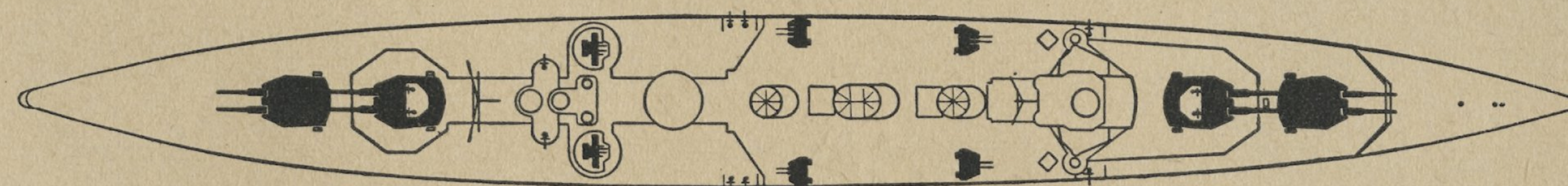
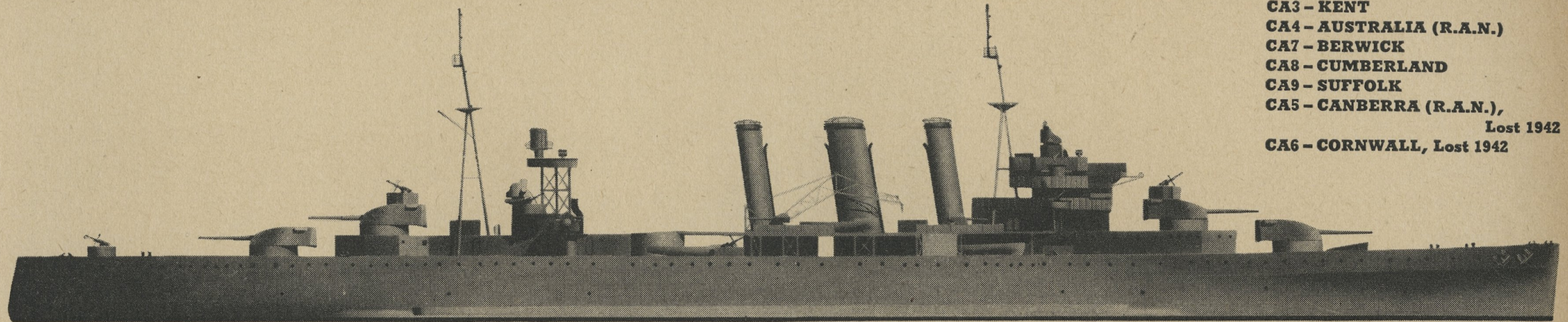


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KENT Class (5 units)

HEIGHT IN FEET:

from W. L.	to Top of Stack - 79'	to Top of Bridge - 73½'
from Foc'sle Deck	to Top of Stack - 53½'	to Top of Bridge - 45½'

LENGTH: 624' (W. L.). BEAM: 68½'

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES:

- Three tall, thin, raking stacks; center stack widest; horizontal stack caps.
- Pairs of twin turrets placed near the ends of the hull; relatively short forecastle and quarterdeck.
- All originally had high-freeboard flush-deck hulls; SUFFOLK and CUMBERLAND now cut down a deck abaft No. 4 turret.
- Distinguished from DEVONSHIRE and NORFOLK Classes by having less clearance between No. 2 turret and the bridge.

RESEMBLANCE TO:

ADELAIDE (Australia - CL). On occasions have been mistaken for liners at long range.
