

#### NEW KIND OF STEEL TESTED IN GERMANY

Jan. 26.—(INS)lests have just been completed at he Bureau of Standards. Department of Commerce of specimens of structuarl steel being introduced n Germany which is arousing onsiderable interest among Ger an engineers.

The tests disclose a yield point igher than that of ordinary strucural steel, somewhat higher than hat of high carbon steel and nearly equal to that of the usual strucural nickel steel. The ducility nd toughness are said to be as od as in nickel steel and markedly better than in high carbon, though not os high as in ordinary tructural steel.

The combination of point and ductility is obtained by using a low carbon and high silicon content. The German process is declared not to be now, however,




