Mar. 1<sup>st</sup> 1866. Strong wind  
last night & this morning,  
blowing down breadfruit  
Si Uavika preserving some  
like the elbow. Got out  
canoe off for more thatch  
with Jennia, Tak & Elias.

Uav. S. seems a little better  
today. A good female pro-  
meeting. Had 14 to teacher  
er's meeting. For the first  
time got the word for  
widow & widower. Also  
think I got the form for  
ordinal numbers.

Find a great disagreement  
between Uav. Doan's gram-  
mar & his translation.

He says ar is the sign of  
the perfect tense: but in  
looking over 6 chapters  
I find ar used 50 times  
5 present tense 22 imper.  
\* 6 perfect & 17 pluperfect!  
Mar. 2. Pleasant. Thatch came  
early, so finished up thatch  
ing for the present. A  
heavy job well over. Recd.  
a tub of salt alk. 7m.c.  
made by boiling salt water  
tried to refine or purify the  
salt I had from C. & C. improv  
nated with kerosene. But  
was no go. The more I  
tried the more it wouldn't

Carrie beat me at a game  
of chess this evg. 50 to pr. M.  
Mar. 3. Saturday. Got up in a  
rain squall. Windy but  
not much rain during  
the day. Settled off with  
my hatch makers &  
most of them went home.  
Paid the 4, Mack, Solomon,  
Elias & Sajoliky, five  
dollars apiece in trade  
including 50 cts. apiece in  
cash = \$20, for the whole  
job, putting 33 1/3 per ct. on  
my Hon. wholesale prices.  
viz. 4 hatchets 8h, 2, 10 in & 2  
5 in. knives, 1 pr. pauls (or chth

for them, 3 shirts (each) -  
11 sacks (cut & fitted for wo-  
men), 3, 4 in combs, & 23 -  
large fishhooks & 2 \$ cash.  
We all feel exceedingly  
relieved that this job is  
off our hands, & now we  
have a good roof.

Finished filing my cross-  
cut saw.

Am getting interested in  
the work of translating.

Sund. H. Pleasant. 14<sup>th</sup> to Chh-  
113 to S.S. Interested attention  
to the entrance of the children  
of D. into Canaan. Crossing Jordan  
& taking of Jeriko & ac.

Wed. 5. Year. Squally. Likokom  
died this morning. Went to  
see her & found all hands  
busy at getting up a feast  
& burning incense. Repaired  
Carrie's Bureau. She is get-  
ting to be quite sharp at a  
game of chess, beat me last  
Friday evng. & came near  
it this evng. An inspec-  
tive day for my house.  
I am sorry to say.  
Am most happy to see an  
increase of U.C. contribu-  
tions. Eight gallons tonight  
and nearly 2 of them from  
Drukwojkoj's family. He &  
his wife came & brought it.  
He is evidently becoming in-  
terested the things of true religion.

4  
Tues. 6. Rainy day. Aca took the  
boards of the two bedroom  
& back entry floors of Mr.  
D's house. I have refit-  
ted a tier of sleepers for  
flooring. Sorry to hear  
that another of my en-  
skoion pigs have been  
killed & eaten.

They finished up their  
" feasting <sup>burial</sup> for Sikokom &  
with an esp. weatherish  
dance.

Ina my further look-  
ing over Maak I find some  
29 cases where the accusa-  
tive of person or persons

is not translated, & 7 cases  
in ubk. it is doubly rendered.  
I am making a note, in a  
letter to Mr. D., of some of these  
omissions.

Wed. 7. Cloudy & windy. Sent  
the boys to Enkoion for a  
pig. But they failed, so wild  
not able to catch one. Many  
of the small ones dead &  
dying for want of food.

Aca at thatching again,  
gd' his burwoj on 4 one qu-  
ble end finished.

But 28 to pr. meeting. Geo.  
made confession of having  
beaten his wife & in a  
quarrel of theirs!

Thurs. 8. Pleasant, but strong  
wind. Busy at my house. In-  
terruptions prevented me ac-  
complishing all I had planned.  
Boys S. M. & J. caught the  
last two of my little pigs  
up country. We routed one, &  
took the other.

Benj. came for his ax heads  
with sack for his wife  
& shirt for himself set-  
tles up for his labors on  
my house. I handled a  
ground his ax, but no  
"kom mol" from him.

Strong wind interrupted  
female pr. meeting. Eleven  
to teachers meeting.

Frid. 9. Mar. 1866.

Weather as yesterday.  
Freddy's birth day. Eight years  
old. A read very poorly, but  
is very fond of being read to;  
has a good memory, a  
kind & generous disposition  
careless about his things,  
takes but little care of any  
thing; was mightily pleased  
that I gave him a knife this  
morning with a string to it,  
has been busy with it all day.  
Has been without one for a  
long time, as he lost two  
while I was gone to Kucis.  
Found this A. M. that Aca  
had been having difficulty

with Benj. before he came  
to me yesterday. His course  
has indicated an exceedingly  
unamiable, if not unchristian  
disposition.

Jeremia has worked kindly  
& faithfully today in getting  
stuff for a pig pen.

Sat. 10. Weather as yesterday ex-  
cept more cloudy.

Finished the children's rooms  
for flooring, & got nearly all  
my red lumber over from  
Acad to the new house. Did a  
little pit sawing with Si<sup>r</sup> M<sup>r</sup>.  
Jen. got a nice mess of fish  
last night, & bot. eleven  
flying fish for Sunday.

So the Lord provides without  
our going out of doors.

Got only about 1/2 done on  
my house I had thot. of on  
Monday last, & yet I have  
worked myself thoroughly tired  
every night. I am now where  
I have got to do it all myself;  
got beyond the depth of my  
"native boys.

Sat. 11. A continuance of fine weather.  
141 to church, tho.  
fewer men than could be de-  
sired. Interesting attention  
to the triumphs of Joshua.  
Rebecca confessed her quar-  
rel with her husband  
with weeping at Jer. 10. 11.

48 to eve's. Mr. meeting of  
Laura confessed to her sins  
of Kamomo, - heathenish prac-  
tices with her child & brother.  
Mrs. S. a sick turn after  
the Feb. pr. 4th, & wd. able  
to come to tea with us. No  
apparent cause for the  
illness. Better now, 9 oc P. 7th.  
Mon 12. Weather as usual. Up early.  
Reviewing my Math. on the use  
of ak <sup>or</sup> for a, but, I am sorry  
to find some 2 or 3 times, & all  
but one in the 1<sup>st</sup> 12 chapters.  
I then took up Mr. Donnie's  
Math & find a very confused  
mess in the use of both a  
& ak.

the boys have got over most  
of my lumber. Hope to begin  
laying ~~floor~~ floor again to-  
morrow. A pig of mine  
has a litter of 7 or 8 pigs.

Mrs. S. better today.  
Tues 13. Fine weather. Hoped to have  
made good progress in laying my  
floor. But had to turn off to help  
George put some thatch on my  
store house, on one side & a  
part of the roof. Writing in the  
eve's. & reading to Mrs. S. from  
the Memorial Vol. And was  
surprised to see by that that a  
missionary don't own his  
own house. So I am building  
for the A. D. C. G. M.

Wed. 14. Yesterday was 34  
weeks since we left Honolulu.  
Will be 8 mo<sup>s</sup> next Saturday.  
A fine day & I have improv-  
ed it by getting down all of  
my floor. Vastly better than  
I expected. Sonom brought 8  
fish yesterday & 10 today.

Oh that I could make every day  
tell as today has in my work.  
Am writing to you. Done to  
learn the price etc. of the  
Baxter & Sons' Lexicons for  
the old & new testament.

Spoke to Elizabeth last eve<sup>s</sup>.  
about her duty to be more  
at home, & not going around  
so much from place to place.

Thurs 15. Pleasant. Up early &  
at work in good season but on  
the whole an ineffective day.  
Had a good oppor. to talk a  
little to Lejoksairik as he  
came with a note from Ca-  
pelle for a spike pole.  
He is evidently very ill at  
ease. And he & Lijiraman  
have been debating the  
matter about separating.

Jere & Si'u. got 4<sup>th</sup> fish for  
their portion of the night's  
labor. I made a ripe bread.  
Quit pudding for dinner.

Jere & I sawed up one of my  
mast pieces for door & window  
frames.

I to teacher's meeting a hard lesson, with several sleepy pupils because of fishing last night.

Frid. 16. Some rain again for a rarity. Up early. Took H.P. for Carpenter. Children & I up country as far as Kapaunui. Jack Smith thinks the Lyril is lost. Put my tools in order & began on my window frames again, i. e. I have two more to make before I can go on boarding the sides of my house again.

I feel exceedingly weary to night. Had a game of chess with Carrie & Freddy.

Sat. 17. I mtd. from Honolulu.

We are having rain again. Saw Capelle off in his boat with Antone fishing for shark fins & porpoise oil. Heavy surf from the West. Heavy thunder off that way this eve.

Natives have a notion or saying that a heavy surf is the sign of a ship's coming to the island.

Sat. 18. Rainy, squally day with much thunder & lightning. Wind well to the South. 10<sup>1/2</sup> to 11. 499 to S.S. An interesting meeting, several of the fallen girls spoke.

Monday, 19. A fine day. Had a begin-  
ning to lay the sleepers to  
my back mandak, at 4 M.

2 M. began boarding again.

Evening, translated 10 verses  
in Ueak, which finishes 4  
chapters. Am much encour-  
aged with Si. Yu. as a teach-  
er.

Aea is making a  
saw pit down to the shore.

Likaji returned today.

Tues. 20. Pleasant & traders. Did  
about 1/2 of what I had hoped  
on my house in boarding. Aea  
sawed one of his logs in two for  
sills. Gave him a lesson in  
Eng. this evening. A good fare of  
fish last night. 34 lb. fish.

Wed. 21. Pleasant. found the pig  
eating one of her young this morning.

The boys made a pen for  
her to keep her from another  
pig. Assisted Aea about his  
sawing. A call from Yu. C.  
for me to look at his boy who  
is badly covered with rank  
sores. I prescribed for him  
Sulphur & cream of Tartar.  
Rain with N. wind in evening.  
About 100 to Mr. Useliff.

Thurs. 22. Pleasant with some  
rain. Boys to Yu. C.'s & got  
Molasses, Butter, Tea, Pickles,  
Ketchup, Prunes, & a duck.  
Busy at boarding. A good  
teacher's meeting.

24  
Fri. 23. March. Beautiful day.  
Ara & the boys off fishing  
last night. Early in morning  
after their return Ara got  
off 4 boys to Enkoion for  
a pig. They returned with  
a poor, bony sow, not worth  
killing. Yet we killed &  
dressed her, & hung her up in  
the wind for tomorrow. If  
she happens to blow away.  
I shall save my salt,  
wh. is quite an item  
these <sup>scarce</sup> dry times.

Mrs. S. rather low spirited  
Had a large sewing soc.  
We greatly need some  
news to wake us up.

Sat. 24. Weather as yesterday.  
Overhauling my lumber  
to see how it is going to  
hold out, & to separate the  
seasoned & dry from the rest.  
Think it will hold out for  
all necessary purposes.  
My Lydia thinks me dull  
& untalkative. Too true.  
Must do more to make  
things cheerful.

Sab. 25. Exceedingly fine weather.  
131 to meeting, & Ara had large  
attendance at Toke, Eneluk  
& Meij. 6<sup>y</sup> to evng. pr. meetg.  
Mrs. S. says I don't take time  
& care enough for my Sab.  
services. Ara w<sup>th</sup> 5 di kapitok at  
Toke.

Mon. 26. A fine day, & I busy  
making & putting up a  
double door frames. All busy  
as usual. In the evg. Aca  
" took his <sup>2<sup>nd</sup></sup> lesson in Eng.

Tues. 27. Some rain & cloudy.  
A call from Mr. C. to get  
more medicine for his boy.  
He cannot get him to take  
Sulphur, so I let him try  
Dr. Jayne's Alterative.

Happy to find that he is  
making some advance in  
correcting his German ideas  
of Sab. Keeping. Was glad  
to correct a false impres-  
sion he had of one about  
not letting him have any

saw. He moves Antone  
over to Jurij, box & baggage.  
He lent me a jack plane  
& long jointer, also a broad  
plane.

Aca took another lesson  
in Eng. this eve'g. <sup>Mr. S. to</sup> <sub>given 2.40.</sub>

Wed. 28. Pleasant. After  
breakfast the children &  
Si Kurika went with me  
to Jurij, to make an ex-  
change of planes, as the  
ones sent were not the  
ones I wanted. Picked  
up a basket of pretty coral  
on my return. Putting up  
a partition. Gk to evg. meet-  
ing. Aca gave them a talk.

Thurs. 29. Pleasant, Partitioning  
Solomon up from Toki. Bot  
of him 6 galls. oil for a large  
sh. hatchet, & 5 lbs. twine  
for, 50c. He gave me the  
names of 5 candidates for Chh.  
membership.

At teacher's meeting saw some  
more mistakes or errors in  
my death.

Fri. 30. Pleasant, getting dry.  
Jeremia & Sikaaji are still  
up country getting thatch  
for the Chh. Aea & fam-  
ily went on a sailing ex-  
cursion to Fabou en in.

Sent books & two boxes pills  
to M.C. by a man whom I

I pulled a tooth for.

Finished my partition but  
not my pilasters for the

" door.

Sat. 31. Still pleasant, with a  
squall or two. Finished the  
finish around the double  
door, & fitted & hung the door  
next to my room.

Apr. 1<sup>st</sup> Rain, light wind &  
calms. 133 to Chh. with  
usual attention. Larger no.  
of boys than usual. A good  
U.C. in ev'g. Aea not  
present. Deborah seems to  
have met with a misfor-  
tune in connection with  
their sail Frida-

Begin translating Mark.

Apr. 2. Mond. Very pleasant, & almost calm. Up at 5:00. & at work on my house before breakfast. Have concluded to spend the school hour of C. & J. with Si'ku. in translating Mark into Kusaie. Spent an hour or so about noon in gathering specimens of coral to prepare to send away.

They brought 7 galls. of oil for U.C. cont.

As Ara was off fishing I spent the evng. with Si'ku. in translating. Got through with 16 verses today.

Shall not often do as much in one day.

Tues. 3<sup>rd</sup> - Cloudy & drizzly. But 10 verses today. Got up another partition. And feel worn tonight.

Wed. 4. Last night between 11 & 12 oc. we heard the usual wild outcry of Sail Ho! or their Kailok. I got up & went out & found it was a fleet of canoes from Jaluit. I went back & put on some clothes & went out again & soon learned from Lebekwo that there were 22 canoes with 3 prominent chiefs, Kaibuke, Sobbaie & Worak; also that Sumorri, Surun & Sejimuta of this Is. were dead.

that one of Kaibuke's wives  
had left him & gone with  
Sobain; & he had murdered  
the other who was with  
child by drowning her; &  
he had also murdered  
a younger brother of the  
one who was drowned work-  
ing for Capelle.

About 2 o'c. A. M. Kaibu-  
ke called on me with two  
men & reported among  
other things that the  
sch. members had all  
run well, that he had  
helped Kapali his house  
on Suerout & had lived with  
him in one part of it.

This A. M. before breakfast  
he called on me again to see  
my new house, & soon after  
Aca went in his canoe to  
Jurij to get letters from Kapa-  
li, but returned without  
finding any. But obtained  
for me (I learned of it in the  
night) a most beautiful &  
perfect orange cowrie of Ja-  
juriling. Been fixing up  
for thivors today.

At sch. meeting examined  
6 from Woke for sch. mem-  
bership. 50 to meeting.

Thurs. 5. Rainy. An early  
call from M. Hama with  
letters from Kaslemakul.

oil agent of Capt. Eury  
of a Mr. Benson from Dan-  
vik, of Dec. 1<sup>st</sup>.

All well & doing well.

A loud call for books.

Changing & fixing doors to  
my room, & store house.

About noon Andrew came  
with letters from Kapli,

He reports hopefully. In  
need of books.

Call from Oaker Henry  
for medicine. Speaks good

Eng., was 5 years in Mr.

Emerson's family. Been  
wicked enough with Kai-  
buke. His body completely  
ruined with disease.

Just at night a call from  
Lobbain, with a present of  
34 lbs. of bop jankwin.

Told me that his father  
& brother left word when dying  
for him to take care of the  
missionaries & build their  
houses etc. Said they  
wanted to go to the good  
place but they were bad  
men.

Teachers meeting as usual.

<sup>by</sup> Frid. 6. Strong trades & squalls.

Chiefs & fleet came up from  
Jurij early. Got on better in  
translating than yesterday. Was  
called away by arrival of

Kaibuke, Nimair etc. A beautiful pearl I found in my hand as I took hand with Kaibuke, Paid him 1/2 \$ conditionally for it. Detained rest of A. M. in entertaining them.

K. wants me to make doors to his house. But I got off by referring him to Mr. C's carpenter.

P. M. went up to call on chiefs, & engaged Tobbin to get me some wood.

Had a sort of settlement or understanding with Kaibuke about our pigs.

Rec'd letters today from Nemair's husband from San at Namirik for his wife, & from Namirik for Antone.

Sat. M. Rainy. Went before breakfast up to Kut's & brought or lead home my large pig with her nojen. Killed the little one for tomorrow etc., giving Aea a portion. Put the large one in the pen & let the other run about.

Assisted Aea some on his house, entertained chiefs, & been writing to Mr. Drane. Mrs. Nemair to tea. While

we were eating one of her  
men <sup>brought</sup> ~~wanted~~ a small bas-  
ket of cooked cocoa nuts entire  
& she wanted pay for them  
I told her if I fed her & her  
husband, I thought it not  
improper that she should  
reajirik us.

I'm surprised to find that  
1/2 of the chiefs - old young  
male & female have died  
since we came here; or  
since Kaituke died inclu-  
ding him; & but 4 births!  
This looks like a blotting  
out of the chiefish stock.  
Not one died in the faith.

Apr. Sat. 8. 1866. Squally.

Some 200 to meeting; & unusu-  
ally good attention. Lobbain  
& Kaituke among the chiefs.  
Three chiefish women. Was  
much aided in the dispensa-  
tion of the truth, & from  
remarks at pr. meetings  
good impressions seem to have  
been made. Just as we  
were beginning service A. M.  
word came in of Sail No! I  
was glad to hear Kaituke  
say "Iekrou." But very  
few left before the services  
closed. "The Sail No! I seems  
to have been Bk. Washington

Baker N. B., & went out  
via N. Zealand.

Some to eve's meeting,  
& Timair's husband spoke  
for the 1<sup>st</sup> time, & spoke  
well. Evident indications  
of the Spirit's presence.

Praise the Lord.

Monday. 9. Up before 5. Pained  
to learn of Kaibuke's order-  
ing women off on board the  
Bk., & also sent off for  
his & my traps yesterday. P. M.  
Noted the things I wanted to  
get on board the Bk. But  
upon reflection concluded  
to have nothing to do with

the concern. So as not to be  
complicated with Kaibuke  
in his Sab. making or with  
me & the Capt. in having  
women on board ship.

So when the Capt. & Mr. C. called  
after a little social talk Mr.  
C. went to hear & Capt. B. &  
I to my new house & study,  
& I told him what I had  
concluded to do & why, with  
was not to trade with him at  
all nor go on board of his  
ship, that I might by so  
doing discontinue both  
Sab. making & licentious-  
ness. What he thought or

Now he felt about it I  
do not know.

Ara took pigs on board &  
traded with him. I advised  
him to do so if he was  
needy, as I knew he was.

My course has been prompt-  
ed more by what I felt  
would be its effect upon  
the natives, particularly  
Kaibuka, than by any ex-  
pectation of good upon  
Capt. B. or his ship.

" Tues. 10. All quiet this morn.

" Ara got home about mid-  
night. Capt. B. did not  
get off on board to do his

paying up for his men's  
till his 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> mate  
went after him, leaving his  
ship in care of the 3<sup>rd</sup> mate,  
returned with him about dark.  
A sperm whale was seen  
near by but not men  
enough on board to lower  
for it, they being on shore  
with the Captain.

Ara said Capelle got 3  
large flasks of gun among  
other things; he sent me  
some Colonial papers today.

" Thot. I did pretty well yester-  
day, does not look so well to-  
day. Yesterday & today thatching

church, & got one side up.

Henry & put a lock on the front door. 17<sup>th</sup> verses today in Kusais.

Wed. 11. Strong trades. After I got through my Kusaisi Aca came & told me of Kaibuke's going to get Simaurik & brought her to his house crying. And then told me of Mr. Co. encouraging them in Sab. making & in furnishing women for ships.

So I proposed to see that we go & see Kaibuke & found him at Soaki's, & we went to the bank & had a long talk, & on the whole

very satisfactory. Shall hope well for him. On our return met Mr. C. & had a long talk with him. And on the whole satisfactory. He brought me about 60 lbs. Salt of his own make.

Chh. meeting P. M. Four examined for Chh. membership, & they with the other 6 were rec'd on prob. Their names are, Lajibor, Lajiw, Lajimor, Lijabuw, wife of the 1<sup>st</sup>, Niskur & Lijero, wife of the 2<sup>nd</sup> all of Lake; Sukoril, Sitabar, Labukwo & Lakobwewa of Ebon.

An interesting pr. meeting  
in the eve. <sup>by</sup> present  
males & females just equal  
After the close Kairuke  
came forward on the  
platform & spoke of hav-  
ing put away his wrath.  
& of his determination to  
live a new life.

Thurs. 12. Rough stormy day.

A call from Laster. Gpd.  
him 4\$ cash & a shirt 1\$,  
for my domestic help.

Said his brother left word for  
him to see that Missionaries  
had good help. And Jere.  
was to be mine & Enock's.

Says too that Loeak has  
no ill designs or feelings  
upon or toward Simaurik's  
friends.

Sent some white sugar to  
Mr. C. & 6 lb. rice.  
He sent back a box of po-  
tatoes & onions, & a little  
bag of bread (Haw) for C. &  
W.

Jeremia & I sawing down  
frame stuff. A full trade  
ev's meeting in eve.

Frid. 13. Much rain & sharp squalls.

Bro. B.C. Osau. A quiet day  
as to callers. Rainy night &  
prospect of rainy tomorrow.

Sat. 15. Stormy Sab. or rather  
do. Some 17<sup>th</sup> or so to abh. &  
for the most part excellent  
attention. Kaibuke & Aimair  
to S.P. Translated 1<sup>st</sup> & 1/2 of II  
Ps. into Kuair, as Tulpe was  
not able to come with Si Yu.  
to reading lesson. Very rainy  
evng. ~~some~~ but some 3/4 to  
meeting, but a good meeting.

Not feeling well this evng.

Mon. 16. Cloudy calm & Windy  
toward night. Went up country  
A. Yu., taking medicine to di-  
kwo & calling on Uokilon  
in men, clear up to the other  
end. Bot 4 fowls of him 1/2<sup>th</sup>.

Bought 2 pre. mats (in) one of  
Kaibuke for 2 lbs. Shob 9 1/4 lbs.  
one of Lake for an inc. knife-  
traded with K. for hatchet  
& 2 knives. Putting up my  
pair of doors. Translated 13 v.

Tues. 17. Less rain than yesterday.

Up before 5. Finished hanging my  
double doors. Went to Capelle's & engaged  
2 pns. of windows 10x12 glass, & bit  
whetstone 1/4 lbs. Assisted in putting  
hatch on other side of oak.

Trans. Translated 24 verses. Kaibuke to dinner.

Wed. 18. While at translating M.  
C. called bringing my windows  
for \$6.50, & saying he was go-  
ing in his boat for coral.

So Freddy & I & Smith went  
with him. But from being too  
late to go outside, & from his  
want of knowledge of its local-  
ities we made a poor hunt.  
He dined with us on our re-  
turn, & then I went to sawing  
with Jerry. I soon down.  
I came, nose, saw, log & all;  
bruising me rather badly.  
But, thanks to a kind Prov-  
idence no serious injury.

changing a door & getting out a frame.  
Gave a call for medicines.  
A good <sup>by</sup> Teacher's meeting.

A getting over my fall faster  
than I feared.

Nov. 20. Pleasant. Aea, Enoch & Jere went  
to Eiskoion for a pig for me. Came  
back early with a savage old boar.  
I cut him & he died before night.

morrow, as Mrs. S. does not care  
to eat a portion of Aea's cooking.  
A call from Kaibuke for uno

for a lame leg. Tried to buy a shirt, but did not succeed.

Wants something that I have not - Clio that no one else has.

Got up another door frame & some advance in translating.

Gave uno this evng. to Nimai's husband.

Sab. 22. Pleasant. Some 125 or so to chh. Larger no. than usual at jitikon. No chiefs except In kwokwoj's mother & Nelson.

Was sorry as I had prepared my talk with special reference to chiefs. Very many are sick with colds. Some 50 to evng. meeting.

Wed. 23. A rainy day after rather a sleepless night. Went up to Jastan's to in a pouring rain to give medicine to a nephew of his. Was not a little annoyed by J's indifference to my call on him in his canoe house. Gave medicine to Jock & his boroni wife, & to several others. Likwon & the blind man among the rest. I might give away a gallon of expectorant & no body would say "Thank you." A call from Kibuke & sent medicine to his sister twice. Carried my door frame & hung the

door. A strong westerly blow  
this eveg. Played chess with  
Carrie. Took down the  
temporary partition to the  
dining room.

Tues. 24. Cloudy, W. + N. + N.E.  
wind. An ineffective day.  
Into 9th chap. of Mark.

Wed. 25. Pleasant morning but a  
squally day. A fallow man  
died day before yesterday. Mrs.  
S. poorly this A.M. Boys get  
pig my large pig & two 8 little  
ones home & in the pen.

Made a little work bench for  
Friday. Made, put up & covered  
a window frame. Some ho to pr

Apr.

meeting. Aca made the  
long talk. Gave out medi-  
cine after meeting.

Extracted a large decayed tooth  
for Carrie. She stood it bravely.

Thurs. Apr. 26. Still rainy & squally.  
lay. Usual hour at Kusaim.  
Had then busy on my house.  
Goodly no. & good meetings  
both female & teachers.

Tooth ache tonight, & it is  
one of the last pair of grind-  
ers I have left. What I shall  
do when that is gone is more  
than I can tell. O that it  
may not be necessary to  
extract it for long years to come.

Frid. 27. Still raining with the  
wind strong all around the  
compass! Don't remember  
ever to have seen the like  
before. Gave Kakahe his  
breakfast, & tonight he sent  
a message on a slate for  
some coffee. I sent the  
Young man & his slate  
home, thinking it not well  
to open a coffee saloon just  
yet.

Sent Jormaia to Ym. C. &  
glass. got 6 panes of his 15X16  
glass.

Yms. S. thinks Ebon a good  
place to cultivate grass.

Sat. 28. No rain hardly & near  
by a calm. Made another  
heavy frame for our Bed-  
room door. Aea killed a  
pig & gave us a quarter.

Sat. 29. A fine pleasant day.  
130 or so to meeting - none of the  
high chiefs. Spoke to them of  
their neglect of repairing the  
house of God. After my exer-  
cise in Kusaie, I went up  
country to see the sick Jala-  
it-people; one of the the 3<sup>rd</sup>  
died last night. Gave medicine  
to 8 of them & to Likwor & Ne-  
lung. Heard on my way back  
that one of Kakahe's widows

was very sick & Nookilons  
wife also; so after tea I  
gave my eve's. meeting up  
to sea & went some 2 1/2 to  
3 miles out to see & give  
medicine to them. Found  
the old lady going off ap-  
parently as Kaibuka did.  
She readily took my medi-  
cines & appeared glad to see  
me. The young woman too  
I found very sick & fear-  
ful. Prayed with them both  
as I did with some of the  
others this P. M.

Came home & found Mrs  
S. down with intense

pain in the lower part of  
her bowels. Diligent appli-  
cations of hot water & flannels  
seems to have relieved her  
for the present at least.  
Wed. 30. Mrs. S. better, tho. feels  
the effect of last eve's at-  
tack. Had to go to my study  
again to sleep as Carrie was  
so troubled with mosquitoes.  
After my Kusaiin lesson  
went with the children to Jurij-  
taking a look at the sick chiefs  
on our way. The Carpenter has  
shooked & packed 100 <sup>old</sup> casks  
ready for shipment. Tells me  
that the firm has been to 40,000%.

Mrs. Mrs. Libuwij was brought  
down to remain today. Her  
case is still doubtful. So also

Wed. May 1<sup>st</sup> Raining & nearly  
calm. 4th Mrs of my  
patients are on the pivot yst.

blister on his side. Mrs.  
S. better & up to see some of  
the sick. My house & Ku  
saien translations progress  
slowly. A part of my wood  
got along today. Kaibuke &  
Lady called about tea time  
for a comb.

Children had a holiday to-  
day, as it was May Day  
Wend. Pleasant. Busy on my  
house & at Kusaien. Up  
twice to see Libuwij. The  
oil that I gave her the  
night before operated tho-  
roughly, so she is weak  
today. As I called tonight

I thought she must be dying her pulse was so low. She wanted Christians to pray for her. I made the request at the pr. meeting in eveg.

Benj's wife gave birth to a son Saturday night.

Thurs. 3. Rainy; word came early of the death of Libuej. Busy at my house & at translating all day.

Twelve at teacher's meeting

Frid. 4. Preparatory meeting to the communion next Sab.

Some 110 to Am. meeting & 90 or so to P. M. & near

to ev'g. meeting. Glad to see Kaibuke & family to meeting also Drakwojkuoj & Ymanuel.

Good attention to the word & many spoke & spoke well. After the A. M. meeting I met a man at the door with a word from Saitan for me to come to see him as he was worse. Went over & found him in a high fever. Waited for M. C. to come; & after some consultation we concluded what course to adopt in treating his case. But he declined all our offers, & conclu-

ded to die, or wait what-  
ever issue might come.

On my way back with K.  
he said he thought he  
would die, & he thought it  
was God's plan to have but  
one chief on the island,  
& he was to be that chief.  
Ara began the P.M. ser-  
vice. Translated some

& copied more in both dia-

lects. I conducted evg. meetg.

Sat. 5. Cloudy & some rain.

Odd & ends, - translating, car-  
pentering, doctoring, pastora-  
ting etc. Meeting of candidates  
this ev'g. to explain articles

of faith etc., & arrange names  
for them & their children.

This giving foreign names  
is a real bother. I greatly  
wish Mr. Doane had not in-  
augurated it.

Was glad to hear that Sa-  
tan consented or concluded  
to take an emetic last night.

See that by getting 160  
verses per week, I can get  
through with Mark in 7  
weeks. Hope to be able to  
do much better than that.

Sat. 6. A favorable day for our exer-  
cises. A full house, & good at-  
tention, except Kaibake -

It was good to look upon so many of this people coming to the table of Christ, clothed & with such becoming propriety. Ten were rec'd today & 4 children baptised.

Aea preached P.M., & a good, full meeting in the eveg. Kimair & her husband spoke.

I was interested in the morning at Lakobwewa, who came early to hear me read over the 'articles of faith' & to fix upon a new name. Concluded to take the name of Simson. I read over

the articles carefully to him twice & some three times.

He tried at first to say the word over with or after me as I read. But he could not seem to get hold of them. Lebekwa came & I read them over again to him. After I left Simson delayed & seemed anxious about something, & soon began to tell me that the words in the book were & had & stuck in his throat - he could not get hold of them to understand them. But, said

Now I believe in Jesus & love him & I understand the word talked in our meetings, will that do? Is it good for me to come if I don't understand the word in that book? The words are hard they stick in my throat. Not having time to explain the word further, I told him he need feel no difficulty about that if he believes in a Lord Jesus. He was allowed to pass as a suitable candidate for baptism.

Wed. Some rain & more wind. A good day for 21 on Ebon - the day of the yearly fast for Micronesia. A. M. Mrs. S. & Debra met the females in our new house, & Aea & I had a meeting of the males in the club. One solemnly touching incident at our meeting viz. Entirely unexpected by me, Si Morika wished me to translate for Kailube the 54, 55 & 56 verses of Jon. 6th, after reading it in Kusaian, & made in connection some very approp

private remarks as a  
Chief from Kusais to Kailun-  
ke & the chiefs of Ebon. It  
was a beautiful & touching  
climax to the train of thoughts  
I had presented before. The  
significant fact that Ebon  
& the Marshall Is. was the  
only station in Micronesia  
where no chiefs belonged to  
the Chh. We had a  
general meeting P. M. in  
the Chh. Asa & I occupied  
most of the time. They  
seemed especially interested  
in the singular Providence  
in connection with Ebon &

the Micronesian Mission.  
Asa conducted the eve's  
meeting, while Si M. & I  
were engaged in translating  
- for Kusais.

<sup>ay</sup> Tues. 8. The Lake people were  
of in good season - all that  
could stick on to one canoe.  
The rest walked in the P.M.  
Was sorry to learn from Asa  
that K. had been disposing  
of 2 pipes to C. I said nothing  
to me about it.

Wed. A day of constant interrup-  
tions, & so not much accom-  
plished. Last door up & put in  
running order, & began

painting. If I only had  
windows could soon move in.  
A call from Y. C. just af-  
ter I had sent a note to him  
& returned some of his tools.  
Sorry to find he had taken  
the pips & paid for them.  
He went to Kaibuke to tell  
him what I said, & they both  
soon returned. Soon as  
I put the question to K.  
he owned up to my claim  
to all the pips on the Is.  
to which he had any claim.  
I said he intended to tell  
me all of what he had  
done, but forgot it!

Recd. 2 galls. paint oil  
from Y. C. & 6 bullets  
for catching jaegers tomorrow.  
Asa has bought a canoe  
for doak. Cut Fred's & La-  
puletok's hair. But little  
progress in translating.  
Nov. 11. Rainy, squally day.  
Very severe squall in  
evening. The event of most  
importance today was a  
call from Kaibuke &  
one of his men, request-  
ing a private interview.  
At that interview, with  
emotion he confessed  
his sins, & his awful wan

derings, murdering  
his wife & the brother of  
the man who came with  
him, while at Gabuit.

Said he was sorry for  
his sins, repented of them  
& was going to turn to God  
& serve him. He would  
not say as he had often  
said before that he was  
very strong or firm in  
his love for Jesus; for  
he did not know what  
he might do hereafter.  
But for the present his  
purpose was to serve God.  
At my suggestion we

prayed together. It was  
easy to see that he was  
had some practice in  
the language of prayer.

After this, the man  
who came with him, who  
had been one of the Chris-  
tian party, made his  
confession & told of his  
purpose to reform &  
do his first works.

I was glad to hear from him  
that the Christian people have  
thought & thought all along  
that K. would turn & be a dif-  
ferent man & a decided Chris-  
tian; for he began so markedly

in the first part of his religious course.

We found that alum water & sweet oil relieved him most of any other remedies we tried. Laid loosely my back over randaah floor & piled out some of my board on it.

Sat. 12. Thunder & squally.

Painting my front room. Got through with 46 verses this week with many interruptions. The Ensko. man brought a pip badly wounded. But paid him  $\frac{1}{2}$  \$ as I promised him yesterday. Aea is to begin his school again Monday 2 hours per d.

rying & exhuming him.

After tea I called on Kaibuke.

made no reply. After sing-  
ing school he came home  
with me & wished a private  
interview, 3 young chief boys

Gave David tea spoonful of castor oil & 3 drops laudanum, after dinner. He is a sick child.

Sat. 19. May. But little rain.

Find by talking with Leah &  
Sikaji that they have a strong  
feeling of entirely casting such  
off from S.S., meetings & all  
intercourse.

Sat. 27. A most beautiful day.  
Some 150 to chh., & at Lake the  
house was overflowing full.  
Sad news in the morning of  
the sudden death of Benjamin's  
little Joseph, probably occa-  
sioned by his father's overlaying  
it in the night.

Good attention to the A.M.  
service. P.M. went to Jitoken  
to attend the funeral of the  
little babe - just 4 weeks old.

Had the service out doors,  
as their houses were small.  
Was interested while at the  
grave that Carrie, who went  
with me, should wish to  
hold the little corpse, &  
at the mother's beautifully  
tender interest in the darling  
dust. Martha put it into  
her arms a little while be-  
fore they buried it; sitting  
near I saw her take up  
one of its little hands &  
pressing the little fingers  
together, she looked at the  
little nails - more beautiful  
than wax work - & then rubbed

them across her lips affec-  
tionately & bathing them  
& her own hand with her

Rain again P.M. with  
much thunder & lightning.

Sab. 8. Pleasant for the most part  
15° to 20°. Sea only to 20k.

Not so good attention as usual.

A good exercise with my  
Kusians. In evng. report both  
of war & of sail (no! both false)  
Am interested in Warm. of Th.  
Fellinghuysen.

Wind, 9. Pleasant. A very strong  
blow in the night from the  
East with but little rain.  
Very seldom have such  
a blow. Feared for a tree  
near my house, lest it  
should fall upon the house.

A note from Mr. C.
