SATURDAY.—Market opened with good demand at full prices, but closed quietly at quotations. Sales and resales 3,530 bales. Gold opened 139 $\frac{3}{4}$; declined 138; closed 138 $\frac{1}{2}$.

MONDAY.—By the City of Boston, we were this morning in receipt of Liverpool dates to the evening of the 17th, showing the market dull with little inquiry, prices weak at about 13d. for Middling Uplands—These advices helped to quiet our market, which was dull and depressed with quotations hardly maintained. Sales and resales, 710 bales. Gold opened 137 $\frac{1}{2}$; advanced 137 $\frac{7}{8}$; closed 137 $\frac{1}{2}$.

TUESDAY.—Market very quiet and heavy, and prices declined 1 cent per pound. Sales and resales 870 bales. Gold opened 137 $\frac{7}{8}$; advanced 138 $\frac{1}{2}$; closed 137 $\frac{5}{8}$.

WEDNESDAY.—By the Persia, we were this morning in receipt of Liverpool advices to the evening of the 19th, showing market dull with little inquiry and prices weak—Middling Uplands about 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. Stock on hand 970,500 bales, including 415,190 bales of American. Sales for the week 60,000 bales.

These advices helped to depress our market, which was dull, heavy and 1 cent lower. Sales and resales 1,050 bales. Gold opened 138 $\frac{3}{4}$; declined 138; closed 138 $\frac{1}{2}$.

THURSDAY.—Market steady with fair spinning demand. Sales and resales 2,300 bales. Gold opened 138 $\frac{7}{8}$; advanced 140; closed 139 $\frac{1}{4}$.

FRIDAY.—Out of respect to the memory of General Scott who is buried at West Point to-day, no business is transacted on the market, and we omit quotations. Gold selling on the Street at 140 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 141.

Our Market for the week has been very quiet, and prices have declined 2 cents per pound. The unfavorable Liverpool advices have at last had their effect, and speculators are either very cautious buyers, or retire entirely from the market.

There is a fair amount of Cotton offering, but good stapled Cottons are wanted, and sell readily at quotations, there being a very good spinning demand which keeps our market steady at present quotations.

The Cotton Goods Market is very quiet.
