

The contractor to have & use such part of the timbers of the old-bridge as are perfectly sound in the erection of the new-bridge. And to add a sufficient number of piles to the stream or mud-sils to make them steady & safe, & all the other timbers needed to make a good bridge as the old-one was from the water or mud-sils to the railing include must be of good heart ~~or~~ either new, or taken from the old-bridge if perfectly sound. The timbers supplied to be of the same size & length of the old-ones except the central sleepers which must be 6 by 10 inches and the upright or standing posts (all except the first panel may be shorn ^{of good heart or} from 4 to 10 inches. The flooring to be ^{of good heart or} 8 to 10 inches wide and two inches thick & same length of the old- & trunnelled at each end to the sleepers. The embattlements to be made entirely new, and well filled in with dirt of the same length, width &c as the old-ones were. The size of all the timbers supplied to be as large as the old-ones were except the upright, or standing posts, which may be shorn as above stated.
