Washington, Dec. 23,-(IINS)ncome tax collections for Decem_ per were estimated today by Sectary of the Treasury Mellon at \$435,000,000 as compared to \$355,-62,000 last December.

Collections to December 21, nounted to \$405,000,000, about 770,000,000 more than for the ame period last year.

Since July 1, the Government has collected \$1,009,000,000 in income and profits taxes, \$305,527,-00 from customs receipts, with a total collection from all sources of \$1,956.666,000. Receipts were \$110,000,000 greater than last year, while ordinary expenses were about \$90,000,000 less
