Re letter from Mr. Eaton at Morehead City that he had secured the public school building in that place for our meeting. That it was very private and would seat from 350 to 400 people. Negotiations are pending in regard to Railroad rates and we are promised the same rates, by Col Andrews, if the others will agree as the teachers were given which will reduce the expenses $\frac{1}{3}$. Complaint was made to the Commission and they went to see Col Andrews. I had written to Beddingfield to come in before left in order to lay the matter before them. He came and the commission met and Bro. Dunn & others went before them and Beddingfield told the commission it must be done. Maj Wilson went to see Andrews and said all would be right. Very hard rain here last night.
