IS THERE NO END?

With drive after drive for one cause or another together with the independent individual begging in our city it is time our citizens were beginning to wonder for what purpose the funds solicited in the name of charity are being used and better than wondering it is high time for the city to adopt a community chest or some other orderly plan of giving to charity in order that the public may know that money given for charity goes to charity. While we recognize that to give to charity is one of man's noblest deeds, and it is not our desire to convey the idea that we are in the least opposed to it, we do feel that the public is being imposed upon by organized solicitors whose livelihood is derived from funds asked in the name of charity as the never-do-well and unscrupulous individual who tells the various business establishments with his or her hard luck story as a means of separating people from their cash. As an example of the extent of the begging now going on here, some of the local business men on last Saturday were solicited five different times and on each occasion for a different cause. Probably there was a certain amount of merit in each of the cases, but the public is not in position to know the extent of the worthiness of the causes and is placed in the position of being an easy prey to beggars or a tightwad, the latter sometimes drawing insulting remarks from the disappointed solicitor.

Upon investigation last year it was found that many of the alleged organizations or which funds were solicited here did not even exist, and had never existed so far as could be learned. Others were found to be worthy. It was found, however, that the unworthy had received much from the public as the worthy, which means that those who really need and deserved the aid of the public were robbed of a portion of what they would have received had the unworthy solicitors been prohibited from carrying on their business of thievery. There is a right way and a wrong way to do everything, including giving to charity, and it is time the citizens of Greenville adopted the right method in the matter. Let's get together on an organized plan of giving. The community chest plan in other cities of this and other states has proved the best way to handle the situation. A committee of good citizens with a sense of business judgment to study the needs of the various organizations, to drive for the funds necessary to carry on the work of the year, then no more begging all year. That in

brief, is the community chest idea and only in a few rare instances has any city ever gone back to the haphazard method in practice here, once it has adopted this systematic plan of taking care of its charities.

If Greenville ever needed a businesslike method of taking care of its charities and getting rid of the unscrupulous beggars, it needs it now. Why not get behind a community chest movement and put it over.
