Egyptians Sell Fake Mummies To Tourists

Cairo, Egypt, May 16.—(AP)—The American brick and Brooklyn Bridge salesmen have a match in the Egyptian souvenir vendors, the local police report.

According to complaints received by the police, the mummies of humble Egyptian slaves have been decked out in regal trappings and sold to glib tourists as authentic mummies of Pharaohs and Tutankhamens.

The sums paid for faked mummies, it is reported, have in some cases run into thousands of dollars.

To the natives the jest is a merry one. For mummies in Egypt are as plentiful as potatoes in Ireland.

It is therefore a simple and a profitable matter for a nimble swindler to dig up the mummy of some forgotten slave, transport it to his workshop and deck it out with a few gilded scarabs, inscription and amulets.

Sometimes, to make the deception more convincing, the re-decorated mummy is swathed in chemically stained linen, carefully buried again and exhumed in the presence of the prospective purchaser.

There has been a brisk trade in the renovated mummies. And the profits were large. Sometimes as much as a thousand dollars was obtained for a mummy which had cost about \$20 to fake.

Winston-Salem, May 17.—(AP)—Frank A. Linney, U. S. District Attorney for the middle North Carolina district will move his office to Winston-Salem from Greensboro within the next few days.

McNider Wants to See Investigation of Inland Waterway

Raleigh, May 16.—Acting Secretary of War Hanford McNider today notified Governor McLean that he hoped investigation to looking to development of the Albemarle Inland waterway to be completed within a reasonable length of time.

The Governor recently wrote President Coolidge that it was his understanding that all of the shipping interests on the Atlantic Coast that use the Albemarle and Chesapeake Canal were unanimous in request that locks be again installed there.

The government purchased the canal, forming an integral part of the inland waterway several years ago and took the guard lock out more or less as an experiment but absence of this lock, Governor McLean said, has caused the salt waters of Chesapeake Bay to come down in great volume into the Currituck Sound, N. C., fresh water.

Currituck Sound, the foremost hunting section of America, is losing its fine grasses and celeries, the fresh water fishing industry damaged, a swift current runs through all the time, the annual damage to the State is about \$300,000, Mr. McLean said.

The acting secretary of war, having charge over improvement of the canal, was sought out by Mr. Coolidge and reported to Mr. McLean that replacement of the lock with dimensions adequate for present navigation will be an expensive proposition, involving probably some half million dollars, so that before authorizing the expenditure, the War Department was investigating to determine if installation of the lock would correct salinity conditions.

Hold Playwright In Connection With Fatal Shooting

Willimantic, Conn., May 17.—(AP)—State police have been ordered under no circumstances to let Leonard Cline, playwright and novelist, whose friend, Wilfred Irwin of New York city, died last night from a wound received at Cline's Mansfield farm yesterday out of their sight.

Cline today was recovering from a blood transfusion, performed in an attempt to save Irwin's life, for which he gave a pint of blood.

No formal charge has been placed against him pending a coroner's hearing to be held later in the day. An autopsy showed that the wound that resulted in Irwin's death had been caused by a choke bore shotgun, between sixty and eighty slugs lodging in the right side. Cline said the shooting was accidental, and Irwin shortly after the shooting said it was accidental.
