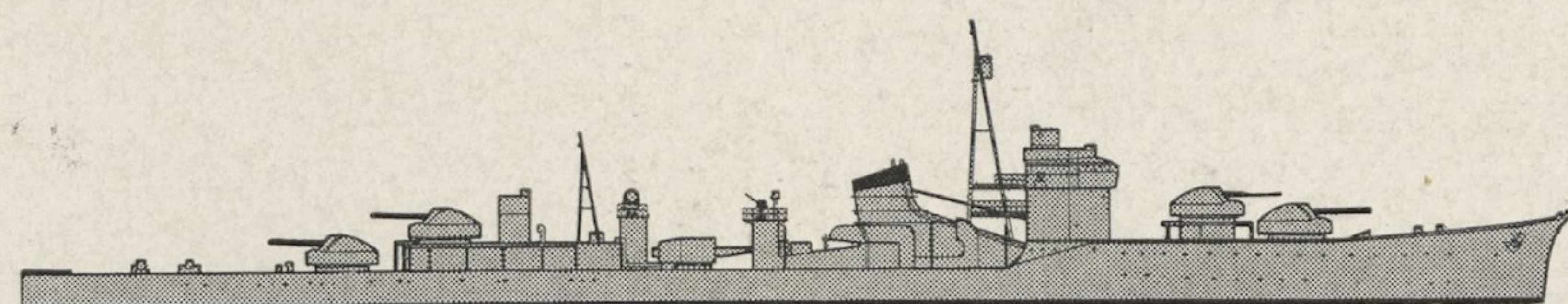
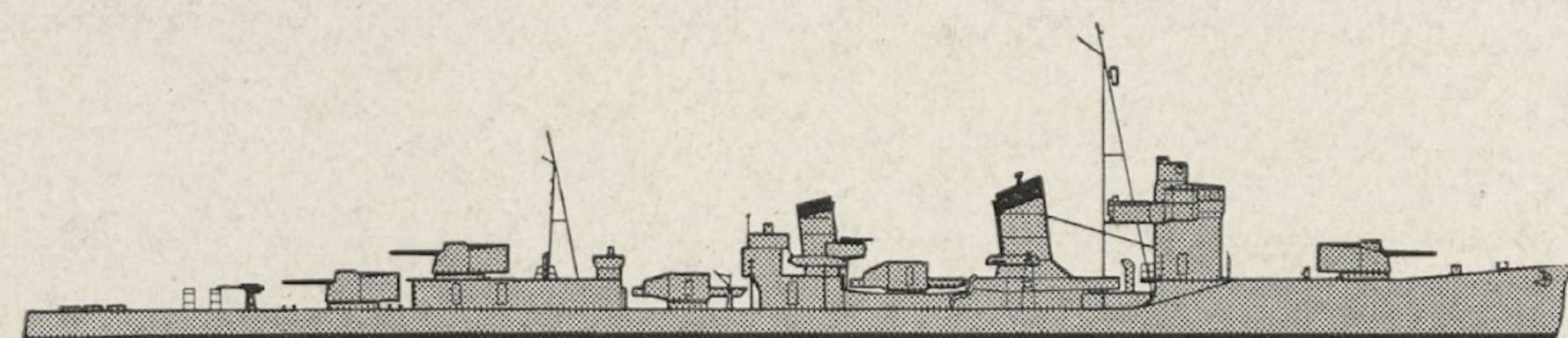


TERUTSUKI CLASS—DD 111

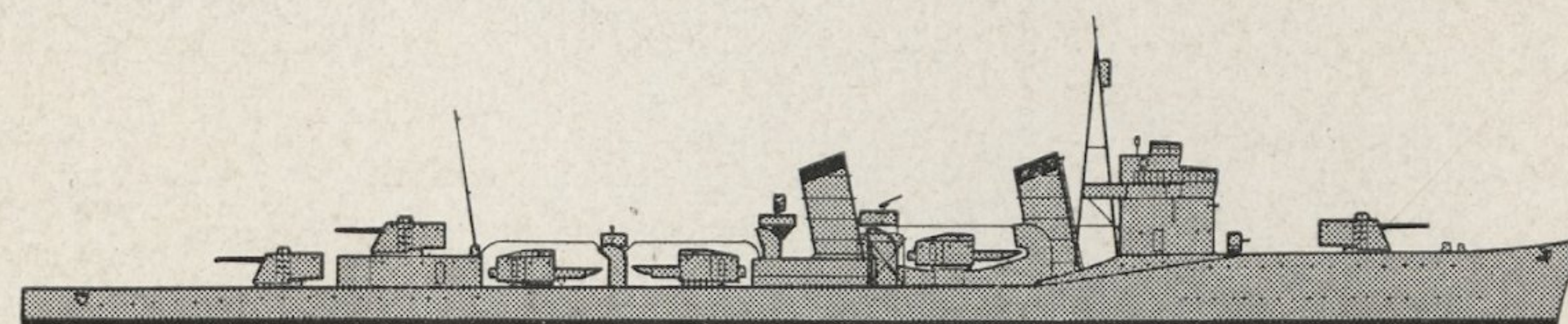


Single Jap raked stack.

FUBUKI CLASS—DD 37-59



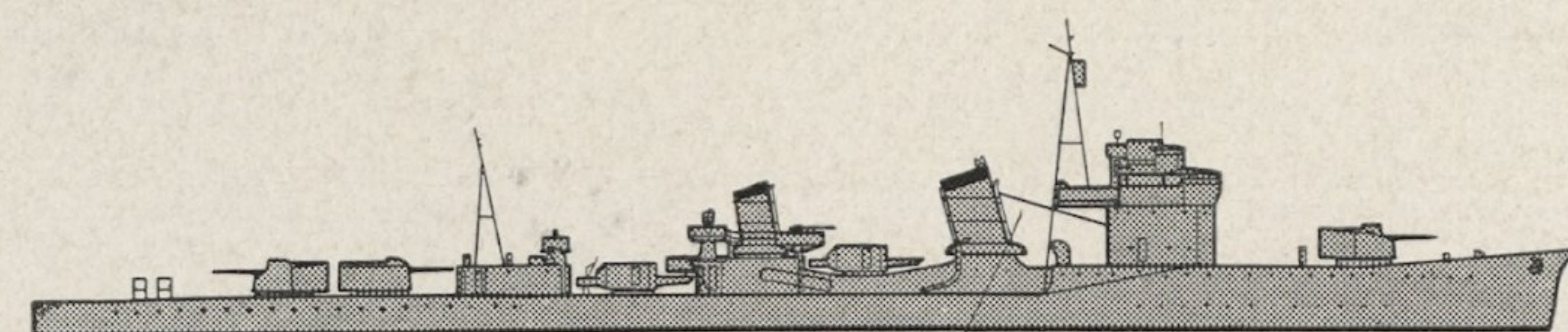
ASASHIO—KAGERO CLASSES—DD 76-110

Torpedo tubes between and aft of stacks.
Superimposed twin shields aft.

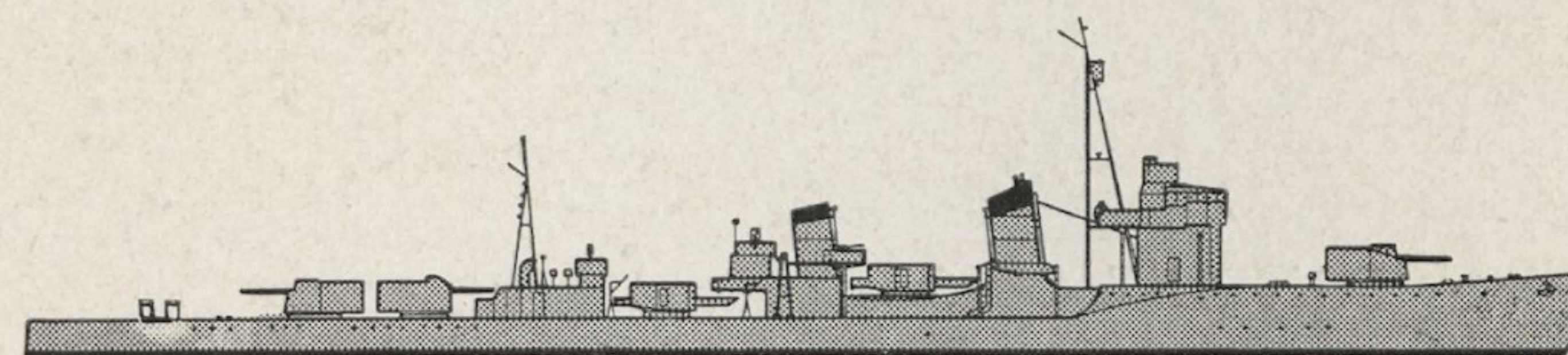
FUBUKI CLASS—DD 37-59

Differs from other classes by having two sets of tubes
abaft 2nd stack.
Stack and torpedo blast shield variances split class into
three groups.

HATSUHARU CLASS—DD 60-65



SHIGURE CLASS—DD 66-75



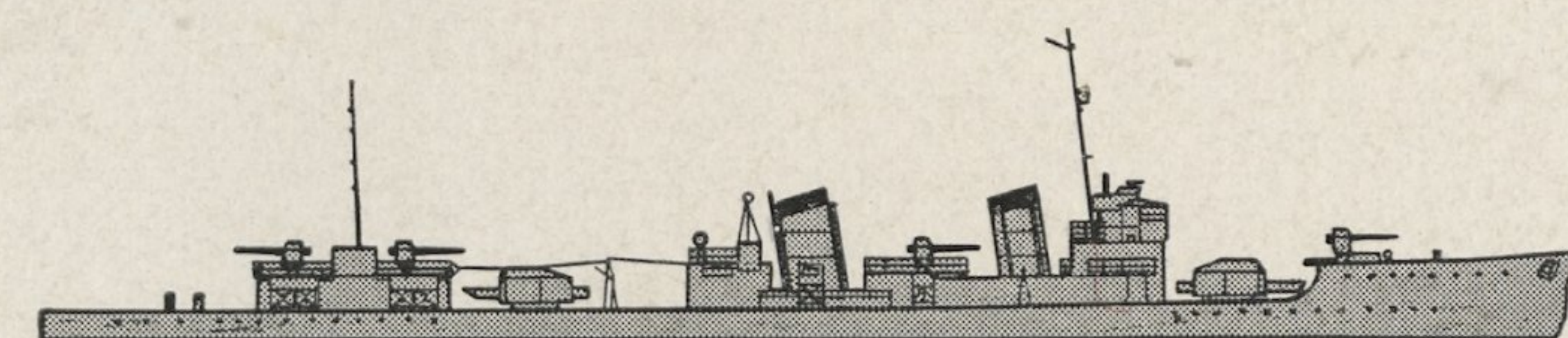
HATSUHARU CLASS—DD 60-65

Similar to Asashio class with aft gun shields placed on
deck.
Note extreme rake to stacks, heavy bridge.

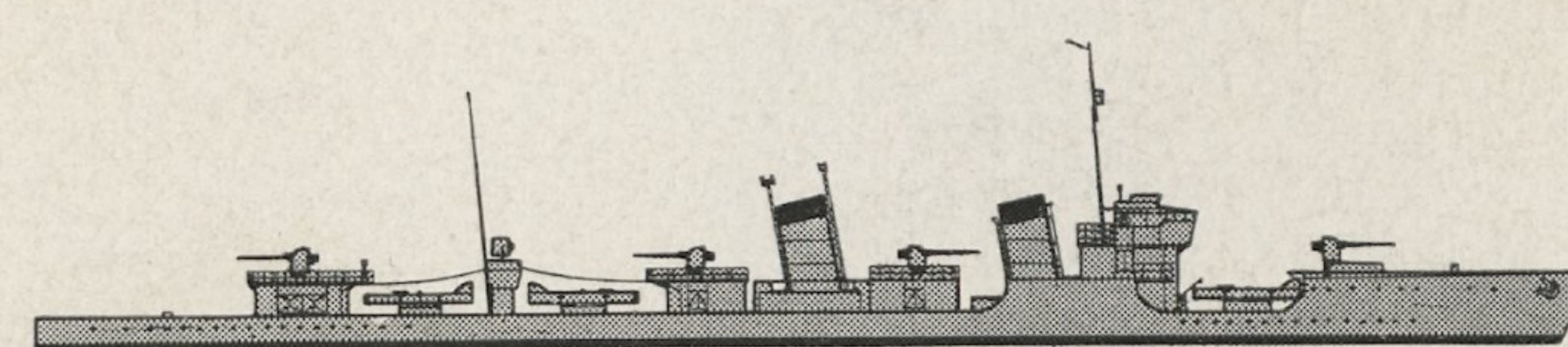
SHIGURE CLASS—DD 66-75

Quadruple torpedo mounts differentiate this class from
Hatsuharu (triples)—otherwise identical.

MINEKAZE CLASS—DD 1-15



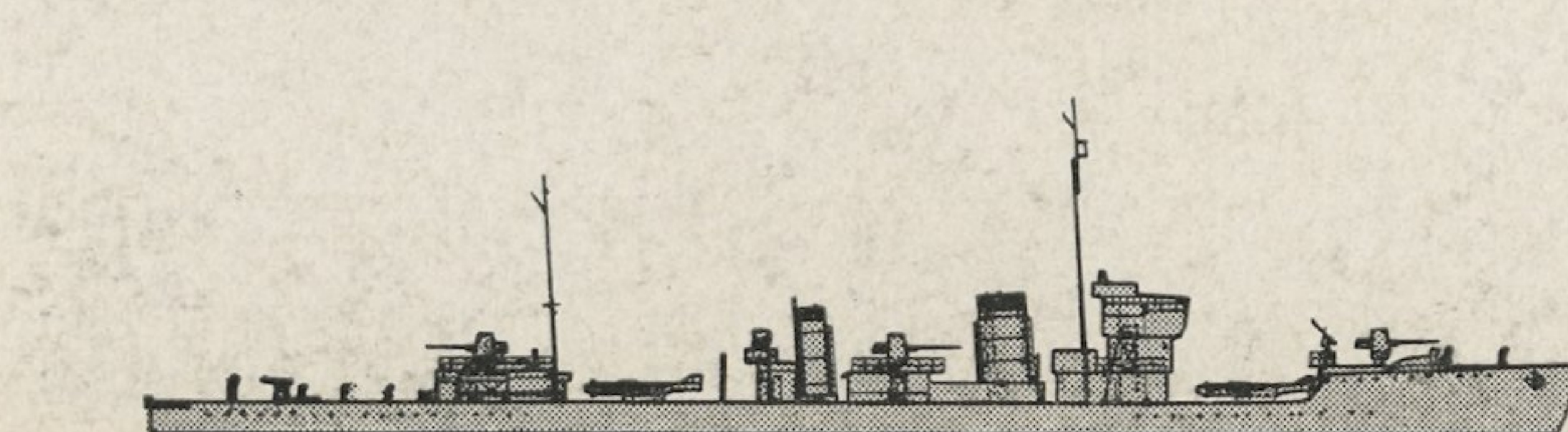
MUTSUKI—KAMIKAZE CLASSES—DD 16-36

Two raked, combined stacks.
Shielded torpedo tubes.
Note large aft deckhouse supporting two guns and main-
mast.
Kamikaze has two torpedo nests aft.

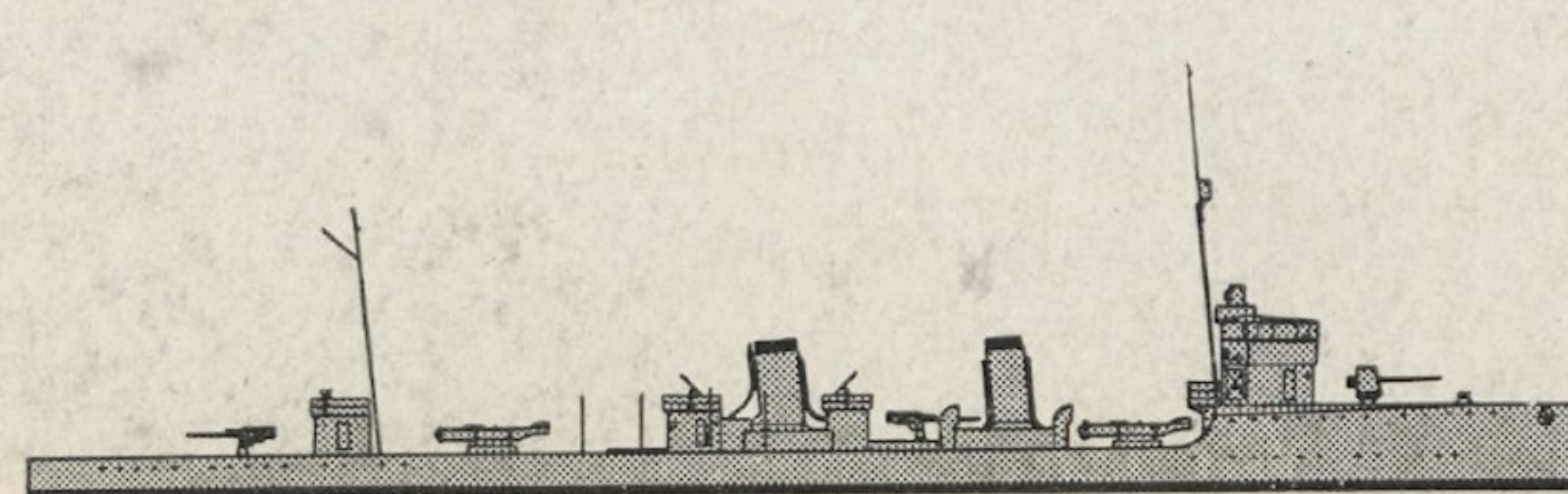
MINEKAZE CLASS—DD 1-15

Distinctive 1A 1-1-1 gun arrangement. Note three torpe-
do nests, separated aft by mainmast.

WAKATAKE—MOMI CLASSES—DD 4-29



MOMO CLASS—DD 1-3



WAKATAKE—MOMI CLASSES—DD 4-29

Distinguished by smaller raked single-pipe stack aft and
1A-1-1 gun disposition.
Minelayer version has no torpedo tubes, sloping stern.

MOMO CLASS—DD 1-3

May be recognized by hull break abaft bridge and short,
raked, single-pipe stacks.
