Under instruction of The Alliance I forward the following for publication.

Whereas, The farmers in many sections of N.C. if not throughout the entire Cotton growing country, have been terribly imposed upon, by having to take a reduced price for their Cotton from speculators, for want of some well organized plan by which they could dispose of their Cotton directly to the consumer, which would enable them to get the very highest market prices. Resolved therefore that we the members of G. M. Alliance Nash Co. N.C. do recommend and petition the N.C. State Alliance at its next meeting to adopt & devise some plan by which the services of a sufficient No. of good, honest, efficient Agents may be obtained, to dispose of every bale of Cotton raised in N.C. by Alliance men. Resolved 1. That said Agents shall be required to give a good and sufficient bond, for honest and faithful discharge of their duties. Resolved 2. That said Agents shall make their head quarters during the Cotton shipping season at the very best Cotton market & take charge & dispose of all Cotton sent to them by Alliance men to the very best advantage. Resolved 3. That said Agents shall be required to register the name of all who ship them Cotton No. of Bales, weight & price for which it was sold. Resolved 4. That in order to raise necessary funds to pay said Agents for services State Alliance be requested to ascertain as near as possible the No. of bales Cotton raised by Alliance men in State, then say what bales shall be paid for bale by each Alliance man, to be paid to said Agents. Resolved 5. That we do humbly and respectfully ask Sub and County Alliances in N.C. to join us by in this petition.
