Sec. Block For Leaf Program

WASHINGTON (AP) - With the active assistance of Agriculture Secretary John R. Block, backers of federal price supports for tobacco say "momentum is building" in the House to retain the subsidies.

"We support the tobacco program," Block said Tuesday. "At least we support it to this extent: We don't feel the tobacco program should be mixed up with the rest of the farm bill."

Responding to critics' complaints about the apparent conflict between tobacco price supports and the government's multimillion-dollar anti-smoking campaign, Rep. Charlie Rose, D-N.C., said, "The health issue is working in our favor."

"We're keeping the price of tobacco high," said Rose, the chief defender of the program and a representative of the nation's leading tobacco state.

Both Rose and Block were working the halls of the Capitol on Tuesday as the House disposed of some minor matters in the multibillion dollar, four-year farm bill.

Rose, who lost battles last week over sugar and peanut price supports, said he has at least 200 votes in support of the tobacco program, "a soft 40 votes on top of that and the momentum is building because people are getting involved."

Even Rep. Paul Findley, R-Ill., was backing retention of

the same kind of production controls for tobacco that he vigorously opposed in successfully defeating the peanut program, which also contained set acreage allotments.

"I don't see any public interest to be served by making it more attractive to grow tobacco and provide it at a lower price," Findley said. "The health hazard is so obvious."

The tobacco program was not originally a part of the pending farm bill, but Rep. Bob Shamansky, D-Ohio, is now proposing its abolition.

Block, who returned early from a Far East trip to be present for final action on the bill, told a number of congressmen that he supported the tobacco program. But at the same time, he asked for their backing of "a balanced program" of commodity price supports.

Even before the final vote on the House version of the farm bill, expected this week, Block said support programs for dairy, grains and cotton are too expensive and could be vetoed. Officials say the cost of the House bill could exceed budget limits over the next four years by as much as \$10 billion.

"I wouldn't predict what we would do," Block said. "But I think we will still have some influence ... before the final action."

But the administration's supporters in the House have predicted that any cost-saving gains in the farm program for the next four years will probably have to come when

differences between the House and Senate versions are resolved in the coming weeks. Block has endorsed the Senate version, which was forced through that chamber under the threat of a presidential veto.

Shamansky had been hoping to capitalize on the anti-commodity attitude that built in the House last week with defeat of sugar and peanut supports. But he admitted that repeated voting delays had seriously hurt his chances.

"The reason for these delays are so there is time for as many deals to be struck as possible," he said.

The price of tobacco, the only non-food, non-fiber commodity supported by the government, is maintained through government loans, restrictive acreage allotments and poundage quotas.

Since 1933, direct government costs have totaled about \$57 million, according to official estimates. Shamansky says indirect costs over the period add between \$600 million and \$850 million to that tally.

The production restraints concentrate control of the tobacco crop in the hands of people or organizations holding 550,000 federally issued acreage allotments, averaging about 4 acres each. Farmers without allotments are subject to substantial government fines for growing tobacco.

The allotments, issued when the program began in 1933, traditionally were handed down from father to son. About half of them now are held by people who lease the franchise to others for up to \$1,000 an acre, officials said.

U.S. Economy Said Sliding Backwards

WASHINGTON (AP) - The U.S. economy slid backwards at an annual rate of 0.6 percent in the July-September quarter, the government reported today in the clearest signal yet of national recession.

The Commerce Department report said inflation-adjusted gross national product - the broadest measure of American economic activity - fell for the second quarter in a row, having declined at a rate of 1.6 percent in the April-June period.

Those two consecutive declines meet the most common benchmark for deciding when a merely sluggish economy has slipped into genuine recession, a period characterized by

production cutbacks, worker layoffs and slow or falling sales totals.

One month ago, department officials had estimated a 0.5 percent rate of decline for the then-unfinished third quarter, but many analysts had expected the drop to be somewhat larger in light of recently fading factory production and rising unemployment.

President Reagan himself declared last weekend that the economy appeared to have fallen into "a slight ... and I hope a short recession." He and his advisers have blamed the downturn on problems inherited from former President Carter, but political foes have blamed Reagan.

As the economy cools down in a recession, inflation also tends to fall, but the new Commerce report indicated that

welcome side effect is not occurring.

The GNP implicit price deflator - a broad inflation measure linked to national output - rose at an annual rate of 9.4 percent, compared with 6.4 percent in the second quarter and 9.8 percent in the first quarter.

Rising consumer prices for food and services were singled out as a cause in the report.

"Real," or inflation-adjusted, GNP rose at a robust annual rate of 8.6 percent in the January-March quarter before declining in the April-June period.

The new report said that before adjusting for inflationary effects, GNP rose 8.8 percent to an annual rate of \$2.95 trillion in the third quarter, which ended Sept. 30. That translates into \$1.51 trillion in 1972 dollars, which are used as a yardstick to help discount for recent inflation.

Seek Amending CN Zoning District

The Greenville Planning & Zoning Commission, acting on an item that was continued from the September meeting, voted to recommend that the City Council approve an amendment to the Neighborhood Commercial (CN) zoning district.

With Commissioners Dick Farris and Dr. Wiley Hines casting opposing votes, the board recommended that the CN district be amended to include in the special use section "other activities which, in the opinion of the board of adjustment, are compatible with the permitted uses in this district..."

Commissioners continued the matter last month pending an expanded definition of "other activities" in the proposed amendment. It was suggested that the definition was too general and could possibly create an interpretation burden on the Board of Adjustments.

Staff planner Skip Browder said the amendment is viewed by the staff as a stop-gap measure that will function until rewriting of the Zoning Ordinance is completed.

In other business, board members voted to recommend that the Council amend the R6-MH (mobile home) residential/mobile home district to allow mobile home parks as a permitted use, subject to various regulations.

Browder said at the present time mobile home park development is permitted only in RA-20 zoning districts and

only through a special use permit. He said the staff feels R6-MH would be a compatible district for mobile home park development.

Browder noted that very little development of that type has taken place since 1970 with most of the area parks built before the zoning district was adopted. Designs for new developments are considered by the planning board.

The commission also voted to recommend that the Zoning Ordinance be amended relative to setback requirements for churches in residential zoning districts. The members endorsed reduced setback requirements for churches in the residential districts and established setback and buffer requirements for parking areas related to the churches. Under the recommended amendment, any time parking

encroaches upon the setback, buffers (utilizing evergreen plants) are necessary.

Commissioners voted to recommend that the Council approve a request by property owners of Meadowbrook Drive for annexation into the city. Browder said all but one property owner along the street signed the annexation petition and he said efforts are being made to secure the signature of the absentee owner.

The section meets all of the criteria for annexation, he said. Annexation can be by petition of the property owners or the city can initiate the action, it was pointed out. Browder said Meadowbrook Drive is an unpaved street that will be

Flying Today To Summit

CANCUN, Mexico (AP) - President Reagan is flying to this island resort today for a 22-nation economic summit and expected opposition to his belief that free-market forces - not huge foreign aid - will alleviate world hunger and poverty.

Reagan's emphasis on the role of private enterprise in improving living conditions and domestic economics in developing countries puts him at odds with many of the leaders attending the conference.

Departing the White House this morning for Cancun, the president said he travels to Mexico "with no illusions" that the problems of world poverty and hunger are severe and deep-rooted and cannot be solved overnight.

But Reagan said he was convinced that these problems are best solved by "economic freedom and individual incentive," not huge foreign aid, and he pledged to continue U.S. support to help "free people build free markets" in the Third World.

Reagan said he might have spoken too harshly last week when he said he will be entering a "hostile atmosphere" at Cancun among some "who simply want a policy of take away from the haves and deliver to the have nots."

But Secretary of State Alexander M. Haig Jr., who also is attending the summit, said Reagan is coming here "very sensitive to the problems of the developing world, problems which also cause great problems in the developed world: the rising cost of energy, the tendency toward the declining economic growth rates, protectionism ... unemployment and other economic dislocations."

"The president goes with an open mind," Haig said Tuesday in Washington. "He wants to listen and he wants to learn and he hopes his own view will be accepted with an equally open frame of mind."

Delegates to the North-South summit, representing capitalist, socialist and Marxist nations, have been arriving here since Monday.

After a late-morning arrival, Reagan planned to join his colleagues at a buffet dinner this evening hosted by Mexican President Jose Lopez Portillo. During the day, he planned private meetings with Lopez Portillo, Premier Zhao Ziyang of China, Indian Prime Minister Indira Gandhi of India, President Shehu Shagari of Nigeria and President Luis Herrera Campins of Venezuela.

While downgrading the role of foreign assistance, Reagan has said the key to global prosperity rests on a combination of fiscal discipline, free enterprise and expanded trade.

But in the two days of meetings scheduled to begin Thursday, most leaders are expected to contend that Reagan's formulas are irrelevant to Third World needs.

They are prepared to argue that nothing short of the creation of new global financial and economic institutions - giving political power to poor countries - will enable them to raise their living standards.

Over the past month, Reagan and his top aides have served notice in a series of speeches that they will oppose any proposals for a fundamental restructuring of the international economic system.

"The challenge is to create new wealth, rather than redistribute current wealth," said Treasury Secretary Donald T. Regan, who is accompanying the president and Haig.

From a security standpoint, Cancun is an ideal location for a summit because its only direct links to the Mexican mainland are two bridges, one at each end of the sickle-shaped island.

Nonetheless, gunboats patrolled the offshore area while marine guards walked the white sand beaches, with the heaviest concentrations near the site of the summit.

The U.S. delegation will be joined by the leaders of seven other industrialized countries and fourteen developing nations.

China and India, the world's two most populous countries, will attend, as will Saudi Arabia, the world's largest exporter of oil. Also represented will be two of the poorest countries, Bangladesh and Tanzania.

Hospital Board Not To Renew Medical Director's Contract

The Pitt Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees voted last night not to renew the hospital's contract with Dr. Donald Weir, medical director of rehabilitation services, when his contract expires March 1, 1982.

The matter was discussed in executive session of the board, so the public has access to no details of the discussion. It was pointed out over the vote that the termination has nothing to do with Dr. Weir's clinical privileges to practice medicine in the hospital.

Terms of the contract, obtained this morning, call for Dr.

Weir to provide his own services and those of two other physicians for a fee of \$80,000 a year. Except for one short period when there was one other doctor involved, Weir has operated with only himself, for a reduced fee of \$60,000, Hospital Director Jack Richardson said.

Hospital Finance Officer Warren McRoy reported that, according to unaudited reports, the hospital finished the fiscal year ending Sept. 30 with patient revenue of \$48,250,000 (up 37 percent from the previous fiscal year) and five percent over budget projections. Expenses were \$39,225,423, one percent over budget projections, he said. Net revenues were \$3,415,000

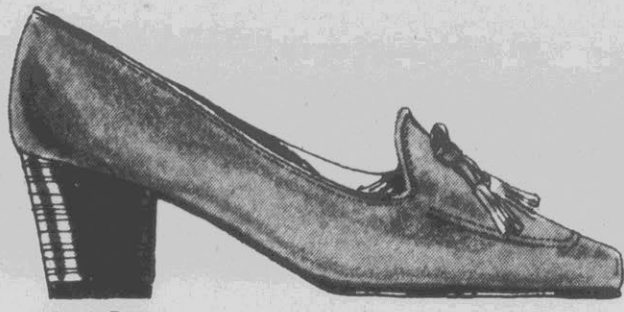

Pocket Book Issues

Tobacco, roads, health care and economic development dominated the conversations as a politically oriented group of some 350 gathered at the Blount Ranch last week for the Tar River Fellowship Club.

Even though it is an off-year politically the crowd was large — perhaps the largest ever.

There was no hot campaign to talk about, although there was some speculation about John Ingram or Rufus Edminsten seeking the Democratic nomination for governor in 1984.

The more immediate concerns were the protection of the tobacco program which has slipped through the U.S. Senate unchanged and

was being considered yesterday by the House of Representatives.

Roads were a matter of concern with Secretary of Transportation W. R. Robertson from nearby Washington telling the group there are only funds available to build 40 miles of two lane highway per year in the state. He noted the U.S. 264 Greenville-Wilson link would cost \$125 million, and there is only \$40 annually available.

Next year there will be Congressional and local races which will dominate the conversations. But this year it was pretty much pocket book issues which concerned the Democratic-leaning group that gathered at the Blount Ranch.

Yorktown Made America

No doubt the celebration at Yorktown was a considerable amount of fun for everyone who participated.

It drew two presidents, our own President Reagan and the President of France Francois Mitterrand whose ancestors did so much to assure the founding of the United States.

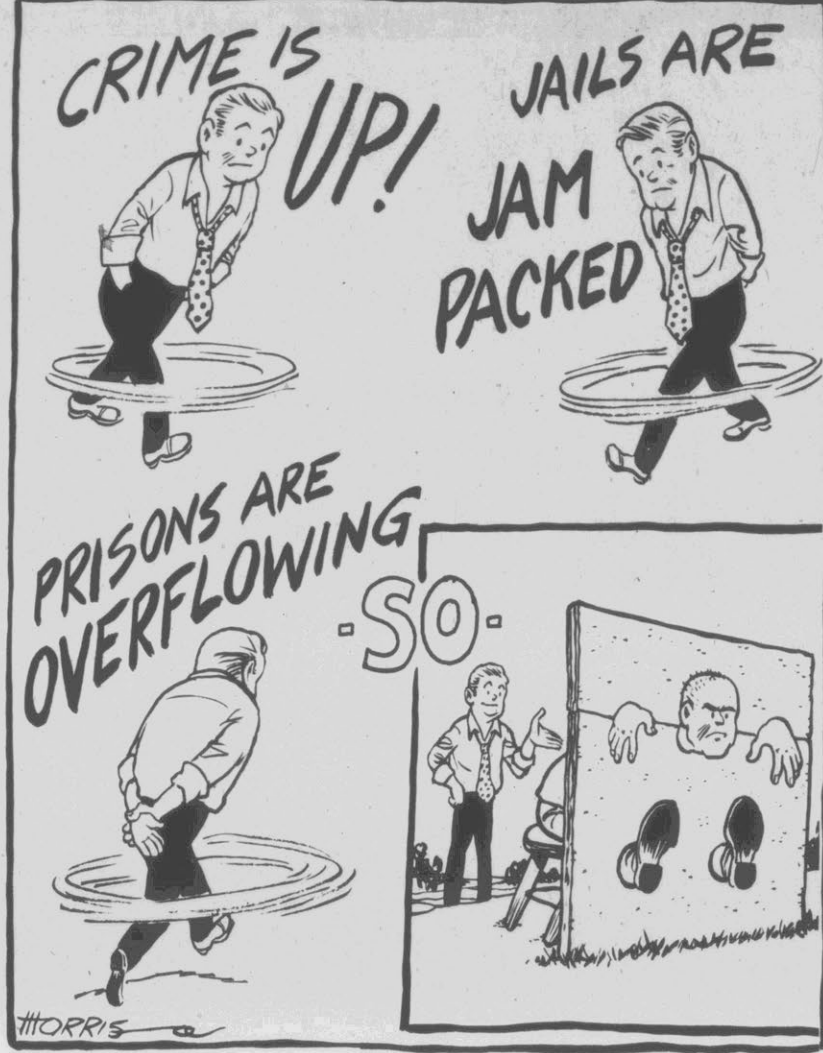
The re-enactment of the famed battle, however, should also remind

Borrowing Habit

Pay-as-you-go financing of major governmental projects is "the biggest falacy talked about recently," Gov. Jim Hunt believes.

No family can go out and put down money to buy a house or a new car. "This country is built on credit," argues the governor.

Why would the chief executive officer of North Carolina take such a stance in the face of growing taxpayer opposition to borrowing money to be paid back double when both state and local governments can manage their money and programs better to produce more benefits with less cost?

One explanation is that bond issues are painless. They don't cost anything today. Raising taxes to increase revenues, or cutting one program to pay for another, is a visible and immediate step on which voters and taxpayers can focus. Pushing a bond issue is in the realm of "pie-in-the-sky-by-and-by" leaving some future political leader to bite the bullet and pay for the program.

An even more significant explanation has to do with current financial attitudes in the government. Gov. Hunt's comments help put that attitude on the record.

FOUNDATION
This country is built on credit, Hunt explains, and it is wise to use the inflated dollars of future years to pay for projects built today.

"Credit makes sense. Often, it is the only way to get something. And, you pay off with dollars worth much less."

All of which, naturally, assumes that inflation continues at a brisk pace. Hunt was asked if he assumes that will be the case in light of current efforts by President

Reagan to bring inflation to heel.

"I don't have a whole lot of faith in the plan going on. I

wish it would work, but..."

The trend worldwide is for inflation to continue, Hunt believes. But even if the rate is held down to 10 percent per year, the value of the today's dollar grows rapidly while the worth of future dollars drops sharply and borrowing continues to make sense, the governor feels.

Such open embracing of deficit financing by the state's top officials helps to make clear the contention that inflation is indeed the most serious threat to the taxpayer's wallet. It is a hidden tax far worse than open, outright taxation; costing far more in the long run, and one which the average person seldom understands and is impotent to battle effectively. You can keep the county commissioner from hiking the tax rate; you can fight your legislator on above-board tax increase. There seems no way to combat inflation so long as government itself actually wants inflation to continue.

AHEAD

What does this signal concerning three big financial problems now confronting North Carolina? There is pending now a \$300 water and sewer bond election to provide state dollars to back up local projects and to replace lost federal dollars.

Gov. Hunt sees that action as critical to future economic growth. There is in the works a \$600 million bond question for public school construction. Gov. Hunt says the state has backed school work with bond money about every 10 years; indicating that in 1983 there would be a good chance for such a bond issue.

There is a gap between the \$200 million yearly Hunt wants for road work and the \$120 million produced by a three-cent gas tax hike. Some are proposing a new one-cent state sales tax to produce \$250 million dollars, split three ways for schools, water and roads.

But this, says Hunt, is a complicated matter which needs a lot of study. One Legislature can't bind another to such a split, he argues, it's a complicated matter which needs a detailed study, and there are no guarantees that the dollars coming in would be enough to do the job.

All of which, it seems, points toward a top-level push for more borrowing down the road.

Kemp Urges No Retreat

WASHINGTON — A private one-on-one meeting initiated by budget director David Stockman with Rep. Jack Kemp ended with the congressman delivering a lecture against destroying Ronald Reagan's revolution by turning backwards to orthodox, big-business Republicanism.

On the morning of Oct. 14, Stockman turned up in Kemp's congressional office (with no aides present) to explain reports that he was willing to delay next year's 10 percent tax cut by three months. He asserted he was under terrific pressure from orthodox Republican senators, such as Bob Dole (finance committee chairman) and Pete Domenici (budget committee chairman). Stockman asked Kemp: what else can be done to close the budget deficit?

Kemp replied that retreating to Republican follies of the past would be no answer. To delay individual tax cuts while keeping big-business tax cuts in force, he said, would be the worst kind of politics. He then urged his old compatriot Stockman to join him in saving Reagan's program.

Schmidt Crisis
West German Chancellor Helmut Schmidt's health crisis may persuade him to retire from politics long before the next scheduled election, in 1984, paving the way for a new governing coalition to take over America's most valued European ally.

That is the privately expressed view of top Bundestag (parliament) politicians of both Schmidt's socialist party and the conservative Christian Democrats (CDU). Schmidt had shown signs of political fatigue before he had a heart seizure last week that resulted in the implantation of pacemaker. Just a few days earlier, after an impassioned defense of the Western alliance in a major Bundestag speech scolding left-wing activists in his own party, Schmidt was congratulated by CDU chief Helmut Kohl who told Schmidt his speech "betrayed sentiments of leave-taking."

The doleful chancellor's heart seizure is now seen as a major new political problem for Schmidt. Should he resign in the next six months, the way would open for a new coalition with Kohl as chancellor.

NSC Turmoil
The imminent departure of two top strategists on the National Security Council staff is the latest proof that all is far from well in President Reagan's national security apparatus.

The unannounced departures will send James Lilley, top political affairs specialist on Richard V. Allen's NSC staff, to Taiwan as the chief U.S. representative to the

Republic of China and Rutherford Poats, senior staffer on international economics, to Europe in a high economic post.

Insiders say that if the NSC staff were able to wield the foreign policy clout inside the White House that former NSC staffers enjoyed they would not consider resigning. But the contrary is the case: Allen's staff, and Allen himself, plays strictly secondary roles in the offices that, in previous administrations, were virtually second to none in power and prestige.

Subpoenaing Cap
Displeasure of Republican members of the Senate Armed Services Committee with Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger is rising to the point where they are considering subpoena to learn whether expert advice on the MX mobile missile decision has been ignored.

Specifically, committee Republicans have been unable so far to get full

The Mongoose And The Cobra

NEW YORK (AP) — An apartment renter new to life in the Big Apple got a not-so-warm greeting from his landlord on the other day.

"Take Notice," said the small computer-printed slip awaiting him in the mailbox as he arrived home from work.

"You are justly indebted to the Landlord of the above described premises for rent of said premises which you are hereby requested to pay on or before the expiration of three days from Receipt of this Notice, in default of which the Landlord will exercise his legal remedy, the cost of which may be added to your balance due."

After plowing through the boilerplate one or twice, the tenant correctly deduced that this was a dunning letter, and a bit of a menacing one at that.

What bothered him most, however, was the fact that he had paid the rent in question by check at the time it was due.

Armed with the number and date of the check, the tenant telephoned the Monolith Management Co., owner of the building in

which he resides. A company representative double-checked and found that, sure enough, the rent had been paid.

"The computer sometimes takes a few days to catch up, and these notices go out automatically," the tenant was told. "You really don't have to worry about these unless you get a final notice of default."

"Oh," said the tenant, relieved but hardly delighted by the whole incident.

By coincidence, at the same time that this little conflict was being played out, a petition was circulating in the office where the tenant worked. It sought signatures in support of a "tenant protection" bill before the state legislature.

The bill would, among other things:

—"Force landlords to open their books to show need before receiving any rent increase — such increase limited to a maximum of 7½ percent in any one year.

—"Eliminate 'passalong' increases like fuel and labor.

—"Stop automatic across-the-board rent hikes."

should pay for increases in the cost of fuel consumed by tenants, if not the tenants themselves, the petition left plenty of space for signatures. When last sighted, it was nearly full of names.

So goes one of the strangest relationships in nature. By logic, the landlord and tenant are mutually dependent species, comparable perhaps to the shark and the remora.

But in practice, they tend to behave more like the mongoose and the cobra, ready at a moment's notice for a duel to the death.

The Real Estate Investing Letter, a monthly newsletter published in New York, recently surveyed some apartment-property owners for ideas to help lessen the animosity. Its comments are directed at landlords, but many tenants might find them of interest as well.

"Most managers we talked to cited poor communication as a major cause of poor landlord-tenant relations," the letter reported. To improve communications, it suggested, first of all, use of simple leases.

"This is frequently called the 'we-you' lease because

'we' and 'you' are substituted for 'landlord,' 'tenant,' 'lessor,' 'the undersigned,' and so on. At the same time, the language is cleaned up to avoid terms such as 'devised premises,' 'covenants,' and many other examples of legalese."

At the time the lease is signed, the letter says, the two parties should discuss not only what is agreed upon — rent due dates, for example — but why. Once the lines of communication are open, it adds, they should be kept open.

"Those who consider apartment investing a 'fixed asset' game often forget the service aspect," the newsletter concludes. "If you want to develop a better relationship with your tenants, who are, after all, your customers, you are wise to view your investment as a service business — the shelter business, to be precise.

"The most obvious way to develop good landlord-tenant relationships is to deliver the service you promise. That doesn't mean that you have to 'soften up' in any way. It just means that you deliver what you said you would."

"The mascot will provide continuity to our program by appearing in our slide show, on information pamphlets and even as a costume worn by the tour guide."

The hospital has asked area teachers of kindergarten through sixth graders to explain the contest and ask the children to work at home on their own time. The posters will be picked up from principals' offices.

A footnote: Weinberger stunned the committee's Republicans in a recent hearing when he defended the planning it led to Desert One, last year's tragically flawed hostage rescue attempt in the Iranian desert. To the senators, that meant Cap had been captured by the Pentagon bureaucracy.

Reagan's House Enemy
There is no enemies list in the Reagan White House, but senior officials have picked their least favorite Republican congressman: Rep. Bill Green of New York.

Green, who represents what used to be called the "silk stocking district" in Manhattan, is one of the liberal Republican "gypsy moths" defecting from President Reagan's economic program.

"What bothers me about Green," one key Reagan adviser told us, "is not just that he's voting against the president, but that he's lining up other Republicans to do the same." The White House is seeking some leverage to apply against Green, but has come up with nothing so far.

New Bern Antagonized By Coal Trains

NEW BERN, N.C. (AP) — It is 4:30 a.m. in New Bern and everything is peaceful in the small waterfront town. Suddenly, there is a powerful rumbling in the distance, then the ear-splitting shriek of a train whistle.

All along the city's residential streets, lights begin flickering on in the windows. The 150-car train loaded with coal passes within 20 feet of many of the houses, blowing its whistle at every intersection and shaking the residents out of bed.

The early-morning train is one of three or four coal trains that pass through New Bern every day on their way to the port at Morehead city. Residents of the historic town, built on the banks of the Neuse River in the early 1700s, say the trains are shaking their houses to pieces and lowering the value of their property.

"I have to wipe up the pieces of mortar that fall away from the bricks every day," said 75-year-old Carrie Miller. "It takes its toll every time."

Mrs. Miller and her husband, Charles, live in the city's oldest house. It belonged to the late Gov. Benjamin Smith and

was completed in 1790. The railroad track runs about 20 feet from their front door.

The Millers retired to New Bern from New Jersey several years ago and paid \$85,000 for their house. They have since spent another \$90,000 restoring and improving the house.

Since the trains began running through their historic neighborhood, the Millers say, many residents have tried to sell or rent their homes. Mrs. Miller points out that five houses on the street currently are for sale, with no buyers in sight.

"These are historic houses that people paid a lot of money for and put a lot of hard work into but now they want to move because they can't stand the noise day after day and night after night," Mrs. Miller said.

"When people find out that the train runs by right outside their door several times a day, they're not interested in buying. Our property value is dropping every day."

The coal trains began rumbling through New Bern last April. The state has a contract with Alla-Ohio Valley Coal Inc. of Washington, D.C., to export 1.75 million tons of coal to Europe this year. The coal is shipped by Southern Railroad.

According to Craven County Crossroads, a group opposed to coal shipments through New Bern, similar coal shipments through Norfolk, Va., have caused buildings to crumble. The group also says black coal dust covers the ground around the tracks, causing pollution in the area.

The group cites a study conducted by a team of consultants for the National Trust for Historic Preservation which said the coal trains would have an adverse effect on a revitalization project in downtown New Bern. The study also said the trains would adversely affect tourism, one of the area's biggest industries, with traffic jams and tie-ups in emergency services.

"In this town, the hospital is separated from some sections by the railroad track," Miller said. "What happens if a person on the other side of the track needs to be treated and a train is slowly making its way through? You'll sit there and die, that's what."

Eugene Bryan, publisher of the New Bern Sun Journal and an outspoken critic of the coal shipments, says residents' pleas with Gov. Jim Hunt and other state officials to reroute the trains have gone unheeded.

"They (state officials) decided to do this without telling the people of New Bern anything about it," said Bryan, whose newspaper has carried more than 50 articles on the coal trains. "Now they won't hear our complaints. Or if they do, they choose not to answer them."

Brent Hackney, Hunt's press aide, said the state is trying to work with city officials to solve any problems caused by the trains.

"We doing everything we can to work with New Bern and Southern Railroad to meet any problems that may occur," Hackney said. "The governor has proposed eventually rerouting the trains, and maybe we can get an alternate route built around the downtown area."

Hackney said the DOT is conducting tests to determine how the vibration affects buildings in the city.

"If we determine that it is having a harmful effect, then we'll have to take another look at the whole situation. But we

haven't heard anything from the tests yet," he said. Some New Bern residents say they don't think the state is interested in their problems. One such resident, R. R. Rivenbark, says the coal trains are adding to problems at his boat-works business.

Rivenbark, president of Barbour Boat Works Inc., says trains coming into town must cross over a Southern Railroad trestle that spans the Trent River.

Rivenbark has been trying for years to get the drawbridge updated so larger ships could through it into the harbor. He says since the coal shipments began coming through the bridge has been out of commission almost constantly, leaving him with very little business.

"We're dying a slow death," said Rivenbark, who has owned the boat works for 49 years. "That bridge was built in 1860 and it just can't take the kind of traffic it's getting now from the coal trains. It stays out of commission all the time and I'm left with vessels waiting to get in for repairs and ships we've repaired waiting to get out."

"It won't be long before we don't get any business at all because the word is out that you can't depend on us," he added. "Vessels can't just sit and wait for a bridge to start working again. They just go somewhere else."

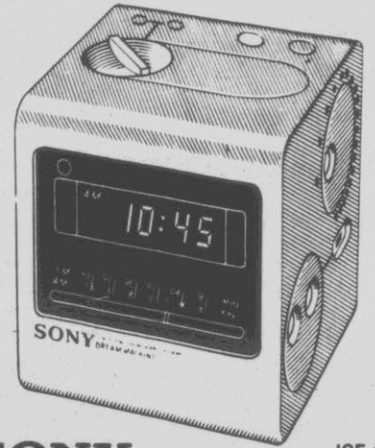

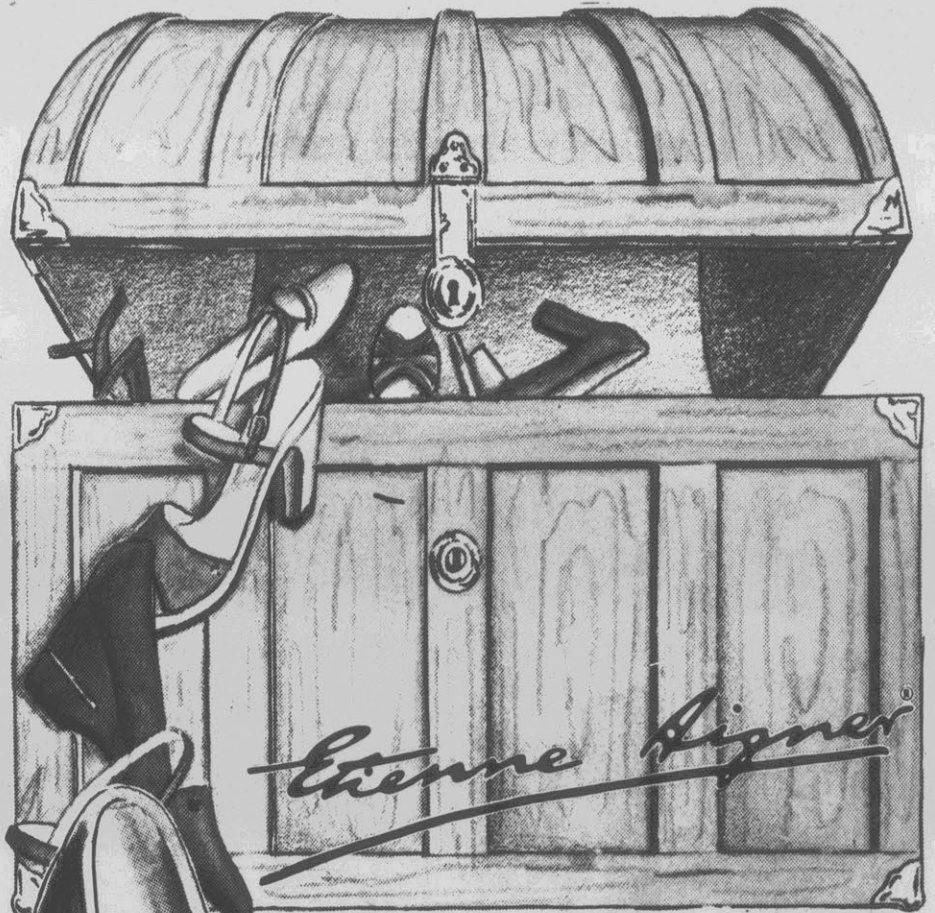

Cancun's Poor Highlight Goal Of Mexico

CANCUN, Mexico, (AP) — The tropical breeze from this deluxe Caribbean resort where 22 world leaders are gathering to discuss poverty brings only a whisper of comfort to the cane hut dwellers of its teeming backyard slum.

To the 30,000 people who live there with no electricity or running water, the breeze can be a curse. When the wind-carries rain that floods the rutted dirt streets, garbage must be burned because the collection trucks — one of their few public services — cannot get in.

One evening, a gust invaded the slats of Pablo Canul's two-room shack, knocking over the butane lantern that is his only source of light and burning down both his grocery store in the front parlor and the bedroom for his family of eight in back.

"Over there in Cancun, we built a paradise, but here we live in a dump," said Canul, a former hotel construction worker.

However, like most Mayan Indians who arrived over the past decade to build or work in the hotels and restaurants

of Mexico's newest resort, Canul says he is better off than he was as a peasant farmer in his native Yucatan village.

Here, he finds full employment, adequate schools and medical care, no political unrest and little crime. Peace and cleanliness prevail.

The mass hunger and desperation elsewhere that prompted this week's summit of rich and poor nations is unknown in the Cancun slum called Puerto Juarez, isolated from the resort area itself where the world leaders will meet Thursday and Friday.

But its proximity to the peninsular hotel strip, where 600,000 Mexican and foreign tourists will vacation this year and spend an average of \$120 a day, points up the immense gap between rich and poor within Mexico and most other developing nations.

Puerto Juarez is part of the county of Cancun; one mayor serves the entire region from offices in the resort city.

The plight of Cancun's poor also highlights the central role of the Mexican state in trying to narrow that gap, in accord with a philosophy shared among Third World nations at this conference that private enterprise alone cannot reduce human poverty.

Ten years ago, when tourism earned more for Mexico than oil, the government assigned Cancun, then a fishing village of 800 people, to become a tourist boom town that would become a "pole of growth" for the backward, isolated Yucatan peninsula.

While investing \$240 million to develop the area and attract big-name hotels, the government created an explosion of unforeseen migration. Each day, officials say 15 people arrive seeking

work and another 10 are born, swelling the population of 55,000.

"Creating a town almost from scratch had no precedent in Mexico since the Spanish conquest," said Manuel Castillo, Cancun's public works director. "The planners expected about half the number that came."

He said they also neglected to plan a cemetery and misjudged the gap between minimum wage of \$9 per day and a cost of living inflated by the expense of importing food and construction material from far across Mexico.

As a result, few workers can pay monthly rents of up to \$600 for a two-bedroom home in Cancun and end up squatting on vacant lots across the highway in Puerto Juarez to build their own precarious shelters. Some paper the walls with colorful travel brochures and magazine covers taken from the hotels where they work.

Juventina Puc-Peh says her family of seven tripled its income after leaving a Yucatan village last year to come to Cancun, where she and two teen-age daughters earn minimum wage in resort hotels.

But food costs nearly twice as much here as it did in the village the family left. Eggs sell for the equivalent of 90

cents a dozen. But the big hotels "don't care" about high prices, Mrs. Puc-Peh said. "They keep buying and driving up the price."

While City Hall tries to meet the town's growing need for light, water and sanitation, the federal government has spent \$12 million on a ground satellite station, 1,000 new telephone lines and an extended airport runway for the summit conference. The satellite has brought commercial television here for the first time, but not many people can afford the \$460 for the

cheapest TV set. Mayor Jose Irabien Medina says worldwide publicity for the resort will bring "incalculable benefits." His aide, Maria Cristina

Castro, said the "long-range solution is for the federal government to divert

Cancun's tourist income to develop cheaper food sources and improve living standards in this region. "Like oil, tourism has to become a source of development and not just inflation."



Still Scrambling For Balanced Budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — Divided Republicans in Congress are struggling to keep alive President Reagan's fading hopes for a balanced budget in 1984. The White House, meanwhile, is looking for a boost from a Democratic senator to save its proposed

sale of AWACS radar planes to Saudi Arabia. New budget projections circulated Tuesday by Senate Republicans showed the 1984 budget shortfall could be more than \$90 billion.

Treasury Secretary Donald T. Regan confirmed that the administration — which is acknowledging the 1984 zero deficit goal may be beyond reach — is considering higher cigarette and alcohol excise taxes and other measures to boost revenues.

House and Senate Republican leaders met privately to review a Senate GOP plan for reducing the deficit by \$14.7 billion in fiscal 1982 and more than \$73 billion over three years.

The House delegation balked at the plan, expressing particular opposition to plans for tax increases and further deep spending cuts. The combined GOP leadership was expected to meet again today.

The administration's drive to win support for the proposed \$8.5 billion arms sale to Saudi Arabia, meanwhile, was stalled in the Senate.

But the White House was looking for a possible boost today with an announcement by Senate Democratic leader Robert C. Byrd of West Virginia of his decision on the deal, which includes five of the Airborne Warning and

Control System planes and weaponry for Saudi F-15 jets.

Byrd hinted Tuesday that he might vote for the sale, saying it is not a partisan issue.

Only five of the 47 Senate Democrats have said they will vote for the Saudi arms sale, according to the latest Associated Press count, but a decision by Byrd to vote for it could influence other Democrats. The Senate lineup stood Tuesday at 52-37 opposed.

The Senate vote is scheduled for next Wednesday.

Congress also worked Tuesday on the multibillion-dollar, four-year farm bill. With the active assistance of Agriculture Secretary John R. Block, backers of federal price supports for tobacco say the "momentum is building" in the House to retain subsidies for the crop.

Responding to critics' complaints about the apparent conflict between tobacco price supports and the government's multimillion-

NEW YORK (AP) — Philanthropic organizations leave a huge mark on the U.S. economy, according to a Yale University study which estimates that such groups had a combined budget of \$129 billion in 1980.

Private donations totaling \$45 billion made up the largest source of revenue for

philanthropic organizations, defined in the study as charitable, tax-exempt organizations as well as hospitals, museums and private universities.

Government grants totaled \$8 billion, investment income \$7 billion, and \$9 billion came from subsidized rents.

The remaining \$60 million in income came from fees for goods and services — for

instance, university tuitions, hospital charges, museum admission fees.

The study, titled, "Toward a Quantitative Profile of the Nonprofit Sector," was published Tuesday. It was part of a five-year, \$1.75 million research effort begun in 1978 by Yale's Institution for Social and Policy Studies to solve unanswered questions about the non-profit sector.

Philanthropic groups employed an estimated 5.6 million people in 1980, and total assets of the non-profit sector of the economy were more than \$200 billion.

The author, Gabriel Rudney, a Treasury Department economist on leave, said he was "not surprised" that philanthropy holds so large a place in the economy. He said a study he conducted in 1974 found that philanthropic groups spent about \$80 billion.

He said in a telephone interview that growth in the budgets of philanthropic groups largely paralleled the historic growth in gov-

ernment support for such organizations.

He cautioned, however, that his figures were

estimates, since no one can really say how many philanthropic organizations are operating.

Committees Continue Redistricting Studies

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — House and Senate committees recessed for the day Tuesday without an agreement to reshape legislative districts after state lawyers suggested major changes.

The committees, meeting before a special session of the General Assembly set for Oct. 29, planned to resume work this morning.

Special deputy attorney general James Wallace told committee members Tuesday they should try to design districts so that no district would have any more than 10 percent more people per legislator than any other district.

The proposal would force changes in perhaps half of the state's House and Senate

districts.

"It's major surgery," said Rep. Dan Lilley, D-Lenoir, chairman of the House committee. "It goes beyond the smaller adjustments; it's more far-reaching."

Legislators drew up reapportionment plans in June, but the NAACP Legal and Education Defense Fund filed a federal lawsuit charging that the plans diluted black voting strength.

The Oct. 29 special session was set to draw up plans after Wallace and other Justice Department lawyers warned they probably could not successfully defend the House and Senate district plans in federal court.

But the higher standard recommended by the state lawyers would require at least 17 of the 44 House districts and 11 of the 29 Senate districts to be changed, and perhaps more districts would be affected as

committees assigned to draw up plans overnight.

Tiare B. Smiley, assistant attorney general, told the House panel that they could be risking the state's system of multi-member districts if they fail to find a solution adequately balanced.

She said if a poorly balanced plan was reviewed in federal court, the court could strike down the state Constitution's ban on dividing county lines and order single-member districts.

That provision is also challenged by the suit and is under review by the U.S. Justice Department under the 1965 voting rights act.

The House committee looked at several plans, one drawn up by the committee staff. It would come closer to the 10 percent goal, though not meeting it, by forming many large, multi-member districts.

U.S. Lumbermen Victims Of Tumbling Prices

SEATTLE (AP) — That big galoot in the unemployment line, with the blue ox double-parked outside, is Paul Bunyan. In the Pacific Northwest, where legendary logger giant Bunyan was said to roam, a depression in the lumber business has silenced many clattering mills and left thousands of people jobless.

The problem is nationwide, but it hits especially hard in the Northwest. In Oregon, the forest industry is the largest employer. It is the second largest, behind aerospace, in Washington state, which is estimating monthly losses at \$45 million.

In the East, the hardest hit area is northern Maine, where dozens of small, family-run mills are threatened and the problem is compounded by cut-rate competition from Canada.

Recovery will depend largely on when soaring interest rates, now in the 18-19 percent range, drop so people can again afford to build homes, the major market for timber.

As of the week ending Oct. 10, 51 percent of the 102,000 Western sawmill workers were either laid off or working shorter shifts, reported the Western Wood Products Association in Portland, which represents lumber manufacturers in 11 Western states and the Black Hills region of South Dakota.

Of 756 Western sawmills, 187 were closed and 252 were running at curtailed levels, association spokesman William Kirtland said, adding that he felt the figures would be similar in other U.S. logging regions.

But the figures don't include others affected — loggers, paper mill workers and workers in the particle board and plywood business. Kirtland said that for every sawmill job lost, 2.5 to 3 other workers are hurt, "from loggers in the woods to waitresses in the communities."

Industry experts say timber has a good year when about 1.75 million housing starts are reported nationally. But only 1.2 million housing starts are expected this year and 1.4 million in 1982, Kirtland said.

"Recovery will be slow," he said. "We've been depressed for about 18 months now. We're not in a recession but a depression. There are mills that have closed, never to reopen, and more will suffer the same fate."

The Weyerhaeuser Co., one of the nation's biggest timber companies, cut shifts at many mills, operates some mills only three or four days a week and closed a mill in Bly, Ore., putting about 150 people out of work, said Tom Ambrose, a company spokesman.

Crown Zellerbach has closed several sawmills, including one in Omak, Wash., that employed 355 people.

The big wood industry companies in Maine's north woods, such as International Paper Co. and Great Northern Paper Co., are not suffering major layoffs because of their size and diversity, company spokesmen said. But the smaller, family-owned mills that employ up to 300 workers are laying off hundreds because they cannot sell their spruce, fir and

cedar products.

Most frustrating to the owners is that the trouble comes from factors they cannot control. The biggest problem is the lack of housing construction, but another factor hurting Maine's mills lies just north of the border in Quebec and New Brunswick.

J. Paul Levesque, a life-long lumber man who owns a mill about 50 miles south of the New Brunswick border and who has had to lay off more than 100 workers — two-thirds of his work force — says the traditional Canadian competition is now a near-monopoly due to government subsidies.

Canada offers grants to cover start-up costs and low-interest loans and gives bonuses for expansions and exports, said James Barresi, executive director of the Northern Maine Regional Planning Council.

D. Ross Hodgins, an officer of a Big New Jersey lumber brokerage, said five years ago he bought half his lumber from Aroostook County mills and half from Canada. Now the Canadians get 90 percent of his business. He said Maine mills can't match Canadian prices.

Deland Lebel, a mill operator in Van Buren, Maine, said Hodgins recently canceled an order for 50 truckloads of fencing and saved \$66,000 by switching to a New Brunswick supplier.

Because lumber brokers pay with U.S. money worth about 17 percent more in Canada, Canadian mill owners can offer huge discounts from Maine prices and still earn a profit, Lebel said.

U.S. Customs import records show how Canadian mill owners have seized the advantage. From 1975 to 1979, the value of white cedar shingles imported through Maine jumped from \$3.5 million to \$6.8 million. Planed spruce lumber imports nearly tripled — from \$19.4 million to \$50.4

million.

Meanwhile, across the United States, lumber prices have tumbled.

The composite price of lumber, compiled from principal lumber goods and tree species, hit \$300 per 1,000 board feet in August 1979. A year ago, it sank to \$192 and recently languished at \$178, said Bill Dean, executive editor of Random Lengths Publications, a forest products information service.

The low — \$153 — came in April 1980. That 1980 spring was bleak for the forest industry.

When the Federal Reserve Board curbed lending and increased interest rates in October 1979, the timber industry coasted for a while on a healthy market.

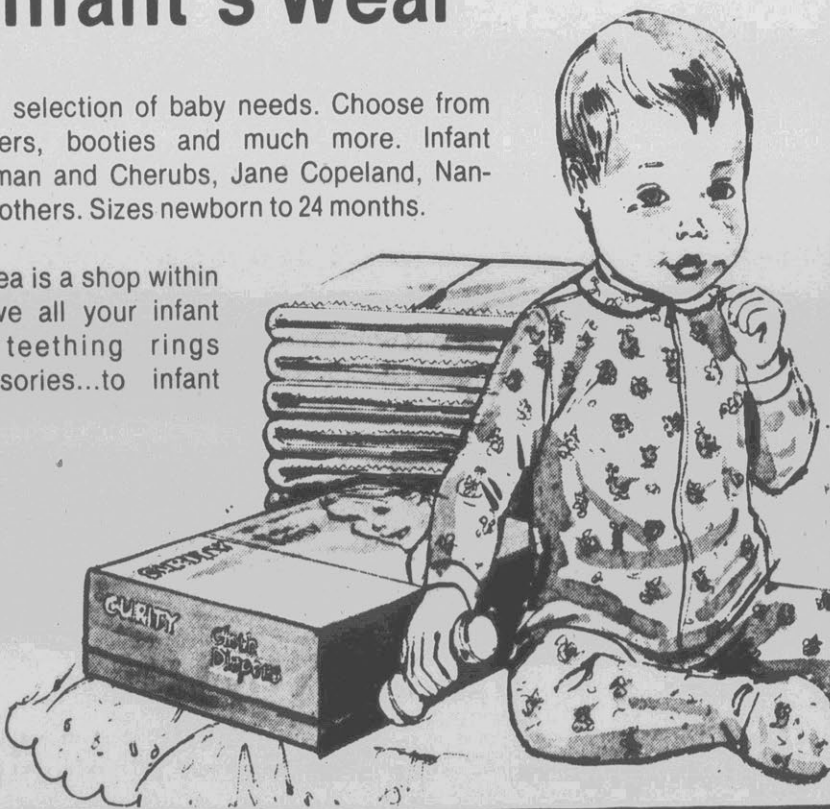

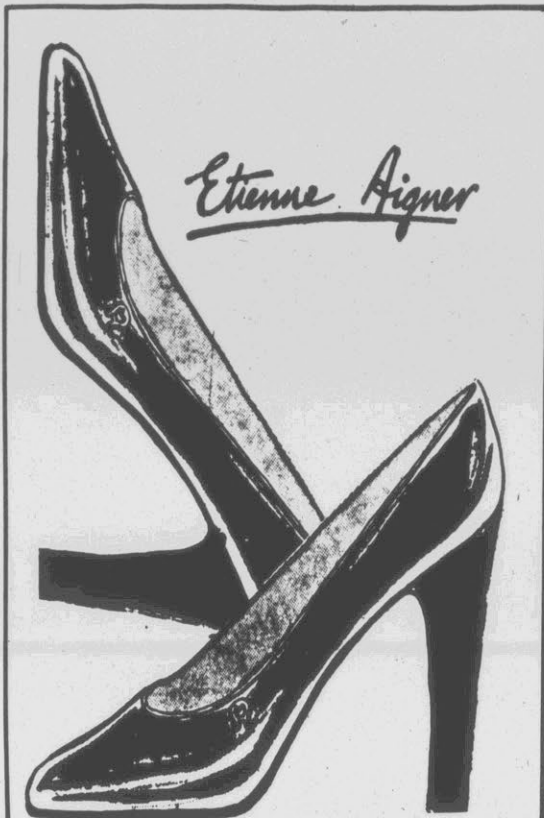

Many hands hinge on control of the trump suit. When this hand was played in a recent North American Championship, one declarer failed to realize just how important trump control can be.

The final contract at both tables of a team match was four spades. The bidding sequences were identical, and the final contract was excellent. But for a 4-1 trump split, both declarers would have coasted home.

At the table we watched, West's queen of hearts won the first trick and he continued with the jack. Declarer again played low

from dummy and ruffed in his hand. He cashed the ace and king of spades, and was disappointed when East discarded a diamond on the second round. Now he went after the clubs, but it was too late.

Declarer took dummy's two master clubs and then tried to get back to his hand by leading a diamond to the queen. West won the ace and returned a trump, and declarer had no way of coming to ten tricks—in fact, he made only eight.

At the other table, declarer was a little more careful. When he saw East's jack of spades drop on the first round of trumps, he realized that there was a strong possibility that the suit was going to break badly. Therefore, he abandoned trumps for the moment and immediately went after clubs. After cashing dummy's two honors, declarer got back to his hand with a trump. When East showed out, declarer's foresight was rewarded.

Declarer simply ran the clubs. West could ruff whenever he wished, but declarer would then overruff in dummy, get back to his hand by drawing the last trump with his honor, and continue to run clubs. One way or another, declarer would score ten tricks in the black suits for his contract.

over expenses, with \$2,743,000 used to finance accounts receivable and \$862,000 used for equipment purchase and capital improvements.

Capital requests approved were carpeting for the main lobby, three admitting offices and a work area, \$7,392.06; a blood bank refrigerator for laboratory medicine, \$7,200; and a bottle warming cabinet for peritoneal dialysis material for CCU, \$5,000.

Hospital Associate Director Rick Gilstrap reported that 140,662 patient days of service were rendered during the fiscal year. There were 18,936 patients admitted; 1,950 babies delivered; 10,651 surgical visits; 8,560 recovery visits; 35,247 emergency department visits; 806,439 inpatient laboratory tests; 63,119 x-rays; 32,461 physical therapy treatments; 15,860 EKGs and 1,605 EEGs.

Some 151,490 patient days are predicted for next year, Gilstrap said.

Board members were given reading material from Betty Trought, Associate Director for Nursing, proposing wage increases and differential pay for nurses to bring local nurses' remuneration in line with primary care hospitals throughout the state. These increases would no doubt call for increases of other hospital personnel's pay, also, the proposals pointed out. She said they offer the only hope for the hospital to be able to recruit the nurses it has to have to provide the services called for. Lack of nurses cuts back on the number of patients that can be accepted and therefore on overall revenue, she pointed out. Action will be taken at a later meeting of the board after an ad hoc committee reports.

It was reported that bids have been taken on the addition of space in the dining room, medical records, the laboratory and special services. The contract was awarded to Eastern Construction Company of Greenville for \$465,000.

The board welcomed Greenville attorney, Louis Singleton, as a new member appointed by the county commissioners to fill the unexpired term of Thomas Bennett, who resigned to become a member of the ECU board of trustees on which Singleton recently finished a term.

Board members were told that the public is invited to the dedication and tour of the new bed tower to be held the Sunday before Thanksgiving. The tower will begin serving patients the Monday after Thanksgiving, they were advised.

Richardson advised the board of work continuing on plans to build a metal building that would house educational and administrative functions of the hospital so as to allow the space inside the hospital proper to be used for more direct patient services. Consideration is being given to leasing from the county land adjacent to the Pitt County Mental Health Center. Work continues, too, he said, on plans to expand the surgery, radiology and emergency areas of the hospital.

Charles Fennessy, new director of personnel of the hospital, was introduced and welcomed. Dr. Edwin Monroe greeted the board on behalf of the School of Medicine. He said Dr. William Laupus, who usually attends the board meetings, is serving on an accrediting team for a Wisconsin medical school.

Prior to the meeting the board toured the new West Bed Tower of the hospital, completed Oct. 15. Guests for the tour and for dinner in the hospital cafeteria prior to the tour were members of the Hospital Gift Fund, the Hospital Foundation, and community advisors.

Following dinner, J. Craig Quick, community relations and development officers, invited everyone present to attend the first annual Foundation Awards Benefit to be held Thursday, Nov. 5, at the Casablanca Restaurant. Attendance is by donation of \$25.

Warn Layoffs In Labor Dept.

WASHINGTON (AP) —

Some 3,500 Labor Department employees are on notice that they could lose their jobs because of agency budget cuts, sources say.

The sources, declining to be named publicly, stressed that the notices of a possible reduction in force were only preliminary and were necessitated by union contract provisions requiring 60-day notice of possible firings.

"Before an actual RIF (reduction in force) could take place, specific individuals would have to get specific notices," one source said.

He said all of those receiving the general notice of possible termination work for the Employment and Training Administration, which was most affected by the \$7.8 billion in cuts announced early this year as part of the first wave of Reagan administration budget-slashing.

The notices of possible reduction in force were sent to some 3,500 ETA employees on Monday under terms of the agency's contract with Local 12 of the American Federation of Government Employees, said the sources, who declined to be identified publicly.

The "letters of intent," given to some 1,100 ETA employees working in Washington and about 2,400 others working in field offices around the country, do

not mean that all of those people will be terminated, the sources said.

They said the letters merely represent the Labor Department's compliance with provisions in its union contract.

One source said that as many as 500 ETA employees could be terminated, "but that decisions on which employees will be affected have not been made."

"We don't really know how many will actually be affected because that depends on whether the further budget cuts are approved by Congress," he said.

Since President Reagan sought — and won from Congress — some \$35 billion in department and agency budget reductions this summer, the president has ordered all agencies to slash their spending by another 12 percent in fiscal 1982, which began Oct. 1.

Labor Department officials had said earlier that as many as 2,500 of the agency's 20,000 employees here and around the country might lose their jobs. The agency's overall work force at the start of 1981 was 21,500.

The sources said the 1,500 terminations this year had been achieved through normal attrition.

Most affected by fiscal 1982 budget cuts at the Labor Department was the federally subsidized public service jobs program funded under the Comprehensive

Employment and Training Act.

Some 310,000 CETA public service jobs were phased out at the end of fiscal 1981 on Sept. 30.

Agency officials have refused to say whether other CETA programs would be affected by the second wave of budget cuts.

The sources said a reduction in force would likely affect the Employment Standards Administration, Occupational Safety and Health Administration and Mine Safety and Health Administration, as well as ETA.

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market opened slightly higher today as the government reported the second straight quarterly decline in the economy, fitting the general definition that the nation has slipped into a recession.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks rose .48 to 852.36 in the early going, with advances outnumbering declines among New York Stock Exchange-listed issues.

The Commerce Department said the inflation-adjusted gross national product in the third quarter of the year fell 0.6 percent after falling at an annual rate of 1.6 percent in the April-to-June quarter.

The report had been anticipated by investors and followed statements by the president and his economic advisers earlier in the week that the nation was experiencing a slight recession.

Oil issues, which led a rally Tuesday, were mixed in early trading today.

Union Oil of California fell 1/4 to 38; Exxon was unchanged at 30 1/2; and Gulf Oil was up 1/8 at 35 1/2. Other early prices included International Business Machines, un-

changed at 51 1/2; Sony, down 1/4 at 17; Merrill Lynch, up 1/4 at 35 1/2; and Avon Products, up 1/4 at 34 1/2.

On Tuesday, the Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks rose 4.75 to 851.88.

The number of shares rising in price held an almost 2-1 lead over losers on the NYSE.

Big Board volume totaled 51.53 million shares, up from Monday's 41.59 million.

The NYSE's composite index of all of its listed common stocks rose .73 to 69.75.

At the American Stock Exchange, the market value index was up 3.10 to 308.88.

Says Hinckley Threat Target

WASHINGTON (AP) — John W. Hinckley Jr., who is accused of shooting President Reagan on March 30, has been the target of a threat and has written of possible suicide, a prison official says.

Capt. Paul Hungerford, chief correctional supervisor at the U.S. prison at Butner, N.C., testified Tuesday that he found it necessary to search Hinckley's cell several times each day.

During the second day of a

hearing in U.S. District Court, Hungerford called Hinckley a "suicide threat, a threat to my staff, to the security of the institution. There was a threat to him from outside."

He did not elaborate on the outside threat.

In one of the searches of Hinckley's cell on July 23, Butner guards found and read a 3 1/2-page handwritten document that defense lawyers said was protected from disclosure by attorney-client privilege.

Hinckley's lawyers asked for the hearing to argue that the seizure violated Hinckley's constitutional rights and cannot be used by the prosecution at Hinckley's trial, scheduled for Nov. 30.

Washington's WDM-TV, meanwhile, reported Tuesday that Hinckley wrote he had been part of a conspiracy and would be willing to make a deal with prosecutors to disclose details.

The station also said Hinckley attempted to send letters to what appeared to be fictitious co-conspirators but that they were intercepted and read by prison officials.

The FBI has said its official investigation of the shooting disclosed no conspiracy.

For now, the document's contents remain private under orders of U.S. District Judge Barrington D. Parker. Parker took the argument under advisement after taking statements from several Butner correctional officers privately in his chambers.

The next pretrial hearing for Hinckley is scheduled Monday.

While Hungerford was not allowed to reveal the contents of the handwritten notes, he was permitted to testify about Hinckley's diary, which Hinckley called "The Diary of a Person We All Know."

Hooton Out To Get Team Even

NEW YORK (AP) — Being down one game in the World Series doesn't bother Tom Lasorda. Based on what has happened the last couple of weeks, it shouldn't.

"Heck, we were down 2-0 in a five-game series and we're only down one game in the best-of-seven," said the Los Angeles Dodger manager Tuesday night. "All it means is that we lost the first game."

Bob Watson's three-run homer in the first inning gave New York the lead for good and third baseman Graig Nettles made sure they kept it with a diving catch in the eighth as the Yankees downed the Dodgers 5-3.

Right-hander Burt Hooton, who has been exceptional in the postseason with three straight victories, will try to get the Dodgers even tonight when he is opposed by left-hander Tommy John, a former teammate.

The Dodgers have played their best baseball this month when in trouble. They beat Houston three straight times after losing the first two games in the divisional playoffs, then came back from a 2-1 deficit to eliminate Montreal in the five-game National League Championship Series.

"We've shown people what we can do," said Hooton, who has allowed only two runs in his three postseason starts. "This is a four-out-of-seven series."

"We're going out to give it our best shot tomorrow (tonight,) but we won't feel like we're out of it if we lose."

Hooton will work on only three days rest for the third straight time.

"No problem," he said. Perhaps not, but the same wasn't true for Jerry Reuss Tuesday night.

Reuss, who pitched 18 consecutive scoreless innings against Houston before losing Game 3 of the championship series, couldn't get through the third inning against the Yankees.

Did the lack of rest bother Reuss?

"Nope, I felt fine," he said. "I have no excuses. He (Watson) hit a fastball that was up a little bit. I would have preferred to have it down. He didn't hit it that well. It got up in the wind."

Reuss will probably pitch the fourth game of the Series Saturday in Los Angeles, meaning he will again go with three days' rest.

HR, 'D' Give Yanks Jump On L.A.

NEW YORK (AP) — Home run thunder and defensive brilliance, a familiar recipe they've used before, have given the New York Yankees the jump on the Los Angeles Dodgers in baseball's 78th World Series.

The thunder belonged to Bob Watson and the defense was provided by infielders Graig Nettles and Willie Randolph. Together, they proved too much for the Dodgers to cope with in the opening game of the battle for baseball's world championship.

Watson became the 17th player in history to hit a homer in his first Series at-bat, drilling a three-run shot in the first inning. Nettles turned in two outstanding plays at third base and Randolph had a couple at second, shortcircuiting the Los Angeles attack in New York's 5-3 victory Tuesday night.

And some less than glowing play by the Dodgers made the National League champions look shoddy by comparison.

Bob Lemon, the philosophical man who manages the Yankees, remembers how Nettles' glove torpedoed the Dodgers in 1978, the last time these two teams met in the fall classic.

"You'd think," he noted, "they'd learn not to hit the ball down there."

They keep trying him, though.

Nettles set the defensive tone for the game with a diving stop on leadoff batter Davey Lopes' shot down the third base line in the first inning. Right away, Yankee pitcher Ron Guidry knew it would be a good night.

"If the ball's got to be hit somewhere," Guidry said, "I'd rather it be hit to him."

The next time the Dodgers came to the plate, they were three runs behind, thanks to Watson. With one out in the bottom of the first, Jerry Mumphrey singled. After Dave Winfield struck out, Lou Piniella hit a ground rule double to right. That brought up Watson, who suspected that with first base open, Dodger

Manager Tommy Lasorda might not let left-hander Jerry Reuss pitch to him. Especially with Nettles, a left-handed batter, on deck.

"In that situation, in the first inning, I'm not going to put him on to get to a left-handed hitter like Nettles, who may hit the ball out with that short porch," said Lasorda.

So, Watson hit one out instead.

"My knees were shaking and there were butterflies like I dreamed there would be," said Watson as he stepped to the plate for his first World Series swing after 17 years as a professional baseball player.

"I can attest I was nervous."

The count went to 1-2 and then Watson drilled a shot to the opposite field, dropping it over the fence about 375 feet from home plate.

"It was a fastball away and he just hit it to the best part of the park," said Reuss.

That, said Watson, was intentional.

"I noticed in batting practice that the ball wasn't carrying to left center," he said. "I decided I would look for a pitch to hit the other way."

Armed with the quick lead, Guidry had an easier task. "Anytime you get a couple of runs in the first inning, you don't have to be so fine," Guidry said. "You can just make them hit the ball. I don't like to nip and tuck when I've got a lead like that."

The Yankees got Guidry another run in the third when Mumphrey singled, stole second and scored on Piniella's second hit. That finished Reuss, with Bobby Castillo taking over. In the fourth, New York made it 5-0, courtesy of Castillo, who walked four batters, the last three of them consecutively with two out.

Now the Dodgers were faced with a major job of playing

catch-up baseball. The glove-work of Nettles and Randolph did not make the task any easier.

In the fifth, Randolph made a tough short-hop stop on Rick Monday and threw him out. It saved a run because the next batter, Steve Yeager, reached Guidry for a home run.

"I got a good jump on it," said Randolph. "The timing was right and I had the good hands to make that play. The ball was knuckling and sinking but with my good range, I could stand up and make that play. I've made that play before."

In the seventh, with the score still 5-1, Ron Cey opened with a shot into the left field corner. He tried to stretch the hit into a double and Winfield cut him down. Lasorda wasn't thrilled with that development.

"You can't get thrown out with nobody out when you're down 5-1," the Dodger manager said.

That would be the last chance Los Angeles would get at Guidry. When he came into the dugout after the inning, Lemon was waiting.

"He said, 'Good job. Take a shower,'" Guidry said. "I didn't get a chance to say anything. You don't argue with the manager."

It was a familiar pattern. With flame-throwing Ron Davis and Rich Gossage waiting.

Series Heroics New To Watson

NEW YORK (AP) — They are both 13-year major league veterans but World Series heroics are new to Bob Watson, while Graig Nettles has been there before.

The two old pros — Watson, a 35-year-old first baseman, and Nettles, a 37-year-old third baseman — teamed up with bat and glove Tuesday night to help the New York Yankees defeat the Los Angeles Dodgers 5-3 in the first game of the 1981 World Series.

There was something old and something new. Nettles, just as he did in the pivotal third game of the 1978 Series, put his magic glove on display with a pair of sensational fielding gems.

"It brought back some memories, a sense of deja vu," he said.

Watson, meanwhile, became the 17th player to hit a home run in his first World Series at-bat, a three-run shot off Jerry Reuss with two out in the first inning that put the Dodgers in a hole from which they never escaped.

"My knees were shaking," Watson said. "I had butterflies. I was nervous. However, I had the presence of mind to know what I wanted to do."

Nettles gave the Dodgers a taste of both the past (1978) and the future (the eighth inning) to start the game. He back-handed Davey Lopes' smash with a dive, floated gracefully to his feet and nipped the runner at first with a perfect throw.

"I took three or four hits away from him in 1978 and another in last year's All-Star Game," Nettles said. "I was kidding him before the game and I asked him if he was going to pick on me again. He said, 'No, I'm gonna go the other way.'"

After the first inning, Lopes did. But Steve Garvey, the Dodgers' cleanup hitter, didn't. Garvey represented the potential tying run when he came up in the eighth inning to face New York relief ace Rich Gossage.

Starter Ron Guidry allowed one run and four hits in seven innings before giving way to Ron Davis. But, Davis walked the first two batters in the eighth and Gossage yielded a run-scoring single to pinch hitter Jay Johnstone and a sacrifice fly to Dusty Baker.

Garvey drilled a line drive toward the left field corner. It never got there. Nettles, who has the reflexes of a cat and the glove of a cat burglar, committed highway robbery. With a dive that would have done Nureyev proud, he made a back-handed catch for the second out and the Dodgers were done.

Miami Booter Started Out Kicking Through Banana Trees

University of Miami coach Harold Schnellenberger studied the situation on the field: fourth and 14 at the Florida 38. Then he gazed upward at the Orange Bowl scoreboard: Florida 20, Miami 18 with 45 seconds left.

It was time to make a decision, but Schnellenberger was having a hard time of it. Not so, Miami kicker Danny Miller.

"The coach had called time out and was trying to decide what pass play to call," Miller said. "All along I thought we were going for a field goal and finally when the timeout was

just about over I went over and asked Coach Schnellenberger what was going on.

"He asked me if I could make it and I said, 'Yeah, it's just 55 yards.' He said, 'Then go on out and kick it.'"

Which is just what Miller did. Sort of. "I knew it was long enough as soon as I kicked it," Miller said. "But I was afraid I pulled it too far to the left."

The kick did hook to the left, hitting the left upright and then tumbling through the upright for the field goal that gave Miami a 21-20 win over the then 17th-ranked Gators.

"I never saw it hit the upright. I saw the officials raise their arms and I knew it was good," Miller said in a telephone interview from Miami Tuesday afternoon. "That was probably the biggest field goal and the most dramatic I've ever kicked."

It was not, however, the first to decide a game. Three times Miller's foot has meant the difference between a win and a loss, a factor that East Carolina coach Ed Emory is well aware of as his Pirates prepare to meet the Hurricanes Saturday afternoon in Ficklen Stadium.

Last year Miller kicked three field goals, of 36, 33 and 41 to help Miami defeat East Carolina, 23-10 in the Orange Bowl. The Hurricanes entered last

year's game having lost three straight games and the victory was the start of a five-game winning streak that ended with Miami defeating Virginia Tech, 20-10, in the Peach Bowl.

This year Miami enters the game with a 3-2 record. The Hurricanes won their first two games this season before losing to then top-ranked Texas, 14-7, a game in which Miami had one touchdown called back because of a penalty.

The Hurricanes second defeat — a 14-10 loss to Mississippi State last week — was just as disheartening. Late in that game the Hurricanes scored the go-ahead touchdown only to have it called back because of an illegal motion penalty.

The loss was not made any easier to accept when the AP

and UPI polls came out on Tuesday. The defeat dropped the Hurricanes out of the top 20 after having been ranked 13th the previous week. Meanwhile, Mississippi State jumped from 16th to ninth.

"I don't worry about the polls," Miller said, not unex-

pectedly. "It's nice to be up there in the rankings, but the only poll I care about is the final one."

Having once achieved a top 20 ranking, Miller was asked whether the Hurricanes might be looking past the Pirates to

Rose Now Sixth In AP Prep Poll

The season-long pattern in The Associated Press poll of North Carolina high school football teams has been reversed this week, with the 3A division involved in a shakeup.

Much of the season, the 4A and 2A-1A divisions have been altered regularly, but those portions of the poll remained fairly stable this week.

Instead, losses by the teams ranked second and third in last week's voting by a statewide panel of sportswriters paved the way for a new look in 3A.

Burlington Williams remained on top, where it has been all season. Williams totaled 13 of 22 first-place votes and 189 of a possible 220 points.

Clinton advanced two notches to second (with three first-place votes and 176 points), and Kannapolis A.L. Brown gained two spots to third.

Kannapolis was a 4A power last season but dropped to the 3A ranks this year.

The changes were the result of losses Friday by Boone Watauga and Lincolnton.

Watauga lost 7-0 to West Caldwell and fell from second to 12th. West Caldwell advanced from 12th to eighth this week. Lincolnton fell 20-7 to Statesville and dropped from third to 13th. Statesville jumped from ninth to sixth this week.

In addition to Williams and Clinton, four other schools in 3A got first-place votes this week — fourth-ranked Pikeville C.B. Aycock, Statesville, seventh-rated Brevard and ninth-ranked South Rowan.

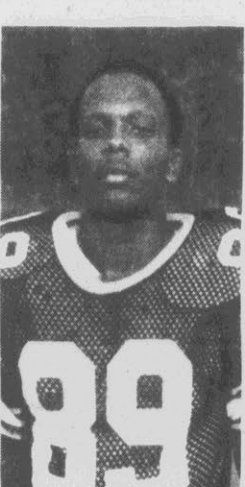

A-G, Jags, N. Pitt Away; DHC Home

Three weeks still remain in the 1981 high school football regular season, but for many teams — including all but one area 3-A team — the state playoffs are nothing but a dream.

Only Ayden-Grifton has a shot at making the state playoffs — and the Chargers best chance comes via the new Division I and Division II playoff format. Under the new system, the ECC champion will compete in the Division I playoff and the runner-up in the Division II playoff.

The Chargers are 5-2 overall and 3-1 in the Eastern Carolina Conference, trailing Charles B. Aycock and Southwest Edgecombe, both of whom are unbeaten in league play.

Ayden-Grifton has already lost to the Falcons but will play the Cougars at home on the last Friday of the regular season, a game that could determine the league's second playoff representative.

Other than the Chargers, however, the rest of the area teams have long been out of the playoff hunt.

Still, the teams must finish up the season and for a number of teams wins in their remaining games could spell the difference between a good season, an average season or a bad season.

Farmville Central (4-4-0, 1-3-0), will be looking for its second ECC victory of the season and a chance to go over the .500 mark when the Jaguars travel to Southern Nash (1-2-0, 1-6-0) Friday night.

North Pitt (2-6-0, 0-4-0) travels to Southwest Edgecombe (5-2-0, 3-0-0) looking to upset the Cougars while D.H. Conley (1-6-0, 0-2-0) entertains North Lenoir (2-5-0, 1-1-0) hoping to avoid a second straight one-win season.

Greene Central (4-3-0, 1-2-0) journeys to Charles B. Aycock (7-0-0, 3-0-0) hoping to play the spoiler.

In other games, Roanoke (6-2-0, 4-2-0) plays host to Williamston (3-4-0, 2-3-0) in a Northeastern Conference battle. Jamesville (3-5-0, 2-4-0) has an open date.

In games last week, Ayden-Grifton rolled by North Pitt, 35-16, White Oak whipped D.H. Conley, 35-6, Charles B. Aycock edged Farmville Central, 21-6, Roanoke upended Tarboro, 8-7, Roanoke Rapids routed Williamston, 47-12, and Midway clobbered Jamesville, 35-12.

Farmville Central is sitting on the edge. Two wins in the Jaguars final two games would give first-year coach Gilbert Carroll a winning record. Two losses and the Jaguars go home with their second straight losing season.

Carroll, of course, hopes for the latter. "I really want to win these two games bad," Carroll said. "Being 6-4 would be dang good for us with what we've had this year."

It won't be easy, however. The Jaguars' last two games are on the road, starting with Southern Nash this week and ending with Greene Central next Friday.

The Firebirds are Carroll's immediate concern. "They've got the toughest schedule in the league," Carroll said. "They've played four 4-A

teams and I'd hate to think where we'd be if we'd played those four teams."

Southern Nash won the ECC crown last year but lost some 20 players and a coach off that squad. Despite that, the Firebirds have managed to remain one of the best three or four teams in the league this season.

"They have a good football team," Carroll said. "They're big and they got some quickness in the backfield. Those are their two biggest assets."

Southern Nash, who has former North Pitt head coach Pat Smith on the coaching staff as an assistant, run a I formation on offense and a 5-2 and a 6-1 on defense.

The Firebirds also have the league's #1 punter in Terry Best, who is averaging 40 yards a kick this season. But what worries Carroll most is being on the road.

"Having to play over there bothers me," Carroll said. "We haven't had anything controversial go our way on the road all season."

Then, too, there is the Jaguars quarterback situation. Senior Jeff Cutler threw three interceptions and fumbled twice in the Jaguars 21-6 loss to Charles B. Aycock last week.

Carroll is unsure whether Cutler or sophomore James Streeter will start this week.

Ayden-Grifton, taking a week off from the ECC wars, journeys into unknown territory Friday night when the Chargers travel to Lakewood.

"We're not that familiar with them, but they're not that familiar with us either," Ayden-Grifton coach Dixon Sauls said. "This is the longest trip of the season for us — it's unusual for us to have this long a trip — and we'll have to see how we react to the trip."

Lakewood, located near Clinton, is a two and a half hour bus ride from Littlefield. The Leopards, 4-3 this season, ended a two-game losing streak last week with a 28-25 victory over South Lenoir in overtime.

The Leopards use the wishbone on offense and a 5-2 on defense and blitz, according to Sauls, nearly 50 percent of the time.

"They're larger than us — quite a bit so at some positions," Sauls said. "But we're much quicker."

The game is a nonconference game — the first for Ayden-Grifton since the fourth week of the season — and comes in the middle of a six-game stretch that includes five ECC games.

"Honestly, we play every game to win and we don't look at it as a nonconference game versus a conference game," Sauls said. "We'd just like to win the ball game."

"We've got to guard against a letdown," he added. "We're playing with much more consistency now and at this stage of the season we need to continue winning and we hope to continue building momentum."

The Chargers appear to be doing just that. Ayden-Grifton has won five of its last six games. The latest victory was a 35-16 victory over North Pitt, a win that gave A-G a sweep of its three Pitt County opponents.

"Our first unit defense controlled the line of scrimmage.

O'Roark Quits Football Team

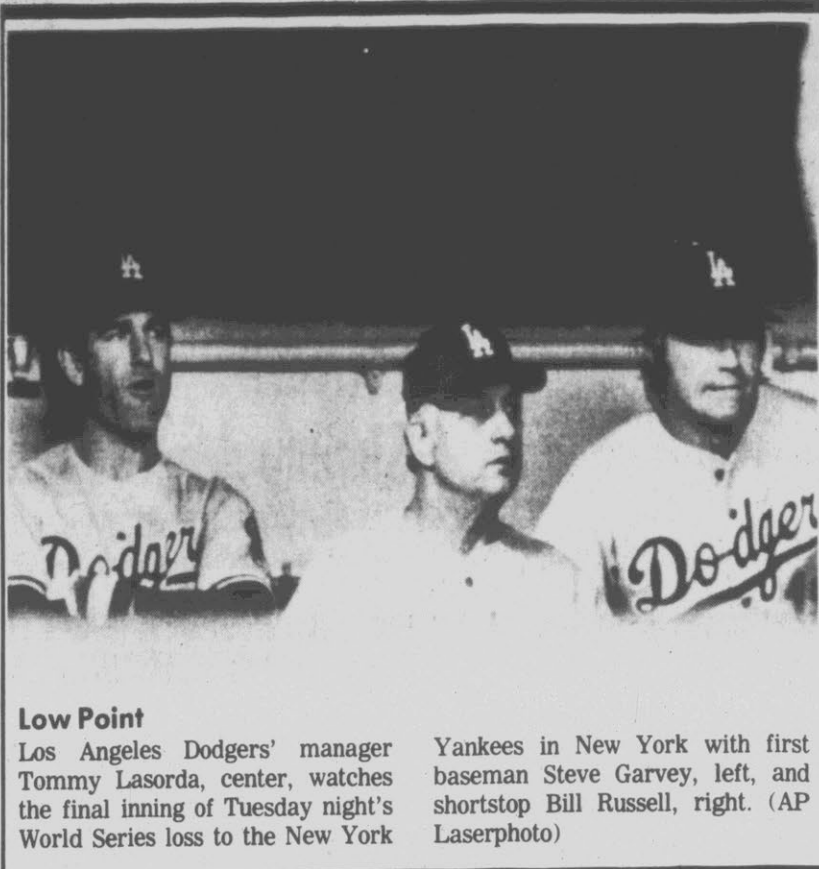
Larry O'Roark, a 6-0, 185-pound junior from Centreville, Va., has left the East Carolina University football team, it was announced.

'Pack Gives UNC Some Answers

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP)—Third-ranked North Carolina had not trailed any opponent through its first five games.

That bothered coach Dick Crum, who wondered how his team would react when it did fall behind. He found out last Saturday.

After one half of play against North Carolina State last Saturday, the Tar Heels trailed 10-0, but bounced back for a 21-10 victory. That extended the Tar Heels' winning streak to six games this season and 10 dating back to last year.

"It certainly answered some questions about us," Crum said Tuesday during his weekly news conference. "I was very pleased with the way we responded."

Crum admitted that North Carolina had some trouble developing its offense in the first half, but, "We didn't necessarily play a lot better in the second half. We just put some things together and the defense kept them off the board."

The controversial outside kick that N.C. State tried to open the second half had been much maligned by fans and some of

the media, especially since North Carolina recovered and went on to score. But Crum call it "an intelligent call."

Wolfpack coach Monte Kiffin has maintained from what he had picked up in films, it had a 95 percent chance of working. But his kicker did not kick it right.

Crum agreed with Kiffin and disagreed that it was the turning point of the game.

"They had us," Crum said. "Our man did what they predicted."

What that man did was turn his back on the play, to which Crum quickly added, "I bet he doesn't make that mistake again."

The real turning point, Crum said, was the punt blocked by defensive back Walter Black.

"After we got into the end zone, they had to score more than one touchdown. In my opinion, that was the turning point."

South Carolina will be the next test for the Tar Heels.

"They are a very good defensive football team," Crum said. "We will have a tough time controlling the ball."

Questioned about a possible emotional letdown after the victory over archrival N.C. State, Crum downplayed it.

"It wasn't a great emotional

game for us," he said. "Our kids weren't jumping up and down. On the bus we just sat and ate our sandwiches. They didn't go bananas."

ing in the bullpen, complete games are rare for the Yankees.

"I have no qualms about being a seven-inning pitcher," said Guidry. "With Davis and Gossage out there — two guys who can throw harder than you — you let them carry you through."

Davis got the call but had trouble with his control and walked the first two Dodgers in the eighth. Gossage came in and set the stage for the play of the game.

After pinch hitter Jay Johnstone singled for one run, Dusty Baker delivered a sacrifice fly, making it 5-3. That brought up Steve Garvey, who smashed a 3-1 pitch on a line toward the left field corner. Nettles made a corkscrew, back-handed grab that bordered on the miraculous. The rally was over.

"A play like that takes the steam out of them," said Nettles. "You can sense the let-down on the other team's bench. To hit the ball so hard and get nothing out of it."

Garvey was hardly surprised at the play.

"I just hit it as hard as I could," he said. "I thought if I hit it with a little less velocity, it would have gone by him. He's been making that kind of play for years, so there really isn't much I can do about it."

Nettles was not guarding the line on Garvey and that made the stab even harder.

"I was playing the situa-

tion," the veteran third baseman said. "Goose was behind on the count and I wasn't really protecting the line. Garvey can pull anybody."

Nettles' play was all the help Gossage needed. He retired the next four batters easily to wrap up the first-game victory.

Afterward, Lasorda was still marveling over the Yankee defense.

"Between Randolph and Nettles, they made six great plays out there," he said. "That guy (Nettles) is amazing. Does he do that all the time? I get sick to my stomach

seeing him make those plays all the time. He must go to bed hoping and praying he can kill us with his glove."

The Dodgers are down, but this team has been playing comeback throughout the post season. They lost the first two games to Houston before sweeping three straight to win the NL West Division playoff. Then had to win two straight in Montreal to take the league title. So Lasorda viewed Tuesday night's game as little more than a momentary setback.

"Heck, we were down 0-2 in a five-game series and now

we're only down one game in the best of seven," he said. "All it means is that we lost the first game."

The Dodgers will try to get even tonight with Burt Hooton, most valuable player in the League Championship Series, pitching against Tommy John for the Yankees. Nettles and his glove will again be at third base for New York. Lemon has a simple suggestion for how Los Angeles might deal with Nettles.

"They really ought to stop hitting it to him," he said.

Penn State, Miami's next foe. "I don't see how we can, considering what happened last week," Miller said. "You've got to always be careful and I just can't see us having a letdown."

"I think everybody on the team realizes that we're two penalties away from being undefeated and everybody wants to make sure that kind of thing doesn't happen again."

Miller has done his share of helping the Hurricanes win. As a freshman he hit a last-minute field goal to beat then nationally-ranked Auburn, 17-15. This year Miller hit four field goals to lift Miami past Houston, 12-7.

Miller, a starter since deciding to attend Miami instead of Florida, holds five individual school records. In his four years at Miami Miller has hit 60 of 62 extra points and 47 of 69 field goals. This season he is seven of seven on extra points and nine of 13 on field goals.

A soccer style kicker, Miller learned the art of kicking as a youngster in Clewiston, Fla., a small town on Lake Okechobee.

"I started out by watching the pros (Jan) Stenerud, (Garo) Yapremian. On Sunday afternoon I'd watch them kick and then go out in my backyard and imitate them."

"I never played soccer. Around Clewiston soccer was a foreign game. I guess part of it was the novelty of it. That, and it seemed much more natural to hit the ball with the side of my foot rather than to come straight on and hit it with my toe."

When he practiced in those early years, more often than not he would take his football and wander into his neighbor's backyard where two banana trees bent to form nature's version of a goalpost.

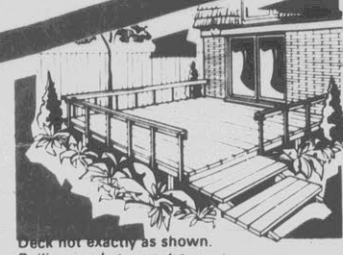
"It was just somewhere I could kick when I was learning how," Miller said. "I would kick between them — I used the banana trees as goalposts."

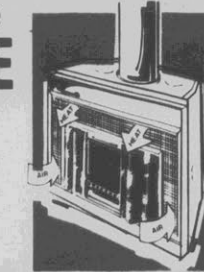

The New York Islanders were in their sixth game without a loss. John Paul Kelly was in his sixth game without a three-goal game.

When the Islanders and Los Angeles Kings left the Nassau Coliseum ice Tuesday night, the defending Stanley Cup champions no longer were unbeaten and Kelly no longer was in search of a hat trick.

The Kings used a four-goal third period to outlast the Islanders 9-6. According to Islanders Coach Al Arbour, the Islanders didn't even do that much.

"I had a feeling my guys were only concerned about how many goals they were going to get against this team," said Arbour. "They didn't give a darn about anything else. I hope they know the past doesn't count. It's the present and future."

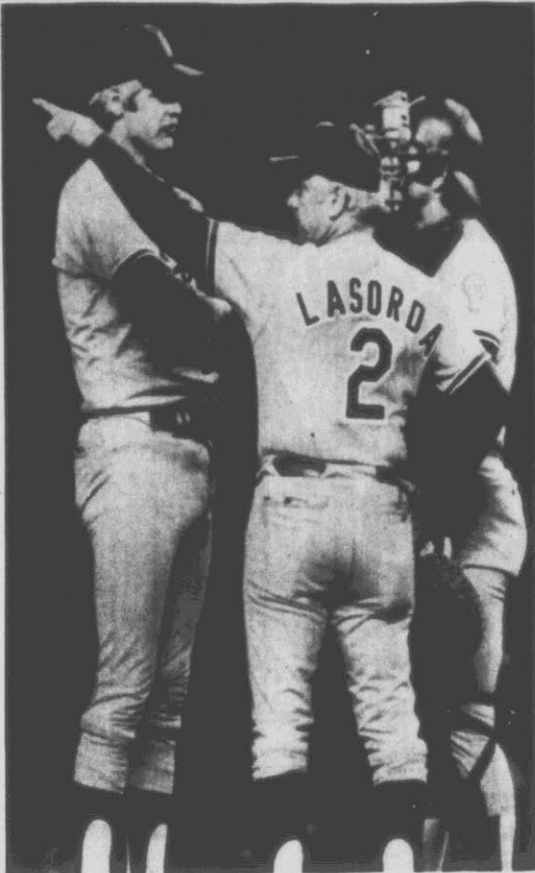
Ridgcroft added two more in the second half, by Eric Joyner and Jeff Futrell, with Chris Harris scoring the lone Knight goal late in the game.

Guidry: Don't Break Up Yanks

NEW YORK (AP) — Ron Guidry has issued a plaintive appeal to his boss, George Steinbrenner: "Don't break up the Yankees."

"I know it isn't for me or anyone else on the team to say, but this is a great ballclub just as it is," said the fireballing Louisiana left-hander, winner of Tuesday night's opening World Series game against the Los Angeles Dodgers. "It would be a shame if these fellows didn't stay together."

"There are a lot of fine players with good years left and I am sure that most of them, like me, would like to stay in New York."

Guidry allowed only four hits over seven innings, striking out six and allowing only one baserunner beyond second base in the Yankees' 5-3 victory. Catcher Steve Yeager sailed a ball into the right field stands in the fifth inning.

Guidry, 31, is among a small knot of veteran Yankees who are playing out their contract with no definite assurance of being resigned next season.

Steinbrenner, iconoclastic

owner of baseball's most successful franchise, has indicated that some of the team's biggest names may not be back in pinstripes in 1982.

Besides Guidry, these include first baseman Bob Watson, a 35-year-old veteran; controversial Reggie Jackson, 35; outfielder Lou Piniella, 38, and the flashy, dependable Graig Nettles, 37.

Watson slammed a three-run homer in the first inning to give the Yankees a cushion. Piniella rapped out two hits and Nettles performed his old magic at third base, making two spectacular stabs to keep the Dodgers docile.

Guidry acknowledged that he was very anxious to remain a Yankee although he has not had any encouraging gestures from the Steinbrenner suite.

"Mr. Steinbrenner hasn't talked to me about next year," Guidry said. "Probably he has been busy with a lot of things. Maybe everything will work out after the series, but I just don't know."

A 25-game winner in 1978 and a stalwart of the staff in 1979 and 1980, the hard-throwing

Louisiana native had an 11-5 record for the fractured 1981 season.

Some critics have said he has begun to lose his stuff, but Guidry vigorously denies this and insists that he is as good a pitcher as in 1978 when his 1.74 earned run average was the lowest by a major league left-hander since Sandy Koufax in 1966.

"In 1978 I was throwing the ball at 95 and 96 miles per hour," the Yankee ace said. "Now I am moving the ball at about 92 and 93 mph. But I have learned to harness my power and am able to come through with the big pitch when I need it."

"You might say I am not as fast but am much smarter. I feel I have five more good years in this left arm. That's how long I plan to pitch and after that I will hang it up and do things that I really like. I

will devote more time to my family."

Guidry is so confident of his ability to continue at a top-rate level that he and his Lafayette,

La, hometown agent are reported to have asked Steinbrenner for a five-year contract totalling \$7.5 million.

Is Bambi Or The Beast Taking Over New York?

NEW YORK (AP) — Is George Bamberger a soft-spoken sort inclined to be a cheerleader on the bench, as he says he is? Or is he a strict disciplinarian who lets you know who's boss, as described by his new boss, Frank Cashen?

The truth probably lies somewhere between these two extremes. And it will be up to the New York Mets' players whether they are managed by Bambi or the Beast.

"They probably will find they are playing for the easiest individual they ever met," Bamberger said Tuesday at a news conference to announce his appointment as the Mets' ninth manager. "As long as they don't take kindness for weakness, they will be all right."

That final sentence may have been a subtle warning for the Mets, who have been known to play far below expectations in recent summers, and it was quickly underscored by Cashen, the National League club's executive vice-president and general manager.

"Bambi says he's an easy-going guy, but you'll be surprised. He can be a disciplinarian, too," Cashen said.

Bamberger brings a winning record as major-league coach and manager to the job left vacant when Joe Torre was fired on the final day of the regular season.

After a one-year stint as a pitcher for the New York Giants (0-0 record), Bamberger joined the Baltimore Orioles as a minor-league pitching coach and joined the parent club in the same position in 1968.

While in charge of the Orioles' staff, he produced 18 20-game winners as the Orioles won the American League pennant in 1969, '70 and '71, when the Birds had a major-league-record four pitchers with 20 or more wins.

He left Baltimore in 1977 to manage the Milwaukee Brewers, and guided them to their first winning seasons ever in 1978 and '79. The following spring, he suffered a minor heart attack and underwent heart bypass surgery, returning to the bench in June. But he retired in September of that year, and since then has been a scout and minor-league administrator for the Brewers.

It would have been a lifetime proposition, but the 56-year-old

New York native could not resist the lure of his hometown.

"This was probably the toughest decision I ever had to make," Bamberger said. "But I decided to come back for three main reasons.

"One, it's the Big Apple. It's the biggest, most exciting city in the world. Two, I'm from New York. And three, I know Frank, I know (assistant general manager) Lou Gorman, I know (administrative assistant) Al Harazin." Cashen, Gorman and Harazin all were with the Orioles.

Bamberger said he had turned down two other managerial offers, and doubted "very much" that he would have returned to the task if it had been anywhere but New York.

"It's a challenge to manage, and to manage in New York is the ultimate challenge," he said. "I've been competitive all my life, and I really wanted the challenge of a New York job."

Bamberger, who will wear No. 31, signed a one-year contract with the Mets, although both he and Cashen said the pact could have been as long as three years if he had wanted it.

"I don't want to be paid if I fail," Bamberger said.

Financial terms of the contract were not disclosed, but Bamberger reportedly will be paid \$220,000.

"I understand he was the highest-paid manager in baseball when he was at Milwaukee, and I assume he'll be the highest-paid here," Cashen said.

N.C. Votes In Congress

ROLL CALL REPORT SERVICE

WASHINGTON — Here's how area House members were recorded on major roll call votes after returning from the Columbus Day recess. There were no Senate votes.

AWACS — The House voted, 301 for and 111 against, in opposition to the Administration's proposed sale of five AWACS and other military equipment to Saudi Arabia. The senate has yet to vote on whether to sell the surveillance and command aircraft to the Saudis. A negative vote there will kill \$8.5 billion arms deal unless President Reagan uses executive powers and circumvents Congress.

Rep. Mario Biaggi, D-N.Y., a supporter of killing the sale, said: "To permit this sale is to crack the very

foundation of the bond which ties the U.S. and Israel together — a bond of mutual security, defense and cooperation."

Opponent Clement Zablocki, D-Wisc., said the sale "contributes to Israel's security by increasing Saudi defense capabilities against direct or indirect Soviet threats, while preserving Israel's significant military edge over all of its neighbors."

Members voting "yea" opposed the AWACS sale.

Reps. Stephen Neal, D-5, W.G. Hefner, D-8, James Martin, R-9, and William Hendon, R-11, voted "yea."

Reps. L.H. Fountain, D-2, Charles Whitley, D-3, Ike Andrews, D-4, Eugene Johnston, R-6, Charles Rose, D-7, and James Brohyll,

R-10, voted "nay."

Rep. Walter Jones, D-1, did not vote.

MILK SUPPORTS — The House rejected, 153 for and 255 against, an amendment setting a less expensive dairy price support program. This marked the second time in two weeks the House rejected a milk support program advocated by President Reagan and the Senate but opposed by dairy farmers. Left intact by the vote is a program the Administration says will cost \$5 million dollars more than it wants to spend between fiscal 1982-85 in dairy price supports. Some dairy spokesmen dispute that figure. The vote occurred during debate on the new four-year farm bill (HR 3603).

Sponsor Paul Findley,

R-III., said, "I believe our country, our president, our Congress (are) committed to a budget restraint" and he disliked any program under which "dairy farmers can produce without limits and get price supports."

Opponent Tom Harkin, D-Iowa, said, "If we have to get the dairy farmer to produce less, of course the answer is 'yes.' But we do not do it with a massive gutting of the program" as proposed in the Findley amendment.

Members voting "yea" favored a less expensive dairy price support program. Johnston, Martin and Brohyll voted "yea."

Fountain, Whitley, Andrews, Neal, Rose, Hefner and Hendon voted "nay." Jones did not vote.

Meteor Shower

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) — A shower of meteors is expected to light the skies over North Carolina Wednesday night providing the weather cooperates, the Morehead Planetarium said Tuesday.

Peak date for the display, known as the Orionids meteor shower, is Wednesday. It began Monday and will continue through Friday.

Terri Gipson, senior intern at the planetarium, said viewers can expect up to 25 meteors an hour. She said they will be bright and of short duration.

The best time to see the meteors is after midnight, before the moon rises.

She said the shower is named Orionids because the meteors appear to be coming out of the constellation Orion, the hunter, which appears about 10 p.m. in the west-southwest skies.

Meteors are generally caused when dust or small particles from space enter the Earth's atmosphere, she said.

Revivals At Adult Store

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — The adult book store once bore a sign in red letters saying, "Do not enter if offended by nudity or the human body." But behind the white door these days there's a mural of Jesus Christ.

The Chapman Highway Adult Book Shop has been turned into the Pentecostal Revival Center. There are pews where projection booths stood. Stained-glass windows decorate the front double doors, and the scarlet letters on the side entrance are hidden by white paint.

There's a steeple on the roof.

"From darkness to light," said the Rev. William Bryant.

Congregation members met in Bryant's home for several months while they searched for a church building. Church member Howard Pennell said he found the abandoned book store after seeing it in a dream.

"We'd been praying for months and months for a place," Pennell said. "It came to me one night in a vision. I saw a building in the vision that looked like this one. I knew it was on Chapman Highway, so I drove until I found it."

Glen Pennell said some people had come by, opened the door and looked in while the church members were resurrecting the building.

"They come to see pictures," he said, gesturing toward the mural of Jesus, "but not like this one."



'Weasel Creek' Amusing But Stupid

NEW YORK (AP) — "A Few Days at Weasel Creek"

starts off nicely as a warm, offbeat road movie about two opposites attacting while chasing different dreams.

But then it takes a bad turn halfway through and crashes in a thicket of strange behavior and some shootings that come out of nowhere. "Weasel Creek," a two-hour TV movie on CBS tonight, is based on a book by Joanna Brent. The movie is worthwhile for half the trip on the strength of engaging performances by Jane Winingham and John Hammond. He's Beldon Stokes, running away from a dead-end farm life in rural Georgia to become a crop duster in Texas. She's Locksley Claitor, a roadie using her companionship to reach California and respectability.

He has a pickup truck; she has a camper — a marriage made on the highway. "I'm real good company," she

says, trying to persuade him to hitch her camper to his wheels. There's a cute scene when Locksley, acting kitenish, strikes a pose to pass his inspection.

She does, and young love soon blossoms in the camper. They're not all that much alike, except they both dream to be different. She's experienced sexually; he's not. She's attracted by family; he wants no ties.

Hammond displays an energetic adolescence in his first starring role. Miss Winingham is a charmer with a strong streak of vulnerability, which doesn't jibe totally with the feisty girl CBS' press releases say she's playing. Because they aren't household names, Colleen Dewhurst is thrown into the mix, making an appearance that doesn't have much meat to it.

Beldon and Locksley — can you see those names carved in a heart? — are supposed to be traveling through the South to Texas, where he has relatives. But there's very little Southern drawl to the proceedings. It's filmed entirely in California.

Still, their experiences as an unmarried couple in transit are amusing, and this would have been a harmless piece of entertainment, the kind TV can churn out almost at will. But then it gets stupid.

Tonight's other original programming, "The Hunter and the Hunted" on PBS, is a documentary about the pursuit of Nazi war criminals 35 years later. Its content makes for a compelling hour, but a confusing format makes the broadcast a bit incoherent.

With narrator Jose Ferrer creating the appropriate seriousness, the broadcast tracks three men: Josef Mengele, the "Angel of

Death," Klaus Barbie, the "Butcher of Lyon," and Walter Rauff, the creator of mobile gas chambers.

Mengele used the concentration camps for human experiments, injecting blue dye into children's eyes, surgically transforming men into women. Mengele was traced to Paraguay. In 1979, his citizenship was forfeited, under pressure from the U.S. Congress and famous Nazi hunter, Simon Wiesenthal.

"He's not sleeping more than two weeks in the same bed," said Wiesenthal. "That's part of his punishment." Wiesenthal's motivation is noteworthy. He says that he could give up the chase for himself, but not for the dead millions. Also, he sees it as a warning for future murderers that there will always be hunters. And also always murderers. "The history of man is the history of crimes."

The most dramatic scene involves a stakeout of Rauff's son's house in Chile. It pays off when the old man drops by. He is confronted by Bill Bemerster, the documentary's reporter. Although it's difficult to connect this slow-walking man with the deeds of 35 years ago, the grisly footage of war atrocities quickly removes any sympathetic inclination.

Salute Actress In Washington

WASHINGTON (AP) — It was "Helen Hayes Day" in Washington, and the honored guest at the unveiling of a portrait of the actress, which will hang in the National Theater's Helen Hayes Lobby, was as sprightly as ever at the age of 81.

Miss Hayes, who was born in Washington and made her first stage appearance here in a comedy 75 years ago, was honored Tuesday by the National Theater, where she saw her first play — and fell in love with the theater — at the age of 5.

"I was sitting up in that balcony with my mother," Miss Hayes said, squinting and pointing upward from the floodlit stage.

"It was 'The Merry Widow,' and when the curtain fell and my mother got up to go, I sprawled across my seat and said, 'I don't want to leave this theater, I won't go.' I thought that if I stayed it would start over."

"You know, I never left the theater after that."

The portrait by Furman Finck will hang permanently in the National, the oldest legitimate theater in continual operation in the country.

Mayor Marion Barry proclaimed Tuesday for the actress, who is honorary chairman of the National's board, and Miss Hayes had tea with Nancy Reagan at the White House before the ceremony.

Dancing By Betty Ford

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Betty Ford at first thought the idea of her doing a soft-shoe routine on TV was a joke — hardly surprising, since the suggestion came from comedian Bob Hope.

But he was serious, and the former first lady rose to the occasion: After a few rehearsals, she and Hope did the dance perfectly the first time the cameras were rolling. The NBC special, taped a few weeks ago at the Gerald R. Ford Presidential Museum at Grand Rapids, Mich., will be shown Thursday night.

"I had never dreamed of doing anything like that," Mrs. Ford said in a telephone interview from her Palm Springs home.

Mrs. Ford, who had a brief dance career in her youth, said Hope suggested the dance as a surprise for her husband, former President Gerald R. Ford, as part of the recent dedication of Ford Museum.

"Bob Hope said, 'Since this is honoring your husband, why don't we surprise him and do a little soft shoe?'" Mrs. Ford recalled. "I went along with the joke, I thought, not taking it too seriously."

Maya Canal Net Insured Ample Food

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Radar devised for the study of Venus has turned up evidence that could solve a mystery of Mayan culture, according to a team of scientists.

An aerial survey with the space-age device penetrated clouds and dense tropical canopy to reveal irregular grids that the scientists say represent prehistoric canals.

Mayas were crafting great pyramids and sculpting stone temples in Central America while barbarians still ravaged Europe, but the swampy, tangled jungle that engulfs most of the Mayan lowlands made scientists wonder how a population estimated at up to 14 million could have grown enough food.

Even if Mayas practiced the same, crude farming technique known as slash and burn that many of their descendants still use today, the land they had seemed insufficient to fuel the Mayan civilization that produced such a sophisticated religion, calendar and astronomical theory.

Slash and burn consists of clearing and torching swaths of jungle, farming there a few years until the soil loses fertility and then moving on.

Now, say scientists at the Universities of Texas and Arizona as well as the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, radar imagery of northern Belize and the Tikal and Rio de la Pasion zones in neighboring Guatemala show evidence that more than 950 square miles of swampland, were drained by the ancient agricultural engineers.

The raised land, most of it reclaimed later by the jungle, was used for corn, squash and beans, according to University of Arizona anthropologist T. Patrick Culbert and his co-workers, Dr. Richard Adams of the University of Texas and Dr. W.E. Brown Jr. of the Jet Propulsion Lab.

Writing in the journal Science last month, the three said "the idea that the Maya were cultivating vast swamps, which constitute up to 40 percent of the land surface in some zones, has met resistance."

Some of the ancient channels that were found by radar have been confirmed on the ground.

Dr. Peter Harrison of the University of New Mexico and Dr. Billy Lee Turner of Clark University in Worcester, Mass., have said they found in Pulltrouser Swamp, near the Caribbean in northern Belize "a coincidence of what we know to be on the ground and what is visible in the radar."

"The borders of the swamp are completely lined with raised fields," Harrison explained in an interview.

Still unresolved is what caused the rapid and near-complete collapse of Mayan civilization around 800 A.D.

There was "very extensive depopulation," Culbert said. "I personally would estimate that 90 percent of the population disappeared. Explaining that is a difficult thing."

"With this new data, we may have to rethink the idea that food shortages might have been a critical factor."

At the same time, the size and complexity of the culture may have made it vulnerable, Culbert said.

"The more sophisticated a system is, the more carefully it must be managed," he said. "The fields and canals would have to have been maintained. There has to be administration."

"And if the administration fails, the whole system can fail."

Land In Texas Spirals In Cost

GIDDINGS, Texas (AP) — Land that leased for \$18 an acre four years ago now leases for as much as \$600 an acre in this area.

The 1,000 square miles of land between Austin and Houston have become one of the busiest drilling areas in the U.S. There were nine wells in 1977, with more than 900 now.

The land is crisscrossed with pipelines that connect wells to seven gas processing plants set up since 1977. The newest one near here is being built by Phillips Petroleum.

Chess Is An Obsession To Russians

MOSCOW (AP) — In Russia, chess is not a hobby. It's an obsession.

While Americans chug beer in the ballparks, almost everyone here is following the world chess championship in Merano, Italy, where Anatoly Karpov, a Soviet, is defending his title against Viktor Korchnoi, a Soviet exile whose family also is trying to leave Russia.

In Moscow, the series is not only considered a top-ranking world sports event but a political grudge match between a man praised as a Soviet hero and another vilified for "betraying his motherland."

The eighth game of the Merano match, postponed by Karpov on Monday, resumes Thursday. Karpov is ahead 3-1 in the tournament. The first player to win six games takes the title and \$260,000 in prize money. The loser receives \$160,000. Draws don't count; there have been three so far in the Merano match.

Special news bulletins are rushed onto Moscow television at the conclusion of each match. The Central Chess Club is packed when Soviet grandmasters analyze the games on giant demonstration boards and locals say debate about the series is growing in proportion to the amount of money wagered on it.

Interest is so high that a Soviet sports editor recently complained of constant telephone calls from people clamoring for the chess results.

Soviets are aware that foreigners often have difficulty understanding the passion here for chess, a game the sports editor lovingly referred to as a "world of wooden pieces, where you can forget everything else."

The Russians have dominated international chess competition for more than 50 years.

Some Westerners claim Russian players receive better training, perhaps at one of the nation's three chess schools. Others say they have better tacticians and theoreticians. Some even insist that the weather plays a part.

Holland's Max Euwe, a one-time world chess champion and later president of the International Chess Federation, reasoned that the long, often bitter Russian winter helps produce better players by forcing everyone indoors.

Euwe also claimed Soviet players get more support from their government than players elsewhere. "In Russia," he said, "if you have talent, it will be protected, nurtured. If you have talent in the United States, you may lose it because some day you will have to say, 'I have to make a living.'"

Karpov is formally employed as a magazine editor, but he and many other Soviet players are said to be compensated for the time they compete at international tournaments.

Another factor contributing to Soviet success could be the early age at which Russians learn the game. "I started to teach my son and daughter when they were 6, and they are playing quite well now. Another boy on the same floor of our apartment building plays too and the children organize tournaments among themselves," said one Soviet.

Pizzas Big In Supermarkets

NEW YORK (UPI) — Pizza is the hottest item in frozen foods sold in supermarkets. For the fifth consecutive year, retailers surveyed by a food trade publication said pizza was the fastest growing frozen product. Retail sales have grown more than 15 percent a year since 1976. Dollar sales per household are highest in Dallas, where last year's average was \$16.82. New Orleans was second, with \$15.90 and Memphis, third, with \$14.88. The most popular varieties are cheese, deluxe combinations, pepperoni and sausage, in that order, according to the September-October issue of Frozen Food Facts, a frozen food industry newsletter.

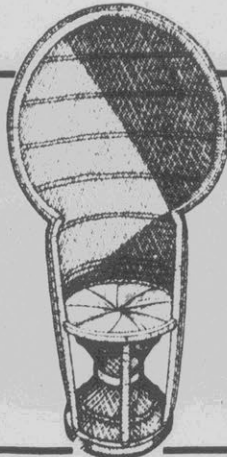

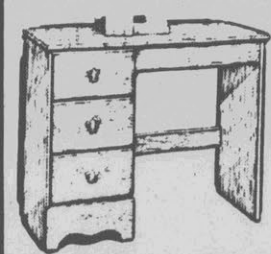

9-Year-Old Overlooks Deformities

MIDDLETOWN, N.J. (AP) — The air was heavy with moisture, warning of the coming storm. Ignoring the angry sky, Maggie Berges races her wheelchair over the back lawn to play on a swing set.

At 9, she celebrates life with every raindrop or sunbeam. When Maggie was born, doctors told her parents she would be better off dead.

But her parents, Peggy and Chuck Berges, wanted Maggie to live, despite their shock, the expense and the effect on family life.

Maggie was born with a form of spina bifida, in which the spinal cord is exposed and the spine protrudes from the back. Unless the spine is fused to prevent infection, the infant will die. If the baby survives surgery, it will be incontinent and paralyzed. And equally as troubling is the danger of spinal fluid dripping into the brain and causing mental retardation.

Maggie was lucky. A successful "shunt" operation — a tube placed in the head to permit spinal fluid to drain — prevented brain damage. Maggie is bright and articulate with all the giggly allure of any other 9-year-old. Surgery and physical therapy will allow her to walk with the aid of leg braces.

She already has begun her first steps. While her mother has to lift her onto the swing or her "special bicycle" — a three-wheeler that's motorized — Maggie has shown remarkable agility getting around without use of her legs or the wheelchair, using her arms and her body.

New medical techniques and knowledge have increased survival chances of spina bifida babies from highly unlikely to something like 20 percent to 40 percent, although most of the survivors are apt to be far more disabled than Maggie.

More than three million children are born each year in the United States, and about 100,000 to 150,000 have significant congenital malformations or genetic disorders, according to the National Institutes of Health.

Spina bifida is just one form in the sorrowful array of malformations. Babies are born without brains or other organs. And there are chromosomal disorders, such as trisomy 13, 18 or Down's Syndrome. Survival past a few months for trisomy 18 babies is rare. Trisomy 13 infants die within six months. In both cases, the newborns have many gross physical deformities: clubfeet, absence of thumbs, cleft lips and palates, sloping forehead.

But many parents and physicians, arguing that quality of life for the infant and its family is the most important consideration, are reluctant to use the sophisticated technology available to extend life. This has stirred a growing debate over the rights of infants and parents and who should decide whether a severely deformed baby should live or die.

"Heroic treatment for the purpose of prolonging dying doesn't make sense," says Dr. Raymond S. Duff, professor of pediatrics at the Yale University School of Medicine.

"It's difficult to tell parents that nothing will help and that many things we're going to do will involve a lot of pain," says Dr. Judith G. Hall, director of medical genetics at Children's Orthopedic Hospital in Seattle.

The American Medical Association's Judicial Council earlier this year proposed that "the decision whether to treat a severely defective infant and exert maximum efforts to sustain life should be the choice of parents."

Increasingly, however, the courts are stepping in when parents refuse treatment for their newborns.

A circuit court in Dade County, Fla., recently ordered surgery for Elin Daniels, who, like Maggie Berges, was born with myelomeningocele, a severe form of spina bifida.

In court testimony, Elin's father, Albert, said he and his wife thought their decision "to allow what would naturally transpire to transpire" was in the baby's best interest.

In another recent case, a Danville, Ill., couple was accused of ordering nurses to withhold food from their severely deformed newborn Siamese twins. The charges were later dismissed.

Not all parents are able or willing to accept a seriously malformed child and the burden it places on their lives. Disbelief, denial, anger, guilt are part of the complex psychological reaction, says Dr. Ruth Stein, director of ambulatory care in the pediatrics division of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York.

"There is the mourning of the lost, fantasized normal child," she says. "The family has a lot of adjustments to make very quickly," and serious medical decisions as well, with little time to weigh them.

Despite advances in pre-natal technology — amniocentesis, ultrasound, fetoscopy — many malformed births come as a surprise because not every woman is a candidate for such tests. Pre-natal detection is usually performed on women whose age, genetic makeup or medical history suggests danger.

However parents decide, a family may grow tremendously from the difficult process of choosing, says Seattle's Dr. Hall.

More than half of the parents take the children home, says Dr. William Fox, director of the infant intensive care unit at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, "but a fairly significant percentage would rather have the institution caring for them."

Clerk Paid \$50,000 By U.S. Govm't

CHICAGO (AP) — Telephones ring incessantly. Letters pour in. And plopped in the middle of the office, entirely out of his element, is a former staff physician for the Railroad Retirement Board who says he was "railroaded into a clerical job."

"I have the dubious distinction of being the highest-paid clerk in the federal government," says Dr. Franklin Streitfeld, who gets \$50,000 a year.

He was bumped from the medical staff in the wave of President Reagan's federal spending cuts in August.

But being a civil service employee, the law required that his employer offer him another job for which he was qualified at the same salary — \$50,000 in this case — for two years. Officials thought he was qualified to be a paper shuffler.

"I don't feel humiliated and I'm not treating it as a joke," said Streitfeld, 58. "I was just caught in a crazy bureaucracy and am sticking it out. I'm having a hearing next month."

Streitfeld said he will seek a reversal from the Merit Systems Protection Board in Chicago on Nov. 10. He said he will be joined in the case by two other staff doctors who also were displaced. Instead of staying on as clerks, however, Dr. Paul Kelley subsequently resigned and Dr. Hans Jalakas retired.

"I could resign, too, and become a staff doctor with a company, but I'm trying to make a point," said Streitfeld.

"I'm staying because I think the merit board — an agency created by the Civil Service Reform Act — will overturn the decision. And I'm staying because when I leave I want to do it under my own steam and not be kicked out."

"The more I think of what happened the more angry I become," said Streitfeld, who had been a staff doctor for the railroad board since January 1978. "If I don't get satisfaction from the merit board, I'll take the case to federal court."

The board, which handles retirement, unemployment and disability programs for the nation's railroad workers, now is contracting private physicians to do the work the doctors used to do. Board spokesman William Poulos said a one-year contract was let out on Oct. 6 for \$88,900.

John Thoresdale, a board spokesman, said at the time the cuts were made that, "It does make a ridiculous situation." But he maintained the government hopes to save at least \$65,000 a year after the second year.

"I don't even have a chance to orientate the new doctors, and they'll need it," said Streitfeld, who is among 15 clerks in the Bureau of Unemployment and Sickness Insurance.

"I process a lot of paperwork dealing with claims," he said.

While he draws \$50,000 annually, the other clerks in the same grade level average about \$13,500.

There is no ill feeling over the pay difference, Streitfeld said.

"On the contrary, everybody in the agency is supportive and understanding," he said. "And I'm not displacing another person in a working position. I was concerned about that. But they actually needed someone to do what I'm doing."

Streitfeld says he sees no saving in contracting for physicians.

"Actually, there is less service and more pay," he said. "The contract doctors will be on a reduced schedule of 27½ hours per week and this figures out at \$62 per hour," he said. "I worked 40 hours per week and it came out at about \$24 an hour."

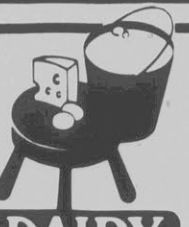

Hotels Rise Despite Sag In Tourism

HONG KONG (AP) — Hong Kong's hotel construction industry is booming despite a slump in the tourist growth rate.

Four deluxe hotels with 2,400 rooms have sprung up this year on the Kowloon side of Hong Kong harbor and eight others, with 3,000 rooms, are in the planning stage and are expected to be completed in 1983.

The four, fronting the scenic harbor and commanding a spectacular view of the Victoria Peak, bring the number of hotel rooms for tourists to 16,389, which is expected to ease congestion during the peak seasons but likely to create a glut during slack periods.

Hong Kong's peak tourist seasons run from March to May and from September through November, coinciding with China's biannual Canton trade fairs. This colony is a gateway to the southern Chinese city of Canton for foreign businessmen.

Official figures show visitors in 1980 numbered 2.3 million, up 4 percent from 1979. The tourist growth rate for 1979 was 8 percent; for 1978 17 percent, for 1977 13 percent and for 1976 20 percent.

Tourist officials predict the growth rate is likely to fall further this year because of a world economic slowdown.

A spokesman for the semiofficial Hong Kong Tourist Association attributed the slump mainly to a decline of Japanese tourists who account for more than 20 percent of Hong Kong's annual tourist intake. Japanese visitors in 1980 numbered 472,182 compared with 508,011 in the previous year.

Tourist officials believe that Japanese shy away from Hong Kong because of its "poor image."

John Pain, association executive director, told a recent press meeting that among the Japanese public "we now have the reputation of the Chicago of the '20s in the Far East."

"I can assure you that there is a reputation throughout Japan, spread by the media, that this town is one big racket," He described the Japanese press reports as "distorted out of proportion."

Despite the grim prospects, the managements of the four hotels say they are confident of their future and believe they could recoup their \$350 million investments within 10 years.

The occupancy rate of Hong Kong hotels has been high, with 91 percent in 1979 and 87 percent in 1980, but Manuel Woo, executive director of Hong Kong Hotels Association, said the rate would continue to decline this year.

Woo said he expected the average occupancy rate would drop to about 82 percent this year but "still well above the break-even point of 65 percent regarded by hoteliers here."

Some tourist officials said the present slump in the tourist industry was unlikely to seriously affect luxury hotels because most businessmen were on company expense accounts. Of the four new hotels, three have been built on reclaimed land.

Ready To Risk Illegal Abortion

NEW YORK (UPI) — A new study indicates 45 percent of women would risk illegal abortion if abortion were banned. The two-year study was conducted among women just prior to their abortions by Choices, a medical center in New York City, in conjunction with Adelphi University and the Mental Health Department of the Health Insurance Plan of Greater New York. Of 176 women interviewed in depth, 45 percent said they would risk an illegal abortion if necessary; 13 percent were unsure and 42 percent said they would not. The survey also found 86 percent of the women interviewed had used birth control in the past and 43 percent had had at least one prior abortion.

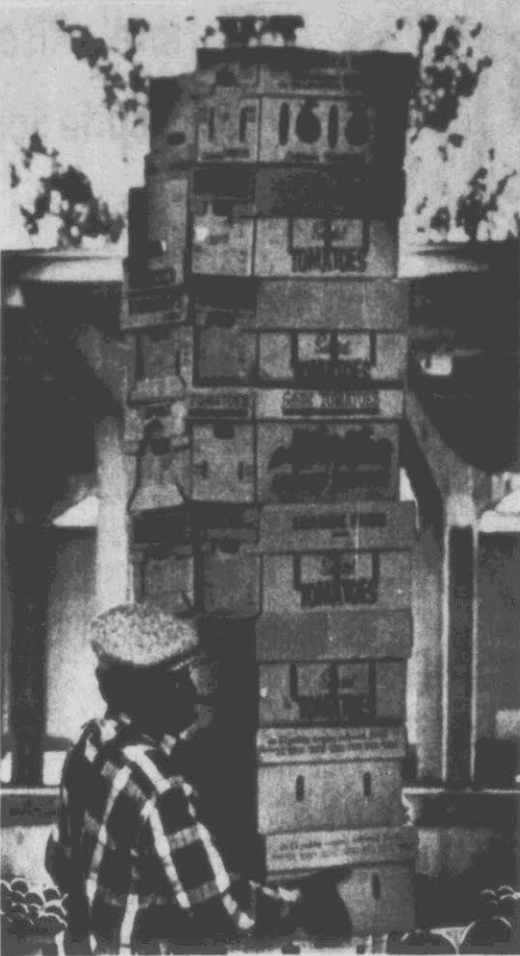

Husband, Wife Manage Cities

EDINBURG, Texas (AP) — When City Manager Aaron Lam comes home after a day of headaches over street drainage, city commission meetings and tax rates, his wife easily can sympathize. She probably has handled the same frustrations 10 miles away in her office as city manager of the small town of San Juan.

Aaron and Wai-Lin Lam could be the only pair of city managers in the country who also are husband and wife. They were born and grew up in Hong Kong but met as graduate students in Stillwater, Okla., while planning a party for the Foreign Students Association at Oklahoma State University.

They have been at their respective positions less than a year. They talked about their careers and lifestyles during separate interviews because hectic schedules prevented a joint session.

"When my wife was named city manager in San Juan recently, everyone called me to congratulate us," said Lam, 34. "I told them, 'I wish one of us had a stable job.'"

City managers serve at the pleasure of elected officials, but the Lams said they're not too concerned about job security.

They have other things to worry about, like finding a baby sitter and spending time with each other and their 3-year-old son, Ranger.

"This job is really a minus as far as a family life," Lam said. "I normally have two to three night meetings."

Despite their similar duties, the Lams said they do not trade municipal secrets at home.

"Every so often, we talk philosophically about how to approach a problem, but because of ethics, we don't say, 'I'm having this specific problem,'" he said. "I feel like I work as hard as anybody else and I turn it off when I come home."

Both moved from Hong Kong to get an education.

"I came from a family of seven brothers and sisters. My parents always emphasized education," said Mrs. Lam, who has a doctor-

ate in environmental design from Texas A&M University. Her speciality is urban planning.

She studied sociology at the University of Tulsa and planned to get a masters' degree in the subject at Oklahoma State. A classmate suggested she investigate urban planning. She switched majors and proposed the same field to her husband-to-be.

"The sociology background is good for me," said Mrs. Lam, 35. "Without that I don't know if planners look into human behavior enough."

Her husband received an undergraduate degree in biochemistry and mathematics from the University of Alberta in Edmonton, Canada.

"My wife opened my eyes to it (urban planning). I decided I knew a lot about some things but I didn't know a single thing about getting along with people," he said.

As graduate students at Texas A&M, both served internships in city planning departments in the Rio Grande Valley.

They married in Houston nine years ago and soon returned to the Valley, a three-county region with many small towns.

"That's why we ended up staying here as long as we have. If we go to another big city, we're not going to get two jobs of the same type as easily," she said.

San Juan counts 7,800 residents, including many migrant farmworkers. The United Farmworkers Union, AFL-CIO, has state headquarters here. The city has a low tax base and an annual budget of approximately \$1,345,000.

Edinburg is the Hidalgo County seat.

Lam said the city has unique problems, in addition to the low income population and drainage problems common to most Valley towns.

"We have a night time population of 24,000 but there are 42,000 who work here. You're producing services for 42,000 based on a tax base of 24,000. It's very challenging," he said.

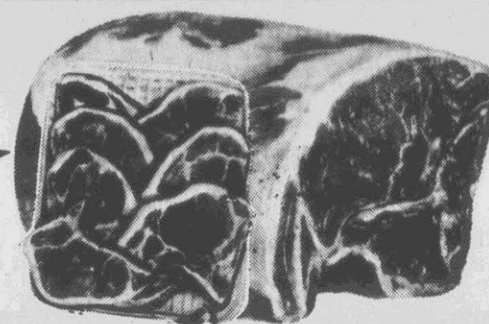

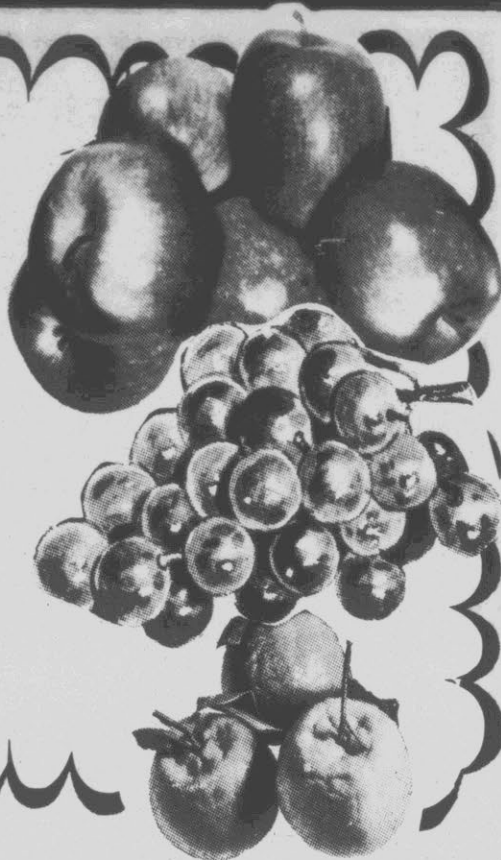

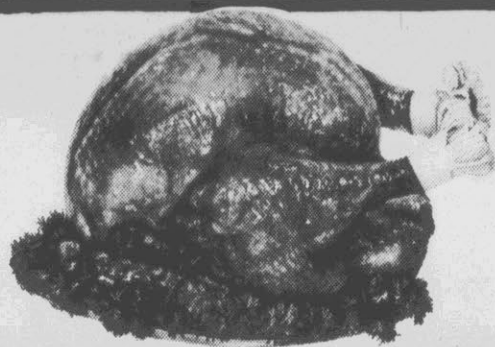

Yugoslavia's Minorities Deeply Split

PRISTINA, Yugoslavia (AP) — Hundreds of Serbs and Montenegrins are leaving Kosovo Province in the aftermath of rioting that erupted last spring over demands of the ethnic Albanian majority for greater autonomy.

Nine people were killed and 260 others injured in the disorders, during which extremists proposed making Kosovo part of neighboring Albania, Eastern Europe's most-orthodox Communist nation.

Local officials say security has been restored to the province, but the minorities leaving are said to fear for their future in the area.

"We have the situation under full control, but this does not mean hostile activity has totally ceased," Azem Vlasi, president of the Kosovo Socialist Alliance, told visiting journalists recently.

Reports on the number of those leaving Kosovo vary widely. But the newspaper Politika of Belgrade, the national capital, estimated that as many as 4,000 people have left or are planning to leave the province, which has a population of about 1.5 million, 77 percent of whom are ethnic Albanians.

Officials here downplay the reports of departures, saying citizens have a right to move about the country as they please.

Nevertheless, a municipal commission, set up in this provincial capital after the rioting to help those moving obtain job transfers and new housing elsewhere, recently has been turning down requests for such assistance.

Enver Redzepi, deputy

president of the provincial legislative assembly, said 882 Serbs and Montenegrins have formally applied to move from the area since the riots.

"There may have been some other cases of people leaving our area, perhaps nearly a thousand," he said.

Most of those asking to leave say new jobs, better living conditions and family considerations prompted their move, but Redzepi said 147 requests had been turned down.

"We will not assist in departures that are not justified," he said without elaboration.

Politika indicated that many do not give "true reasons," fearing they will not receive official help with their move.

The departures from the province could prove significant for Yugoslavia, since the nation is made up of areas inhabited by various ethnic groups with long histories of rivalry.

In Kosovo, relations have long been poor between the province's Albanian majority and the Montenegrins and Serbs, who used to hold the most important political and economic jobs.

The province is in the southern part of the Republic of Serbia, one of Yugoslavia's six constituent republics. In view of Kosovo's large non-Serbian population, however, the province enjoys a greater degree of autonomy than provinces in other constituent republics.

"It's a real worry for them," one Western diplomat said of the departing Serbs. "It's a part of Serbia, but over the years there's fewer and fewer Serbs."

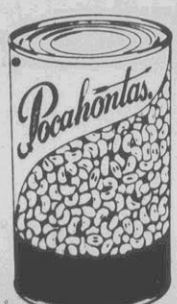

Artificial Blood Keeps Five Alive

NEW YORK (AP) — Artificial blood has been tested on humans for the first time in this country and enabled five Jehovah's Witnesses who refused regular transfusions on religious grounds to stay alive in surgery, a researcher reported today.

Dr. Kevin Tremper of the University of California at Los Angeles said the tests prove the artificial blood, a milky chemical soup called Fluosol, can carry oxygen and deliver it where it is needed. The main ingredient is perfluorodecalin, a chemical cousin to the non-stick coating used on kitchen pans.

"It does not replace blood, but it is a temporary emergency replacement when red blood cells are not available," Tremper said in a telephone interview last week. The research was reported today at a meeting of the American Society of Anesthesiologists in New Orleans.

The patients were all Jehovah's Witnesses who refused human blood transfusions on religious grounds.

Last week, Dr. Stephen Gould of the University of Chicago reported at the meeting of the American College of Surgeons in San Francisco that he had kept baboons alive with the artificial blood.

Fluosol can be frozen, Tremper said, and it should be possible to thaw it in a microwave oven and deliver it within a few minutes. It can take 20 minutes to prepare human blood for emergency transfusion, he said.

The artificial blood might also be used to treat carbon monoxide poisoning and to treat patients whose arteries or veins have become smaller because of disease.

Red cells exposed to carbon monoxide cannot carry oxygen. "Fluosol will carry oxygen when you're blood won't, and it will also carry carbon monoxide out of you," Tremper said.

Because the particles in Fluosol are only one-seventieth the size of red blood cells, "they might go through blood vessels constricted due to some disease, and carry oxygen where normal red cells wouldn't go," he said.

Fluosol is made by the Green Cross Corporation of Japan, and it has been tested on about 300 patients there, Tremper said.

His research was done at Esperanza Intercommunity Hospital in Yorba Linda, Calif., where 90 percent of the patients are Jehovah's Witnesses.

Seven patients with bleeding problems requiring surgery were given small doses of Fluosol. Two of the seven patients had adverse reactions, and they were not given any more.

The other five were given intravenous doses of about 1 1/2 quarts of Fluosol the night before they were taken to surgery. A normal adult has about six or seven quarts of blood.

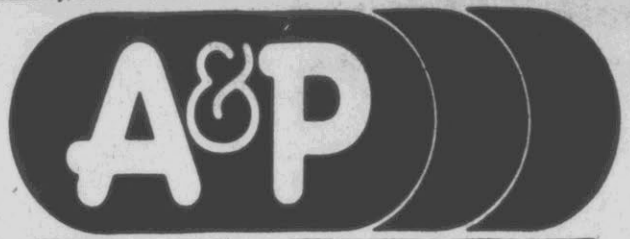
The patients underwent surgery to correct bleeding problems caused by such things as ulcers, hernias and tumors.

Four of the patients lived, and are now doing well. One, who had lost an enormous amount of blood before the operation, did not survive, but Tremper said his death was due to the loss of blood, not to problems caused by Fluosol.

The adverse reactions suffered by two of the patients are not considered a serious problem, Tremper said. Researchers think they understand why the reactions occurred, and what can be done to prevent them.

"The Fluosol did work as expected, but it is not anywhere near the equivalent of giving regular blood," Tremper said. The blood substitute worked best when patients were breathing pure oxygen with an oxygen mask, Tremper said. It did not work very well when they were breathing room air.

Tremper collaborated on the research with Dr. Ronald L. Katz and R. William Shoemaker of UCLA, and Edward Levine and Alan Friedman of Alpha Therapeutic Corp. of Los Angeles, which is owned by Green Cross.

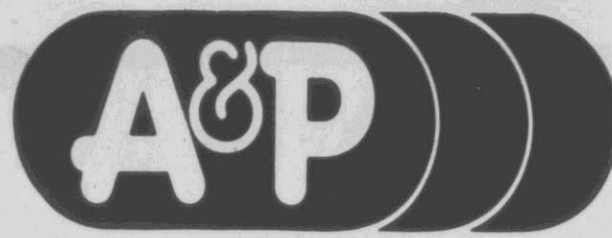

Argentina Is Approaching 'Nuke' Role

ZARATE, Argentina (AP) - By 1984, Argentina will produce everything it needs to keep its nuclear reactors going, according to one of its leading nuclear officials.

Horacio Rapoport, director of Latin America's only functioning nuclear-power plant, said recently this includes the production of heavy water, fuel elements made from Argentine uranium and the zircaloy tubes that surround the fuel.

Independence has from the beginning been the goal of Latin America's most advanced and most ambitious nuclear-power program, and it is imminent despite a three-year-old cutoff of cooperation from the United States.

The Swiss are building a heavy water plant in southern Argentina, the Canadians are completing a second reactor that will go on line next year and the West Germans, who built the 340 megawatt Atucha I plant Rapoport heads, have begun construction of the 690 megawatt Atucha II.

At the same time, the National Atomic Energy Commission has turned out its first fuel elements and zircaloy tubes, although it will be two years before they are manufactured in commercial quantities.

The Atomic Energy Commission's chief, Adm. Carlos Castro Madero, has indicated Argentina also could make a nuclear bomb. Two nuclear studies institutes produce all the engineers and technicians the country needs.

Argentina refused to sign the 1968 nuclear non-proliferation treaty, so the Carter administration barred the transfer of U.S. technology here under the U.S. Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act approved by Congress in 1978. But that has not significantly retarded the Argentine development program, which calls for six plants providing 20 percent of the nation's electricity by 1997. Argentina has been getting the material it needs from Europe, including five tons of heavy water from the Soviet Union last year.

Aastro Madero said prospects for cooperation with Washington have improved since President Reagan took office, but he made it clear any concessions must come from the United States.

"I do not think the cooperation of the United States is so necessary that Argentina would be willing to change its policy," he said.

Reagan has said the United States continues opposing nuclear proliferation but has also said, "I don't think our actions should hinder the development of nuclear capacity for peaceful uses."

Argentina insists on the purely peaceful intentions of its nuclear program, but maintains the non-proliferation pact is discriminatory and would infringe on Yts sovereignty. According to Castro Madero, the 111 signers that pledged not to develop nuclear arms have been "completely defrauded" by the current nuclear powers - the United States, the Soviet Union, Britain, France and China.

These powers, he contends, have failed to live up to their commitments to facilitate the transfer of technology and to actively pursue disarmament. He claims the U.S. decision to develop the neutron warhead is a "contradiction" of pact principles.

There is not enough weapons-grade uranium in Argentina to make a bomb. Small quantities of enriched uranium are used in three small experimental reactors, mainly for making medical radioisotopes. Castro Madero says his commission is "studying" how to reprocess spent natural uranium fuel into plutonium, which can be used to make a bomb. He says plutonium will have to be used as fuel when the uranium runs out.

James Donnelly, president of Atomic Energy of Canada, Ltd., says Argentina has everything necessary to make a bomb. Castro Madero has not stated that explicitly, but said in August, "Application of nuclear technology is a political decision. If the country were threatened by a nuclear attack from abroad, well, the decision is obvious."
