' in that they are generally acceptable to party leaders and are now politically at liberty.

Col. Thompson's report on his three months' investigation of affairs in the Islands will be laid on President Coolidge's desk shortly. if it is not already in his hands, It is understood to make three prime recommendations;

1. Appointment of a civil rathor than a military governor.

2. Removal of the islands from control of the War Department to a civil department, such as the Department of the Interior.

3. Revision of some of the native laws, particularly one which limits any corporation from holding more than 2,500 acres of land.

The first two are designed to remove some of the friction between the Filipino leaders and the American agministration of the islands, due to the severity of some


