The Massachusetts Senator declared he was not willing to let money matters stand in the way of the campaign funds investigation, which he described as involving "the principle of honest government."
"I demand adjournment at 12 o'clock," he shouted, "and that the President call a special session and go to work with a clean conscience."
A majority for Senate action on the committee report was on the second class, third class and parcel post matters next was blocked by Senator McKellar, Democrat, Tenn., who had refused to sign the conference report.
During another temporary break in the blockade, the Senate put through the longshoremen's compensation act already passed by the House.

All things are subject to time, even the flow of hot air in Congress. Noon today brought an end to the sixty-ninth Congress of the United States.

Despite the fact that we have been referred to as a "Nation on Wheels" the majority of North Carolina has surely been a people on foot since the heavy snows swept the state Tuesday night and Wednesday.

Not prepared to cope with such blizzards as hit this section this week, Greenville, like other places of the state, was at a standstill from the standpoint of industry and movement of traffic Wednesday and yesterday. While there is yet much work to be done before the streets are absolutely cleared and normal traffic resumed, the city authorities are to be congratulated for their efforts at clearing the streets. The use of tractors and road scrapers over the main thoroughfares of the city has made it possible for people who must get out to do so.

DAUGHERTY'S RECORD
Twice the case of Harry M. Daugherty, former Attorney General, charged with conspiracy, has been before a jury in the past five months, and twice has the jury failed to agree on a verdict. The last jury to hear the case today returned a verdict of guilty against Thomas W. Miller, former Alien Property Custodian, but no agreement as to Daugherty. Following the verdict government counsel asked that the charge against Daugherty be not pressed, which means that so far as the law is concerned, Daugherty is now free.
In both trials, evidence has shown that a portion of the bribe money paid for allowing a claim of \$7,000,000 in connection with return of German property, went to Daugherty's personal bank account, but even with this evidence there have been some on the juries who could not convince themselves that he was guilty of any wrong doing. Despite the action of these juries, Daugherty is not acquitted, insofar as the majority of right thinking citizens of the United States are concerned and his acts will ever be a dark blot upon his own record and that of the administration of which he was a part.

STOCK MARKET

New York, March 4.—(AP)—Stock prices displayed a strong undertone at the opening of today's market. New record high prices were established by commercial solvents B and General Railway Signal. General Motors, United States Industrial Alcohol, Hudson Motors and General Asphalt registered initial gains of a point or more.

Foreign exchanges opened firm, sterling quoted at around \$4.84 3/4 and French francs just above 3.90 cents.

COTTON

New York, March 4.—(AP)—The cotton market opened steady today at a decline of 3 to 5 points under southern selling and local selling inspired by the easier showing of Liverpool and reports of less active demand for cotton cloths in Manchester.

The early decline extended to 14.32 for May, and 14.65 for October making net losses of about 8 to 13 points, but there was a little more trade buying and the market worked up a few points at midday most months showing recoveries of 3 to 4 points.

route, Lake Tahoe line. You will pass the Humboldt mountains, named in honor of a great scientist, and you can, if you choose to stop, visit geysers, strange caves, and become acquainted with Indians as wild as any we have left. You will cross the old bed of Lake Vonneyville, in Utah, and see high on the hills marks of an ancient inland sea that has disappeared. Also you may inspect on Antelope Island, Salt Lake, the largest herd of buffaloes remaining in the United States. And on certain days, if you are willing to pay and are that kind of a person, you can have the pleasure of shooting one of the buffaloes. Any buffalo would despise himself if he thought of doing such a thing to you. But that's another story.

Above all, you use in this high western land a most majestic revelation of the power that created this earth, for, insignificant humane creatures. Great snow-covered hills and mountains roll away to the horizon's edge above a blue sky, so high and wide that it makes the biggest mountain seem like ant hills. Visit this country and you will say with unhappy joy, "What is man, that thou shouldst magnify him? And that thou shouldst set thine heart upon him?"
