Jury Returns Verdict of "Not Guilty" Against Former Secretary and Oil Mag-

Washington, Dec. 16-INS-Albert Fall and E. L. Doheny today were aquitted of conspiricy to defraud the Government in the leashing of Nav'l Oil Reser-

The verdict was rendered by a youthful jury that for more than three weeks sat in the district supreme court and witnessed one of the keenest legal battles in American court annals.

The Government thus lost the first of its criminal cases against those charged with being the central figures and conspirator, in the "Oil Scandals" of the Harding Administration.

The verdict was prought in as coon as court opened at 10 o'-clock this morning—twenty hours after the case was given into its hands at 2:48 P. M. yesterday. ... As soon as Justice A. A. Hoeh-
