

Braebridge Hall Feb 25 1838

My dear Sister

I regretted very much you were not able to visit us with Bro John I know he would have spent his time more pleasantly & would not have hurried back so soon as he did, we had bad weather when they were with us & it has continued so, we had the greatest sleet ever known in this part of the country. I expect it was much worse with you on the hills. It is now time to be gardening & every thing is frozen up, I think we shall have a very late spring. My Husband is still much engaged in house building, it has been a deal of trouble I think we shall have room enough for two children — my health is tolerable good at present Mr Carr & the children are in fine health, William is as fond of knives as ever has Mr Grimes at work every night & never sees him without asking him some question about a knife. Mary has a doll which she amuses herself with she is a great nurse — we shall go to Nash the first of April I expect to visit you at that time if nothing
