Dear Sir,

I have this morning rec<sup>d</sup> yours of the 5<sup>th</sup> inst & in reply here to say that the cost of the first box (lost in the Tulelight) is \$339.52, which has been paid to me by Dancy Hyman & Co. charged by them to you. Your instructions in regard to the sale of cotton to meet your draft will be attended to - cotton is now down to 44¢ for middling & great fear an entertainment that it will go still lower. I hope for an advance, but from the heavy receipts coming in, cannot expect it soon if at all - Mary Ann joins me in regards to you & family

Some of your goods bay, carpets, curtains & blankets were ship<sup>d</sup> by mistake of the merchant from whom they were bought to Wilmington, we have rec<sup>d</sup> a dispatch from that place they have been rec<sup>d</sup> & forwarded - The other things have been on board a schooner here for Wilmington more than a week, but have not yet left this Port hope they may all reach you safely
