samples drawn and submitted them to three

so we have to submit - the party we sold them
to reports 3 more bales rather objected to by the party
to whom he sold them, they have gone to a Cotton
Mill, we think likely it is the last we shall hear
from them, but if a claim should come we will have
to pay it in accordance with the custom of the trade,

We sold this morning the 6 Bales rejected at
31st as soon as delivered we will make up acc-
current and send to you - The market for some
days has been much depressed, one house that receives
largely from your State sold 200 Bales yesterday at 32st
We sold a line to day at 32^{3/4}, should Gold improve
we would look for a better market, In truly
