The Lady Bullets are now 15-2 overall while Belhaven is 4-9. Jamesville travels to North Edgemonte on Thursday.

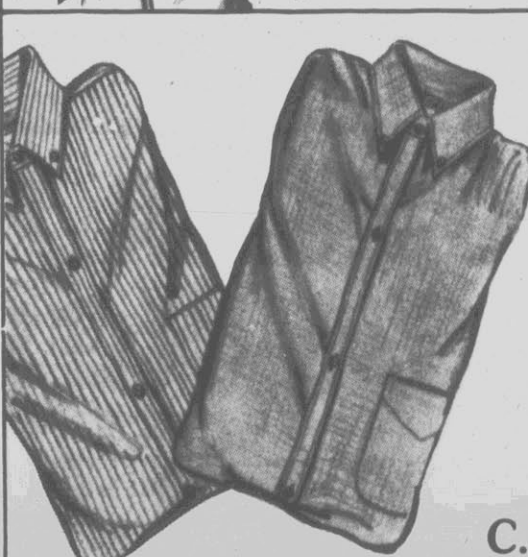
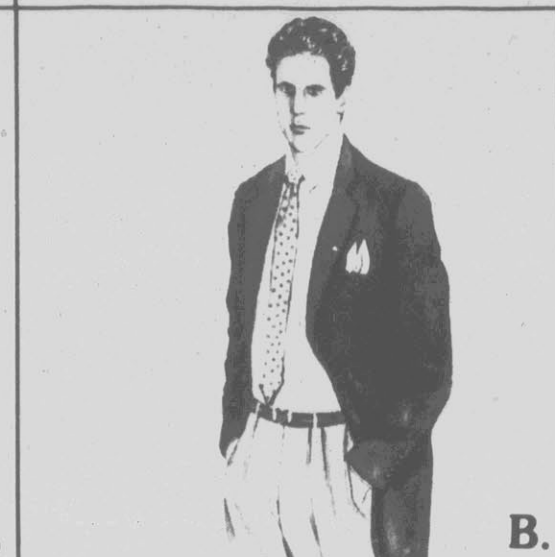
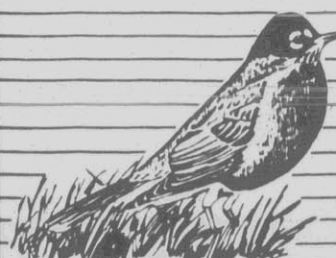

Tribe Wraps Up No. 9

Andre Thornton hit two home runs, then crossed his fingers.

"There's always some apprehension when you know it's going to rain," Cleveland's designated hitter said following Tuesday night's rain-shortened 6-1 victory over the Kansas City Royals. "But there's nothing you can do about it. You just wait it out."

The Indians didn't have to wait long — just one hour and 21 minutes — before wrapping up their ninth straight victory. The game was called off when the anticipated thunderstorm hit Municipal Stadium with one out in the bottom of the fifth inning — just one out after the game became official.

The victory kept the Indians in first place in the American League East by 13 percentage points over the New York Yankees, 10-6 winners over Chicago.

In other AL games, it was Oakland 17, Toronto 3; California 6, Boston 2; Milwaukee 10, Seattle 0; Texas 4, Detroit 2, and Baltimore 5, Minnesota 3.

Thornton's big game, which included five RBI, was a breath of fresh air for him. He had driven only seven runs prior to Tuesday night and his two homers boosted his batting average to .191.

"Guys have been picking me up all year," Thornton said. "It felt good to be able to contribute to a win."

Thornton hit a two-run homer in the first inning after Julio Franco had doubled, then socked a three-run homer following singles by Andy Allanson and Brett Butler in the third. The homers were the third and fourth of the year for Thornton, giving him 201 in his career with the Indians.

Tom Candiotti, 2-2, got the victory, giving up one run on six hits in five innings. Kansas City starter Bud Black, 1-3, allowed six runs on seven hits while striking out five in three innings.

A's 17, Blue Jays 3

At Toronto, Dave Kingman drove in five runs with two homers and a sacrifice fly and unbeaten Moose Haas became the major leagues' first six-game winner this season, yielding three hits over seven innings as Oakland beat Toronto.

Haas, who gave up one of Jesse Barfield's two bases-empty homers, struck out five and walked one. His record is the best for an Oakland pitcher since Matt Keough and Mike Norris each got off to 6-0 starts in 1981.

Mickey Tettleton and Carney Lansford also homered in Oakland's 17-hit attack.

"He's a big part of our ballclub and he's starting to find his stroke," Oakland Manager Jackie Moore said of Kingman. "When he's swinging the bat like that, he's going to win some games for us."

Angels 6, Red Sox 2

Gary Pettis hit his first homer in almost a year, and Rob Wilfong singled in the decisive run in the eighth inning as California defeated Boston at Fenway Park.

After Boston pulled into a 2-2 tie in the seventh, Dick Scofield opened the eighth with single and was sacrificed to second by George Hendrick. Wilfong followed with his ground single through the middle off loser Dennis (Oil-Can) Boyd, 2-3.

The Angels added three runs in the ninth on Bob Boone's RBI single, an error by center fielder Steve Lyons and a ground out.

Pettis, who had only seven hits in 54 previous at-bats, gave California a 2-0 lead with two out in the third inning with his two-run homer. Pettis' homer was his first in 114 games, since last June 1 in Detroit.

Brewers 10, Mariners 0

Paul Molitor hit a two-run homer and Ben Oglivie had three hits, driving in two runs, to lead a 15-hit Milwaukee attack as the Brewers beat Seattle behind the six-hit pitching of rookie Juan Nieves.

Four Mariner pitchers gave up six walks and host Milwaukee scored two runs in the fifth inning on bases-loaded walks en route to their fifth straight victory.

Seattle Manager Chuck Cottier, who went through four pitchers Tuesday, was impressed with Nieves, who struck out four and walked five in pitching his first complete game in the major leagues.

"He's got a lot of composure out there for a young kid," Cottier said. "He's got good rhythm on the ball."

Yankees 10, White Sox 6

Dave Winfield drove in the tiebreaking run with an eighth-inning sacrifice fly and Rickey Henderson hit a three-run homer in the ninth to carry the Yankees over the White Sox at Chicago.

The White Sox have lost seven of eight.

Behind 6-2, Chicago tied the score with four runs in the seventh inning. Carlton Fisk drove home the first run with a sacrifice fly, Ron Kittle hit a two-run single, then Bobby Bonilla singled in the tying run.

After the White Sox tied the game, Winfield's sacrifice fly brought home Willie Randolph from third with the eventual winning run.

Along with his clinching homer in the ninth, Henderson stole three bases to increase his AL lead to 22 steals. He also has stolen 18 bases in his last 17 games.

Rangers 4, Tigers 2

At Arlington, rookie Pete Incaviglia hit a two-run homer and Charlie Hough won his 1986 debut as Texas defeated Detroit.

Hough, activated Monday night, had been on the disabled list since spring training when he broke the little finger on his right hand shaking hands with a friend. Hough struck out four and walked two in 6 1-3 innings. Mickey Mahler and Greg Harris finished in relief.

"I struggled a little bit, but I had better control than I thought I would," Hough said. "I didn't have

the real good knuckle ball, but when I did I threw it at the right time."

For Texas Manager Bobby Valentine, it was just the performance he wanted to see.

"Charlie did a great job," Valentine said. "Whether he had been in the rotation the whole time or just had come back, it was a great job. That's the kind of game he can give us."

Orioles 5, Twins 3

Juan Bonilla, Eddie Murray and Lee Lacy hit home runs, powering Baltimore over Minnesota at the Metrodome.

Baltimore starter Storm Davis, 2-1, struck out six and walked one and gave up seven hits in 7 2-3 innings. Davis was chased in the eighth by Kent Hrbek's third homer of the year and was replaced by Don Aase, who finished up for his sixth save.

Minnesota starter Frank Viola, 3-2, yielded only six hits over 8 1-3, but three of them were homers. He struck out six, all in the first three innings, and walked six — including Cal Ripken before Murray snapped a 1-1 third-inning tie with his fifth homer of the year.

Even experienced defenders tend to take their aces too soon. Holding them to the right moment, even when declarer leads an obvious singleton, can reap rich rewards. Venezuelan stars Robert Benaim, West, and Francis Vernon, East, showed the right technique in a match against Panama.

North-South bid aggressively to game, thanks to North electing to jump to three hearts at his second turn, even though he had already made a two-over-one response. However, with all three missing aces and the king of spades favorably located, it looked as if four hearts would be a simple contract to make.

Benaim elected to lead a trump, his partner won the ace and returned the suit to declarer's king. The four of clubs was led and, even though that was possibly a singleton, West ducked and dummy's queen took the trick. The singleton diamond from the table was ducked by East and declarer won.

Declarer now tried to make the hand on a crossruff. But when two diamond ruffs on the table and two club ruffs in hand failed to drop ei-

ther minor-suit ace, declarer had to settle for nine tricks with the help of a spade finesse.

Such excellent defense deserved to be rewarded. As the cards lie, however, declarer missed a chance to land his contract. After the queen of diamonds wins, declarer should run the queen of spades. (West must duck, otherwise declarer can make the hand easily by taking a finesse for the ten of spades on the way back.) Now declarer draws the last trump and continues with a spade to the ace and a spade back. In with the king of spades, West is end played. Whether he elects to exit with a club or a diamond, he must set up a trick for declarer in the suit led. The long spade is the fulfilling trick.

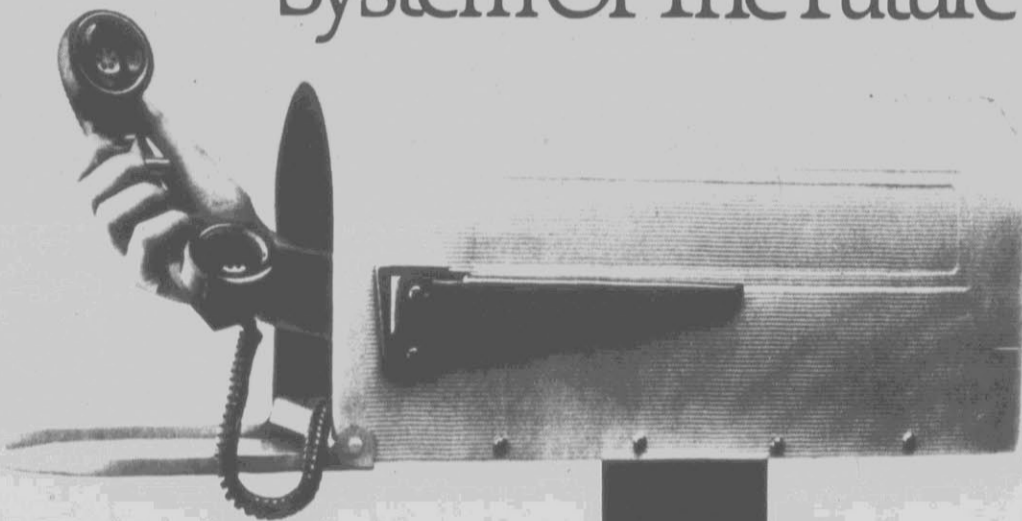





NBC Tops Weekly Ratings

NEW YORK (AP) — The first fight of the May sweeps was a split decision. The television audience was fairly evenly divided for the major Sunday night movie match-up, and each network could claim it won something.

The first part of ABC's \$25 million, 12-hour "North & South, Book II" was the top-rated performer of the Sunday blockbusters, ranking 10th for the week.

The first installment of NBC's four-hour "Deliberate Stranger" finished second for the night and 17th for the week, but improved on a poor lead-in from 42nd-ranked "Alfred Hitchcock Presents." The performance was good enough to keep NBC in front for the week of April 28-May 4, as the top-rated network ended a two-week drought and topped the A.C. Nielsen ratings again.

CBS' two-hour film, "Vanishing Act," ranked 20th for the week, but CBS was easily top-rated for Sunday night because of its earlier Top 10 shows, "60 Minutes" and "Murder, She Wrote."

"It was one of those cases in which everybody got a piece of the viewing," said Mike Eisenberg, CBS' research director.

According to Nielsen figures released Tuesday, NBC, which had finished third the previous two weeks, won with a 15.4 rating. CBS averaged a 14.0 rating and ABC had a 13.2. A rating measures the percentage of the nation's 85.9 million homes with television. A share measures the percentage of sets in use that are tuned to a broadcast.

A repeat of NBC's "The Cosby Show" ranked first with a 29.5 rating, 49 share, followed by original episodes of its follow-up Thursday comedies, "Family Ties" and "Cheers." Only "60 Minutes," which finished fourth, kept NBC's blockbuster comedies from a sweep. "Night Court" was fifth, in a tie with NBC's Saturday comedy king, "The Golden Girls." Then came "Murder, She Wrote," CBS' "Kate & Allie," CBS' "Newhart" and the first part of "North & South, Book II."

The next 10 shows, in order, were: CBS' "Dallas," ABC's "Dynasty," NBC's "Miami Vice" in 13th, NBC's "Highway to Heaven" and ABC's "Moonlighting," tied for 14th, ABC's "Hotel" in 16th, "Deliberate Stranger" and CBS' "Knots Landing," tied for 17th, ABC's "Perfect Strangers" in 18th and "Vanishing Act" and ABC's "Who's the Boss?," tied for 20th.

May is one of the four sweeps months for which local station ratings are measured, prompting the networks to schedule major programs to hype audiences for their affiliates.

Last November, another sweeps month, ABC broadcast the 12-hour

"North & South" and it became the season's No. 1 miniseries. Its opening installment, against NBC's "48 HRS" and series programming on CBS, had a 25.8 rating, 37 share — better than the opener of "North & South, Book II," which drew a 19.8 rating, 30 share.

Network To Open With Joan Rivers

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Joan Rivers is taking on former boss Johnny Carson next fall in the opening assault of Fox Broadcasting Co.'s new fourth network. NBC immediately canceled her remaining scheduled appearances as his substitute.

The caustic comedian, whose show, "Late Night Starring Joan Rivers," will make its debut in the fall, had been permanent substitute host for Carson's "The Tonight Show" on NBC for the past three years.

She was to be host two more weeks before her NBC contract expires July 19.

But she will be replaced the week of June 2 by comedian Gary Shandling and the week of July 14 by another host who has yet to be selected, said Gene Walsh, vice president of publicity for NBC's West Coast operations.

"We wish her well," said Walsh, who added that Carson learned of plans for the late-night competition from the news media.

Carson "was shocked and surprised to learn of it through a press release," said spokesman Jim Mahoney. "It's an unusual way to do business, to say the least."

Barry Diller, chairman of Fox Inc., said Tuesday that prime-time programming on the new service will start in March 1987. The new network springs from the purchase and consolidation by Rupert Murdoch of Twentieth Century-Fox Film Studios and six former Metromedia television stations.

Miss Rivers appeared at a news conference Tuesday with Diller and other Fox executives.

"I want to thank NBC a thousand times. I am grateful to NBC for the three years I had on 'The Tonight Show,' but they should thank me, too. My ratings were good. And they were

better than the regular host," she said.
Miss Rivers said she talked by telephone to Grant Tinker, chairman of NBC, and to Brandon Tartikoff, president of NBC entertainment.
"I called Johnny Carson twice, but he would not take my call," she said.

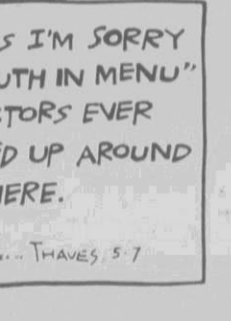
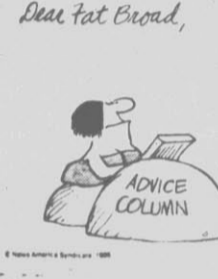
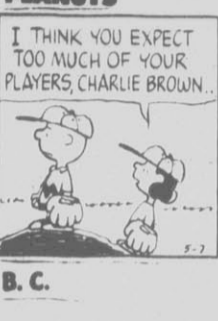

Senators Confirm Fletcher

WASHINGTON (AP) — James C. Fletcher is taking over NASA at a time when the space agency is grounded, in low esteem, and uncertain about how to soar again.

He returns to the job he held from 1971 to 1977 with an 89-9 vote of confidence from the Senate, but also with carping from one senator that "he is a NASA retread who ... is not the man for this job."

Fletcher, who was confirmed Tuesday but has no swearing-in date yet, takes over from William Graham, acting administrator of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, while the United States finds itself with little capability to launch anything other than weapons of war.

Space shuttles Columbia, Discovery and Atlantis are locked in hangars awaiting fixes made necessary by Challenger's Jan. 28 destruction. Their next flight, by all estimates, is more than a year off.

In the debate that preceded Fletcher's confirmation, Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., said the 66-year-old space executive had shown an unwillingness in his previous stint as administrator to face up to the shuttle's serious difficulties.

"Dr. Fletcher, for all his sterling qualities, is, quite simply, a NASA retread," Proxmire said. "He is not the man for this job."

Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., praised Fletcher as just what the doctor ordered, prompting Sen. Thomas Eagleton, D-Mo., to say: "If we want to continue the malpractices of the past, then Dr. Fletcher is our man. His nostrils and his pills will mean more of the same — and more trouble in the future for NASA."

Sen. Paul Simon, D-Ill., who also opposed Fletcher, said "NASA needs a chief with a critical eye, not a chief who was part of any of the decisions of the past."

Barbecue Is Not Only For Meats

Barbecues are not for carnivores only. Meat-munchers do not have a monopoly on the sun, beer and the cheer of springtime gatherings while vegetarians sit inside moping over their millet-tofu-carrot patties.

Grilled eggplant, corn in the husk and jacketed potatoes can make delicious and substantial meals if prepared with imagination. So move over, burger breath, here come some new ideas for a meatless BBQ with all the trimmings.

Grilling marinated vegetables is a colorful choice. "The Silver Palate Good Times Cookbook" (by Julee Rosso and Sheila Lukins, Workman Publishing, 1984) offers this recipe:

To serve 8, splash 2 cups of olive oil, 1 cup white wine, 8 crushed garlic cloves, 1 cup coarsely chopped fresh basil leaves, 1-4 cup fresh rosemary, salt and pepper together and immerse about 8 pounds of vegetables, including new red potatoes, baby artichokes, shallots, Italian eggplants, plum tomatoes, small green, red, and yellow peppers in the marinade for an hour.

Remove the vegetables from the marinade, reserving the marinade, and roast at 400 degrees for 35 minutes before grilling.

String fresh herbs such as rosemary, basil, parsley in between vegetables as you string them on skewers for grilling. Grill the

vegetables about 6 inches from the heat, basting frequently with the marinade about 6 minutes on each side.

Serve grilled vegetables with flavored butters. Corn on the cob is delicious with Jalapeno Pepper Butter. To make, blend 1-2 cup unsalted butter with 2 jalapeno peppers, seeded and finely minced, and 1-2 teaspoon ground cumin.

Top vegetables with homemade olivada by pitting 3 cups of imported black olives and processing to a puree in food processor. Add about 2 tablespoons olive oil to bind and process to a thick smooth paste. Add more oil if needed. Season with freshly ground black pepper.

Double your output and grill stuffed vegetables. Cut the tops off tomatoes and squeeze out the seeds. Fill the cavity with pepper or caraway seasoned melting cheeses and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Wrap in aluminum foil and cook about 5 minutes until the tomatoes soften and the cheese melts.

Try stuffed potatoes; bake the potatoes, scoop out the flesh and mash with your favorite fillings, stuff the potato shell with the filling, wrap each potato in aluminum foil and grill 5 to 10 minutes on each side until the potato is heated through.

But if you just have to have that BBQ feeling of chomping down on an oozing, gooey, charcoal-crusted burger, try meatless hot dogs and

vegetable burgers. They are available at health-food stores.

Some stores sell Lightlife Meatless Tofu Pups and Light Foods' Tofu Light Links, which are both cholesterol-free and low-calorie, as well as tempeh burgers, already in patties, and tofu burger mixes.

Top your sizzling treats with natural ketchups and barbecue sauces, low in sugar and without artificial additives.

So the next time those muscle-y meat odors waft over the fence and into your back yard, charge up your own charcoal fires and create a barbecue feast that's fresh and filling. The two recipes below require

only sugar, oil, salt and pepper before you dash through the express lane.

Remember to oil the grid before cooking vegetables if they are not wrapped in foil.

EXPRESS LANE: potatoes, mustard, red-wine vinegar, onions, yellow peppers, goat cheese, basil, tomatoes

MUSTARD ROASTED POTATOES
(4 to 6 servings)
1 1-2 pounds red new potatoes
1-2 cup dijon mustard

1 teaspoon grated lemon rind

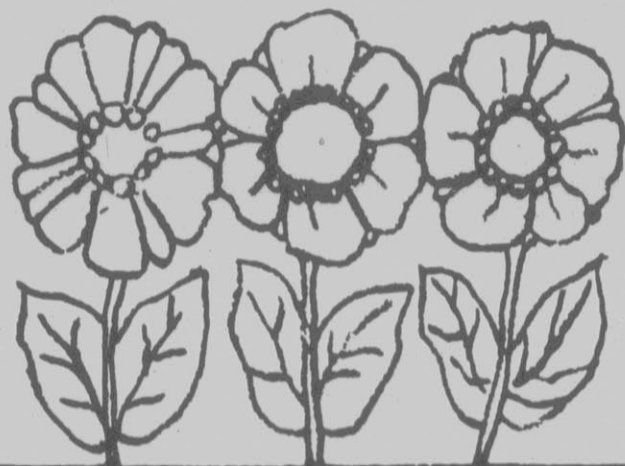
Wholesale beef prices are expected to drop significantly as more dairy farmers take advantage of a U.S. Department of Agriculture buy-out program aimed at reducing the nation's staggering milk surplus. The \$1.8 billion plan offers farmers throughout the country a financial incentive to liquidate a portion of their herds as a means of reducing milk production.

Estimates state that more than 10 percent of the nation's dairy herd will be slaughtered or exported, including 950,000 cows and 600,000 heifers or calves. The program is expected to reduce annual milk production by 12 billion pounds.

1/2 teaspoon vanilla
2 large carrots, coarsely grated (1 cup loosely packed)
1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar
Filling, see recipe

Grease a 15 1/2- by 10 1/2-inch jelly roll pan; line with wax paper and grease again; set aside. Combine all-purpose and whole wheat flours, cornstarch, baking powder and cinnamon. With an electric mixer at high speed beat egg yolks until thick and lemon-colored — about 5 minutes. Slowly beat in honey, lemon rind and vanilla extract. Stir in reserved flour mixture just until blended. Stir in carrots. In another bowl with clean beater blades beat egg whites until foamy. Sprinkle with cream of tartar. Beat until stiff but not dry. Stir about one quarter of the egg whites into the carrot mixture. Fold in remaining egg whites. Spoon onto prepared pan, smoothing the top. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven until a cake tester inserted into the center comes out clean — 12 to 15 minutes. Loosen edges with a sharp knife; turn out onto a kitchen towel sprinkled lightly with confectioners' sugar. Gently peel off wax paper. Roll up cake from the narrow end with the towel inside the cake; set aside until cool. To fill, unroll and spread with the filling to within 1/2-inch from edge of cake. Using the towel to aid rolling, roll up from the narrow end of cake. Place on a serving plate. Adapted from "Rodale's Sensational Desserts" by Joan Bingham and Delores Riccio (Rodale).

Filling: Beat together 1 cup softened cream cheese, 2 tablespoons honey, and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla until fluffy; stir in 1/2 cup chopped raisins.

Homemade Pizza Is Limited Only By Imagination

In recent years pizza has overtaken other fast food snacks in unexpected ways. It now shows up on menus in the trendiest restaurants as well as the neighborhood hangout. And it also has earned a goodly amount of space in the frozen-food sections of supermarkets and the hot food sections of most delicatessens.

Along with the increase in popularity of the pizza, however, comes inevitable change. The days of the simple chewy wedges of freshly baked pizza dough lightly flavored with herbed tomato sauce and shredded cheese apparently are waning. Today's pizzas sport toppings of imported goat cheeses, prosciutto, ratatouille and marinated artichokes, among others. They are a far cry from the earthy Italian open-faced sandwiches that were their forerunners.

Fortunately, pizzas tend to be flexible enough to lend themselves to creative design without losing their basic flavorful characteristics. A good cook can have a whale of a time creating a variety of masterpieces by switching doughs and toppings.

The dominant current thinking seems to be that when it comes to fillings, more is better. And when it comes to pizza dough, anything goes. Thick, chewy crusts, skinny crisp ones. Whole-wheat doughs, rye doughs ... take your pick. It is a whole new pizza world out there.

The following recipes are from the recently published two-volume food processor recipe cookbook by Abby Mandel, "Fast and Flavorful" (Cuisinart Cooking Club; \$25). It can be ordered from the Cuisinart Cooking Club Inc., P.O. Box 900, Cos Cob, Conn. 06807. If ordering from Cuisinart, include \$2 for postage and handling.

FRESH TOMATO PIZZA SAUCE

2 1/2 pounds plum tomatoes, halved and seeded
1 1/2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil

1/4 cup tomato paste
3/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon crushed dried red chiles
1/4 teaspoon sugar
2 tablespoons finely snipped basil or 1 1/2 teaspoons dried basil

Place 1-3 of tomatoes in food processor fitted with metal blade. Pulse to chop tomatoes finely. Remove tomatoes and process remaining tomatoes.

Heat oil in 2 1/2-quart saucepan. Add tomatoes, tomato paste, salt, chiles and sugar. Cook over medium heat, uncovered, until reduced to 2 2/3 cups, about 45 minutes. (Sauce can be stored 4 days in refrigerator or up to 3 months in freezer.) Just before serving, add basil and mix thoroughly. Makes 2 2/3 cups.

PIZZA SAUCE WITH CANNED TOMATOES

1 (16-ounce) can plum tomatoes, drained
2 tablespoons tomato paste
2 teaspoons snipped basil or 1/2 teaspoon dried basil
2 teaspoons snipped oregano or 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
1/2 teaspoon sugar
1/2 teaspoon crushed dried red chiles
1/2 teaspoon salt

In food processor fitted with metal blade, combine tomatoes, tomato paste, basil, oregano, sugar, chiles and salt. Process 10 seconds. (Sauce can be stored up to 5 days in refrigerator or up to 4 months in freezer.) Stir well before serving. Makes 1 1/8 cups.

PEPPERONI-GREEN PEPPER-ONION PIZZA

Roll dough for 1 (14-inch) or 2 (9-inch) Thin Crusts
12 ounces mozzarella cheese, well-chilled
2 ounces pepperoni, peeled and cut into thirds
4 ounces Parmesan cheese, quartered
1 small onion, peeled
1 small tomato, cored
1 medium green pepper, stem end cut and cored
6 tablespoons Pizza Sauce of choice
Salt
Freshly ground black pepper
Dash sugar

1-2 teaspoon dried oregano
1-2 teaspoon dried basil
Fifteen minutes before baking, place rack in center of oven and preheat to 425 degrees. If using quarry tiles or pizza stone, place on center rack to preheat.

Pierce prepared and rolled crust(s) in several places with fork. Bake at 425 degrees until very lightly browned, about 5 minutes. Cool 5 minutes before adding topping. Leave oven at 425 degrees.

Process each ingredient in food processor as follows, removing from work bowl after each time and reserving each ingredient separately:

Using medium shredding disc with light pressure, shred mozzarella.

Using metal blade, pulse to coarsely chop pepperoni and Parmesan.

Using thin slicing disc (2-mm) with medium pressure, slice onion.

Using all-purpose slicing disc (4-mm) with light pressure, slice tomato and remove. Stand green pepper in feed tube, cut end down, and slice into rings.

Spread sauce evenly over partially baked crust(s). Separate onion into rings and distribute over sauce. Sprinkle with mozzarella, then arrange tomatoes over. Season with salt, pepper and sugar.

Distribute pepperoni and Parmesan mixture, then green pepper rings, over top. Sprinkle oregano and basil over top. Bake at 425 degrees until bottom of crust is well-browned, about 15 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Makes 1 (14-inch) or 2 (9-inch) pizzas.

Thin Crust

2 teaspoons olive or safflower oil
2 teaspoons cornmeal
1 package dry yeast
1 teaspoon sugar
1-2 cup plus 2 tablespoons warm water (105 to 115 degrees)

1 1/2 cups plus 2 tablespoons unbleached all-purpose or bread flour, about
3/4 teaspoon salt
Rub 1/2 teaspoon oil over 1 (14-inch) or 2 (9-inch) pizza pans. Sprinkle pan(s) with cornmeal. Stir yeast and sugar into warm water and let stand until foamy.

Combine flour, salt and remaining oil in food processor bowl fitted with metal blade. Turn on machine. Pour yeast mixture through feed tube. Process until dough cleans inside of work bowl.

If dough sticks, add more flour by tablespoons through feed tube, letting each addition work in before adding more. If dough is crumbly, add water by teaspoons through feed tube, letting each addition work in before adding more. When desired consistency is reached, process dough until uniformly supple and elastic, about 40 seconds.

Dough does not need to rise. Roll immediately and use as is. If dough is allowed to rise until doubled, crust will be slightly chewier.

On heavily floured board, roll dough to 14-inch circle. Or divide dough in half and roll each half to 9-inch circle. Add flour to board as necessary, rotating dough while rolling. If dough resists, let rest 5 minutes to relax gluten, then try again.

If dough is allowed to rise, transfer to oiled bowl and rotate to coat entire surface with oil. Cover with oiled plastic wrap and let rise in warm place (75 to 80 degrees) until doubled, about 1 hour. Then, roll as suggested.

Remove excess flour in dough with soft brush. Fold dough in half, then in

quarters and place in prepared pan with point of dough in center. Unfold dough and lightly press into place, working from center to edge. Pinch edge together or fold over edge to form 1/3-inch rim. Proceed with recipe. Makes 1 (14-inch) or 2 (9-inch) thin crusts.

DEEP-DISH SAUSAGE-MUSHROOM-GREEN PEPPER PIZZA

1 pound mild or hot Italian sausage, with casings removed
1 large green pepper
10 ounces Herkimer or white Cheddar cheese, chilled
1 pound mozzarella cheese, well-chilled
2 tablespoons flour
1-2 teaspoon fennel
1-2 teaspoon dried oregano
1-2 teaspoon crushed dried red chiles
1-4 teaspoon salt
4 large mushrooms, with sides of caps trimmed flat
2 cups Pizza Sauce of choice
2 tablespoons safflower oil
Rolled dough for 1 (14-inch) or 2 (9-inch) Deep-Dish Crusts

Fifteen minutes before baking, place rack in center of oven and preheat to 425 degrees. If using quarry tiles or pizza stone, place on center rack to preheat.

Crumble sausage and cook in 8-inch skillet until browned. Drain off fat and transfer to large mixing bowl.

Stand green pepper on cutting board. Using sharp knife, cut off sides in 3 or 4 vertical slices, discarding core and stem. Remove any membrane from slices.

Process ingredients in food processor as follows:
Using medium slicing disc (3-mm), stand green pepper slices lengthwise in feed tube, wedging tightly to hold. Slice, using light pressure.

Using medium shredding dish with light pressure, shred cheeses. Add cheeses and green pepper to mixing bowl with flour, fennel, oregano, chiles and salt. Combine thoroughly.

Using thin slicing disc (2-mm), place mushrooms in feed tube, flat side down. Slice, using light pressure. Gently fold mushrooms into Pizza Sauce.

Brush bottom and sides of rolled crust(s) with oil. Add cheese mixture in even layer. Spread Pizza Sauce over, leaving rim exposed. Fold upper edge of dough over and pinch to form decorative edge. Bake at 425 degrees 20 to 22 minutes. Let rest 10 minutes before serving. Makes 1 (14-inch) or 2 (9-inch) deep-dish pizzas.

Deep-Dish Crust

1 1/2 tablespoons olive or safflower oil
2 teaspoons cornmeal
1 package dry yeast
1 teaspoon sugar
1 cup warm water (105 to 115 degrees)

2 1/3 cups unbleached all-purpose or bread flour, about
1 teaspoon salt

Rub 2 teaspoons oil on sides and bottom of 1 (14-inch) deep-dish pizza pan, 9 9-inch layer cake pans or 1 (17 1/2 by 11 1/2-inch) jellyroll pan. Sprinkle pan(s) with cornmeal. Stir yeast and sugar into warm water and let stand until foamy.

Combine flour, salt and remaining oil in food processor bowl fitted with metal blade. Turn on machine. Pour yeast mixture through feed tube and process until dough cleans inside of work bowl.

If dough sticks, add more flour by tablespoons through feed tube, letting each addition work in before adding more. If dough is crumbly, add water by teaspoons through feed tube, letting each addition work in before adding more. When desired consistency is reached, process dough until uniformly supple and elastic, about 40 seconds.

Transfer mixture to oiled bowl and rotate to coat entire surface with oil. Cover with oiled plastic wrap and let rise in warm place (75 to 80 degrees) until doubled, about 1 hour.

Punch dough down on heavily floured board. Roll into 20-inch circle or divide dough in half and roll each half to 12-inch circle. For jellyroll pan, roll to rectangle 22 by 18 inches. Re-flour board as necessary and rotate dough upon rolling. If dough resists, let rest 5 minutes to relax gluten, then try again.

Remove excess flour from dough using soft brush. Fold dough in half, then in quarters. Place in prepared pan with point of dough in center. Unfold dough and lightly press into bottom and sides of pan, working from center to edge. Gently ease dough so it extends 1/2-inch beyond rim of pan, then cut away any excess.

Distribute topping of choice over crust. Fold dough over to edge of topping and pinch to form finished edge. Proceed as directed in pizza recipe. Makes 1 (14-inch), 2 (9-inch) or 1 (17 1/2 by 11 1/2-inch) Deep-Dish Crust.

Remove excess flour from dough using soft brush. Fold dough in half, then in quarters. Place in prepared pan with point of dough in center.

Unfold dough and lightly press into bottom and sides of pan, working from center to edge. Gently ease dough so it extends 1/2-inch beyond rim of pan, then cut away any excess.

Distribute topping of choice over crust. Fold dough over to edge of topping and pinch to form finished edge. Proceed as directed in pizza recipe. Makes 1 (14-inch), 2 (9-inch) or 1 (17 1/2 by 11 1/2-inch) Deep-Dish Crust.

FRESH VEGETABLE PIZZA

1 large clove garlic, peeled
1 small onion, peeled and quartered
1 tablespoon safflower oil



12 large mushrooms, with sides of caps trimmed flat
3 medium carrots, peeled and cut into 2-inch lengths
1 medium zucchini, cut into 2-inch lengths
2 cups Pizza Sauce of choice
1 1/2 teaspoons dried oregano
1-2 teaspoon salt
12 ounces Jack cheese, well chilled
4 ounces Parmesan cheese, at room temperature
Rolled dough for 1 (14-inch) Thick Crust

Place garlic in food processor fitted with metal blade and process until minced. Drop onion through feed tube and pulse until finely chopped. Heat oil in 10-inch skillet. Cook garlic and onion over high heat, stirring often, until begin to soften, about 2 minutes.

Using all-purpose slicing disc (4-mm), place mushrooms in feed tube, flat side down, and use light pressure to slice. Add to skillet and cook gently until most of moisture has evaporated, about 15 minutes.

Using medium shredding disc, place carrots in feed tube and use firm pressure to shred.

Using French fry disc, place zucchini in feed tube and use light pressure to cut. Add carrots and zucchini to skillet and continue to cook, stirring occasionally, until begin to soften, about 4 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in Pizza Sauce, oregano and salt.

Using medium shredding disc with light pressure, shred Jack cheese.

Remove and reserve. Using light pressure, shred Parmesan.

Spread vegetable mixture over prepared crust, leaving 1/2 inch of edge exposed. Sprinkle Jack and Parmesan cheeses over surface. Let pizza rest at room temperature 1 to 2 hours before baking.

Fifteen minutes before baking, place rack in center of oven and preheat to 425 degrees. If using quarry tiles or pizza stone, place on center rack to preheat. Bake until bottom of crust is deep golden-brown, about 20 to 22 minutes. Let rest 10 minutes before serving. For neat slices, cut through cheese and vegetables with serrated knife, then finish slicing with pizza cutter. Makes 1 (14-inch) pizza.

Barrel Trees

COGNAC, France (AP) — The trees in the forests of Limousin and Troncais here have a common destiny — they end up as barrels for the aging of cognac.

The oak from these forests, with its straight grain, minimal knots and faults plus the right amount of tannin, helps make the brandy age properly, according to the blenders in this town of 23,000.

The trees are cut when they are between 70 and 150 years old and some 90 feet tall. The staves are seasoned outdoors for four to six years before being fashioned into barrels.

Lobster Pernod Is Quick

Sharon Oliver, a friend of mine who is still under 30, has switched careers. Born, bred and educated in Utah, she became a successful travel agent in California. But a year or so ago she came to New York City to try another field — cookery.

Now Sharon, just graduated from The New York Restaurant School, has begun to free-lance. As a starter, she has been developing recipes.

When I told her I was looking for a dish that could rival Lobster Newburg — famous since turn-of-the-century Delmonico days — she took on the challenge.

Recently Sharon arrived in my kitchen around noontime. In short order she produced Lobster Pernod, one of the most delightful of dishes. Modeled on Lobster Newburg, it has few ingredients and is made quickly. Served with wide noodles, it makes a grand and glorious main course for a "celebration dinner" for two.

LOBSTER PERNOD
3 frozen South African rock lobster tails (each about 4 ounces)

1 tablespoon butter
White part of 1 scallion, finely chopped
2 tablespoons Pernod
½ cup chicken broth
2-3rds cup heavy cream
Salt and pepper to taste
Scallion greens, thinly sliced

Thaw lobster tails. With a kitchen scissors cut along each side of the soft underside membrane and remove it. Pull the meat carefully from the hard shell and cut it crosswise along the natural divisions.

In a 10-inch skillet melt butter over high heat, quickly add all the lobster pieces and cook, tossing carefully until firm — about 3 minutes. Drain on paper toweling.

With skillet off heat, toss in the finely chopped scallion and the Pernod. Return to moderate heat and stir in chicken broth and cream; reduce by boiling gently until sauce coats the back of a metal spoon — 8 to 10 minutes. If sauce is thicker than desired, add more broth; if thinner, add more cream. Stir in lobster, salt and pepper, and heat briefly. Serve at once. Garnish with thinly sliced scallion greens.

Makes 2 large servings.

2 tablespoons red-wine vinegar
1 teaspoon sugar
2 large yellow onions, cut into 1-2-inch-thick rounds

Freshly ground pepper to taste
Cook the potatoes in boiling, salted water 5 minutes. Rinse under cold running water; drain. Cut into 1-2-inch thick slices. Coat the slices well with mustard.

Combine the red wine vinegar and sugar and sprinkle over the onions. Combine the potatoes and onions. Season with pepper and toss lightly to mix.

Place the potato and onion mixture in a hinged grill basket and grill over medium-hot, direct heat until tender, about 10 minutes per side. Or wrap the mixture up in aluminum foil and set on grill for 20 to 25 minutes, turning the package over after 10 minutes.

GRILLED STUFFED YELLOW PEPPERS

(4 servings)
4 large yellow bell peppers
12 ounces soft mild goat cheese, cut into 5 equal pieces
Salt and pepper for sprinkling
1 bunch fresh basil
2 ripe large plum tomatoes, sliced
1 tablespoon oil, preferably olive oil

Cut the tops from the peppers and reserve. Core and seed peppers. Press 1 piece of goat cheese in the bottom of each pepper, sprinkle the inside of each pepper with salt and pepper and place 2 basil leaves in the bottom.

Divide the tomato slices evenly over the basil. Season again to taste. Layer 2 more basil leaves in each pepper and drizzle 1-2 teaspoon oil over the basil in each pepper.

Crumble the last piece of goat cheese on top of the peppers, and season again. Replace the tops.

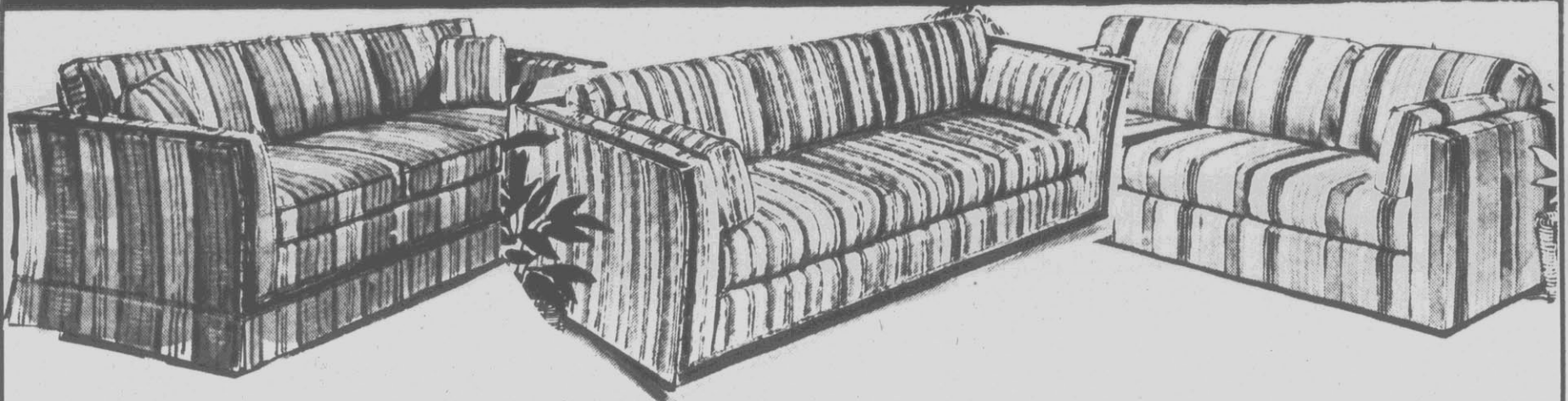
Rub the outside of the peppers with the remaining 1 teaspoon oil and wrap in foil. Grill over medium heat for 15 to 20 minutes, turning it every 5 minutes.

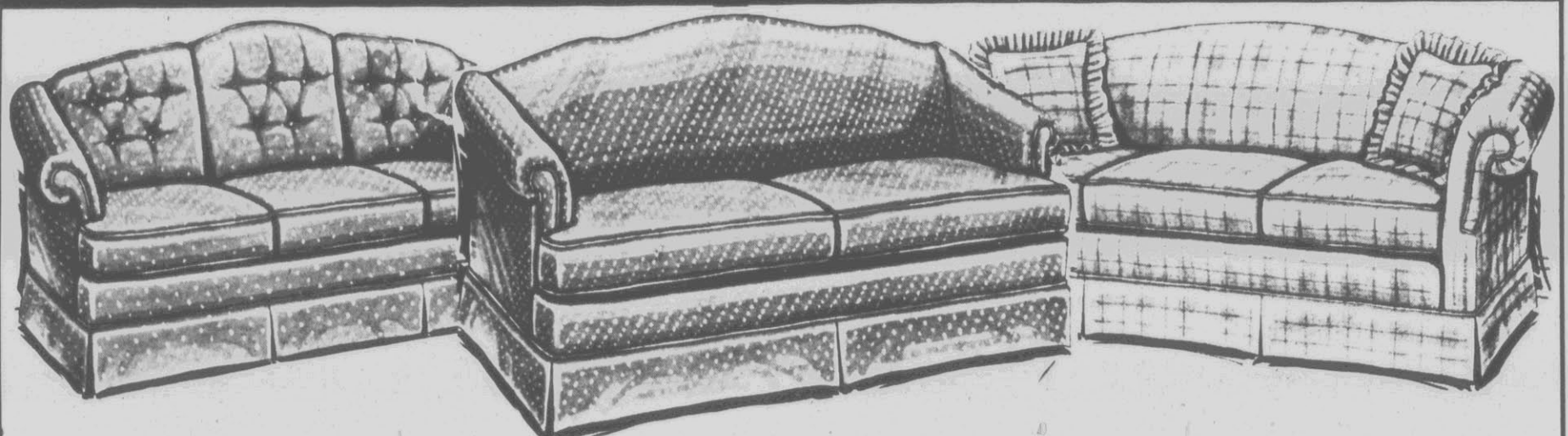

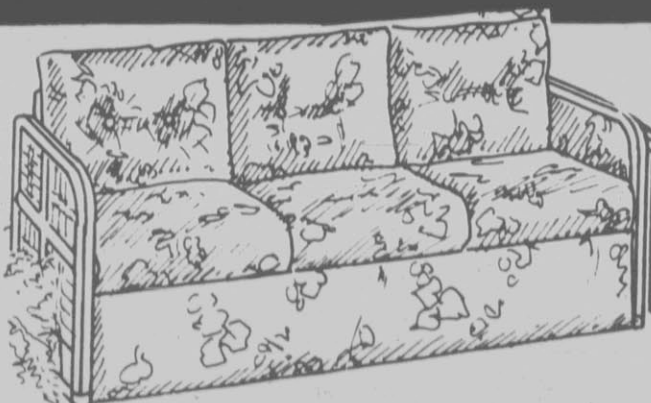

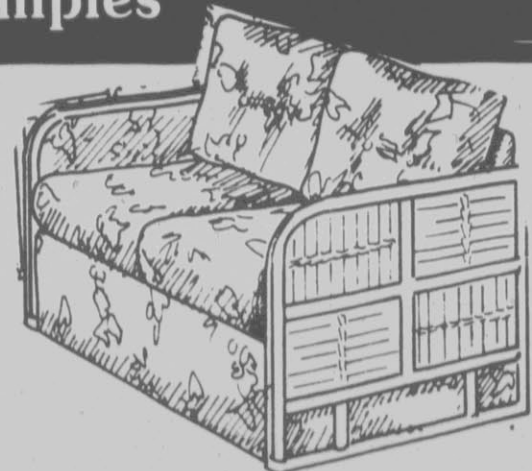

Oilman Underwrites LaRouche Headquarters

CUSHING, Okla. (AP) — Like thousands of others, David Nick Anderson's first brush with the politics of extremist Lyndon H. LaRouche was at an airport where LaRouche followers were selling magazines to travelers.

Anderson liked what he heard, charged a copy of LaRouche's Fusion magazine to his credit card, and stayed in touch. Several years later, the 36-year-old third-generation Oklahoma oilman is a major financial supporter of LaRouche's presidential campaign and network of organizations.

He is, in fact, Lyndon LaRouche's landlord.

The sources of the money for LaRouche's organizations, publications and reported payroll of more than 250 people have been a mystery. LaRouche himself has said in court that he has no income and few assets, has filed no tax returns in more than 10 years, and doesn't know who pays his bills — including the rent.

Nick Anderson's money plays a key role in the financial underpinnings of the LaRouche operation, although he says he has never met LaRouche or seen the Virginia estate he bought for LaRouche's use.

Anderson, a political conservative who says he doesn't fully understand or embrace all of LaRouche's philosophy or policy proposals, is attracted to LaRouche by a few of the positions espoused by the political extremist, such as his advocacy of nuclear power and a space-based system of defending against missile attack.

"I don't agree with everything he says, but I do get the gist of most of his philosophy, and I think a lot of it is good," Anderson said in an interview last week. "I'm not a wild-haired fanatic that believes everything I hear."

Anderson, who goes by "Nick," is owner of the 171-acre estate in the affluent horse country of Loudon County, Virginia, where LaRouche lives in its heavily guarded manor house, reportedly with 14 rooms, eight fireplaces and five baths.

Records in Loudon County, less than an hour's drive from Washington, show Anderson paid \$1.3 million for the property in January 1985, with \$400,000 down and the rest financed by the seller.

"They were looking for a place to move, a location, and obviously didn't have the capital," Anderson said, referring to LaRouche and his various groups.

"They came to me with it. The paperwork all looked real good. I wouldn't have done it if I didn't think it was a good investment."

During the three-hour interview in the lobby of his business, Big Four Petroleum Co., here last week, Anderson described himself as a LaRouche supporter, distrustful of most mainstream politicians but not an ideologue steeped in LaRouche's conspiracy philosophy. Anderson said he's never met LaRouche, or seen the Virginia estate he owns.

Anderson said LaRouche has a "fairly long-term lease" on the estate, and that LaRouche's organization pays rent covering Anderson's monthly payments on a loan for the balance of the purchase price.

That payment, according to public records, was \$9,605 a month in principal and interest during 1985. Since the interest rate was pegged to the prime and adjusted annually, it would be slightly lower this year.

LaRouche, 63, is a fringe candidate for president who has already announced he's running in 1988, his fourth bid for the White House. While gaining few votes in previous campaigns, LaRouche directs a large political operation including dozens of organizations and corporations, and espouses a philosophy that appears conservative in some ways but is based on global conspiracy theories that are best described as bizarre.

Anderson's own finances are based on oil.

Five years ago when the oil industry was booming, so was Cushing, a town of 7,500 people 50 miles due west of Tulsa, just before the rolling, wooded hills start flattening into prairie. But with the price of crude less than \$13 a barrel, times are hard for oilmen and most everybody else in Oklahoma. The local refinery shut down three years ago.

Most people interviewed here who know Anderson said they were surprised to learn of his ties to LaRouche, and that his only visible political involvement were contributions to the local Republican Party and a 1984 bid for city council, which he lost 1,002 to 642.

"They've kept a real low profile," local clothing store owner Bob Brooks said of Anderson, his two brothers in business with him and his father, Oscar S. Anderson.

Nick Anderson, whose work attire is jeans, a knit shirt and designer sneakers, said he was uneasy and reluctant to discuss his dealings with LaRouche.

But he described how he was attracted by LaRouche's Fusion Energy Foundation and its support for nuclear energy and space-based nuclear defensive weapons, first encountering LaRouche followers at Denver's Stapleton Airport several years ago.

Anderson contributed the maximum \$2,000 to LaRouche's 1984

presidential campaign, according to Federal Election Commission records. Yet Anderson, a registered Republican, said he voted for President Reagan.

He also said he has made loans to LaRouche organizations, though he declined to say how much.

Anderson keeps copies of LaRouche's Executive Intelligence

Review magazine on the coffee table of his company's lobby. The Big Four Building was purchased by the company 10 years ago, and stained glass windows remain as evidence of its former owner, the First United Methodist Church.

The Virginia estate Anderson owns is a far cry from the home where Anderson, his wife Linda and their

three young children live. It is a comfortable brick ranch-style home purchased for \$81,000 in 1980, according to county records.

While he said he hasn't seen the LaRouche estate, Anderson said it is "more than just a living quarters. He does a lot of his operation out of there. It's a headquarters."

Anderson said he talks frequently

with LaRouche associates, including Edward Spannaus, treasurer of LaRouche's presidential campaign, and others he declined to name. He declined to say who pays the rent to him.

"In essence, it's all the same, whether you're dealing with one of the entities, it's the same machine," he said.

Anderson and his brothers run the company, started by their grandfather, which explores for oil. Anderson has a degree in geology from the University of Oklahoma, and friends say their oil business was one of the first around to use computers extensively.

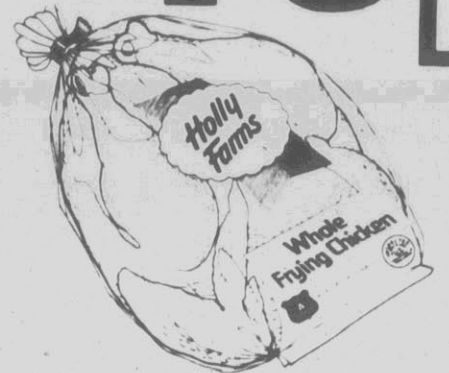

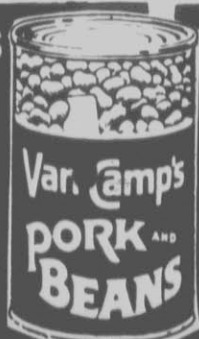

Wood Can Be 'Creative Statement'

RETE, Ill. (AP) — Since the third grade, when he turned a packing crate into a boat, Ken Sauvage has felt the need to make "creative statements."

And whether slogging through the steaming jungles of Vietnam, drifting around the Midwest as a transient farm hand or earning a college degree in art therapy, the need to create has always been an integral part of his life.

Sauvage has experimented with many creative mediums — he plays musical instruments, writes poetry and does watercolor works and pen-

and-ink drawings. But the material he likes best is wood.

"I have an affinity for wood," he said recently. "It's a living thing. No two pieces are alike in terms of color and grain, and it moves with humidity and temperature changes. You have to respond to it. You can't carve against the grain, so if it reverses, you have to, too."

Sauvage has been employed at a woodworking shop in New Lenox for the past three years. But it's only in the past year and a half, since he's been working there full time, that he's committed himself to wood-

working as a vocation as well as an avocation.

His decision was the culmination of years of experience during which he accumulated techniques and skills piecemeal. "It's not the best way to learn. It wastes time and wood, but it was the only way I had," he said.

Growing up in Chicago, Sauvage read what he could about woodworking and shared ideas with other woodworkers. "But mostly," he said, "I learned by making mistakes and not making them a second time."

Later, after being injured in Vietnam, he again took up carving.

first used his skills professionally.

He also had a short-lived business repairing musical instruments before he found his current job on a search through the Yellow Pages.

Sauvage has helped repair a \$45,000 Wurlitzer theater organ, a rosewood grand piano, even the fine detail on a German trunk made in 1752. Now, he is designing furniture for banks and other commercial facilities.

Although the work is not as creative as sculpture, he finds it satisfying, particularly when customers want the repairs done slowly and carefully. "I like quality work," he said.

And, he said, "When I run into a project that stretches my abilities, I get excited. I like the new and exciting, something I can really get involved in."

Still, Sauvage has found that he needs a creative outlet away from work. Now, at home, he's making a new top for one of his mandolins and is fashioning a landscape relief.

LAKEVIEW, N.C. (AP) — When Red McCauley came back home from fighting in World War II, he slowly, but surely, "messed up the family farm," replacing crops with wrecked automobiles.

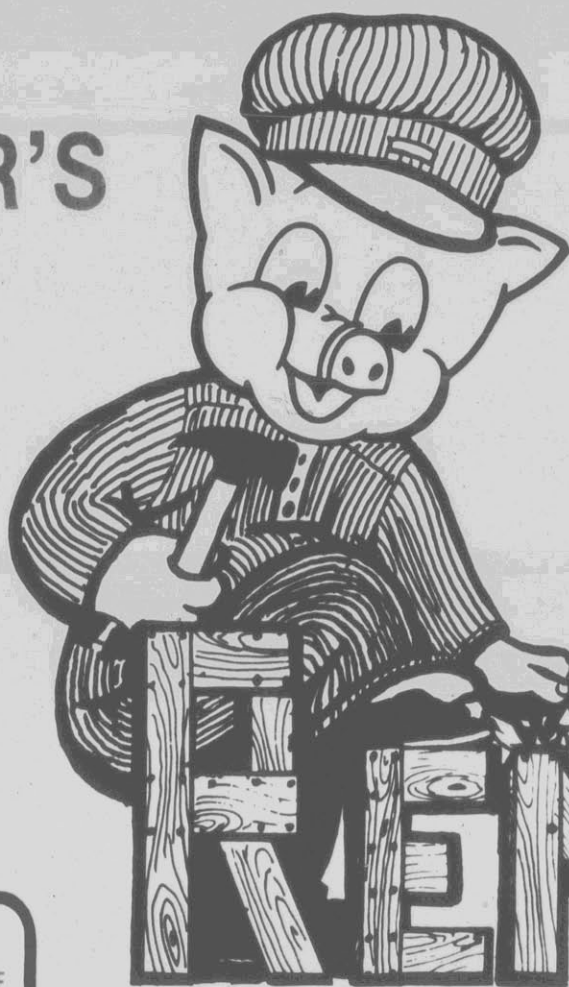

Scientists To Study Seafloor's Hot Spots

WASHINGTON (AP) — Hot undersea geysers, once thought limited to the Pacific Ocean, are now

attracting scientists to the Atlantic, where researchers will dive more than two miles deep to study the

recently discovered underwater vents.

The deep diving program this month and next will give scientists their first close look at the geysers — detected last summer by shipboard instruments. Their discovery dispelled the notion that the phenomena occurred only in the Pacific. The studies will be conducted in

dives in the research submarine Alvin, said Dr. Peter Rona, an oceanographer with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration in Miami.

Scientists were surprised to find the vents, Rona said, but the find "opens up the possibility for these in more than half the world's oceans." "It's not just that these things are

spectacular. They concentrate critical mineral deposits on the sea floor, copper, zinc, and possibly silver and gold; as well as having a very important chemical impact on the composition of the oceans," Rona said in a telephone interview.

Rona said he, along with Dr. Geoffrey Thompson of Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute and Dr.

John Edmond of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, plan several dives to view the vents and take samples of the chemical-laden water around the vents and to study the fish and other forms of life nearby.

The geysers are located about 1,800 miles east of Miami, along the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, a submerged mountain range where material is welling up from inside the earth to create new seafloor at the rate of about an inch a year.

"The bottom of the ocean does not contain water like a swimming pool does; it's fractured, full of cracks," Rona explained. "In most cases the sea water just soaks in. But in some cases, where submarine volcanic mountain ranges (exist) the water is heated, expands, becomes lighter and rises. The hot water dissolves metals and other chemicals from rocks and discharges them as geysers we call black smokers."

"It's very much like Old Faithful going off under 12,000 feet of water," he said.

When the hot, chemical-saturated water hits the cold seawater the dissolved chemicals crystallize, forming the so-called black smoke at the vents, he said. The minerals can create deposits at the site, or be carried away by currents.

In addition to the minerals, Rona explained, thousands of shrimp, clams and worms live near the vents, eating bacteria which in turn eat chemicals in the hot water.

The result, he said, is a food chain which exists without benefit of light — something once thought impossible.

Before the discovery of the vents in the Atlantic, scientists had thought the phenomena occurred only in the more rapidly growing seafloor in the Pacific. In that ocean, the floor is spreading as much as 10 inches a year, Rona said.

Since most of the world's oceans are like the Atlantic, not the Pacific, in terms of rate of spreading, the finding means vents are possible in most parts of the world.

These are "just the first, there must be other sites. There should be sites in the Iceland area, although they haven't been found yet, and in other areas. The fact that we found the first one gives us the clues to find others," said Rona.

Asked if commercial exploitation of the mineral deposits found near the vents is possible, despite the great depth of water, Rona suggested that it could be considered a resource for the future.

Questions of ownership would have to be worked out, he observed, since these vents are located in international waters.

However, he added that following the Atlantic expedition, the scientists will travel to the Gorda Ridge off the coast of Oregon and Washington to look for similar vents in that area. The Gorda Ridge is within the United States 200-mile exclusive economic zone, Rona said.

Oscar Anderson keeps a hand in the business but spends much of his time sailing the world in his West Coast-based yacht, according to Brooks and oilman Jerry Rogers.

As evidence of the hard times here, Anderson's close friend Rogers keeps the lights turned off at his Oil-Gas Equipment Inc., a drilling and supply business, to save money after a brush with bankruptcy. He switched on a light to be interviewed.

But the Andersons and Big Four present the appearance of fairing better than most, with wells here and in Colorado. Brooks described the Andersons as determined, opinionated, self-reliant people — and fortunate for having tapped shallow, big-producing wells early on.

"They've got a well of money — great chunks of it," said Brooks. "I don't know where it is, but they've got it."

Rogers said he knew of the LaRouche ties but that Anderson didn't push his views on anyone.

"He must have some good, honest, strong feelings," Rogers said. "If something's wrong with the deal, Nick doesn't know about it because he wouldn't be there."

Despite his financial support for LaRouche, Anderson said he saw LaRouche's role as that of provoking people to think about issues rather than as a presidential prospect.

"I support Lyndon because of his influence," Anderson said, citing support for nuclear power and space weapons and opposition to most foreign aid as his own main concerns.

Anderson said he found it "bothersome" that some suggest LaRouche's organization is a cult, that he once was a radical Marxist, that some opponents have called him a neo-Nazi, and his groups are the object of a federal fraud investigation.

"If someone can prove to me the man is a Hitler, in the negative sense, sure I won't support him," Anderson said. "But I see no evidence of that... If he is a cult, certainly that would be bothersome to me... I wouldn't be involved in any cult."

And what does Anderson think of LaRouche's oft-repeated claim the Queen of England is a drug trafficker? Anderson said he'd like to see some substantiation of that claim — but he didn't rule out the possibility it was true.

Many Burn Patients Are Attack Victims

WASHINGTON (AP) — More serious burn injuries are due to attacks than commonly believed, and women make up a strong majority of the assailants, a new study says.

A typical incident, the authors say, involves a woman throwing scalding liquid or chemicals at a man as a result of a domestic quarrel.

"These victims, a previously unrecognized subset of burn patients, represented 10 percent of our patient population during the two-year study," said Dr. Mary Jeanne Krob,

who helped prepare a report for presentation today. "We feel the group we studied is representative of a much larger group of silent victims who need specialized help," she said.

The report was prepared for a meeting of the American Burn Association in Chicago by Ms. Krob and Ann Johnson, both of the Burn Center of the Washington Hospital Center, which released a summary in Washington.

Among 41 cases investigated, women were the assailants in 23, men in 13, and the attacker was unknown

in five others, the report said. Of the 23 female attackers, 18 used scalding liquid and four caustic chemicals, often aiming them at victims' faces or genitals. The other assailant used actual flame in an unspecified manner.

Seven of the male attackers also used liquid or chemicals, but four used flame and two touched the victims with hot instruments, the report said.

"Hot liquids and chemicals are the weapons of women," said Ms. Johnson. "These substances are readily available and do not require

great physical strength to wield. The female assailants can also run away as soon as the substance is thrown because the victim is stunned and rendered immediately helpless." She added that most cases seemed premeditated with the assailant either boiling the liquid or buying the chemical.

Most cases involved domestic disputes, but there was no indication whether the victims had themselves abused the attackers earlier.

Four victims among the 41 in the study died from their burns. Fourteen other victims pressed charges against their attackers.

Ms. Krob and Ms. Johnson, whose comments were included in the hospital's release, urged health-care professionals to be aware of burns as a form of physical assault and to call for appropriate medical, psychosocial and judicial intervention when finding such cases.

"We feel as a result of our study that, like child abuse, the problem of burned-and-battered adults may be a larger problem than initially apparent," Ms. Krob said. "We hope this report will alert the burn community to the potential magnitude and seriousness of the problem."

Dr. Marion Jordan, director of the burn center, was quoted as saying he hoped this initial study would lead to a more comprehensive, nationwide study of the problem.

The Washington study included people with burns treated at the hospital from September 1983 to August 1985.

Of 27 attacks on men, 16 were by women, seven by men, and four assailants were unknown.

There were 14 attacks on women, the assailants including seven women, six men and one unknown attacker.

Study Will Examine How Doctors Set Fees

BOSTON — William Hsiao, a Harvard University medical economist, has heard countless stories like the one told by a California gastrointestinal specialist — and they are typical of why the professor believes major changes are almost inevitable in the way physicians are paid in America.

The doctor recalled the cases of two patients. The first had been referred by his family doctor after several liver-function tests produced abnormal results. Adding urgency was the fact that the patient had recently reported persistent weight loss and fever.

The initial examination took an hour. The doctor ordered a battery of specialized laboratory tests and spent another 30 minutes reviewing the perplexing file in his office after the patient had left.

The patient returned two or three days later and the doctor, after spending another 30 minutes with him, prescribed a long list of drugs. The diagnosis: sarcoidosis, an unusual disease of unknown cause that is extremely difficult to detect. It is life-threatening if not diagnosed quickly. The doctor billed the patient's insurance company \$175.

On the same day as the liver patient's initial visit, the doctor walked over to a hospital where a patient was waiting for him in a procedure room. Using a fiber-optic device called a colonoscope, the doctor spent a total of 10 minutes removing a small, benign growth from the patient's large intestine. Fee: \$650.

It is likely that the liver patient's life was saved by the doctor's diagnostic skill — a set of techniques that relies in large degree on spending enough time with the patient to get a sense of what may truly be wrong. It is a talent that underscores that medicine today — even in a high-tech era — is still often more art than science.

To Hsiao, who is currently organizing a complex study of the way American doctors are paid for what they do, the example could be representative of almost a standard of inequality that has come to govern since private health insurance became widely available after World War II.

What is troubling to Hsiao and other experts in health-care economics is that, by skewing its financial rewards, the prevailing system of medical economics may distort the effectiveness of the medical care many Americans receive. This proclivity makes it increasingly certain that the long, anything-goes era of fee charges that are "usual and customary" may be ending.

And therein is the reason Hsiao and a team of other researchers at Harvard have begun a 30-month, \$2-million inquiry financed by the federal government's Health Care Financing Administration. It is intended to determine if there is any rational explanation for the way physician fees are structured and, if there is not, how a better system might be devised.

Behind the decision to sponsor the study, moreover, is an acknowledgment by both the federal government and the American Medical Association, which is participating in the research, that the time has come to resolve one of the major — though, in consumer terms, perhaps one of the quietest — controversies in medicine today.

In essence, the controversy poses this question: Are what are commonly called "cognitive services" rendered by doctors — those activities that involve thinking, reasoning and other manifestations of intellect — worth more, less or the same as those that are lumped together as "procedures" — operations, biopsies, sophisticated invasive tests and the like?

The debate has already attracted significant attention from federal agencies. The congressional Office of Technology Assessment released a physician payment study a month ago that focused in large degree on vagaries of how services are valued. The Health Care Financing Administration itself is expected to release a related study soon — focusing on how payment systems can be changed for federally funded health programs, in particular.

The process could result in elimination of the financial premium now paid for such ultra-technical things as coronary artery bypass surgery, pacemaker insertion and cataract operations — three often-cited examples of fee excess. This could so radically change the medical fee structure.

It would be nothing short of a massive market shakeout in the medical profession, predicted Dr. Richard Egdahl, director of Boston University Medical Center. Working under the auspices of the American College of Surgeons, Egdahl filed an unsuccessful counter application with the Health Care Financing Administration to conduct the rate reform study now being done by the Harvard team.

Hsiao called what may be happening potentially a "revolution" in which there must ultimately be a collision between the results of government policy that have brought about the training of ever more doctors and building of ever greater hospital capacity and new market forces working to restrain costs.

For the consumer, says internist C. Burns Roehrig, what is wrong with the situation and the way the system may be changed has an important, if indirect, bearing on health care. By giving the greatest financial reward to doctors when they render the most technical types of care, the existing system may actually be directly responsible for serious overuse of technical services, Roehrig said.

"It (the existing system) can't help, even in a conscientious practice, but give the doctor the incentive to do the more expensive thing," said Roehrig, who calculated that his hourly gross wage for doing colon examinations with a sigmoidoscope is \$300 but, for working on complex diagnostic problems, it is only between \$50 and \$60.

What Hsiao and his colleagues are organizing has its roots in a study the Harvard team published in 1979. What they focused on was what are called "relative value

scales," or systems by which insurers, government agencies and other groups decide how much one service rendered by a doctor is worth, compared financially to other physician services.

The concept originated in California in 1956 when the California Medical Association introduced the California Relative Value Scale, which included standard descriptions of hundreds of physician services and advice on how fees for them compared. The weakness in the California Relative Value Scale, however, was that it simply adopted existing fee discrepancies, several doctors agreed.

The discrepancies, said Roehrig and Dr. Peter Braun, one of the Harvard researchers, are historically based — rooted in the days just after World War II when health insurance was starting to come into its own. Most insurance plans paid only for hospital services.

Office visits were comparatively cheap then, and financial calamity for the patient generally could be averted until hospitalization was necessary. What took root, though, several doctors agree, was a system in which office-based doctors sometimes deliberately held down the fees they charged for office services — since they were borne personally by patients — and made their money, so to speak, on hospital services that were reimbursed by third-party payers.

Insurance plans changed over time and the federal government added the Medicare and Medicaid plans, but the foundation of comparison on which fees were based remained the same.

Computer Program Helps In Pinpointing Illnesses

WASHINGTON — It doesn't make house calls and its bedside manner is pretty impersonal, but it's on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

In a small but growing number of hospitals, one of the first experts consulted by the attending physician in a difficult case is a computer.

Use of computers in medicine dates back to the early 1960s, and today many laboratory tests and medical monitors are computer-based. Most blood tests and about 10 percent of electrocardiograms, for example, are read by computers.

But scientists are also working on a new generation of "smart" computers that not only record medical information but also interpret it and help doctors use the results to diagnose and treat illness.

Such computer systems have the potential of improving diagnoses, saving time and reducing costly and dangerous drug interactions. But they also raise troubling questions about quality control, regulation, liability and protection of privacy.

These issues were aired last week at a hearing on computerization of health care, held by the investigations and oversight subcommittee of the House Committee on Science and Technology.

Though few are commercially available, about a dozen "smart" computer systems for use in medicine are in various stages of development and testing around the nation, said William Roy Baker Jr., chairman of Knowledge Research Associates, a small Maryland software marketing firm.

Baker even predicted that the courts would eventually decide "that it's malpractice not to use one of these systems."

Medical computer programs are designed to advise — not replace — a doctor, emphasized Dr. Jack Myers, former chairman of medicine at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine who helped design a still-experimental system called Caduceus.

"They're not intended in any sense to replace the physician or be used directly by the patient," Myers said. "These are advisory programs."

Caduceus, named for the serpent-and-staff emblem of the medical profession, is designed to help internists diagnose diseases by recognizing their symptoms and the results of laboratory tests. The system currently includes computer profiles of almost 600 diseases, including more than 4,000 symptoms, Myers said. Eventually, it is expected to cover some 800 diseases.

Caduceus consists of two basic parts: an "electronic textbook" of medical information and an "inference engine" that interprets symptoms and test data. Both parts are designed to overcome what Myers called the two leading causes of incorrect medical diagnosis: limited human memory and limited problem-solving ability.

Because of the knowledge explosion in medicine, he said, the amount of basic information required for a practice in internal medicine is now about four times the capacity of the human memory. And while an expert considering a complex problem cannot deal with more than eight or 10 hypotheses at once, a difficult medical case can require consideration of dozens.
