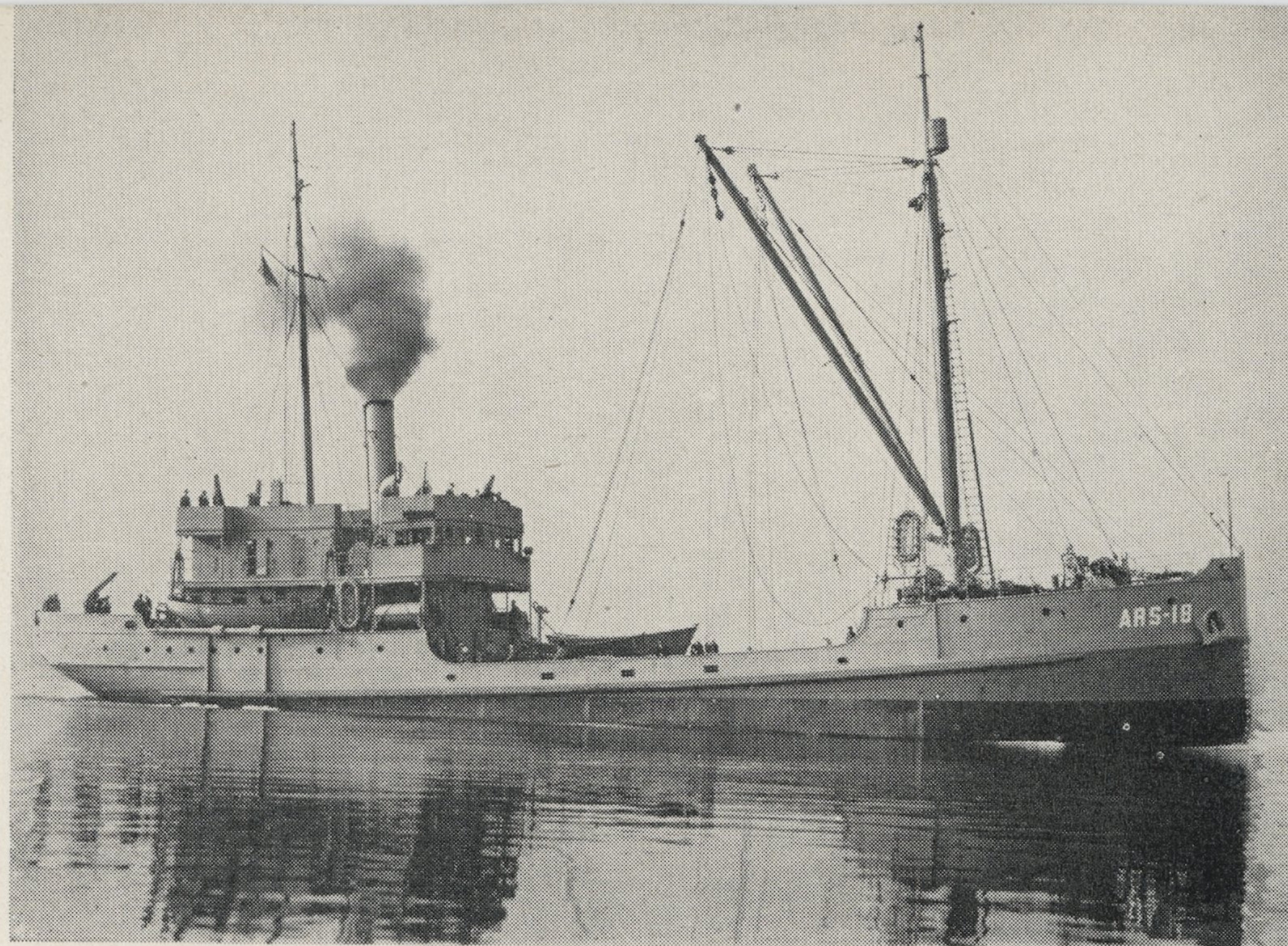


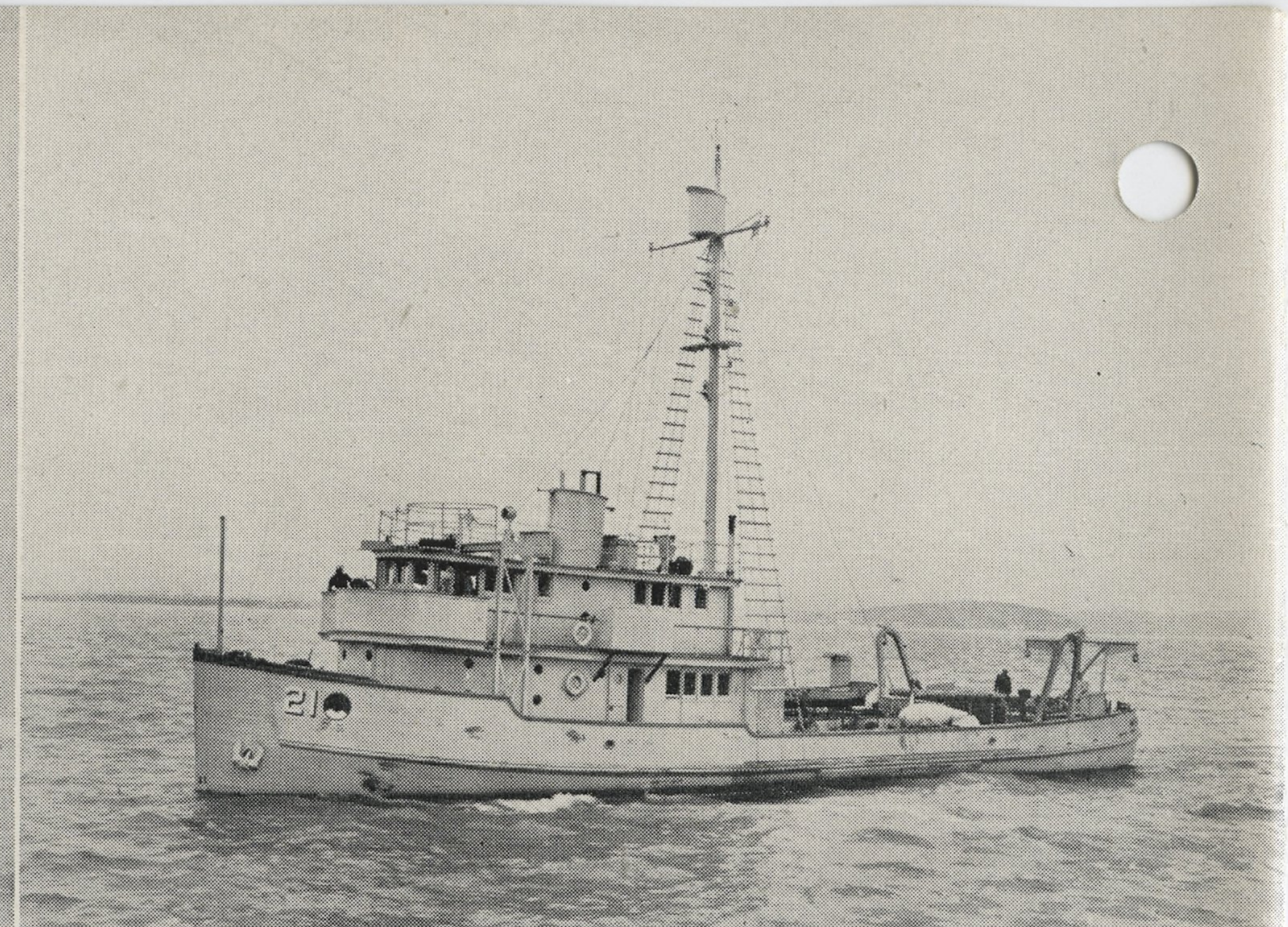
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COASTAL SMALL CRAFT

Hundreds of small craft of many sizes and types have been pressed into service by the Navy and Coast Guard and used for coastal patrol and other important, strictly local assignments. The vessels shown here indicate only a few of the types now in such service.



▲ ARS—RESCUER, typical of many Army and Navy conversions of coastal freighters and bulk cargo carriers.

ATR—Rescue tugs, are typical of a large fleet of new and converted small craft used as AT, AG, and in USCG reserve. ►
