I recently resected a large tumor which we considered a primary tumor (sarcoma) of the chest wall, which proved to be a metastatic hepatoma. I wonder if in your series of chest tumors you or anyone else, has observed a single bone metastasis due to hepatoma masquerading as primary tumor.
