Battled and Bounded as follows Beginning on the west side of the  
Deeprun Swamp at a Cypress <sup>on the road</sup> running thence down the Swamp  
to a Cypress <sup>at the head of the swamp</sup> thence nearly a Southwest <sup>Cross</sup> to a Cherry tree on the Lane  
thence nearly an Northeast Course to John Hardisons line  
Containing by Estimation fifty Acres be the same more or less  
which s<sup>d</sup> Land I the Sr James Moore for myself my heirs and  
Assigns do on for ever will Warrant and defend to him the Sr  
John Hardison his heirs and Assigns Against all lawful claims  
of any person or persons whatsoever I Witness Whereof I have  
Heardunto set my hand and seal this Eighth day of October in the  
Year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty three
