## FBI Probing Kugel's Tactics In N.C. Deals

The Federal Bureau Of Investigation has launched a study of Pennsylvania developer Owen Kugel's tactics in dealing with North Carolina cities as a result of his aborted offers to redevelop aging municipal centers.

Former sponsors in Greenville, the first North Carolina city to sign with Kugel and the first to break off its contract with him, said today they have not been contacted by the FBI. Kugel refunded a \$50,000 deposit to the Greenville sponsors in February.

The Associated Press reported today that confirmation of the FBI investigation came from Daniel Wozniak of the FBI office in Greensboro and Robert Pence, special agent in charge of North Carolina FBI operations. The confirmation came after reports Tuesday that Reidsville officials had been contacted by the FBI.

Pence said the bureau is investigating to determine whether Kugel, the owner of OK Associates, is involved in "mail fraud, wire fraud or any other type of fraud." He added that the use of interstate facilities, as well as the use of funds in interstate commerce, would be studied.

Pence said the investigation began about 30 days ago, but he would not say what prompted the probe.

Wozniak would not discuss the details of the questioning, and Kugel declined to comment on the matter Tuesday night when reached at his Lancaster, Pa., home.

The developer has offered to bring \$2 million worth of investments to 21 downtown areas in North Carolina in exchange for \$60,000 each, but many of his projects are behind schedule and five cities have asked Kugel for refunds.

Greenville, Asheville, Fayetteville and Kinston have ended their contracts. A group of Burlington investors decided this week to end a contract with Kugel to convert an old bank building into 20 luxury apartments, a restaurant and office space.

Spokesmen in Burlington said Kugel never got beyond buying the option on the building and outlining plans for its renovation, which was supposed to begin last Nov. 1.

Dick McKee, president of Evergreen of Greenville, and Reid Hooper, Evergreen secretary-treasurer, both said this morning that they have not been contacted by the FBI in connection with Kugel.

However, Stuart Powell, president of the Reidsville Downtown Organization, said "the FBI has contacted us. He (the FBI agent) was asking us questions about what Kugel had promised us and what he had done."

In Kugel's downtown redevelopment projects, he has asked for payments based on a promise of development in the cities. But many of the projects are behind schedule and some investors have backed out of the deal.

"We're doing our best to try to get out of this and get our money back," said Claiborne Young, spokesman for the Burlington investors who have been paying money to Kugel since last June. "At the end of March, we instructed our attorney to try to get our money back."

Burlington investors pledged to pay \$60,000 in \$5,000 monthly installments in return for the downtown investments. The city stopped paying Kugel in January and recently asked him to return the \$35,000 it has paid him to date.

"We met sometime around March 1 along with our attorney," said Young. "We instructed our attorney to write and tell Kugel. We will give you a 90-day extension if you take our \$35,000 and place it in a mutually agreeable escrow institution and we'll place the balance in escrow, and if you come through, you get the money."

Young said Kugel told the investors that the project was going fine and there were no difficulties. Kugel did not agree to place the money in escrow.

## Reagan Asks Arabs To Oppose Khadafy

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan, rejecting suggestions that terrorism is an outgrowth of a conflict between the Arab world and the West, today called on Arab nations to "join with us to eliminate this scourge of civilization."

In a speech prepared for the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, Reagan sought to drive a wedge between Libyan leader Moammar Khadafy and other Islamic leaders, pointing out that Khadafy has allied himself with the Soviets, whom he accused of

supporting the slaughter of Moslems in Afghanistan.

In Bonn, the West German Cabinet today ordered the expulsion of 22 of the 41 people accredited to the Libyan embassy in that country.

As a result of that order and the one Tuesday from Britain also expelling more than 20 Libyans, officials in Tripoli ordered all 250 foreign journalists who arrived after the U.S. bombing raids to finish their missions and leave Libya.

Setting the stage for his 12-day trip

to the Far East beginning on Friday, Reagan said he will discuss terrorism with other allied leaders in Tokyo because "unilateral response is not enough."

"It must be dealt with forcefully and collectively," the president said, declaring that if the democratic nations let them, terrorist attacks will

"erect a wall of fear around nations and neighborhoods. It will dampen the joy of travel, the flow of trade, the exchange of ideas."

"Let no one mistake this for a conflict between the western democracies and the Arab world," Reagan said. "Those who condone making war by cowardly attacks on

unarmed third parties, including women and children, are but a tiny minority."

Pointing out that Arab nations have been victims of terrorism too, Reagan said, "We hope and pray the Arab world will join with us to eliminate this scourge of terrorism."

## S. Africa Pass Law Erased

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — The government today stopped enforcing a requirement that blacks obtain permits to live and work in white areas, and said people of all races instead must have an approved residence in order to move to an urban area.

A government statement said the "pass laws" that restricted black movement were a "relic of the past" and would be replaced by a policy of "planned, positive urbanization." Officials said they were releasing prisoners detained for pass law violations.

"Fundamental rights should be protected and ... discrimination on the grounds of race or color is not acceptable," the statement said.

The new policy requires approval by Parliament, which is dominated by the governing National Party.

The policy continues to bar integration of residential neighborhoods, and makes no mention of any plans to give blacks voting rights.

The new requirement that people moving to urban areas obtain approved accommodations could be a major obstacle for blacks, because there is a shortage of urban land available to blacks.

Some blacks trying to move to Soweto, Johannesburg's largest black township, have been on a waiting list for nine years.

Justice Minister Kobie Coetsee said that 245 pass law offenders were in custody as of March 31.

## Temperatures Hit Record Low

North Carolina farmers appeared to suffer few crop losses despite record low temperatures this morning, but the National Weather Service warned of an even harder freeze tonight.

"Agricultural interests and home gardeners across the Tar Heel state should prepare for another night of temperatures low enough to threaten young vegetation," forecasters said in a weather bulletin this morning that called for frost or freeze warnings across most of the state.

Meanwhile, Asheville was the coldest of four cities matching or beating record low temperatures for the date, posting a 29-degree reading to erase the mark of 34 degrees set in 1978. Greensboro recorded a

temperature of 30 degrees to break a record set on the same date in 1971, Wilmington's 37-degree reading surpassed the record of 41 set in 1927 and a 33-degree mark at Raleigh-Durham Airport matched the record low set in 1971.

Surry County horticultural agent Milton Parker said today he had heard of no damage and that winds probably staved off the worst of the cold.

Herbert Burgess, a strawberry grower with six acres in Yadkin County, said he irrigated his crop all night and let the freezing water insulate the berries from temperatures that dropped as low as 23 degrees.

"Farmers are gonna have a heart attack, I'm afraid," Robert Shaw, a Columbus County agricultural extension agent, said Tuesday.

Shaw said tobacco crops in Columbus and Bladen counties were especially vulnerable because there is "a lot of tobacco in the field that would be damaged by a light frost." A freeze, he said, would kill most of what has been planted.

"Right now, I'm optimistic," said Clarence Black, superintendent of the Sandhills Research Station in Jackson Springs, an Agricultural Extension Service point. "I think we're going to be all right. I just don't believe the good Lord could do it to us again."

Four of the last five peach crops have been extensively damaged by freezing weather in April.

Fruit crops, including strawberries, blueberries, melons, apples and peaches were threatened by the cold,

along with newly transplanted tobacco, peppers, cucumbers, squash and tomatoes, experts said.

"We may squeeze by this time, but I know what I'm doing," said W.R. Baker Jr., superintendent of the Central Crops Research Station in Clayton. "I'm prepared for the possibility that temperatures will get cold enough to get plant damage and I think that's what growers are going to have to do."

"We had 26 degrees last year on April 10th, and that's the cold weather that took out all of our apple and peach crop here," Baker said. "I don't know whether it's going to get to 26 or not, but it's not April 10th, either. Normally, we don't have these kinds of temperatures after about the middle of April."

# Pat's Pointers

When you hear fashion saying, "Ribbon knits for spring and summer," but your pocketbook says, "No way," think about using ribbon as an accent. In this elegant but easy-on-the-budget summer top, double strands of a silky, cottonlike acrylic are used for the body, and ribbon and yarn for the smocked yoke.

Large needles are used for a gauge of 3½ stitches per inch. Directions are for petite (to fit a 32-inch bust), small (34 inches), medium (36 inches) and large (38 inches).

The kit price includes shipping charges, full instructions, yarn and ribbon in your choice of lilac or ecru. Please specify your size and color preference.

Just a touch of pattern stitchery adds such a special magic to your knitting that you really should promise yourself to learn a new one every month or so. I'll do my part by giving you special pattern stitch instructions from time to time.

The clever designer used a "mock smocking" stitch on the yoke of today's featured sweater to create the special effect. While it may seem a bit tricky at first, you'll breeze through this pattern stitch with a little practice.

While the effect will differ when using other yarns, make a sample swatch with any yarn you have on hand just to learn the stitch. Cast on a multiple of four plus one. Regular readers of this column will know that this means to cast on any number of stitches evenly divisible by four and then cast on one additional stitch at the end of the row. In this case, cast on 17 for your practice piece.

Work a couple of rows of garter stitch before starting the pattern stitch. Row 1: Step 1, knit the first stitch; Step 2, holding the yarn in front of your work, slip 3 stitches, purlwise, from right to left needle, then take the yarn to the back of your work and knit 1. Repeat Step 2 on each group of 4 stitches to the end of the row. To slip stitches purlwise, insert right needle tip into first stitch on left needle as if you were to purl it, but instead just pass it from left to right needle.

The strand of yarn at the front of your work as a result of holding the yarn in that position while you slipped the stitches will later be referred to as a "floating strand." You will want the floating strands to be as long as possible and this can be achieved in a couple of ways:

Knit the stitch following the 3 slipped stitches very loosely and then insert the top of your right needle under the floating strand and stretch

it out. Or, you can stretch the 3 slip stitches before making the knit 1.

Row 2: Step 1, purl 1; Step 2, knit 3, purl 1. Repeat Step 2 across to end of row. For Row 3, repeat Row 1. For Row 4, knit all stitches, and for Row 5, purl all stitches.

To create the smocked effect, work Row 6 as follows: Step 1, knit 2 stitches at the beginning of the row; Step 2, lift, from the back of your work, the 2 floating strands, hang them over the left needle and purl them together with the next stitch on the left needle; knit 3. Repeat Step 2 across row, ending with knit 2.

Row 7: Step 1, knit 1, purl 1; Step 2, knit 1, slip 3 purlwise, holding yarn in front as in Row 1. Repeat Step 2 across row, ending with knit 1, purl 1, knit 1.

Row 8: Step 1, purl 1, knit 1; Step 2, purl 1, knit 3. Repeat Step 2 across row, ending with purl 1, knit 1, purl 1. Row 9: Repeat Row 7. For Row 10, knit all stitches and for Row 11, purl all stitches.

Row 12 is worked the same as Row 6 except that you begin and end the row by knitting 4 stitches instead of knitting 2 stitches. Repeat these 12 rows over and over for desired length.

# Reunion Makes Family's Dreams Come True

LEHIGHTON, Pa. (AP) — The scene in the Walnutport home of Clinton and Anna Meinhart was more than a typical family reunion.

When relatives from near and far crowded into the Meinhart home, there were happy tears and laughter, some funny family stories and the usual hugs from relatives who hadn't seen each other for a long time.

What made that reunion special were the guests of honor and the unusual circumstances that led to the reunion.

For 61 years, the reunion of the "Dudler Kids" existed only in their dreams.

George, Ferenc, Stephen, Leonard, Charles, Helen, Ann and Mary Dudla were born to immigrant parents in America. All eight children were born in the Palmerton area, where their name was "Americanized" from Dudla to Dudler.

In 1925, when Ferenc Dudler was 7 years old, he and his brother, Stephen, were taken to Austria by their maternal grandparents.

The boys thought they were only going on a trip. The grandparents promised them they could return to America "when they were older." Meanwhile, as time went on, they had to earn a living. Both Ferenc and Stephen traveled around the country from farm to farm, working as laborers.

When the boys returned to the family homestead, they learned their grandfather had died. Their grandmother sold all the family's possessions, then gave their home to a neighbor. The boys were left with no family, no home and no money.

All Ferenc and Stephen had were dreams. Someday, they promised themselves, they were going back to America. They dreamed of being reunited with their family in the land of their birth.

Then, war broke out and the boys were forced to fight for Hungary in the German army. Ironically, although they didn't know it at the time, they were forced to fight against their brothers.

When George Dudler was sent to serve with the U.S. Army in Germany, he looked everywhere to find his brothers. "I suspected they might be with the Hungarians in the German Army, but I didn't know for sure," the Slatington man recalls.

While George Dudler was stationed in Germany for five years, he never ceased looking for his brothers. Meanwhile, Stephen became very ill and Ferenc lived with the dream of going to America.

It almost happened. At one point, Ferenc managed to escape into the American zone.

Because he had second thoughts about leaving his dying brother, he crossed back into the Russian zone. Stephen died shortly after that, while Ferenc decided there was nothing for him to do except to forget his American dreams and build a life for himself in Hungary.

Just when he thought he was settling into life by marrying and raising his own family, Ferenc received word that his brother George was trying to locate him.

"Your brother wants you to come to America," said the messenger. At last, those magic words. But they came at a time when family commitments made it impossible to follow his own dream. "Someday," he promised himself.

That someday never came. Authorities told Ferenc he could never leave the country. When he had served in the Hungarian Army, he had lost his American citizenship, they said.

Through the years, the Dudler brothers and sisters kept in touch with Ferenc through occasional letters. Ferenc wrote in Hungarian while they answered in English. Each letter required an interpreter. Then the letters stopped. Because mail wasn't getting through, each side of the family lost all trace of the other.

Two years later, George Dudler took a chance. He sent a Christmas card to his brother at the only address he had. That card reached its destination and set off an exciting chain of events.

By the time he heard again from his American family, Ferenc Dudla was 68 years old, with a grown son and daughter.

Feri Dudla (Ferenc Dudla Jr.), now 37, had dreamed for years of being able to install indoor plumbing in the small home he shares with his parents, his wife and his children. Feri and his wife saved every spare penny for the indoor bathroom.

But because Feri feared his father "didn't have many years left to fulfill his dream," he and his wife put aside their own dream to help Feri's father visit America. The couple gave their life's savings to pay for the trip. Feri accompanied his elderly father, but because there was not enough money to pay for his wife and children, they stayed home.

"I am full of love and gratitude to my wife for her decision," said Feri through an interpreter. He explained that his wife also works full time and had to make many sacrifices to save the money.

In Hungary, Feri has what he calls "a good job" as a handyman for a large company. He makes \$80 a month. The trip to America cost the equivalent of \$1,300 U.S., which to Feri represents "a fortune."

When Ferenc Dudla saw the brother and sisters he had not seen for 61 years, the tears that rolled down his face spoke for him. Those same tears told Feri he had made the right decision about which dream was most important.

I have never known a woman who, in the face of oncoming guests, has not spent two hours cleaning the bathroom.

This, despite the fact that the light is off when you go in, blinds you for the first 10 seconds you are there, and by the time you have done what you came to do, the switch is flipped, throwing the room into darkness again.

I don't know why we do it, but if I thought I was going to expire tomorrow, I would take the scissors and cut two more inches of mildew off the bottom of the shower curtain to make me look good.

Men don't seem to have that kind of pride about "outsiders" seeing the way we really live. You never see them in a frenzy cleaning out their toolbox or scrubbing grease stains off the garage floor minutes before guests arrive.

It burns me up that my husband is not as phony as I am. Would it hurt him to replace the light bulb where the water heater is stored, just in case someone wanders off and gets lost?

To ready a house for a couple of people who are going to spend four hours in our house for dinner makes the coronation look like an impulse. I have to clean off the countertop in the kitchen, put grouting around the bathtub, wash windows, put a pencil and pad by the phone, clean out the fireplace, bathe the dog, put fresh flowers on the back of the commode, alphabetize the bottles in the medicine cabinet, toss out every newspaper in the house, line up my cosmetics with chessboard precision, and hide every item that might give a clue that people actually live there.

I want guests to go away thinking I

always use soaps shaped like strawberries and that every day I dress my toilet tissue in cute little crocheted dresses.

When the children were smaller, I felt compelled to dress every naked doll in the house and line them up like I was selling them, and to buy new night clothes in case they woke up and came out to see the guests.

In many ways, this kind of pride can be a curse. It is also congenital. Our whole family is like that. A few years ago, we visited my aunt and uncle for two nights. Upon arrival, we were greeted with the smells of fresh wallpaper paste and newly laid carpet. Cartons in the garage were evidence of new furniture and appliance. The paint was wet on the porch, and the plants in the yard were still squared off from the square pots they came in. A grill had the price tag still on it, and the car was dripping water from the car wash.

Early in the evening, I noticed both of them nodding in their chairs. They were exhausted. It's the price you pay for pride.

# Magazine Says Women Suffer Financially Following Divorce

In divorce settlements, it is usually the man who pays — but it is the woman who suffers financially. Women must protect themselves in divorce actions, according to an article in the May issue of Cosmopolitan, or they may not get a fair financial deal.

Research by Stanford University sociologist Lenore Weitzman found the effect of the average divorce is to decrease the standard of living of the woman and any children by 73 percent, but increase that of the man by 42 percent.

Divorce courts generally discriminate against women, not men, said a study commissioned by the New York court system. The 1983 census reveals only 37 percent of all women ever divorced received any form of cash or property settlement. Less than 15 percent were awarded alimony. Among women caring for minor children of the marriage, only 58 percent were awarded child support. Alimony averaged \$3,976 per year and child support \$2,341, no matter how many children.

"My advice to most women getting a divorce is, you'd better hope your husband is having an affair," said attorney Harry P. Hall Jr., a veteran of the Atlanta divorce wars for 28 years. "If he is, he'll feel guilty, and he'll probably be reasonable, perhaps even generous, about a settlement."

"But if he doesn't have anyone else, and even suspects that you

might, watch out, because he'll fight like a tiger."

The woman who wants a fair settlement must avoid some of these common divorce pitfalls that lead to unequal distributions.

— The hide-and-seek gambit. The divorcing husband uses his superior knowledge of family finances to hide assets or income.

Emily S. Blair, an Atlanta divorce lawyer, said indicators of hidden assets fell into two categories — known income or assets that do not appear on available financial statements, and unexplained income, such as interest from unknown sources. Useful documents in making accurate financial assessments include joint income tax returns and joint banking records.

— The anti-support debate. A wife may work to support her husband early in his career, but she is criticized if she expects reciprocal consideration in a divorce.

The tide may be turning. A recent New York State court decision held that a husband's medical degree, earned during the marriage with the help of the wife, was "marital property." Thirteen other states, by statute or court ruling, recognize spousal property interest in a professional degree.

— The tax bite. Alimony is taxable income for the wife. It is deductible for the husband. Also, property may carry future capital gains tax liability. A good tax accountant can evaluate the tax consequences of any divorce settlement.

— The conduct question. No-fault divorces are available, but a serious fault on the part of the husband can be a bargaining tool for the wife if he does not want his conduct made public.

— The double standard. "Any lawyer will tell you a double standard still exists," Blair said. "What is acceptable for a man may not be considered acceptable for a woman."

"A wealthy man is viewed as particularly powerful, and some people will actually expect him to have affairs outside the marriage. Yet identical behavior in his wife will be considered quite offensive, and a violation of the marriage contract."

— The divorce-now-pay-later ploy. Many states allow a two-part divorce, in which the parties get a divorce right away and settle financial affairs later. Such divorces favor the "financially dominant spouse." A husband in a hurry to divorce may be motivated to reach a reasonable financial settlement.

DEAR CONFUSED: Your compulsion to steal (transitory kleptomania) was triggered by your tragic loss. You unconsciously tried to compensate for your loss by taking from others because something had been taken from you. You stole from those close to you because you unconsciously envied and resented them for not having had to suffer the way you did.

You need more help than I can give you in a letter. You seem to be a fine and decent person who was temporarily destabilized by a terrible loss. You stole to "equalize" things. It was sick behavior, and sickness is no crime. Forgive yourself, my friend. Please see a therapist

## Stockamania

The ranks of former David A. Stockman admirers may be presumed to grow with publication of two books; one by, the other about, the wonder-child of early Reagan administration economics.

The tales they'll tell are being widely shared by news magazines, writers and columnists for news services, commentators and others whose talents may enhance sales of the books and balloon fees Stockman may get for interviews feeding the publicity mills.

Critics have been vociferous in recent weeks of former White House people who have been cashing in on their past connection. They should stand back. Perhaps the biggest one of them all is moving to center stage.

The Stockman books cannot pretend to be wholly objective. They were written with interpretations, points of view, after-the-fact accounts as seen or heard or told to and by David Stockman, and selected with an eye for making the readers press on for more details on succeeding pages.

They had to be marketable as well as self-serving; for after all, the former boy-guru of Reaganomics must look ahead to years of future employment.

He describes his associates with warts and all (mostly "warts"); but he portrays himself as a qualified judge of others.

Stockman is said to have told friends if he ever returns to Washington his dream job is already picked out: he would be defense secretary. The prospect is remote. Who would ever fully trust him again?

A third book about Stockman is said to be in the works. That one takes a less kindly view of his contribution to government and his personal background.

His book, "The Triumph of Politics: Why the Reagan Revolution Failed," is depicted as a self-serving account. The accompanying biography by a journalist with the Knight-Ridder chain describes the Stockman conflicts with other White House personalities in defending his economic blueprint for America.

They will all sell; just as do the tabloid gossip sheets in racks at the checkout counters.

## Stockman Throws Light On Budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — David Stockman's story of his five years as President Reagan's budgetary whiz kid is a classic of the kiss-and-tell genre, but its greater value may be the light it throws on that enduring capital scam, cooking budget figures.

Anyone who can remember numbers from one year to the next knows that budget estimates, whether they come from the White House or Capitol Hill, always turn out wrong.

Deficit projections have been so far off for so long that the whole process has lost its credibility. Is there anyone who believes the White House or the congressional budget committees when they announce they have found a way to reduce the deficit?

Now comes Stockman to confess that not only are the numbers usually way off, but the people who come up with those figures often know they are wrong.

Stockman's revelations are contained in "The Triumph of Politics: Why the Reagan Revolution Failed." Excerpts from the book are being published by Newsweek magazine.

What he described is a cynical system in which budget assumptions reflect political needs.

The former budget director described an agreement reached among the president's economic advisers to predict a "reasonably high" growth rate.

With that agreement, he wrote, "Nearly \$200 billion in phantom revenues tumbled into our budget com-

puter in one fell swoop. The massive deficit ... was substantially covered up."

The cover was torn off 24 months later when instead of growing 5.2 percent, as the administration had predicted, the economy contracted by 1.5 percent.

When the administration needed additional savings that it couldn't find, Stockman said they invented the "magic asterisk."

"If we couldn't find the savings in time — and we couldn't — we would issue an IOU. We would call it 'future savings to be identified,'" wrote Stockman.

The former Michigan congressman joined the Reagan administration with revolution on his mind and ended up producing a memoir that of-

fered startling insights into how decisions are made at the highest levels of government.

A reader might well wonder whether that process is any different when the administration is trying on foreign policy?

Are those predictions of dire consequences that would flow from congressional failure to support the administration's foreign and defense policies any better founded than the budget projections?

Most readers will be satisfied to skim through the volume to find the former budget director's scathing descriptions of administration figures. No one escapes — not the president, his top aides, his Cabinet officers.

Ronald Reagan is described as the leader of the revolution, but lacking the stomach to do what is necessary to bring it off. The president is described by Stockman as a man who ignores "relevant facts and wanders in circles."

The president's top White House aides were dismissed as "competent enough at their trades. But they were illiterate when it came to the essential equation of policy."

The president said Thursday he hadn't read Stockman's book.

"I'm not sure that I want to," Reagan quipped. "I don't have too much time for fiction."

The president's friends have been somewhat less restrained.

"Sleazy," said Lyn Nofziger, the president's long-time aide who served as White House political director during Reagan's first term.

"He's a turkey," said Nancy Reynolds, a public relations consultant who is a close friend of Mrs. Reagan.

Stockman has moved on to become a managing partner of Salomon Bros., the New York investment firm. He has said he "no intention" of returning to public life.

After his memoir, it's unlikely any politician would want to bring him into their inner circle for confidential discussions.

While he was budget director, there often were rumors Stockman would return to Michigan and run for office. He never did. But maybe the political bug lingers in his blood and Stockman dreams of one day looking for a bright young fellow to serve as his budget director.

## EastCare

EastCare helicopter ambulance service from Pitt County Memorial Hospital was full of great promise when it first began.

It still is, but the reality of the great cost of the service is a matter of concern.

The hospital board of trustees has said it wishes to continue the service even though it is felt it will never be a money maker.

The trustees are studying ways to cut costs, however. One possibility might be to restrict pickups of patients to attending physicians at Pitt County Memorial. The contract with Omni Flight which provides the helicopter service is being studied and other vendors are being contacted concerning costs.

The helicopter ambulance service is an exciting venture which is being instituted by a number of regional referral hospitals. It has the possibilities of being a wave of the future.

It is costly, however. While the hospital trustees are correct in seeking to continue the service it is also proper to study every way possible to reduce the costs of operating the service.

## Centers For Alzheimers

RALEIGH — When a family member suffers from Alzheimer's disease, the whole family suffers. Not only must the family watch as a loved one falls into senility, it also has to put up with the victim's helplessness and confusion. Given the situation, it's not surprising that victims are often put in a full-time care facility.

But are families getting what they think when they put a parent or grandparent into an Alzheimer's treatment facility? Ernest Messer, former legislator and former director of the N.C. Division of Aging, says maybe not. He says some rest homes are now advertising themselves as Alzheimer's centers and duping an unsuspecting public in the process.

Messer, a member of the Legislature's Study Commission on Aging, wants the Legislature to prohibit rest homes from so advertising themselves unless they do offer special Alzheimer's programs. But the commission rejected his proposal saying there is no problem. Messer said, "There is a move-

ment to have name changes to names like the Alzheimer's Care Center." That kind of name leads potential clients to think "that this institution has a knowledge and expertise that no one else has. That is a false impression," Messer said. "It's kind of like a doctor of veterinary medicine who wants to change his title to heart surgeon."

Representatives of the Martin administration and the rest home industry opposed Messer's proposal.

"Existing standards already address this issue and take care of it," said Ann Hughes of the N.C. Association of Long Term Care Facilities. The state can order a facility "to provide adequate care" for any patient, she said. And the state's "Patient Bill of Rights ... that is the crux of the whole thing. Any type of resident is entitled to receive adequate and appropriate care and the facility can be required to provide that care."

As for advertising, Ms. Hughes said, "They cannot advertise some-

thing they are not licensed to provide."

But Messer argued back that by calling themselves "Alzheimer's care centers," these rest homes were not technically breaking the law. They are only misleading people, he said.

"Some of these homes are not full and they need more patients," Messer said. "There is a lot of desperation among the families who have family members with Alzheimer's" and these rest homes prey on those desperate people, he said.

But John Tanner of the N.C. Division of Aging argued that Alzheimer's victims can be adequately cared for in a rest home. He said that it is up to a doctor to decide how much treatment a patient gets. If a doctor decides the patient is in the early stages of Alzheimer's, then the care that patient would get in a rest home would be sufficient, Tanner said.

Tanner also questioned why Messer was so upset. He said that to his knowledge there was only one rest home in the state calling itself an Alzheimer's center. Messer replied that more plan to make the change and that a problem should be stopped before it is allowed to get out of hand.

Messer also said that with the publicity Alzheimer's has received lately, some people are making posthumous gifts to Alzheimer's facilities. He is afraid that some of this money will mistakenly be given to rest homes instead of research centers.

Sen. Ollie Harris, D-Cleveland, a commission member, agreed with Tanner that a problem doesn't exist yet. He promised Messer, however, that he would introduce legislation in 1987 to stop the name changes if they become a problem.

## Casey's Message: Contras Can Fight

WASHINGTON — CIA Director William Casey delivered a top-secret report to the White House on the true size of that Sandinista force that crossed the border to attack Contra base camps in Honduras earlier this month.

Casey's report said that the Sandinistas had 24 battalions in close-up reserve positions, a force larger than the Honduran army. But the prelim-

inary attack failed. Contra patrols discovered the invaders early and Contra sharpshooters surrounded them. Casey's message: The Contras can fight.

Before it ended, the Sandinistas lost 120 killed and 300 wounded. Casey's report explained the basic fault of Sandinista intelligence: a false assumption that most Contras attached to the base camps were not

there when, in fact, they were in the area.

Communications Director Patrick J. Buchanan will temporarily take direct control of the strife-torn White House speechwriting shop following Bently Elliott's departure of May 31, guaranteeing a continuation of conservative presidential rhetoric.

Elliott, who will write speeches and give policy advice for Rep. Jack Kemp's presidential campaign, has been the author of President Reagan's key speeches for the past five years. But over the last year, Chief of Staff Donald T. Regan has taken issue with Elliott's conservative prose.

Elliott also has clashed lately with Tony Dolan, a fellow conservative on the speechwriting staff specializing in foreign affairs. Rather than name Dolan as chief or pick an insider, Buchanan will take over by himself for a spell.

A requested fund-raising speech by George Bush was turned down for Rep. Bill Cobey, facing a tough reelection fight from a marginal North Carolina district, after Cobey declined to serve on the vice president's congressional steering committee.

Cobey conceded to us that "some people" draw a connection between the two events, but said he did not. He added that he still hopes for a vice presidential visit in the autumn. Bush political adviser Lee Atwater

claimed "no connection" between support for the vice president and his speaking appearances. One Bush insider, however, said such a connection might be "a good idea some time in the future."

A footnote: Bush will make a fund-raising speech for Rep. Fred Eckert, a conservative upstate New Yorker whose appointment to the vice president's steering committee surprised his friends. One insider privately accused Eckert of selling out for pieces of silver, but he denied any connection.

Wayne County (Detroit) Executive Bill Lucas, counted on by national Republican leaders to be the party's first black nominee for governor in a major state, is trailing badly in the Michigan GOP primary.

A poll conducted by White House pollster Richard Wirthlin shows Dick Chrysler, a 43-year-old auto parts manufacturer who has never held public office, with a 41 percent to 27 percent edge over Lucas. The poll was commissioned by Chrysler.

When Lucas switched parties last year, Republican strategists looked to him as a major catalyst for party gains among blacks. But his campaign has bogged down among outstate Republicans. Democratic Gov. James Blanchard is heavily favored for re-election, whoever wins the Republican nomination.

# High-Tech Arms-To-Iran Ring Smashed

NEW YORK (AP) — Authorities smashed alleged conspiracies to smuggle \$2 billion worth of high-tech U.S. weapons, including tanks and fighter jets, to Iran by arresting nine "brokers of death," officials said.

Among those arrested Monday were a retired Israeli general and an American lawyer based in London, who were picked up in Bermuda with three other men. The four others were arrested here.

Eight Europeans also charged Tuesday remained at large.

The retired general, Avraham Bar-Am, was quoted by Israel Radio and the daily newspaper Davar today as saying that Israeli authorities knew of the alleged plan.

"The defense establishment knows about this group, of which I was an adviser, and if the state of Israel does not help us I won't sit here for a month for nothing. I'll give myself up to the United States," Davar quoted Bar-Am as saying.

Israeli officials denied their nation knew anything about it.

All 17 defendants were charged with conspiring to violate U.S. arms laws and if convicted would face up to five years in prison.

U.S. Customs Service Commissioner William von Raab said Tuesday that the Iranians, who have been fighting neighboring Iraq for six years, would have opened a "terrorist flea market" had they succeeded in acquiring the weapons.

They included F-4 and F-5 fighter planes, Bell helicopters, M-48 tanks, TOW anti-tank missiles and various air-to-air missiles, von Raab said, calling the defendants "brokers of death."

The three complaints filed in U.S. District Court here alleged five separate conspiracies to get the arms to Iran.

The London lawyer, Samuel Evans, participated in all five, either locating arms procurers or

negotiating deals, said U.S. Attorney Rudolph W. Giuliani.

Prosecution papers identified the purported Iranian buyer as Cyrus Hashimi, who was charged here in 1984 with trying to smuggle arms there. Giuliani refused to comment on reports that Hashimi, who is free on bail while awaiting trial, cooperated with U.S. investigators in the latest case.

Von Raab also refused to say how Customs officials infiltrated schemes which allegedly began late last year.

One deal allegedly involved two Israeli businessmen, Guri and Israel Eisenberg, who were charged with planning to provide Iran with \$800 million worth of U.S. arms in Israeli inventories.

Nickos Minardos of Beverly Hills, Calif., who was arrested in New York, agreed to transport the arms from Israel to Iran under papers giving the destinations as Turkey and

the Philippines, prosecutors charged.

It is against U.S. law for a country owning American-built weapons, such as Israel, to transfer them to another country without a permit.

Sales of American arms to Iran have been barred since the 1979 hostage crisis, forcing that nation to turn to the black market in order to maintain the American-built arsenal it acquired under the shah.

A second conspiracy allegedly centered around a plot to supply F-5 aircraft and other items from Northrop Corp. of California directly to Iran.

The key figures in that deal were identified as William Northrop, an American living in Tel Aviv with no connection to Northrop Corp., and Bar-Am.

Bar-Am is an adviser to Israel's Northern Army Command and belongs to the military reserve, prosecutors said.

Israeli radio identified him as an agent previously involved in selling arms to Third World countries.

Giuliani said there is no suggestion the Israeli government was involved in the arms deals.

Israel considers Iraq, Iran's opponent in the Mideast war, one of its worst enemies. The Khomeini regime is also anti-Zionist.

Yossi Gal, a spokesman at the Israeli Embassy in Washington, said, "The government of Israel has no connection or involvement with this


matter." Bar-Am "retired from the Army way back."

In Jerusalem, the Foreign and Defense ministries issued a joint statement denying knowledge of the alleged plot.

The U.S. State Department refused to comment on the case.

## House OKs Cuts In Military Pensions

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House overwhelmingly approved changes in the military retirement system in an effort to cut costs and keep people in the service longer.

The bill, passed Tuesday 399-7, will not cut the pensions of any of the 1.4 million retirees now drawing checks or the potential future pensions of the 2.1 million people now in the armed forces. Only those entering the services after the bill becomes law would be affected.

The Senate Armed Services Committee also has a bill changing the pension program, but the panel hasn't yet acted. Any differences between the two measures would eventually have to be reconciled by a conference committee.

Under the current system, military personnel can retire after 20 years in the service and receive up to half

their base pay, averaged over a three-year period. People who leave before 20 years get nothing.

The benefits increase by 2.5 percent for each additional year of service up to a maximum of 75 percent for 30 years.

The bill passed Tuesday provides that someone who retires after 20 years would only get benefits of 40 percent of the base pay, averaged over five years, but still rising to 75 percent after three decades.

Rep. Les Aspin, D-Wis., chairman of the Armed Services Committee, told his colleagues the bill "will encourage people to stay in the full 30 years and keep the people who are

the most experienced and the most valuable."

But Rep. Charles Bennett, D-Fla., criticized any attempt to reduce pensions as being "unwise for the national security."

Bennett's opposition echoed the strong disapproval of Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger and the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the uniformed leaders of America's military.

They all have said any cuts in retirement would hamper efforts to attract and keep recruits to the all-volunteer U.S. military force, particularly in future years when the pool of potential recruits is likely to

be dwindling due to the reduced size of families in recent years.

## Viet Vet Executed

STARKE, Fla. (AP) — A decorated Vietnam veteran who claimed he suffered from a war-related stress disorder when he killed two people had accepted the fact that he was to be put to death, one of his final visitors said.

David Livingston Funchess, 39, was executed Tuesday in Florida's electric chair for the fatal stabbings of two people in a bar where he had been fired for stealing.

"He felt his life was complete," said Susan Cary, an attorney who visited Funchess shortly before his execution, the nation's third in eight days and the 56th since the Supreme Court allowed resumption of capital punishment 10 years ago.

Funchess was calm when he was

strapped into the electric chair 90 minutes after the Supreme Court voted 7-2 against extending the five-hour stay it had issued earlier Tuesday.

After being strapped in, he smiled at Ms. Cary and mouthed: "It's OK. It's OK. I love you."

Funchess made no final statement before the executioner threw the switch. He was pronounced dead at 5:11 p.m.

In a pasture outside the Florida State Prison, the daughters of Funchess' victims hugged each other when the execution was confirmed.

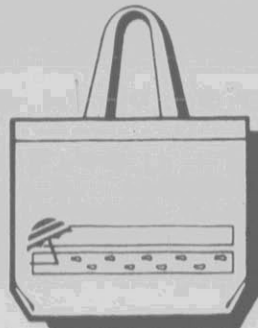

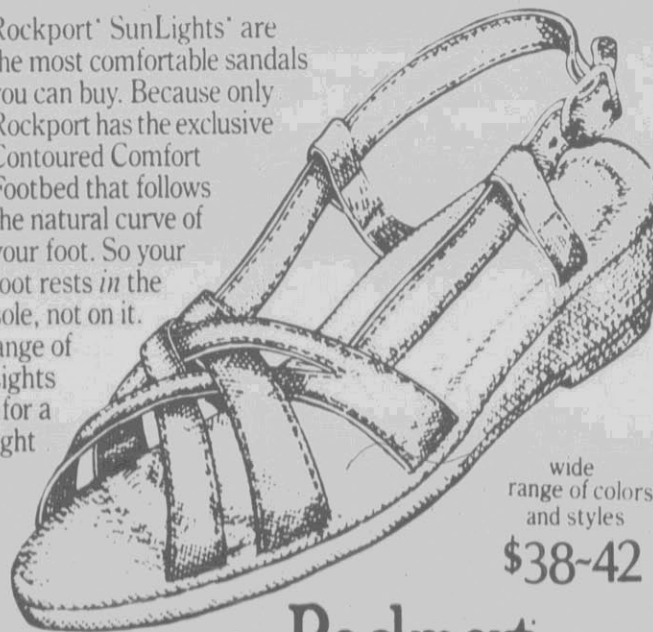

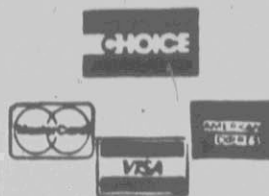

# Southern Lawmakers Get Research Institute

WASHINGTON (AP) — Thirteen Southern corporations have pledged more than \$300,000 to launch a research institute designed to help Southern congressmen and senators better understand the regional implications of federal legislation and policy.

The Sunbelt Institute was officially inaugurated Tuesday at a luncheon where Southern businessmen and lawmakers praised the new venture as potentially the South's best weapon in the battle for federal dollars.

"This institute ... is going to be able to give the members of Congress

from the Sunbelt the kind of information we need to make sure our citizens are treated in an equitable and fair way," said Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., a member of the institute's Senate steering committee.

"We're not trying to get more than our share, and we realize that we have to look at the country as a whole, and not just as one region," Nunn said. "But the Northeast and Midwest have already led the way in this and we want to make certain that ... our citizens and our states and local governments are treated fairly at the federal level."

The institute is patterned after the Northeast-Midwest Institute, which was created in 1978 to research

regional issues for congressmen from those regions. It has an annual budget of more than \$1 million and a research staff of 35.

Rep. Buddy MacKay, D-Fla., chairman of the Congressional Sunbelt Council task force that raised the seed money for the Sunbelt Institute, said the new think tank will have an annual budget of about \$250,000 and will start with 10 staff members.

Rep. Stephen Neal, D-N.C., chairman of the Sunbelt Council, said the congressmen and senators on the institute's steering committee will determine the research priorities for the staff.

Sen. Thad Cochran, R-Miss., said

the institute will "make a great deal of difference in our economic prosperity (in the South) and in our ability to speak effectively for the Sunbelt in the Congress."

Sen. Bennett Johnston, D-La., said the institute will provide Sunbelt congressmen with "the ability to get cohesive political action for shared political goals," will offer "self-defense" against similar research efforts by other regional groups, and will provide the means "to have some creative thinking as to what we as a region should be doing."

MacKay said the 13 corporations whose contributions made them founding members of the institute are American Family Corp., Barnett

# State Says Manufacturing Losses Offset By Other Employment Gains

RALEIGH (AP) — North Carolina's loss of 8,200 manufacturing jobs last year was offset by strong growth in the non-manufacturing sector, where 88,500 jobs were created, Gov. Jim Martin says.

Martin's Department of Commerce released its 1985 Economic Development Report on Tuesday, one day after the North Carolina Center for Public Policy Research Inc. said the department for many years has inflated by nearly half the number of jobs created by new and expanding businesses.

Martin said growth in the state's economy was sluggish last year after a boom in 1984, but declining unemployment and other factors indicated that the economy was sound.

"Generally you'll find that North Carolina experienced a relatively good year," he said.

The Gross State Product grew at 1.8 percent in 1985, compared with 9.0 percent the previous year, while personal income increased less rapidly than the national average, the report said.

Commerce Secretary Howard Haworth said he had been "startled" to learn after taking office last year that the department's system for compiling statistics on new jobs was "uniquely simplistic" and "quite shaky."

But Haworth said the Martin administration was developing a new reporting system that would reflect more accurately the number of jobs coming into North Carolina.

One step in that direction, Haworth said, was the use of employment fig-

ures supplied by the Employment Security Commission. "These are not some of those dream numbers," he said.

Additionally, this year's department report differentiates between the manufacturing and non-manufacturing jobs in its review of the employment generated by new and expanded business in the past five years, Haworth said.

Among the highlights of the report:

- Unemployment in 1985 was 4.7 percent, compared with 7 percent nationally.
- Total civilian employment rose above 3 million people for the first time.
- A total of \$2.8 billion in manufacturing business investments and \$1.5 billion in non-manufacturing investments was recorded. The investments are expected eventually to create 52,611 jobs.
- Wage and salary levels improved slightly, but the growth was less than the national average. Haworth said North Carolina probably remained near or at the bottom among the 50 states in wage and salary averages.
- The Piedmont continued to draw far more investment than the East and West. Some \$3.1 billion or 78.3 percent of the new investment was in the Piedmont, especially along the Interstate 85 corridor from Raleigh to Charlotte.
- Eastern North Carolina got 15.4 percent of the 1985 investment, or \$651.1 million, while Western North

Carolina got 6.23 percent or \$487.1 million.

- A total of 44 percent of the manufacturing investment last year was made by the state's three largest manufacturing industries — tobacco products, textiles and electronic machinery.
- The largest category of non-manufacturing investment in 1985 was multipurpose office buildings, with 47 percent of the total. Second was the hotel and lodging facilities category, with 18 percent of the non-manufacturing activity.


Martin said Tuesday that the annual report was helpful as his administration prepares its economic blueprint, a major program for developing the state's economy that should be released in mid-June.

He said that while it was important to continue the gradual transition to a more diversified economy, the state should do all it can to assist such "traditional industries" as textiles and tobacco.

Three areas of special concern, he said, are disposal of industrial wastes, highway construction and maintenance, and international investment.

Martin said it would be unrealistic and would make North Carolina business "very uncompetitive" to ask it to dispose of its own hazardous wastes, and that he hopes the private sector can provide sufficient disposal facilities without major government intervention.

# Bills Filed To Block Bid For Nuke Dumps

WASHINGTON (AP) — Legislators from seven states under scrutiny for sites to store nuclear waste have introduced Senate and House bills to terminate the process.

The bills, introduced Tuesday and spearheaded by Sen. George Mitchell, D-Maine, and Rep. Olympia Snowe, R-Maine, would eliminate the volume cap on a disposal site planned for the western United States and stop the Department of Energy search for a second site in a crystalline rock formation.

The sponsors said a second repository for high-level waste and spent reactor fuel will not be needed if a 70,000-metric ton cap is removed from the first repository.

"This is an artificial cap, having no basis in scientific requirements," said Ms. Snowe. She and Mitchell also cited DOE statistics indicating the volume of high-level nuclear waste is not expected to increase as quickly as was originally projected.

"Does it make sense to spend tens of billions of taxpayers' dollars for the siting and characterization of crystalline sites when it is not necessary to do so? The answer is clearly no," said Mitchell.

The first repository is expected to be built in Nevada, Texas or Washington state and is scheduled to be operational in 1998. DOE is selecting possibilities for a second site from among crystalline rock formations in Maine, New Hampshire, Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Wisconsin and Minnesota.

The companion House and Senate bills would, among other things, end the crystalline repository search; remove the volume limitation on the first site; and set up a scientific commission to report to Congress on deep geologic disposal and available alternatives.

## Panel Told Poor Lack Health Care

RALEIGH (AP) — Poor, old or disabled people living in the rural mountains and Eastern North Carolina often have no health insurance and no way to pay medical bills, according to a report presented to a legislative panel.

Members of the Indigent Health Care Commission were told Tuesday about Robert D. Stevens, a 48-year-old cancer patient whose doctor refused to continue his chemotherapy treatment because he owed \$175 in medical bills.

"He died without medical treatment after paying his Social Security taxes for 30 years," Dona Montgomery told commission members.

Ms. Montgomery, founder of the Alliance for Social Security Disability Recipients in Charlotte, said it often takes 25 months for disabled people to start receiving federal government Medicare payments to pay for their medical care.

"Who pays for the care of the indigents is a very complicated problem, and there are about 20 different policies you can go into," said Kit Simpson, a University of North Carolina researcher who helped prepare the report. "If it's left for counties to solve, some may be able

to solve it on their own and some may not because of the revenue base they have."

The UNC report estimated that 3.9 percent of North Carolinians, or more than 230,000 people, were both poor and uninsured in 1980.

The highest percentage of uninsured poor is in Warren County with 9.2 percent, followed by Hyde County with 8.6 percent and Swain County with 7.8 percent, the report says.

Cumberland County has the highest number of uninsured poor patients with 9,482, followed by Mecklenburg County with 8,616 and Guilford with 6,205, the report says.

The report said the problem of caring for the indigent has worsened because of increased competition among hospitals for paying patients, decreased patient population resulting from a trend toward outpatient care and shorter hospital stays, and an apparent increase in the

number of people seeking help in larger, more specialized urban hospitals.

"We just heard horror stories about people who didn't go to the doctor because they couldn't pay the bills," said Rep. Jim Crawford, D-Granville, the commission co-chairman.

"We still have some very basic needs. The gap is widening instead of closing," Crawford said. "The increased cost of insurance is going to affect us all. On top of all this, we have Gramm-Rudman, which is going to pull out more money."

The report said 17 counties have no general, acute-care hospitals and have to export most of their patients.

### Hazing Charge

GREENSBORO (AP) — A criminal investigation into hazing by Omega Psi Phi fraternity at North Carolina A&T State University has led to criminal charges of hazing by another A&T fraternity, officials say.

Eight members of Alpha Phi Alpha were each charged last week with one count of hazing, a misdemeanor. All but one of the alleged hazing incidents occurred on Feb. 22, and all the charges involve the same pledge, according to criminal citations.

Pledge James T. Glenn was paddled repeatedly on the buttocks with a wooden paddle, elbowed and punched in the stomach, slapped and thrown to the ground, and choked with a rope necklace, according to citations.

John Williams, university police chief, said the hazing allegedly occurred off campus at the home of a fraternity member. Williams said no assault charges were filed because the alleged hazing did not involve violence or personal injury.

### 'Silent Sam'

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) — For the first time in 73 years of enduring birds, vandals and off-color jokes, "Silent Sam" is taking a vacation.

The bronze, life-sized statue of a Confederate soldier was removed Tuesday from its pedestal on the University of North Carolina's old campus at McCorkle Park for a trip to Cincinnati, where it will undergo an \$8,200 restoration. When it is returned in about six months, the statue should look as good as it did when it was unveiled in June 1913.

The soldier, facing north with musket ready, has been known as Silent Sam for years. Some university officials say the statue has the name because legend has it that he only fires his gun during commencement ceremonies. But according to a story popular among UNC students, Sam has been silent for the past seven decades because he will fire his weapon only when a virtuous woman walks past.

Durham Police Cpl. W.D. Bell stopped about 7 p.m. Sunday when he saw the men pushing a car. Shortly after Bell told police communications he was assisting a stranded motorist, a communicator told him that the car matched the description of one wanted in connection with a larceny of cigarettes from Kroger's.

Clayton and Jackson were placed in the Durham County Jail in lieu of \$400 bond each.

### Litter Cleaner

RALEIGH (AP) — North Carolina Department of Transportation officials have announced the arrival of a litter retrieval machine that will clean trash from state roads.

Secretary of Transportation James Harrington said the machine will "effectively improve our litter pickup activities by increasing productivity and by reducing costs."

The Board of Transportation approved the purchase of the \$43,000 litter pickup machine at its May 1985 meeting. DOT spends \$2 million annually on roadside maintenance.

### Knoxville Man Held In Theft

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — A 34-year-old Tennessee businessman was arrested Tuesday and charged with a 1984 North Carolina bank robbery, which the FBI said ranks as one of the largest North Carolina bank heists ever.

FBI agents arrested Justin Green of Knoxville without incident Tuesday morning at his printing business in nearby Lenoir City, said FBI spokesman Larry Paul.

Green was taken to the Knox County Jail after appearing before U.S. Magistrate Robert P. Murrain on bank robbery charges, authorities said. A bond hearing was set for Thursday.

Paul said about \$750,000 was taken in the robbery at the Branch Banking & Trust of Smithfield, N.C., on Sept. 5, 1984.

# Reagan To Call For Repeal Of Windfall Tax

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan, coming to the aid of America's beleaguered oil industry, is campaigning for repeal of the windfall profits tax that was imposed in the days of skyrocketing prices and gasoline shortages.

Now, with the oil industry reeling from a worldwide production glut and collapsing prices, the windfall profits tax produces virtually no revenue for the Treasury but is a source of irritation for petroleum producers.

Repeal of the tax would be wel-

come news in energy-producing states, particularly in Texas, which accounts for about one-third of the U.S. production and is a key battleground in presidential races.

Reagan's decision to work for repeal of the tax and to win deregulation of the natural gas industry was announced Tuesday following meetings with oil state congressmen and governors.

Rep. Richard Cheney, R-Wyo., said the windfall profits tax — which would kick in again if oil prices increase — "fundamentally

discourages people from taking risks that go with exploration for oil and gas.

"Now, while the price is down (it's) a good opportunity for us to clear away some of the underbrush that would otherwise serve as a disincentive to the kind of investment we're going to have to have," Cheney added.

Rep. Bill Archer, R-Texas, said the tax, while producing no revenue, "places a very large administrative burden on the industry, a cost which

could be used to develop and find more energy."

As a candidate in 1980, Reagan had opposed the windfall profits tax, but as president he had not worked for its repeal.

Announcing Reagan's decision, presidential spokesman Larry Speakes said, "While the president remains concerned about our energy security, he reaffirmed his belief that lower energy prices are of great overall benefit to the American economy."

Democratic Govs. George Nigh of

Oklahoma and Ed Herschler of Wyoming said Reagan had agreed with all but one of the proposals that had been formulated by oil-state governors at an "energy summit" in Dallas last week. The president did not support their call for a temporary, variable fee on imported oil.

## Fuel May Be Cause Of Blast

VANDENBERG AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AP) — The nearly instantaneous explosion that destroyed a Titan rocket and its secret payload leads investigators to conclude there was a propellant failure in a rocket booster, a newspaper reported today.

Air Force investigators made that tentative conclusion after studying pictures that all but rule out the possibility of a failure in one of the rocket's joints or of detonation of the Titan's self-destruct device, the Los Angeles Times, quoting unidentified sources, reported.

"There must have been some kind of irregularity in the propellant itself," an unidentified aerospace engineer told the newspaper.

The explosion of the Titan 34D was so powerful and quick that investigators think the problem was far more serious than a slow leak in a rocket booster like the one believed to have caused the space shuttle Challenger explosion, the engineer said.

"It was actually an instantaneous blow" rather than a progressive series of events, the engineer said. "That usually occurs because of instantaneous high pressure brought about by some major problem within the propellant itself."

The \$64 million Titan exploded five seconds after liftoff Friday, sending a toxic cloud of unburned liquid rocket fuel along the Pacific coastline. Although no one was seriously injured, 74 people, mostly military personnel, were examined after complaining of eye and skin irritation.

It was the second loss of a Titans launched from this sprawling missile test center 175 miles northwest of Los Angeles.

Previous reports speculated that the Titan was carrying a super-secret KH-11 photo-reconnaissance satellite. However, the Times said it was told by a source in the Pentagon that a spy satellite was not aboard the rocket. Air Force officials have refused to comment on the payload.

## ECU Nursing School Gets 'Good' Report

East Carolina University's School of Nursing expects to receive continued full accreditation of its graduate and undergraduate programs by the National League of Nursing for the eight-year maximum period of time, a school spokesman said.

A three-member site visitation team, headed by Dr. Mary Lohr, dean of nursing at Clemson University, read "a very positive" report at the conclusion of a four-day visitation last week, according to Dr. Emilie D. Henning, dean of the ECU School of Nursing.

"The visitors were most impressed with our quality faculty, able students and well-designed curricula," Dr. Henning said. The report recommending continued accreditation is to be made to the League's Board of Review in October.

"I anticipate that this will be continued accreditation for the maximum period of time, eight years," Dr. Henning said. "This will be a first in the history of the school."

The visitation team cited only one area of desired improvement — ad-

ditional space for the nursing school, Dr. Henning said.

The school of nursing, which has 585 undergraduate and 80 graduate majors, has been accredited continuously since 1964, Dr. Henning said.

## High Winds Rip Through Idaho Trees

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — High winds blasted the Boise National Forest, leveling enough trees to load 1,000 logging trucks, said officials who were trying to figure out whether to blame tornadoes for the damage.

High gusts hit Ada and Boise counties Tuesday evening, cutting through 1,500 acres of forest, pitching a trailer, injuring two people and leaving thousands without electricity.

A gust lifted the mobile home into the air and tossed it about 60 feet, injuring the two people inside, Michael Yates, 33, and his girlfriend, Carol Watrous, 26, said Yates' father, F.R. Yates. They were treated at a Boise hospital for cuts and bruises.

"The wind just tore it all to pieces, just like a tornado," F.R. Yates said. "Mike's back looks like he's been through a meatpacker."

More than 10,000 Idaho Power Co. customers in Boise were left without power, said company spokesman Larry Taylor. He said power was being restored but at least 500 customers would be without power until sometime today.

The National Forest Service planned an aerial survey today of the forest.

Trees were "snapped off like sticks," said Charlie Vaughn, fire management officer for the Lowman Ranger District.

The National Weather Service planned to examine how trees fell to determine whether a tornado struck, said spokesman Gerry Burdwell.

The winds felled 6 million board feet of timber, estimated Dale Dufour, public affairs officer for the Boise National Forest. One logging truck hauls 5,000 to 6,000 board feet, he said.

Roofs were ripped off homes and trees were strewn across Idaho 21 between Idaho City and Lowman, Boise County Sheriff's Deputy Chuck Richards said.

In one place in the forest, trees were downed in a swath that ran down one mountainside, across a valley and up another slope, he said.

## Paper Says NASA Lost 'Billions'

NEW YORK (AP) — NASA and its contractors have wasted billions of dollars on the shuttle and other programs despite repeated warnings that bad management procedures were causing heavy losses, The New York Times reported today.

The newspaper said it had reviewed more than 500 audits of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, other government documents and economic reports by outside experts. The audits were made available under the Freedom of Information Act.

The Times also said it had conducted a series of interviews with experts.

Basing its estimate on dollar amounts cited in the audits, the Times reported that the total waste comes to at least \$3.5 billion. However, it said, the audits in many cases did not give dollar figures.

"We always assume we have only seen the tip of the iceberg — there is probably much more out there," Francis P. LaRocca, the attorney for the Inspector General's office, told the Times.

Dr. James C. Fletcher, who headed the agency in the 1970s, has been nominated by President Reagan to lead the agency again during investigation of the Jan. 28 explosion of shuttle Challenger that killed seven astronauts.

Fletcher, who faces congressional confirmation hearings that begin today, told the newspaper he was over-optimistic in talks before Congress in the 1970s but he denied he attempted in any way to mislead.

# Aviator Hangs To Dream Of Flight Around World

MOJAVE, Calif. (AP) — In a drafty hangar where the desert winds howl like the ghost of some phantom flier, test pilots are working on an aircraft they hope will break another aviation barrier — a round-the-world flight without refueling.

"You never get used to the wind," test pilot Dick Rutan said last week as he performed a test on Voyager's forward engine. "You endure."

For nearly five years, Rutan has endured the winds blowing through the hangar, the challenges of flight test and the difficulties of fund-raising.

The project, which has cost more than \$1 million so far, subsists on non-tax-deductible contributions, the dedicated efforts of a staff paid on a shoestring, and help from volunteers, Rutan said.

"We go from month to month and hand to mouth and that's the way it's been since day one. We sell T-shirts and trinkets," he said. "The alternative was to abandon the project, and that was unthinkable."

The 46-year-old former Air Force fighter pilot is determined to go into the history books with Charles Lindbergh and Wiley Post, the globe-trotting, one-eyed pilot who died in a plane crash with humorist Will Rogers in 1935.

Rutan believed the task would be

relatively simple in 1981, when he formed Voyager Aircraft Inc. with his friend and co-pilot, Jeana Yeager.

The pair hope to depart from Edwards Air Force Base on Sept. 14, and spend 12 days circling the globe, flying 25,000 miles around the equatorial trade wind route — the same way Christopher Columbus reached America, Rutan said.

The Voyager was the brainchild of Rutan's brother, Burt, who had designed commercially successful lightweight planes that employed small engines and unconventional wing designs to improve fuel efficiency dramatically. It took 22,000 hours of labor over more than two years to build the Voyager, a plane with a 110-foot wing span that weighs

939 pounds without fuel. Because of its revolutionary design, the craft carries 8,934 pounds of fuel.

The Voyager, which is almost entirely constructed of super-light graphite material, sits in Hangar 77 at Mojave Airport in the desert 75 miles north of downtown Los Angeles, looking like a dream of what is possible.

No one has ever flown an airplane around the world non-stop without refueling.

"It's a very interesting concept," said Ned Crain, a quality supervisor for Boeing Co. Inc. in Seattle who visited the hangar to see the strange plane. "I wouldn't want to fly in something where the fuel weighed more than the aircraft."

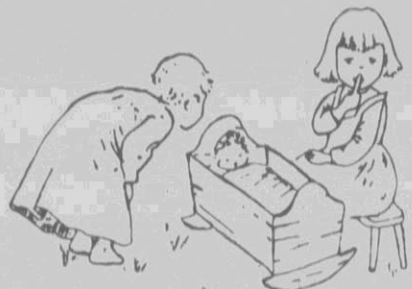

# Stock And Market Reports

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market declined broadly today, continuing Tuesday's drop amid worries about the outlook for the dollar and interest rates.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials slipped 4.47 to 1,826.51 in the first hour of trading.

Losers outnumbered gainers by more than 2 to 1 in the early tally of New York Stock Exchange-listed issues.

As the dollar tumbled Tuesday in foreign exchange, bond prices fell and interest rates rose in the credit markets. Today, prices of long-term bonds lost another \$10 to \$15 for every \$1,000 in face value.

Analysts said traders were concerned that a declining dollar would dampen foreign demand for U.S. securities such as Treasury bonds.

Eastern Airlines rose 3/8 to 8 1/2. There were reports that the company, which is slated to merge with Texas Air, has been approached by the Pritzker family of Chicago about a possible competing takeover bid.

Among actively traded blue chips, Sears Roebuck dropped 1/2 to 44 1/2; American Express 1/2 to 64 7/8, and International Business Machines 1/4 to 152 3/4.

At 10 a.m., the NYSE's composite index of all its listed common stocks was down .69 at 139.17. The American Stock Exchange market value index fell 1.36 to 271.17.

## Election Plan OK'd

Elizabeth City officials and attorneys representing black voters who filed a lawsuit challenging the city's elections procedures have agreed on a new plan for electing city council members.  
The agreement came one month after the U.S. Justice Department rejected a redistricting plan submitted by the city. The department claimed the plan discriminated against blacks by preserving at-large elections and diluting blacks' voting strength.  
Under the new plan, which was approved Monday by the city council, the city would be divided into four districts, two mostly white and two mostly black, with two council members chosen from each district and voted on only by residents of the district, said Ron L. Matthews, Elizabeth City manager.  
The plan must be approved by the Justice Dept. and U.S. District Court in Eastern North Carolina before elections can be scheduled, said Ronald B. Penny, attorney for the plaintiffs. He said city officials also would ask the General Assembly this summer to approve the agreement.  
The proposal that was rejected by the Justice Department had called for two council members to be selected from each district. One of the two would have been voted on only by residents of the district; the other would have been selected at-large by all city voters.

## Two Sign Cage Pacts With ECU

East Carolina basketball coach Charlie Harrison has announced the signing of one incoming freshman and one junior college transfer to grant-in-aid for the coming year.

The two are Theodore Edwards, a 6-4 swing man from Louisburg Junior College and Luther Tutt, a 6-6 incoming freshman from Rockaway, N.Y.

Edwards, a graduate of Greene Central High School in Snow Hill, averaged 22.3 points a game and 6.0 rebounds during his sophomore second with the Hurricanes. The most valuable player in the Hurricane Classic, Edwards was voted to the All-Region X team. He shot 65.8 percent from the floor in 31 games this year, hitting on 268 of 407 shots.

"Forget his 6-4 size," Harrison said. "He is strong, has good speed, excellent strength and uncanny jumping ability and innate scoring instincts. If his intensity of play becomes more consistent at both ends of the floor, he can make an immediate and very significant impact on the success of East Carolina basketball."

Tutt, who attends Beach Channel High School, averaged 18.7 points per game and 12.0 rebounds this winter. He was selected to the New York City All-Star third team, and was also named All-Queens. He was named as one of the top 15 players in New York City and one of the top five in Queens.

The past three years, his team has reached the New York City Championship's quarterfinals.

"He's a long 6-6 and still growing," Harrison said. "He has played against excellent competition for the past three years and will continue to play through the summer as a member of the highly regarded 'Gauchos' basketball team of New York City. Luther will get better quickly and could see considerable playing time before his freshman year ends."

The two bring to three the number of players signed by ECU. They signed Reed Lose, a 6-3 guard from Harrisburg, Pa., during the early fall signing period.

Harrison said he expects to sign two more players later on.

# Celts, Nets, Rockets End Series

Winning in the playoffs, when teams play each other in consecutive games instead of sporadically, often becomes a matter of problem-solving.

The Boston Celtics' problem was Michael Jordan, the Milwaukee Bucks' problem was 73 first-half points by the New Jersey Nets and the Denver Nuggets problem was an injury to center Wayne Cooper. All three teams found the solutions they needed Tuesday night, and joined Philadelphia, Houston and Detroit in the victory column.

Boston, which won the first two games of the best-of-five series against Chicago despite 49 and a playoff-record 63 points by Jordan, held him to 19 in Game 3, while Kevin McHale scored 31 in a 122-104 Celtics

victory that moved them into the second round.

New Jersey shot 65 percent from the field and surpassed its playoff scoring record for a half in taking a 73-55 lead at halftime, but Milwaukee held New Jersey to 40 points and 36.1 percent shooting in the second half. The Bucks' 118-113 victory also completed a series sweep.

Blair Rasmussen, starting in place of Cooper, scored a career-high 26 points, 11 more than his previous best, leading the Nuggets to a 115-104 victory over Portland, giving Denver a 2-1 lead.

Elsewhere, Houston completed a 3-0 sweep over Sacramento with a 113-98 victory; Philadelphia took a 2-1 edge over Washington with a 91-86 triumph over Washington; and Detroit got its first win in three

games against Atlanta, a 106-97 decision.

Tonight, Los Angeles is at San Antonio and Dallas at Utah. The Mavericks and Lakers both lead 2-0.

**Celtics 122, Bulls 104**

Boston, which never trailed, got 23 points from McHale in building a 66-52 at the half before Chicago cut the deficit to 72-61. The Celtics responded with 15 consecutive points to turn the game into a rout.

The outcome was decided long before Jordan, who scored just five points after the first quarter, fouled out with 5½ minutes left. He received a standing ovation from the Chicago Stadium crowd.

"It seemed like every time I got the ball, before I could make a move, they would send someone else at me," Jordan said of the Celtics' double-teaming tactics.

"Our game plan was to minimize his scoring opportunities and the best way to do it was to double up on Jordan and push the ball up court," Celtics Coach K. C. Jones said.

Bird, who scored 19 for the Celtics, said he never thought one man could beat a team in the NBA, but "Michael nearly did. We didn't want him to get 40 or 50 points so that they could get back into the game."

Danny Ainge finished with 20 points for the Celtics, while John Paxson and Dave Corzine led Chicago with 23 and 22 points, respectively.

**Bucks 118, Nets 113**

Milwaukee Coach Don Nelson, after watching New Jersey shoot 44.4 percent in the first two games of the series, couldn't believe what happened in the first half of Game 3.

"It didn't look good for us," Nelson said of the 18-point halftime deficit. "I was shocked. I thought we would come out like tigers, but it just shows you can't read your team."

Milwaukee outscored the Nets 36-22 in the third period to draw within 95-91, then took the lead down the stretch behind key plays from Terry Cummings and Paul Pressey.

"Defense was really the key for us," said Pressey, who scored 22 points. "We got back in the game in the third period, but we didn't anticipate making up that much ground that fast."

After drawing within a point of the lead six times in the fourth quarter, Milwaukee took a 112-110 lead with 2:28 to play when Pressey converted a steal into a layup and free throw. New Jersey got even on two free throws before Cummings, who had 23

points and 11 rebounds, put the Bucks on top to stay with a baseline jumper with 52 seconds left.

Otis Birdsong paced the Nets with 28 points and Buck Williams had 25. Each scored 18 points in the first half as New Jersey surpassed its previous first-half playoff scoring mark of 69 points.

**Nuggets 115, Trail Blazers 104**

Rasmussen, who averaged three points per game during the season and played fewer minutes than any other first-round draft pick, was the difference for Denver against Portland.

"They weren't too worried about me as a scorer because I really haven't done anything all year," the 7-foot Rasmussen said. "I guess I was just in the right place at the right time."

Dominique Wilkins, who scored 50 points in Atlanta's second-game victory, was held to 21 Tuesday night. Glenn Rivers had 20 points for the Hawks and Isiah Thomas added 20 points for the Pistons.

**76ers 91, Bullets 86**

Sedale Threatt scored eight points and Julius Erving and Bobby Jones added six apiece during a 26-6 streak that helped Philadelphia overcome a 13-point Washington lead.

The Bullets, who overcame a 17-point deficit with an 18-0 streak in Game 1, cut a 10-point deficit to 89-86 with 16 seconds remaining with a 7-0 streak, five of them by Gus Williams, who finished with 28 points. But Erving sank two free throws with 11 seconds left to blunt the comeback.

## Groups To Study Open Olympics

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — The world's national Olympic bodies agreed today to study further proposals that could open the Games to professionals, the organization's leader said.

The National Olympic Committees also agreed to hold off any changes in eligibility.

At the end of a long debate, the Association of National Olympic Committees decided to form a panel that would fully investigate changes in athlete eligibility.

Mario Vazquez Rana, the ANOC president, said IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch had promised that he would "not take steps on this matter until he hears from all of us."

The IOC had been scheduled to take up the matter of eligibility in October. Wednesday's decision by ANOC may mean that timetable can not be met and that in turn would mean that the current eligibility rule would be in effect for the 1988 Olympics in Calgary and Seoul.

Vazquez Rana said he had never been happy with the proposed change, known as the Athletes Code, which would give the responsibility of determining who is eligible for the Olympics to 28 international sports federations.

He acknowledged that the current rules have loopholes, allowing athletes to be paid, while technically remaining amateurs. But he said there was no sense in trying to rush through changes that might do more harm than good.

"Hypocrisy we can endure a little

bit longer while we study this matter," he said. "Although it is urgent, we are not in a hurry. We have discussed this for many years."

Wednesday's action was a rapid turnaround from what appeared to be smooth sailing earlier in the week for the eligibility change.

The little brother from San Francisco is beginning to resemble Lefty Grove and Walter Johnson. The big brother from Los Angeles is starting to look like a punching bag.

The Giants scored seven runs before the Dodgers could record an out in the first inning Tuesday en route to a 10-3 romp which kept San Francisco in first place in the National League West. The Dodgers, winners of the West last year, are last at 4-11.

"It's kind of like slapping your big brother in the face," Giants pitcher Krukow said. "I think this is showing other teams in our division that they have to respect us."

Krukow earned his third victory in as many decisions this season, but it was the Giants' hitting and the Dodgers' poor pitching that was the key Tuesday.

"Let's put it this way, I'm not happy, not happy at all," Dodgers Manager Tom Lasorda said after starter Dennis Powell allowed four hits and a walk in the first five batters, including a two-run double by Chili Davis. "We're making every pitcher look like Lefty Grove and Walter Johnson."

Comparing every pitcher to Hall-of-Famers Grove and Johnson may be an exaggeration, but Lasorda's anger is well placed. The Dodgers are batting .200 as a team.

In other games, it was New York 7, Pittsburgh 1; Houston 3, Atlanta 2; Montreal 8, Philadelphia 2, and Chicago 3, St. Louis 2.

Carlos Diaz wasn't anything like Grove or Johnson in relief of Powell, 0-3. He allowed three hits and walked one before Dan Gladden — the 10th batter in the inning — hit into a run-scoring force out for the Giants first out of the game.

The Giants collected seven hits,

walked twice and capitalized on two Dodgers errors in the seven-run inning.

"I've never seen anything like that before," Lasorda said. "In the dug-out you're saying, 'I can't believe it. We'll get the next guy out.' And you don't do it. It seemed as if everything they hit went through."

Right now, that's what the Giants are doing to everyone. They haven't been in first place this late in the season since 1978.

"Everyone picked us to finish last, and here we are in first," said third baseman Chris Brown. "I hope we make a lot of experts look silly this season."

## Director Preminger Dies At 79

NEW YORK (AP) — Otto Preminger, the autocratic director whose 39 films included such innovative standards as "Anatomy of a Murder," and "The Man With The Golden Arm," died early today. He was 79 and had cancer.

Preminger died at 12:42 a.m. in bed at his apartment, with his wife, Hope, and a nurse at his side, said police spokesman Sgt. Ron Severin.

Preminger was born Dec. 5, 1906, in Vienna, Austria, and earned a law degree there in 1928. He came to the United States in 1935 and the following year made his first U.S. film, "Under Your Spell."

He also was on the faculty at Yale Drama School until 1940, and then became a stage director in New York, winning the Critics Choice Award and Full Circle Award for Broadway productions.

Preminger was known as an innovator, challenging the film industry's taboos in films like the 1953 "The Moon is Blue," the 1954 "Carmen Jones," a modern-day adaptation of Bizet's opera with an

all-black cast, and 1956's "Golden Arm," which starred Frank Sinatra and was Hollywood's first depiction of narcotics use.

He also appeared in four films, including "Stalag 17," in which he portrayed the dictatorial commandant

of a German prisoner-of-war camp. "The Moon is Blue," an adaptation of the Broadway bedroom comedy, ran without the Motion Picture Production Code seal of approval because its screenplay contained the words "virgin" and "pregnant."

## Network Television Cuts Cable Erosion

NEW YORK (AP) — Led by top-rated NBC's major audience gains in its historic victory season, network television finally halted its audience erosion to cable and independent stations for the first time since 1976-77.

Combined viewing on NBC, CBS and ABC increased 1.24 percent from 48.5 to 49.1 ratings points in 1985-86.

"We took audiences from the (network) competition, pay-cable and the independents," said Bill Rubens, NBC's vice president for research.

"About half of NBC's increased audience came from non-network viewers," said Dave Poltrack, CBS' vice president for research.

NBC's audience growth, which Poltrack called extraordinary, was 1.3 ratings points over last season, giving the network its first outright prime-time victory since the A.C. Nielsen Co. started counting eyeballs three decades ago. CBS had finished first the past six seasons.

According to Nielsen figures released Tuesday, NBC won the 30-week season that ended Sunday with a 17.5 rating, an increase of 8 percent. CBS fell from 16.9 to 16.7. ABC

slipped from 15.4 to 14.9. (A single ratings point equals 859,000 homes with television.) NBC also led in every age group except adults over 55, which CBS still dominated.

"I've been waiting 6½ years for this," Brandon Tartikoff, president of NBC Entertainment, said during a satellite hookup with television writers. Tartikoff joined NBC in 1980 and suffered third-rated seasons until the network jumped to second place last year.

Much of the credit goes to NBC's twin Thursday comedies, "The Cosby Show" and "Family Ties," which finished one-two, replacing the soapy "Dynasty" and "Dallas" as television's most-watched series. The last two comedies to top the ratings were "Laverne & Shirley" and "Three's Company" in 1978-79.

The rest of this season's Top 10 included CBS' "Murder, She Wrote" in third, followed by CBS' "60 Minutes," marking its seventh consecutive season in the first four, and NBC's "Cheers." Next came CBS' "Dallas," which reached the Top 10 for the seventh straight time, ABC's "Dynasty," last season's No. 1 show, NBC's "The Golden Girls," the top-rated new series, NBC's "Miami Vice" and ABC's "Who's the Boss?"

This season, Poltrack said, the networks proved more adept at counter-programming for available audiences. For example, while CBS' "Falcon Crest" was appealing to women viewers on Friday night, NBC found the disaffected male viewers with "Miami Vice," producing two simultaneous hits, Poltrack noted.

A Nielsen study of homes with pay-cable's HBO in March showed that viewing was up for all three networks in those households but down for all other stations, including HBO and independent stations. NBC showed the greatest increase — 2.4 ratings points.

"In essence, each of the networks put on a better schedule than a year ago," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC's vice president for research projects.

Ratings for all three networks were up with those viewers earning more than \$40,000 in income. "Cable is not taking away our upscale viewer," Poltrack said. "Cable is taking away some of our heavy television viewer," which he described as more middle class, earning about \$20,000 a year.

The networks also improved their performance with adults 18-49, the favorite group of most advertisers. "In that respect you'd have to say it was a good year," said John Sisk, senior vice president of the J. Walter Thompson ad agency.

One of the faults of an inexperienced player is a tendency to waste aces "on air." Average players, on the other hand, err in the opposite direction; they are reluctant to win tricks when they should.

The bidding was a model of accuracy. After South's weak two-bid was passed round to him, East elected to make a balancing double. West judged well that his side was unlikely to make nine tricks and his defensive prospects were good, so he passed. It required foresight and good defense to vindicate his judgment.

West led the king of diamonds and East signalled encouragement with the nine. Before playing on, West took time to review his side's prospects. His doubleton heart was ominous—it looked as if there were not going to be any trump tricks for the defenders. The king of spades and ace-king of clubs in dummy made it look as if there was at most one trick available in the black suits to go with three diamond tricks. The setting trick would have to come from a trump promotion.

That required some care. The first thing West did was to cash the ace of spades. Then he continued with the queen of diamonds. East overtook with the ace, cashed the jack and simply continued with the 13th diamond, and West's queen of hearts was promoted.

Noted that it was essential for West to cash the ace of spades before continuing with diamonds. Had he failed to do so, declarer would have got home. When East gained the lead with the third round of diamonds, he could not attack spades for he had no entry back to his hand to lead the last diamonds. And if he continued with the diamond, declarer would have sluffed his spade loser while West ruffed, and would have held his losers to three diamond tricks and the ruff.
