You have aroused my curiosity relative to your questions concerning room in Plainview for a well qualified general surgeon with some interest in peripheral vascular problems.


Dr. Busby and I discussed this on our way back and felt there would be no harm in writing you to see whether or not you had someone in mind, or whether the interest was simply general.
