Supreme Court Finds Contracts Tainted With Fraud and Fall Policy Illegal

Wsahington, Feb. 28.—(AP)— Edward L. Doheny must give up the naval oil leases and contracts awarded him when Albert B. Fall

was secretary of the interior. Nor will he receive back the money he spent in attempting to carry the agreements into effect. In an opinion amounting to a complete victory for the govern-

ment, the Supreme Court held today that the agreements not only were tainted by fraud, but that the Fall leasing policy under which they were made was illegal. It was under this same policy that the Teapot Dome lease was given to Harry F. Sinclair, although

the suit to cancel the lease was not directly involved in today's finding. The opinion of the court was an nounced by Justice Bultre, and there was no dissent. 




