

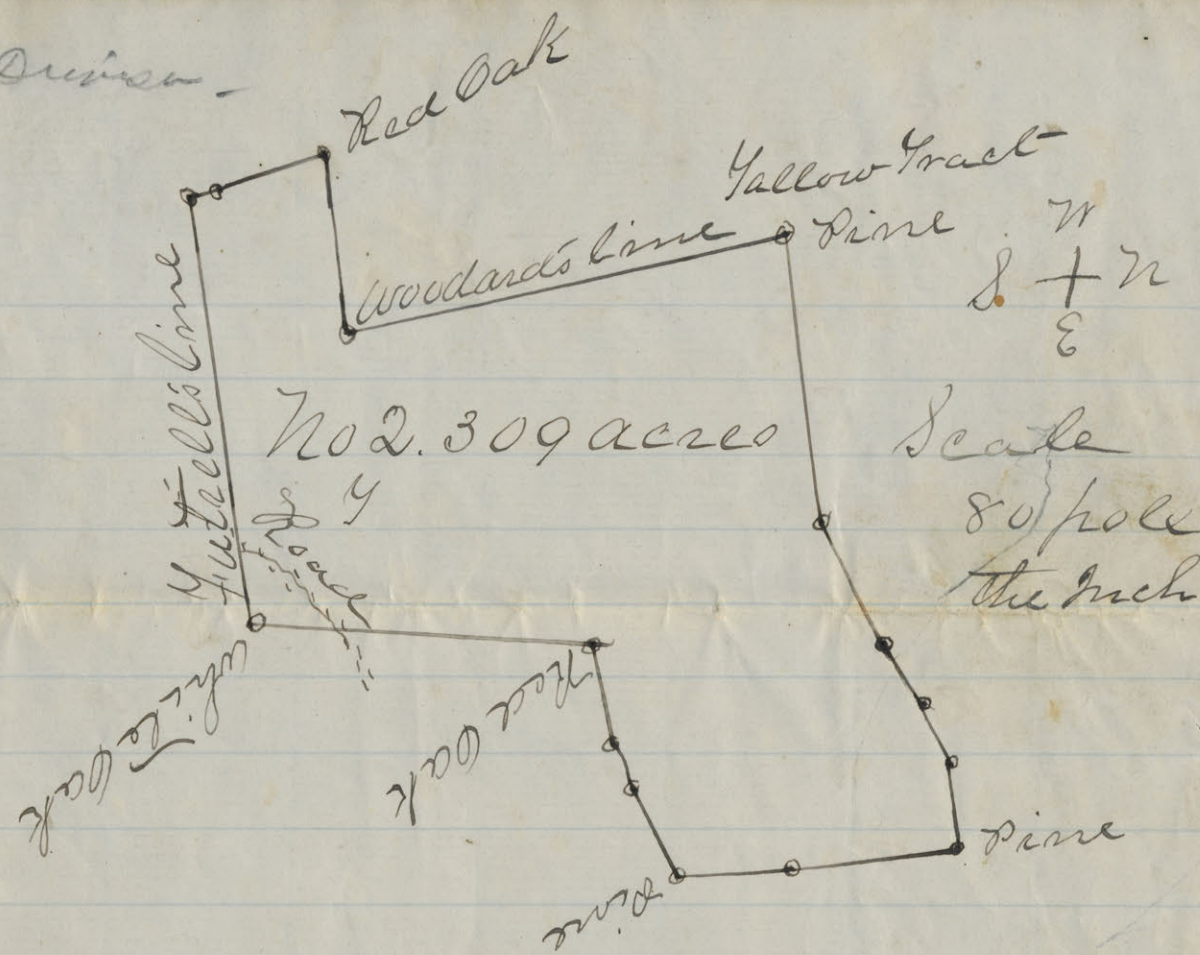

The above plat represents a tract of three hundred & nine acres of Land known as the Gallow place appropriated to William W Powell (No 2) beginning at a corner red oak in Woodlands line running thence the Futrells line S 24 E 24 poles S 5 1/2 E 13 poles to a corner blank this the Futrell line & by his course N 80 E 180 to a corner white oak stump then Beals line N 18 W 38 poles to the road then N 2 E 108 poles to Beals corner Red Oak then N 75 E 42 poles N 60 1/2 E 62 poles to Beals corner thence N 9 W 46 pole N 13 W 72 poles to a corner pine then S 8 1/2 W 34 poles S 57 W 113 pole S 75 1/2 W 72 poles S 80 W 48 poles to Woodlands corner pine

then Woodard's line S $77\frac{1}{2}$ East - 184 poles
to a corner, then S $76\frac{1}{2}$ W 77 poles to the
first station.
