

Director of Child Welfare of State Makes Reports of Activi-

Raleigh, Aug. 19. (AP) Visits to nore than thirty homes where mothers' aid grants are being administered in eight counties in the extreme western part of North Carolina showed that the theory of mothers' pensions as a constructive child welfare measure is making good by very definite results, according to Miss Lily E. Mitchell, di-rector of child welfare for the State Board of Charities and Public Welfare, who has just returned from a visit to Cherokee, Madison, Gra-ham, Clay, Swain, McDowell, Macon and Buncombe counties.

Miss Mitchell visited every active mothers' aid case in the eight counties and found that almost all of the children in the families had been promoted in school, that special health problems were being attended to and many special measure were being taken in order to help the mothers to care adequately for their children. The women who are granted aid are those who are deprived of their husband's support and are qualified in every way to give their children the best of care poverty being alle only drawback

Good weather helped matters to getting to the families in the most distant and inaccessible parts of the counties, although Miss Mitchell had to walk six miles to reach one
