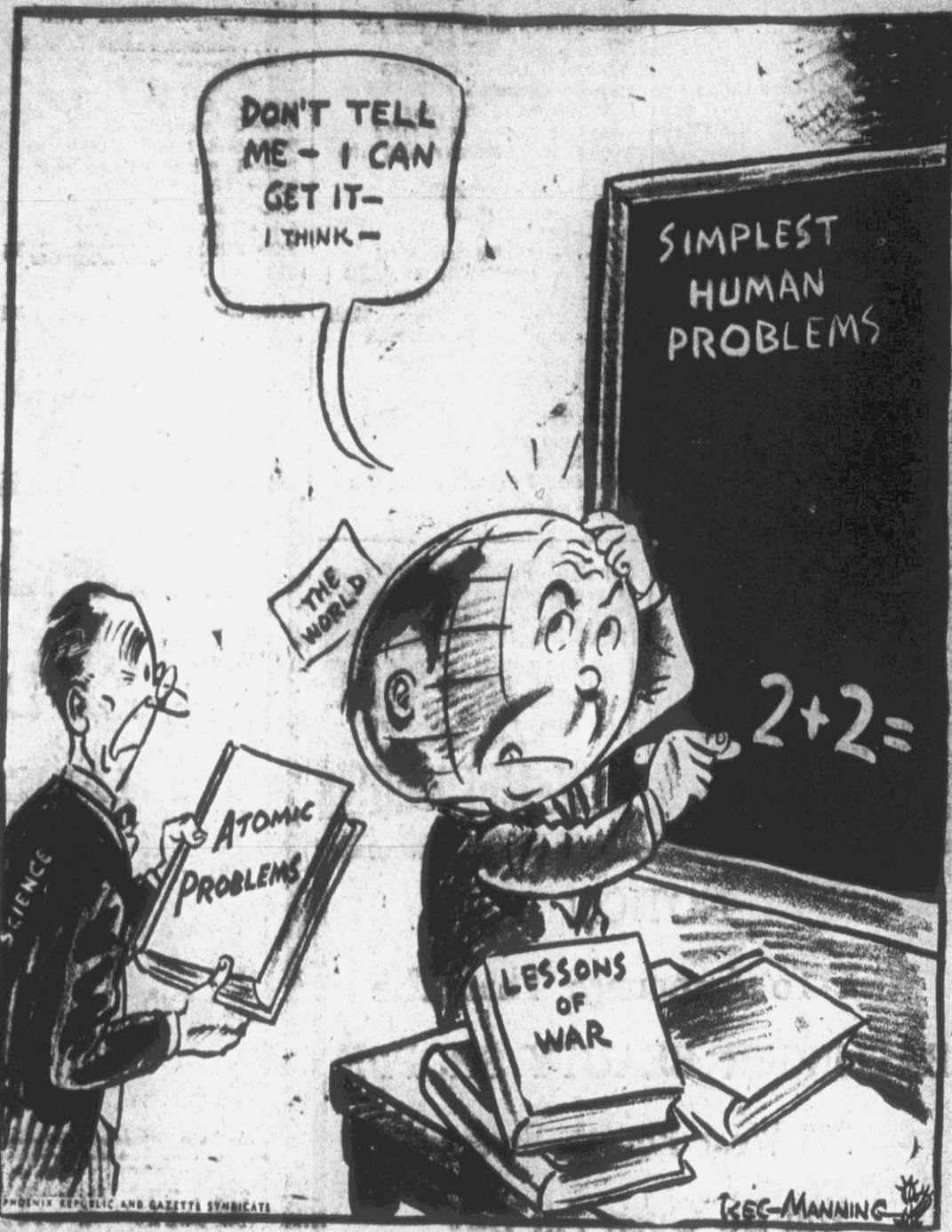

The record was set by a single ship built by the Rheem Manufacturing Co. at Providence, R. I. The company spent \$6,988,790 on it, and the commission had to chip in \$772,444 more to finish the job.

The North Carolina Shipbuilding Co. at Wilmington, N. C., built 126 liberty ships at an average cost of \$651,793 to the builder. The price to the commission, which furnished some materials, averaged \$1,508,906.

McNarney acknowledged that "we are thinking of alternate plans" although the official American policy still is to seek implementation of the Potsdam agreement to treat Germany as one economic unit. One of these alternate plans, he acknowledged is that Germany might remain divided approximately along the lines of the present four occupation zones.

Fayetteville Hit By Violent Wind Storm

Fayetteville, May 21.—(AP)—City crews cleared away today the debris left by a violent 15-minute storm yesterday afternoon which disrupted power and telephone service for several hours.

A score or more trees were uprooted, including the giant Flora MacDonald oak, under which the Scottish heroine, was supposed to have reviewed Tory troops before they marched off for the battle of Moore's Creek early in the American Revolution. The wind was accompanied by rain, hail and lightning.

U. S. Troops Raid Smuggling Fleet

18—U S TROOPS wailed Vilshofen, Germany, May 21.—(AP)—Four thousand American troops, striking by surprise at dawn today, raided a Hungarian river fleet suspected of smuggling SS fugitives, ammunition and black market supplies along the Danube river in Southeastern Germany.

Nearly 400 boats, including many former units of the Hungarian navy, were boarded and searched by heavily armed U. S. constabulary troops.

Hundreds of the boats' occupants were removed for investigation by U. S. army counter-intelligence agents. The report said that many machineguns and other weapons, radio transmitters and receivers, quantities of U. S. army food, clothing and other contraband were found. No resistance was encountered. The only shots fired were by American troops at three German river patrol boats cooperating in the raid, which were improperly marked and slow in heeding commands.

Marine Ace Sues Former Friend

San Diego, Calif., May 21.—(AP)—Sheriff's deputies today hunted Mrs. Lucille (Lucy) Rogers Malcolmson on complaint of Lt. Col. Gregory (Pappy) Boyington.

Early this year Mrs. Malcolmson charged the famous marine flier with jilting her. His complaint on which she is being sought today charges her with grand theft of more than \$9,000 he turned over to her to care for his three children by a former marriage.

Her attorney would not disclose her address, but said she was in the Reno vicinity. Mrs. Malcolmson had gone there to establish residence for a divorce. Attorney Joseph P. Haller said he "imagined" his client would submit to service of a warrant for her arrest after he made an effort to have her bail reduced.

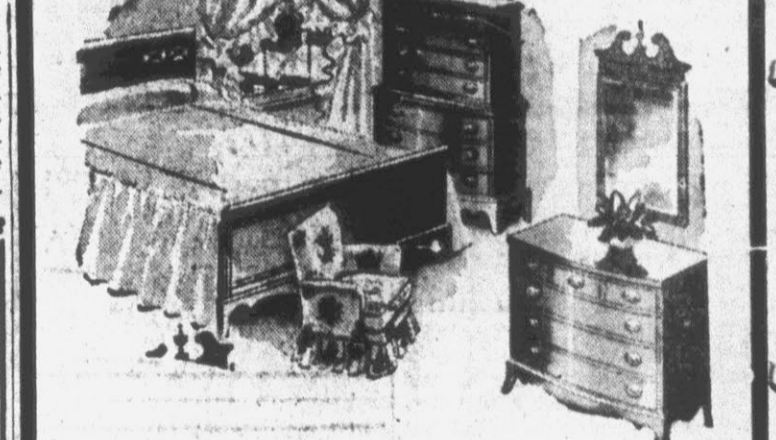
